

## TONIGHT'S GAME WHYTE and MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v DUNDEE NORTH END

Taking into account Dokens' reasonable start to the season and the Tayport connections within the playing and management staff at North End Park, this afternoon's Super League match is the game of the day.

That's how this article was to have started when this game was originally scheduled in December, but as we know much has changed in the intervening six months. Co-manager Gary Strachan intimated that he was standing down and Bob Williams, the North End club chairman, also resigned his post. There are still the Tayport connections, however, and that's what makes tonight's league fixture so interesting

It's a game which is of crucial importance to Tayport. The presence of four prominent ex-Port players in Dokens' squad, seeing out the twilight of their careers, will bring a decided edge to this evening's game. In addition, another Tayport ex, Paul Reilly, shares the North End management responsibilities with Gary Strachan - or at least he did until a week ago.

The Dundee side's firepower was boosted by the 'window' signing of Sean Christie, the 22 years old striker who was released by Forfar Athletic last season and who had returned from USA. Already with prolific scorers Darren Bonella, Stevie Ross and Dave Reilly available, Christie's signing gives Dokens' management plenty attacking options.

This will be the fourth occasion in little over six weeks that the two sides have met. Twice 'Port have recorded three nil wins, in the NCR Cup and the corresponding league fixture at North End Park and one nil in the North End Challenge Cup, also at North End Park.

This being their last game of the season, North End will be very anxious to stop the rot and get a point or three to lift them clear of the drop zone. Not that relegation is a real issue, as their current goal difference is sufficient to ensure that relegation can be avoided.

Tayport will be looking to build on Sunday's success and the players will be fully aware of the importance of tonight's match. Whether Dave Baikie shuffles his line-up remains to be seen but there's little doubt that the heat sapping conditions for 120 odd minutes at Firhill will have affected some players more than others, so one or two changes could be on the cards.

Despite being ordered off, as it was for two yellow cards, Ross Gunnion will not be suspended and is available to play.

#### **MATCH REVIEW**

"What a feeling!" exclaimed Brian Craik at around six o' clock on Sunday evening. Hear, Hear! Following Tayport since the football odyssey began back in 1990, has been a true pleasure, with no shortage of memorable cup and league triumphs to celebrate. We all know, however, that there is something magical about the OVD Scottish Junior Cup and Sunday June 1st was another magical day.

Firhill was bathed in sunshine, the Main Stand was awash with red and white, and the Tayport players were simply dynamite.

Port and Linlithgow have both played better football, but what mattered was winning the "Scottish" and, as has been the case all season, it mattered most to Tayport. The desire was tangible and, consequently, the Canniepairt men dominated the game.

Even after Ross Gunnion's unfortunate dismissal, with ten minutes to go in normal time, the belief of Dave Baikie's troops was unshakeable. When a team wins junior football's showpiece event, the entire squad are afforded hero-status and rightly so, but someone has to grab the headlines, someone has to score the all-important goal.

Just as in the semi-final, "Birdie" was the man to wheel away in delight, towards an ecstatic 'Port support, becoming in the fourth minute of extra time, the second player to score a Cup Final goal for Tayport. Just as in the semi-final, it was not a spectacular strike, but there were no complaints. From then on our heroes battled away until the relief of the final whistle.

With the party underway in the stands and on the pitch, the sound of the Proclaimers died away as Grant Paterson stepped up to lift the Scottish Cup. It takes a special type of player to captain a club to this most prestigious of honours and there is no doubt that "Patty" a special type of player.

One last thought as to the magnitude of this achievement. Since Tayport turned junior, only ourselves and Auchinleck Talbot have twice won the Scottish Cup. Our old foes have appeared in three finals, we've appeared in four. Dave Baike et al have turned Tayport into the nation's most successful junior football team. bar none.

It's fitting that, in invoking memories of 1996, it is Dundee North End who visit the Canniepairt this evening on Whyte and Mackay Super League duty. Heroes of the twelfth of May, Stevie Ross, Sean Wilkie, Dave Reilly, Paul Reilly and Fraser Mann will all be in the Dokens' camp, looking to put one over their former club.

The Tayport boss will have his men focussed, though, as they stand on the brink of a unique double. After a goalless draw against relegated Edinburgh United, Port have won two successive Super League fixtures. Davie Evans struck the winner at Glenrothes, while a Barry McNaughton double along with singles from Brian Craik and Jonathan Mitchell accounted for Arniston Rangers in a cracking match at Newbyres Park. The six points, coupled with Arniston's win at Hill of Beath, have moved Port to within five points of the title.

Tonight sees the first of a three game championship run-in. So many factors point to this as being a major test, not least the recent NCR Trophy victory against North End at Glenesk. A rampant Tayport chalked up a three goal win, courtesy of another McNaughton double and a John Ward penalty. Pride, revenge, the threat of relegation, and Tayport's current standing will spur on the experienced visitors. How will Tayport respond?




All hands on deck" for Dundee North End as they defend an indirect free kick in the NCR Cup Final

It's our sad duty to report the death of Chris Carmichael, a few days before the Cup Final. Chris was a Tayport FC enthusiast who never missed a home game until ill health took it's toll. Nevertheless Chris kept up with what was happening at the Canniepairt through the press and the Port Prog. He was laid to rest on Monday, his last wish being granted, that he be buried in his Tayport FC sweater. Our condolences go to Chris's family.

#### DR To Retire

Dave Reilly plays the last game of an illustrious career when he turns out for North End this evening. It's entirely appropriate that a player who gave Tayport such fine service for over ten years, should bow out on the Canniepairt.

Dave played amateur with Lawside FP and such was his talent that he was signed by Forfar Athletic. However, it was a career move which did not last. It has been one of DR's regrets in football that, by his own



admission, he did not give that move his best shot and returned to the amateurs with Lawside. However Forfar's loss was subsequently to be Tayport's gain.

DR was one of the Baikie / Marr management team's first signings for 'Port as the club assumed Junior status in readiness for season 1990/91. The 25 years old Reilly gave Tayport just over ten years sterling service, turning out in 'Port colours on 497 occasions, including three Scottish Cup finals, scoring goals 362 goals - with some crackers amongst them.

All good things come to an end however, and in December 2000, DR, looking for the guarantee of a regular game, moved to Dundee North End where he has spent the past two and a half seasons. The move meant that the steady flow of medals DR had been regularly gathering all but dried up, although a further North/Tayside Concept medal came his way in 2001.

A brickie by trade, it is great credit to DR that he rarely, if ever, missed his two nights training whilst at Tayport, putting in so many quality matchday performances and is still playing as his 39th birthday beckons.

All at the Canniepairt wish Dave a happy retirement and only hope that, if he is playing tonight, he doesn't sign off with a trademark backheeler a la Denis Law for Man City v Man United!

I feel compelled to add my thanks and total admiration for Davie Reilly whom, I am informed, has made the very difficult decision to stop playing after tonight's game.



It's long been the expectation that the first ever Super League title was going to be fought out in the final staight by 'Port and Haws and so it has turned out.



#### TAYPORT IN THE FIFE CUP

#### PART 6



Season 1979/80 continued with a gap of six weeks before the quarter final match away to the top Fife amateur side of the era, Ballingry Rovers.

It was a tall order for Tayport and what made things worse was the fact that the game had been scheduled for Saturday 5th April in Ballingry. It was a major headache for the Taysiders as a trip to Belgium to play in an international tournament had been booked and paid for that weekend. Unbeaten Ballingry, probably sensing that Tayport's minds would be on other things, agreed to bring the match forward to the Thursday evening, April 3rd, with an early kick-off. With Tayport leaving at six o' clock the following morning, Rovers had every reason to be confident.

However, it didn't work out as planned and Tayport returned a 3-2 victory thanks to a magnificent performance. Raymond White, the goalscoring hero of the previous round, Gordon Hughes and Alex Reid were the scorers. Reid, a bit of a fancy dan, but a regular goalscorer nevertheless, had been recruited just prior to the signing deadline. His other claim to fame is that he appeared in the same Lochee United team as Dave Baikie and Mel Irons.

The Tayport team in that famous victory was - Ian Lyall,;Alan Hart, Ian Mathers, Bobby Wilson, Rab Downie; Alex Reid Jim Downie, Peter Cuthill; Ian Howe, Raymond White and Gordon Hughes. Subs were Kenny Smith and Peter Wilson.

The same team, without Mathers and J.Downie but with Stuart Davie and Doug Paterson added, was to perform with distinction 48 hours later in Belgium. It is interesting to recall that, as Tayport required to carry three sets of strips to compete in Belgium, the set they played with at Ballingry was washed, dried, ironed and packed in time for the 6 am start the next day - a mere 10 hours after the final whistle!

The win at Ballingry had taken Tayport into the semi-final v Eastbank, a Kirkcaldy League side, at Leven Juniors' ground.. Tayport were favourites and duly returned a 2-1 win with goals from Bobby Wilson and Ian Brown! It was Brown's first game since January and gave 'Port a place in the Fife Cup final at Central Park, Cowdenbeath against Strathmiglo United.

## FROM THE TAYPORT FC ARCHIVES AUGUST 1999

Not too far back but the league match with Lochee United on the Canniepairt on 21 August 1999 was the last time North End's quintet of former Tayport players, Fraser Mann, Sean Wilkie, Stevie Ross, Dave Reilly and manager Paul Reilly appeared together in a 'Port starting line-up.

There was a healthy attendance of 244 for Tayport's first home game of the season against a Lochee United side set to experience yet another false dawn.

Stevie Ross and DR netted 'Port's goals (how often has that phrase been repeated?!) in a 2-1 win for the locals.

Tayport's line-up was Fraser Mann, Grant Buist, Grant Paterson, Mark Spalding, Kenny Jones, Sean Wilkie, Paul Reilly, Steven Stewart, Stephen Ross, Dave Reilly and Graham Nicol; Appearing during the game as substitutes were Brian Craik (for Nicol), Keith Nicolson (Ross) and Mark Corcoran (Wilkie).

No real difficulty tracing their whereabouts after only just over three years. Buist, Spalding and Nicolson have retired, Nicol is with Lochore Welfare, Jones is at Violet and Corcoran is at Linlithgow, no doubt relishing his return to the Canniepairt next Saturday. Paterson, Stewart and Craik should be pulling on a Tayport shirt again this afternoon





#### **MEDIA WATCH**

Media coverage of Tayport FC these past few weeks has been more intense than ever. And, as the old saying goes - There's no such thing as bad publicity'.

The run up to the final was covered by most newspapers, the TV and radio. I think after the latest OVD Scottish Junior Cup win, that Tayport FC has finally become the best known junior club in the country at this time, eclipsing the likes of Pollok and Auchinleck which have long been regarded as *the* names in Junior football.

Even the broadsheets gave the game coverage, although it is clear that some so-called journalists have formed an opinion of Junior football before a ball is even kicked.

The Fife Herald's advertising spread a couple of weeks ago was a bit disappointing in that they cut down drastically on copy and photos supplied to them. They tried to make amends the following week but didn't really make a job of it. However, with a new editor (who is a football man, we understand), things could maybe get better.

The Courier built up the final well with a series of articles during the week, although the one on Bunter and his T-shirts surely warrants a report to the Press Complaints Commission. 


