

TODAY'S GAME

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP QUARTER FINAL REPLAY TAYPORT v CUMNOCK

Tayport's 85th OVD Scottish Junior Cup game brings West Superleague side Cumnock back to the Canniepairt, after a break of over 11 years, for this afternoon's quarter final replay.

There's no doubt that Tayport had more, and by far the better, of the chances to win the tie last week but that's history now, of course, and it's a fresh start again this afternoon.

Cumnock demonstrated their resolve in the earlier rounds of this competition to reach the quarter final stage. After being held 1-1 at home by Musselburgh in round two, they travelled east to comfortably win the replay. Away to Kilsyth in round four, 'Nock struggled to a 1-1 draw against the runaway Central Division One leaders and were also under the cosh in the replay at Townhead Park but scraped through thanks to John Dempster's early goal.

Manager Tom Spence considers that Tayport blew their chance last week and is confident that a visit to Canniepairt will hold no fears. If keeper Jon Connolly performs as he did last week, then the Cumnock boss's confidence could well be justified. Young striker Aidan McVeigh caught the eye last week, and not just for his bleach blonde hair. The Ayr United player showed glimpses of the form which brought him two goals at Shettleston earlier this month.

It's unlikely that Manager Spence will make many changes from what has been a pretty settled line-up for much of the season but there could be a starting place for Chris McGowan who netted one of the goals in the 3-2 OVD win over 2001 champions Renfrew in the last round.

Manager Dave Baikie's selection is anybody's guess. Regulars Grant Paterson, Jon Mitchell, Gareth Dailly and the club's top scorer in the competition, Davie Evans, were all missing from the starting line-up last week and all will come into contention for a place today. Grant Buist trained this week but is unlikely to be risked.

Today's match which has to be played to a finish, will be under the control of the same refereeing team as last week. Mr Eddie Smith, a police inspector from Hamilton, is the man with the whistle and he will be assisted by Tony Ventre from East Kilbride and Pat McFadden from Stewarton.

Another relatively card free afternoon would be fine!




Scott Peters scores for a fourth successive game when he makes perfect contact with Steven Stewart's free kick to head Tayport into the lead at Cumnock last week.

MATCH REVIEW

Tayport today return to action on the Canniepairt, bidding to reach their fifth OVD Scottish Junior Cup semi-final, after last Saturday's lengthy trip to Ayrshire proved to be inconclusive.

Incredibly, the clash at Cumnock's Townhead Park was 'Port's first away fixture of 2003, following six successive home victories in a variety of competitions.

If truth be told, the winning sequence for this calendar year should have been extended last weekend. There was certainly no shortage of opportunities.

Scott Peters did give Tayport a 64th minute lead, but only after several good openings had been passed up.

Brian Craik had a couple of efforts blocked, while Barry McNaughton shot over the top and saw a header cleared off the line, all during the first half.

'Nock 'keeper Connolly initially kept Dave Baikie's side at bay in the second half, with McNaughton being the man most denied. The midfielder must have left the field in a state of frustration, although he should have been encouraged by the regularity at which he was able to break into positive positions.

Not having capitalised on these chances, however, Tayport allowed Cumnock to retain a sense of belief and when Steve McCulloch was given a sight of goal, albeit from 35 yards out, he sent a fabulous free kick into the back of the net, to set up today's make or break encounter.

It is likely to be a tighter affair than the last home fixture when Lochee

United were defeated by four goals to nil in the NCR Trophy, a fortnight ago. Two goals in each half eased 'Port into the last four of the interregional competition, at the expense of several former players and old rivals in the Bluebells' camp.

Goals from Ralph Hunter (2), Steven Stewart and man-ofthe-moment Scott Peters were the reward for another solid performance.

THE BAIKER'S BIT

I remember last season at this stage, prior to our quarter final replay with Bathgate that it was our ninth encounter of the campaign and expressing the fact that it could be up there with the record number of games played by a club at this stage in the Scottish Cup - at least in recent times. Well, our opponents this afternoon can better that, because to-



day's game will be their tenth of the competition. So, if some of their players lacked Scottish Cup experience prior to this season, they've certainly gained plenty to date.

I felt that experience showed in their performance last week. Although I may just be a wee bit biased in my assessment of the game, I felt we clearly had the better scoring opportunities over the piece but our opponents showed the character that's required to continue in this competition.

I look at last week and feel that our players must learn from that game. We earned the lead but let ourselves down through slackness and let our concentration lapse when we most needed it. But we will learn because we will talk about it and re-organise certain areas..

Another important aspect that we all must realise, is that today is a new day and and a new challenge. We must realise that we have another mammoth task on our hands. As I've already said of our opposition, they showed that they have fighting qualities and, to overcome them this afternoon, we have to better their commitment. I genuinely believe that we are capable of doing just that. Our workrate must be absolute. That coupled with discipline both in our shape and behaviour and I'm confident that we can achieve a place in the next round of this great competition.

Spence backs his men for a cup 'Nockout

CUMNOCK boss Tom Spence has warned OVD Cup favourites
Tayport: We'll take you in the replay.

A huge Townhead Park support will follow 'Nock east on Saturday with Spence's claim ringing in their ears.

After a 1-1 draw at Cumnock, many observers believe their best chance has gone but Spence is having none of it.

He rapped: "Tayport are a quality side but we showed them too much respect. "Now my players have seen them at close quarters, they maybe think they are not quite as good as they first thought. "I keep saying we are not good enough to win the cup but I am quietly confident we can go to Tayport and win."

Keeper Jon Connolly was a busy man as Tayport opened on fire but it was 65 minutes before the visitors forged ahead, the unmarked Scott Peters scoring with a header. When Cumnock levelled it was through a stroke of genius from Stephen McCulloch who cracked home a 30 yard free-kick with everyone lined up expecting a cross. Spence claimed: "If David Beckham had scored a goal like that, everyone would be raving about it for years. It was pure quality.

"Tayport are a big, big team but we are still in there fighting."



TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP

PART 5

Season 1975/76 started well for Tayport Amateurs finally getting the monkey that was Star Hearts off their back. Not in the Fife Cup, though, but in the 1st round of the Scottish Amateur Cup when Star, the holders, in their first game in defence of their title, went down 2-0 on Tayport's East Common.



Tayport had received a bye in the opening round of the Fife Amateur Cup and managed a 2-2 draw against **Argos United** at Beveridge Park in Kirkcaldy in round 2. The team that opened the campaign was Richard Callander; Frank Leslie, Ian Mathers, Graham McLaren, Ronnie Fleming; George Taylor, Jim Scott, Stuart Davie; Ian Howe, Graeme Dandie, Gordon Hughes. Subs were Keith Ritchie and Doug Henderson. Dandie, a prolific marksman from Guardbridge, and Arbroath lad Keith Ritchie were the scorers.

The replay took place at Tayport on 27 December, 'Port winning convincingly by 4-0 thanks to a Dandie hat-trick plus an own goal. Tayport had found a rich vein of form and old adversaries **Methilhill Strollers** were crushed by 6-0 in round 3 thanks to Keith Ritchie(2), Howe, Scott, Dandie and an own goal.

Tayport continued in good form and their only blemish prior to the quarter final at **Pitlessie** on 17 April was a shock 2-3 home defeat by local rivals Newport in a league game. Pitlessie were brushed aside by a confident Tayport side which won 4-0 to reach their first ever Fife Cup semi-final. Keith Ritchie(2), Dandie and Hughes were the scorers and there was a return to action by George Ritchie and there were cup debuts for the late Bertie Thoms and Gordon Gray.

The semi-final on Wednesday 19th May 1976 was at Thornton Hibs' Memorial Park against a team from the Kirkcaldy League known as Marion United. Tayport were favourites but, in reaching a first-ever Fife final, didn't impress in a 5-3 win. Again there were new faces in the 'Port team for whom top marksmen Howe and Dandie did not feature. Mick Allan, a serviceman from RAF Leuchars, and Stewart Ritchie, making his first top team start since November, came into the team. Hughes (2), Dave Henderson, Stewart Ritchie and Jim Scott were the scorers.

The final took place only eight days later at the now defunct Leven Juniors' ground. The opponents? Yes, it was **Star Hearts** again but 'Port couldn't repeat their Scottish Cup win and went down 4-2, Ian Howe scoring both goals in a disappointing performance.

In 1976/77 Tayport, still playing on East Common, fell at the first hurdle, losing 1-3 to a new team called Hill of Beath Hawthorn. Haws, founded a year earlier, carried all before them, turned Junior and the rest, as they say, is history.

Next - Several new faces in the team - and Star Hearts are finally beaten in a Fife tie.

CUMNOCK'S LAST VISIT TO CANNIEPAIRT

DECEMBER 1991


It's over eleven years since Cumnock paid their only previous visit to Tayport, losing 2-0 in a third round tie in season 1991/92.

The match, which attracted an estimated attendance of 500, some of whom were housed in the two mobile stands brought in for the occasion, was sponsored by the Tayport Arms which paid £100 for the privilege.

The match report noted that "Tayport always looked the more likely side although Mann's penalty save from Day at 1-0 proved a turning point. Magnificent second goal from Devine"

Elsewhere in the OVD Cup that day, according to the *Sunday Mail*, "Seven man North End disgraced themselves in a stormy encounter, losing 5-1 at home to Auchinleck Talbot". Current Linlithgow manager Jim Sinnet had one of Rose's goals in a 2-0 win over Rob Roy and Hill of Beath beat Downfield by 3-0.







WHYTE and MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE REPORT

With only one league game played in three months, Tayport's place at the top of the Whyte & Mackay Superleague is being increasingly threatened, but it is certain to remain unchallenged for at least another week as our two nearest rivals are on local cup business.

We won't even get the chance over the next couple of weeks to address the situation, as our next two scheduled East Region games are cup ties, Broughty Athletic away next week in the Findlay Cup then Oakley away in the Redwood Leisure Cup.

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP REVIEW/PREVIEW


