

NCR NORTH / TAYSIDE CUP SEMI-FINAL TAYPORT v GLENTANAR

This afternoon we welcome Glentanar FC, one of Junior football's newest clubs, to Tayport for the first time. However, it's not the first time the clubs have met, having been drawn together in this competition in Glens' inaugural season in the Juniors back in 1998/99.

In the match report for that game, Glentanar FC was described as being an ambitious club with an impressive and efficient set-up. This has certainly proved to be the case, with steady progress being made in the five years since joining the juniors from the amateur ranks. Promotion in their third season, holding on to a Premier spot in season No.4 and making a mark in this, their fifth season with a top six finish a near certainty.

Changes in playing personnel have been essential to take the club forward from that first season and indeed only one player survives from that era, striker Robert Poidevin.


Manager Gary Forbes is still in charge, however, and his committee will be well pleased with the progress that is being made on the field and the fact that he has attracted players with the pedigree, of for example, former Dundee FC striker Jerry O'Driscoll to the club. O'Driscoll made his debut for Dundee in 1995/96 and was the Dark Blues' top scorer in 1996/97 before eventually moving on to Montrose.

Although Glens went down 1-2 at home to Formartine last Saturday, they impressed the previous week with a 2-0 win away to second top of the league Stoneywood with goals from Steve Campbell and O'Driscoll.

Tayport have four survivors from that first meeting, Grant Paterson, Allan Ramsay, Steven Stewart and Brian Craik. All featured prominently in Wednesday evening's win over North End. Glentanar manager Forbes and his assistant Alan Cheyne took in this game and will have briefed their troops on their observations in advance of today's game.

Davie Evans, Doug Scott and Gareth Dailly only appeared from the bench in the second half while Robbie Holden, Grant Buist and Ralph Hunter didn't feature at all but that doesn't rule any of the six from being in from the start today once boss Baikie has assessed the post-Wednesday fitness situation.

Definitely out injured, however, are Mark Craib, who will likely have to undergo an operation, and Derek Wemyss, back in training following his leg break at Linlithgow in August but still well short of match fitness. Extra time and penalties if it's a draw at ninety mins.



WHYTE and MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE REPORT

With only one league game played in 16 weeks it was little surprise that Tayport were eventually toppled from the top of the Superleague. Bathgate's 2-1 win at Arniston on Saturday past gave the Creamery Park side a six point lead at the top of the table. However, with Tayport and Hill of Beath having six and five games in hand respectively, the Bathgate stay at the top is likely to be a short one. Both Tayport and Haws reduced the gap to three points in midweek with sound victories against North End and Glenrothes.

Since the last issue of Port Prog, Violet and Edinburgh United have been officially relegated. It is the first time in over quarter of a century that Violet have suffered relegation.

Oakley showed last Saturday what a stuffy outfit they are and it's clear that, despite being in the third relegation spot at present, they won't give up without a fight. The breath of fresh air which the new set-up has provided, is such that Edinburgh United, despite recording only one win to date, are desperate to get back and the clamour to get a spot upstairs to replace them has provided exciting finales to the Lothian, Tayside and Fife League seasons.

If Oakley do hit a purple patch, then Carnoustie, Glenrothes and North End can ill afford a late season slump. Remember Bankfoot last season?

Carnoustie, showing improved form of late, can go a long way to getting out of any trouble when they play at home to Bathgate today. In midweek they are here at Canniepairt whilst Oakley host Hill of Beath.

Next Saturday Tayport are at Violet.

THE BAIKER'S BIT

It's been a month or so since our last home fixture and it's been four weeks of great highs and unfortunately a couple of lows thrown in to bring us back to reality. Victories over Cumnock and Maryhill saw Tayport arrive at our fourth Scottish Cup Final.



We deserved our victories. I felt we started poorly against Cumnock but a positional change midway through the first half gave a different dimension to our play which proved to be too much for our opponents on the day.

The semi-final at Broadwood wasn't a classic by any means but, when you are competing for a place in the Scottish Cup Final, tension will play a significant part. We outplayed Maryhill in the first half and really could have almost had the game sewn up but our 1-0 lead proved to be enough.

The disappointments just happened to be either side of that semi-final. Was it a case of minds elsewhere? I don't know, but what I do know is we're out of two cups, one of which we were the holders and the other one which I desperately wanted to do well in.

If I was to take any positives from these reversals, I would say that the first gave me, and hopefully our players, the awakening required prior to the Maryhill game. The second proved that, if you don't work harder than your opponents, you've every right to expect defeat. The big plus I got from the Broughty defeat was that we've not lost a goal since then. Over 300 minutes of play. Long may that continue.

Wednesday night's 3-0 win at North End was amazingly, only our second league game of the year. I'm obviously delighted to gain three valuable points and it was no more than we deserved on the night. We doninated play without penetration but I knew that, given a break, we'd go on to win. That break came from an unusual source in the shape of Roberto Morris. It reminded me of Craig Brewster's thundering winner for Dundee United in the Scottish Cup final. But it was the key that unlocked the door. It made them have to open up a bit to get back into the game and of course the outcome was another two well taken goals and a 3-0 victory.

This afternoon we have Glentanar as our visitors for this NCR Cup semi-final. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to Tayport. Glentanar are a very well run and organised side and have earned the respect of all the clubs in the North Premier Division. They have earned their place, as we have, to compete at this stage of the competition. I believe that if we produce the workrate we expect from each other, I'm confident we can and will, reach our second cup final of the season

Flurry of first half goals see off Highlanders

comers Glentanar, with at least one of the two supporters' buses embarking on an unscheduled mystery tour of the outskirts of Aberdeen, before eventually stumbling upon the impressively neat, but well-hidden, Woodside Sports complex.

Despite their efficient set-up, the ambitious Aberdonians proved to be no match for their more illustrious visitors, whose superior guile and movement off-the-ball produced a sevengoal advantage by half-time.

The opener, however, was a bizarre affair, coming after less than a minute of play. A Steven Stewart corner kick put the home defence under pressure and an attempted clearance struck the ever-opportune Kenny Cameron in the face, then flew past the helpless home keeper, Michael

Hopkins, and into the back of the net.

If that goal was a touch fortuitous, then the second was, in complete contrast, breathtaking. Grant Paterson drilled a cross into the middle of the box for Steven Stewart, who flicked the ball into the air and, with his back to goal, executed a perfect overhead kick, which would have beaten any goalkeeper.

Buoyed by this fantastic strike, Stewart netted again on 11 minutes, this time with a clinical header, as Tayport ripped apart the Glentanar rearguard, for whom the falling mixture of sleet

and snow was the least of their problems.

The homesters found themselves further behind after 17 minutes. Kenny Cameron knocked the ball towards Dave Reilly, whose deft behind touch guided it beyond the despairing defenders

The match was essentially taking place in one half of the field and 'Port went nap on the half hour mark. Steven Stewart crossed for Kenny Cameron, who finished with a clinical header.

The prolific striker notched up his second suc-

cessive hat-trick seven minutes later. Grant Paterson crossed from the left and Dave Reilly headed onto Cameron, whose cushioned header floated over Hopkins and into the net.

The Reilly brothers combined for the final goal of the half. Paul's deep, right-wing cross was lethally swept home, at the back post, by Dave. In addition to these seven goals, Tayport went

close on numerous occasions, with Allan Ramsay and lan Greig, for example, both firing in powerful efforts, while Mark Corcoran was denied what looked to be a certain penalty.

There was a slow start to the second half, with 'Port finding it difficult to get back into top gear following such a comfortable first period.

Furthermore, the proud Aberdeen outfit seemed to relish the brighter weather conditions which prevailed after the break, upping their determination and, consequently posing more of a threat to the visiting defence.

Tayport did add an eighth goal on 65 minutes. Substitute Grant Miller swung over a corner which was bulleted past the goalkeeper by the inrushing Paul Reilly.

Miller was also involved in his team's ninth counter of the afternoon. Dave Reilly held the ball up for the substitute's overlapping run, on the right flank, and the fine cross was met by the boot of none other than Kenny Cameron, who volleyed home, to continue his personal assault on the record books.

Mark Corcoran, one of four Tayport residents in the side, was unlucky not to get his name on the scoresheet, but after a mazy, solo run, he saw his low drive fly narrowly wide of the upright, which was perhaps an early sign that the Canniepairt outfit was destined not to reach double figures.

Barring any injuries at training, the only absentee is likely to be Grant Buist, who recently had an operation on his broken nose and could be out for a few weeks.

Kick off at Westfield Park is scheduled for 2.15pm and supporters' transport will leave the Canniepairt at 12.45pm, although it is advised to phone the newsline on 01382 552755 for up-todate information.

MATCH REVIEW

Tayport have enjoyed mixed fortunes since the last edition of 'Port Prog. The main highlight, of course, has been reaching the final of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, for the fourth time in ten years.

Ayrshire aces, Cumnock, were outclassed in the quarter final replay on the Canniepairt (22/3). Brian Craik, man-of-the-match Steven Stewart and super sub Davie Evans notched the goals which saw 'Port through to the semi-final clash with Glasgow outfit Maryhill. Allan Ramsay also found the net, but his counter was an own goal which mattered little to either side.

And so, less than a fortnight later, to Clyde's Broadwood Stadium, for the biggest game of the season to date. Another solid, if unspectacular performance produced a slender one goal victory and earned Tayport a place in the final of one of Scottish football's most prestigious tournaments.

The club, and the town itself, can now look forward to a special Sunday afternoon at Firhill, on 1st June, thanks to a priceless 19th minute strike by the inimitable 'Birdie' whose knack of netting important goals has become invaluable.

Unfortunately, there have also been setbacks over the past few weeks, with 'Port surprisingly crashing out of two other cup competitions. Between the aforementioned ties in the 'Scottish', Dave Baikie's troops were dumped from the Findlay & Co. Cup by the Kris Ward-inspired Broughty Arhletic (29/3). A late equaliser, courtesy of an Allan Ramsay shot, looked set to spare Tayport's blushes, but the Fed hit-man completed his brace in extra time, much to the satisfaction of Andy Heggie and Billy Coventry, in the Broughty dugout.

Extra-time was required at Oakley's Blairwood Park last weekend (12/4), in the inter-regional Redwood Leisure Cup. Neither side was able to find the net until a penalty shoot-out. The hosts converted all of their spot kicks. The visitors did not. On a positive note, the two cup exits reduce fears of a fixture pile-up and will allow 'Port to focus on the Whyte and Mackay East Super League campaign.

And that's exactly what happened on Wednesday evening when Tayport travelled to North End Park, on league duty. A greater degree of intensity ensured there would be only one outcome - victory.

Roberto Morris opened his Tayport account with an ever-so-vital first half strike and, on half-time, Barry McNaughton arrived in the box to head home a Steven Stewart cross. The Tayside champions were back in the groove. A Brian Craik goal twenty minutes into the second half, sealed an impressive win and underlined the quality which 'Port undoubtedly possess.

TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP PART 6

Season 1977/78 and things were starting to come together at the club. Manager Bobby Waddell had been gradually been adding a player here and a player there and had put together quite a formidable force. The season was to start with a 24 game unbeaten run.



The opening Fife Cup tie was away to North Queensferry and there were six Fife Cup debutants - Bobby Nicol in goal, Ian Dobie, Mike Clerihew, Steve Braid, Jim Downie and Ian Brown but it was two old faces, Ian Howe and Gordon Hughes who had the goals in 'Port's 2-0 win in November 1977. Four weeks later in the second round Guardbridge United fell 4-1, one of the goals coming from another new face, the cultured midfielder Doug Paterson, with Braid, Downie and George Ritchie getting the others.

Things were really buzzing by the time the 3rd round came around in February. Star Hearts again - and at Treaton Park - but there was a new confidence about this Tayport side and there was a hard fought 2-1 win through goals by Howe and Paterson. Making his Fife Cup debut was Peter Wilson, a rugged defensive midfielder from Dundee who had succumbed to the persuasive ways of his then workmate, Andy Robertson, and decided to move across the bridge.

4th of March brought a 4th round tie at Duffus Park against local rivals Cupar Hearts. Tayport's form continued to impress with a 4-1 win, Howe (2), Wilson and Paterson scoring. Hwever the wheels came off the bandwagon in the semi-final against Windygates. Tayport, despite winning week after week, hadn't kept a clean sheet since the start of the year and reliance on their scoring prowess on this occasion wasn't enough to see off their opponents. Played on Saturday 25th March 1978 at Strathmiglo and despite having the best of the game, Tayport were level 2-2 at full time thanks to two Dougie Paterson goals but conceded an extra time goal to end their Fife Cup interest for another season. The team that day was Bobby Nicol; Bobby McMahon, Ian Mathers, Ron Fleming (Peter Spink), Ian Brown; Peter Wilson, Doug Paterson, Jim Downie; George Ritchie, Ian Howe, Gordon Hughes; Doug Henderson.

1978/79 saw Tayport play seven Fife Cup games but by the end of March 1979 had only reached the fourth round - and that was as far as they were to get that season.

Again a first round tie v North Queesferry and again a number of cup debutants - Ian Lyall in goal, Alan Hart, Bobby Wilson, Micky Hall, Sandy Hamilton and Kenny Smith.

A bit like this season, Tayport were caught up in cup-ties and, from 18th November 1978 to 7th April 1979, the team managed to play only one league fixture.

Next - three ties, six games and extra time.







Thirty years ago this morning, on Easter Saturday 21 April 1973, 24 intrepid members of Tayport Football Club stepped ashore from a hovercraft on the beach at Calais en route to Ougree near Liege in Belgium. It was to be the first of many trips by the club to play in AC Ougree's international football tournament - trips made by well over 300 different club members over the years and trips which have given rise to a million tales which will be related as long as there is someone around to remember.

That first trip was by a 40 seater coach hired from Williamson's of Gauldry and the total cost to each of the travellers was £16 per head. (you can hardly get a round of drinks after the match for that money these days, never mind a trip abroad and accommodation for five days!) There was a shortfall of £155.22p but the Tayport Town Council of the day had generously agreed to underwrite any loss. Councillor Walter Goodwin was sent along with the party by the Council to look after the Town Council's interest! Such was the success of the pioneering visit, the Town Council hosted a civic reception for the travellers on their return.

All but nine of the party were aged under 21 with one, George Caldow, being only 15. For the record the others who made the trip were Lindsay Ancell, Murray Anderson, Gordon Brankin, Ronnie Fleming, Eddie Gilmour, Jim Herd, Davie Hughes, Bobby Jackson (aka Le Boab, accordionist and cheerleader), Alex Houston, Walter Kemp, Andy Johnstone, Frank Leslie, Ian Mathers, Jim Mathers, Alastair Oswald, Albert Oswald, Ian Rae, Bruce Ross, Andy Robertson, Eddie Stewart, Ian White and Raymond White. Doug Henderson, who was doing teacher training in France, joined the party at Calais. Sadly Bruce Ross, Davie Hughes and Jimmy Herd have passed away but the majority are still knocking about these parts with several still involved with the club either as committee, season ticket holders or occasional spectators.

Thirty years? Sounds like a good excuse for downing a few Stellas tonight!

With the tenth anniversary of a first OVD final appearance almost upon us, we take our first extracts from the Quarter Final v Downfield.

Saturday 3rd April 1993. Tayport O Downfield O.

I feel we did everything possible with the build-up. The training went well. the pre-match preparation went like clockwork. St Andrews, the meal, everything. The players were wound up before they went on the park. But things Just didn't materialise on the field. They played 4-4-2 and defended well. We Just didn't create enough so it's back to the drawing board for next week.

Saturday 17th April 1993 [10th April was postponed because of rain]

Downfield 1 Tayport 1. Scorer D. Reilly.

What can I say. We let them off the hook. When we were 1-0 up and for the next ten minutes we were in command. Then a slack pass from Cushnie lets them back into it. Then Andy [Somerville] gets sent off with 30 minutes left which not only left us with ten men but forced me to leave the subs [Lamont and Mackay] on the bench much longer than I wanted. We'll win next week, I also feel they have penalty kicks in mind. But it won't go any longer than the 90mins.

Saturday 24th April. Downfield O Tayport 1 (D.Reilly).

At last! We played much more like we can. We created six good chances. Didn't take them but we've got to be happy. From my point of view, I'm very happy. George Grier tried to put it down to a tactical battle between him and myself. I tried not to let it affect me but it did. He might have won the battle but I won the war. He should have said nothing. Quality will always win in the end. Paul Reilly came in for the first time against them and was Man of the Match for me.

Auchinleck Talbot at Firhill, tall order. We've got the ability. Have we got the bottle?




The winners of the final on 1st June will be awarded a further two points.

MEDIA WATCH

A pity, then, that Whitburn turned down automatic promotion this time last year.


