



TODAY'S GAME WHYTE and MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v EDINBURGH UNITED

Edinburgh United pay their first visit to north Fife for this afternoon's Whyte & Mackay Super League match. Although United are already relegated, their pride is at stake and there is also the incentive to pick up points which will take them above Dundee Violet and off the bottom spot.

For Tayport, this is yet another crucial match in their quest for the title and the knowledge that Hill of Beath are hard on their heels with the adrenalin flowing should continue to spur the locals on.

Although goals have generally been hard to come by for Edinburgh in the Super League, it won't have escaped the Tayport management's attention that our opponents today netted four goals at Oakley in a league game earlier this season - a venue where we recently hardly managed a shot, never mind a goal as we tumbled out of the Redwood Leisure Cup.

Edinburgh will show several changes from the side which went down 1-0 to Tayport at Paties Road earlier in the season. Chris Lynch, Graeme McCann and Ross Belford have all left the club. There are new faces in Sean Irvine a small but nippy striker signed during the January transfer window and Kenneth McMenemy, a student in the capital who hails from Stonehaven and joined around the same time.

The backbone of the Edinburgh team has been with the club for a number of years. The longest serving is Scott Inglis, a versatile left-sided player who has worn the white & black for some 12 years. Inglis has been injured but could return today.

For 20 years old midfielder Danny Alexander, it could be one of his last games for the club as he leaves for Australia in the summer to play his football in Brisbane. Another who could be moving in the close season is ex-Cowdenbeath central defender Martin Humphries who has admirers amongst clubs with money to shell out.

Left sided midfielder Nicky Brookfield is the club's top scorer and the other main scoring threat is likely to come from Val Chisholm.

Manager Baikie shuffled the pack on Wednesday. Dailly was unavailable and the Tayport boss rested Peters, Craik, Gunnion, Mitchell and Holden. Mitchell only came on for the last ten minutes but was injured and had to be substituted before the end so he is unlikely to be risked today.

Despite coming from the capital city, United, regretfully, aren't a well supported side and are unlikely to carry a significant travelling support.

TODAY'S VISITORS

EDINBURGH UNITED

This afternoon we welcome Edinburgh United to the Canniepairt for the first time. United have the distinction of being the capital city's only junior club and it is with some regret from Tayport's point of view that the Paties Road club are now relegated.

A match in the capital always attracts a few Tayport exiles and the Tayport FC Travel Club in particular, is mourning United's waygoing from the Whyte & Mackay Super League. A trip to Auld Reekie provides a fine opportunity for an extended stay to partake of a few fine ales.


A relatively young club, having joined the SJFA five years earlier than ourselves, in 1985/86, Edinburgh United was a spin-off from the renowned Merchiston Boys' Club, and the newcomers made an immediate impact in the East Region Juniors, reaching the 5th round of the Scottish Junior Cup in their first season and taking the division two championship. Cup success followed with the Brown Cup in 1987 and again in 1989. Indeed 1988/89 was to be the club's most memorable season to date when the club lifted the Fife and Lothians Cup. Following a 1-1 draw with Camelon at Linlithgow's Prestonfield, United won the area's premier trophy in a penalty shoot-out.

Following promotion Edinburgh became an established Division One club until relegation in 1993/94. For six seasons the club languished in Division Two, twice finishing in the bottom three. Things picked up however, and the new Millenium brought promotion and a place back to the top division. It could have so easily been the championship but Harthill Royal pipped Edinburgh for the title by the slimmest of margins - a one goal better goal difference after the sides had finished on the same points.

2000/2001 saw the club consolidate once again in the top division and improve sufficiently last season to finish fifth and earn automatic promotion to the new Whyte and Mackay Superleague.

Despite finishing bottom of the pile this season, playing in the Superleague is not a move Edinburgh have regretted. Manager Jimmy McLauchlan saw the step up as a challenge and was backed by his committee who have gone on record as praising the new set-up, commenting that they've made a few new friends and have learned from their experience. It's a very tough league, say Edinburgh and those clubs, having seen the error of their ways in not supporting the change last season, are now spending big to get up.

With only one club from the Lothians feeder leagues being promoted each season, it's going to be much tougher to get that step up in the future.



WHYTE and MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE REPORT

If Oakley do hit a purple patch, then Carnoustie, Glenrothes and North End can ill afford a late season slump. Remember Bankfoot last season?

These were the comments in the last Port Prog's Super League Report and it would appear that Oakley have hit that purple patch. The magnitude of their win at Glenrothes last Saturday was the talking point of the week and of course now has the Gowfers and the Glens quaking.

Oakley will be feeling that they can escape now that they are only two points behind Glens and three behind Carnoustie with two games in hand. We said earlier in the season that history showed that 25 points was the magic total to aim for in order to escape relegation but we could see a team relegated with 26 points.


Although it's highly unlikely, in theory North End could still go down. A landslide win for Carnoustie in their final game against already relegated Violet would leave the Dokens in a precarious position.

Oakley and Glenrothes have matters in their own hands. Both have enough points to play for that would take them above Carnoustie, regardless of the Gowfers' result against Violet. Carnoustie will be anxiously awaiting the outcome of Glens' game at Bonnyrigg and Oakley's home game with Arniston this afternoon.

If it's tight at the bottom, it's equally tight at the top with ourselves and Hill of Beath fighting it out for the inaugural title - although Arniston would, quite justifiably, claim that they are still in the hunt. Bathgate, too, can mathematically still take the title

The sponsors, Whyte & Mackay, must be delighted that the new league set-up has provided such an exciting climax with eight clubs still having something to fight for and, in addition, the league can boast the two OVD finalists.

MATCH REVIEW

Since the last edition of *Port Prog*, Tayport have been involved in two cup matches and two must-win league encounters. To everyone's great relief, maximum points were collected, but plain sailing it was not.

Before the league business, 'Port first had to play rapidly improving North outfit Glentanar, in the semi-finals of the NCR Trophy (19/4). Gareth Dailly gave Tayport a flying start, scoring with a curling free kick after only three minutes.

Dave Baikie's men could not build on this early lead, though, and a frustrating afternoon ensued. Despite having most of the possession, 'Port did not test the visiting 'keeper often enough and there was always a risk of conceding an equaliser. Glentanar did, in fact, hit the woodwork, but essentially, the home support spent the best part of an hour and a half awaiting the final whistle, without any great anxiety or entertainment.

Anxiety was to the fore on the Wednesday evening, however, when Carnoustie Panmure visited the Cannipairt on league duty (23/4). On this occasion there was to be no early goal to settle the nerves and time began to ebb away at an alarming rate.

Thankfully, Davie Evans came off the bench to net a scorching effort from the edge of the box, beating player-boss Bobby Geddes all ends up. The super-sub had struck again!

Evans earned a starting slot for the Saturday trip to Glenesk (26/4) and, once again, scored a late goal which secured the points. This fixture, though, had even more intrigue. Tayport broke the deadlock through Barry McNaughton in the fifth minute, only for Kenny Jones to level for the already relegated Violet on the hour mark. With just ten minutes remaining, McNaughton headed the visitors back in front, before Evans completed the rescue mission.

The deserved involvement of Frazer Fitzpatrick and Scott Peters in the Scotland team meant the next competitive game was not until Wednesday evening (7/5), and the North End Challenge Cup tie away to the Dokens.

Steven Stewart lit up a rain soaked North End Park when, ten minutes into the second half, he netted a blistering 30 yard free kick, which absolutely screamed past keeper Andy Stewart. The goal was fit to win any match and it certainly won this one.

TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP PART 6

Season 1978/79 and goals from Ian Howe, Peter Wilson, Jim Downie, Gordon Hughes and Kenny Smith got Tayport off to a flyer, beating North Queensferry 5-2 in a first round tie in November. In the 2nd round in December, 'Port were held 3-3 at



home by Thornton but triumphed 4-1 at Thornton on 23 December in the replay. It was March before Tayport played their 3rd round tie and again they were held at home, 2-2 by Eastbank from the Kirkcaldy & District League. The following week, March 17th, it was 0-0 after 90 minutes but Willie Lawson netted the winner during extra time.

Tayport's run to a 6th round replay in the Scottish Cup had caused a log jam of fixtures and the 4th round of the Fife Cup followed immediately and, for the third successive round, the tie was drawn - 3-3 at Ballingry Rovers, Bobby Wilson and Ian Howe (2) scoring. Getting a draw at Ballingry was no mean feat in those days and hopes were high for the replay but, alas, the following side lost a second half goal to exit the competition - Ian Lyall; Ronnie Fleming, Bobby Wilson, Peter Wilson, Gordon Emslie; Dougie Paterson, Stuart Davie, Alan Hart; Kenny Smith, Ian Howe, Gordon Hughes; Willie Lawson and Alan Paterson were substitutes. Others who played in that season's campaign were Doug Henderson, Bobby McMahon, Micky Hall, Sandy Hamilton and, would you believe it, Jimmy McCafferty.

Season 1979/80 started in the same vein as the previous season's Fife Cup campaign had ended - with a draw. This time 1-1 at Wemyss Club Athletic, Ian Howe scoring. It was more or less the same team,too, although Ian Mathers had come into the side in central defence. The replay at Tayport was by 3-2, Hart, Smith and Howe scoring.

The second round was mid December and Strathmiglo United, going very well in the Kirkcaldy League at the time, were duly accounted for by a 2-0 margin on the Canniepairt, Howe and Hughes doing the damage. The tie of the round emerged from the 3rd round draw - away to cup favourites Star Hearts at Treaton Park. It was to be a memorable victory for Tayport. A cracking goal early in the game from Raymond White, playing his first Fife tie in six years, gave Tayport a 1-0 win. However the tie would be best remembered for the magnificent performance by Rab Downie - probably his finest hour in a football jersey.

Listed as substitute, not having played for the first team since November, Rab wasn't expected to be called upon. You could probably say he was ill prepared, having been on the sauce on Friday night and spent Saturday morning delivering bags of coal. However his brother Jim was injured in the opening minutes and Rab had to take his place. Revelling in the mudheap that was Treaton Park that afternoon, Rab's display inspired Tayport to a famous win.

Next issue - Another memorable victory. This time with a former team mate of Dave Baikie's playing a big part.

THE BAIKIE DIARIES

Unlike the Hitler Diaries, this is the real thing. Port Prog has acquired the genuine diaries written by Tayport boss Dave Baikie. Today and in succeeeding Port Progs, we will print excerpts from these 1993 scribblings.

With the tenth anniversary of a first OVD final appearance almost upon us, we take our first extracts from the Semi Final v Auchinleck and the two league games which followed within 5 days.

Friday 30th April 1993, Auchinleck O Tayport 3

(OVD Scottish Junior Cup Semi-Final at Firhill)

Everything went according to plan. A magnificent performance by every player. Everyone was a hero. We have now achieved what no team from Tayside has done for 39 years.

The job is only half done, though. It's the 64 year target I'm after - 1929 Dundee Violet. It can and will be done. I'm positive about that. We must pull out every stop to achieve it. But let's just enjoy the moment. We seized the day as J.B. [Jack Black] would say. Let's go and win the 1st Division Championship on Monday. I've got to get their feet back oin the ground. It won't be easy.

[footnote: Baikie persuaded the committee to invest some hard earned shekels to bring in Jack Black, the world renowned life and business development guru, to help the players overcome the psychological barrier of Tayside clubs falling at the semi-final hurdle. A sound investment, as it turned out]

Monday 3rd May 1993, Dundee Violet O Tayport 5 (League)

1st Division champions. Magic. We didn't play well in the first half. Understandable after Friday's game. But once we got the second goal they caved in. Another great night. Possibly a bit of an anti-climax but great to be champions once again. Next stop Zamoyski Cup semi place and PA Cup Final.

Wednesday May 5th 1993, Tayport 2 Forfar West End 2 (League)

Disastrous start. We were still in the dressing room and they were 2-0 up. Mackay and Cushnie weren't at the races. 


