



TODAY'S GAME

The punters look to be in line for an interesting game this afternoon. Visitors Arniston Rangers have recovered quickly from an indifferent start to the campaign and will see themselves well capable of taking away something from the Canniepairt this afternoon.

A share of the spoils with Glenrothes, victories over Carnoustie and Linlithgow, and then last week, by all accounts, they were very unlucky not to have taken something from the Hill of Beath game, losing by the only goal of the game.

It won't have escaped their notice that the home fans have yet to acclaim a Super League goal on the Canniepairt - well, at the right end anyway (sorry, Roberto!)

To get a result today, there's little doubt that Tayport will require to create more chances than in their last home outing and will look to strikers Craik, Evans and Mitchell to come up with the goods. Ralph Hunter has been plagued with a groin injury so the home fans are again likely to be denied a home debut for the big striker.

Arniston's recent performances have heartened their support and hopefully that will be reflected in the attendance today. Recent signing from Cowdenbeath, John Dickson, has settled well and was influential in the wins over Carnoustie and Linlithgow.

Keyvan Kerami has hit three of the Gorebridge side's goals to date and will require to be well watched, as will fellow striker, the veteran Dave Scally, who netted both goals against Linlithgow with well placed headers.

Best known of the Arniston players this afternoon will be Scott Nisbet

(right). The former Glasgow Rangers player's Ibrox career was cut short by injury and he was forced to retire from the game.

His comeback with the wee Rangers has gone well, with his experience a vital factor in the club's current run of good form.

With Tayport going into a two week break from the Super League, a win this afternoon would be very welcome.

TODAY'S VISITORS

ARNISTON RANGERS

We welcome Arniston Rangers and their supporters to the Cannie-pairt for the second time. The Gorebridge, Midlothian side's last visit was in the 5th round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup in 1997. Tayport were the victors that afternoon winning by the only goal of the game, scored by Dave Reilly, before a crowd of 807.

Grant Paterson, Allan Ramsay and Steven Stewart survive from the team that day and the trio were also in action when we met in 1998 in the 3rd round of the same competition, Tayport winning 4-1 on a snowbound Newbyres Park pitch in early December.

Arniston have been pretty consistent in recent years, always finishing in a fairly respectable league position, so it's no surprise that they qualified for the Super League, albeit by default after Whitburn's inexplicable decision not to participate.

Lothians clubs appeared somewhat lukewarm over the new set-up at the beginning, but they are definitely warming to it now. A comment on the web the other day from 'a Bathgate supporter' perhaps sums that up - "I've been pleasantly surprised by the Super League, as the games have been much more competitive than they were last season. I can't believe there were teams that didn't want to be part of this set-up. This shows huge lack of ambition".

Rangers are one of the oldest clubs in the country with a history that dates back to 1878. Despite this longevity, honours have been fairly sparse, particularly in recent years. Their last league championship was thirty years ago and, for cup success, we have to go back twenty one years for the last piece of silverware, when the Gorebridge lads lifted the East of Scotland Cup.

There looks to be a change on though, with manager Jimmy Crease and his assistant Brian McNaughton intent on getting some overdue success for the club.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Not football......but part 2 of a short series on Tayport taken from the town guide published in the early years of the 20th century

Tayport (Fifeshire).

GENERAL INFORMATION.

Population: 3,325. Early Closing Day: Wednesday. Distance from London: 435 miles.

With the exception of low-lying streets to the east of the town, the residential part of the burgh is of comparatively modern construction, and quite a goodly number of up-to-date villas, cottages, and terraces have been built by enterprising house-holders, the "sea" names of many of them denoting the havens of retired ship masters of whom there are not a few in the place. The main street runs through the town from the Station to the Cupar Road, and is composed for the most part of modern well-built shops and stores.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS AND PLACES OF WORSHIP. The Parish Church, one of the oldest buildings in

the district, is in Castle Street. It is a quaint edifice, with a square tower which has a slight "lean" to the main building. This feature made a local wit observe that "it was the only thing in the place with a leaning to the Church!" That, however, is not the case, for the good folks of Tayport are noted churchgoers, as the regular attendances at the services of the various places of worship

Erskine United Free Church is also in Castle Street, and though unpretentious in style is well-built and comfortable. Queen Street United Free Church bears the name of the street in which it stands. Its Gothic style gives that beauty of design which is so pleasing eye. The Episcopal Church is a sma a small but picturesque brick-built structure, and is situate in Cupar Road. The Brethren meet in a small hall in Brown's Wynd. The Salvation Army Headquarters are in Tay Street, and last and least in numbers the Baptists meet for worship in Mason's Hall, Broad

The Municipal Buildings, acquired some years ago, are situate in William Street, one of the rooms being devoted to a Subscription Library and Reading Room.

The Public School, which stands in Queen Street, facing William Street, is a large, commodious and handsome structure, and well adapted in every way nandsome structure, and was marked for Educational purposes. The Infants' Department is separated from the main building and is situated in William Street, on the site of the old Subscription School.

The Temperance Hall, which stands in Queen Street, is used largely for social gatherings



THE BAIKER'S BIT

Four players returned to the starting line-up last week at Oakley. Fitz-patrick, Peters, Ramsay and Evans all missed our home debacle with Glenrothes the previous weekend. This afternoon our visitors are Arniston Rangers and I'd like to take the opportunity to welcome them to Tayport. The last time Arniston were on the road, they returned from Carnoustie with a 4-2 victory.

They followed that up with a 2-1 win over Linlithgow and last week had a perfectly good goal disallowed to be denied a share of the points with league leaders Hill of Beath so I don't think we need much more reminding of what's required of us today. However I also know that we are well capable of achieving a win if our attitude and workrate is of the highest standards.

REVIEW by DUNMORE

The last fortnight has seen Tayport suffer their most disappointing Whyte & Mackay Super League result to date but recover to win their next match, and remain very much in touch with the leaders, in the upper echelons of the table.

Glenrothes visited the Canniepairt on deadline day, Saturday 31 August and, aided by a couple of lively new signings, recorded an unexpected 2-0 victory.

The first goal conceded by Tayport in the new league set-up was scored, ironically, by Roberto Morris, who turned the ball past stand-in keeper Graeme Finnan, midway through the firest half.

A few chances (too few) were passed up by the home side and the Glens later moved further ahead, when debut boy Martin Grant slammed in a scorching volley from the edge of the area, condemning the hosts to a first league defeat in ten months.

Victory at Oakley's Blairwood Park, therefore became imperative. Strikes early in each half proved to be enough to earn the three points, with Davie Evans, back in the squad following an eye infection, perhaps the key man. The nimble forward began by laying on the first goal for partner Brian Craik, then, in the 50th mniute, profited from Barry McNaughton's intrusion into Oakley territory, to double Tayport's tally.

Another player to return to the squad was regular goalkeeper Frazer Fitzpatrick, who maintained his own perfect defensive record, by chalking up his fourth clean sheet of the campaign.

And so to today's encounter with Arniston Rangers, who will be facing league chasmpions for the third consecutive Saturday. A narrow win versus Linlithgow, followed by a narrow reversal against Hill of Beath would suggest that the Gorebridge outfit will be capable of providing Tayport with a stern test this afternoon.







Changed Days Indeed!

Picked up this item from a 1913 newspaper reporting the local news from Windygates under the heading "Football Notes" - "The local football club intend going strong this year. More power to their elbows, or rather their knee joints. Some of their enthusiastic supporters are backing them to win three cups. It seems superfluous, however, to wish them more power in their knee joints, for on Saturday after a three point win to nothing, the (Windygates) Rangers gave an excellent concert in the Shepherds' Hall, at which a Glasgow company of artistes delighted a huge audience, and immediately after, the team stripped the light fantastic until nearly midnight."

FROM THE TAYPORT FC ARCHIVES 14th SEPTEMBER 1968

34 years ago in 1968 Tayport FC (then Tayport Amateur Football Club) put out two teams every week in the Midlands AFA, the 1st XI and the Alliance or 2nd XI.

It's interesting to note that all but a couple of the players (Newport and Gauldry) resided in Tayport. For many years the club ran three amateur sides and, from time to time, there were three pub teams playing on a Sunday as well. 34 years on, however, there are not enough locals to form even one team - Saturday or Sunday.

In 1968 both teams played in their respective second divisions and September 14th was a good day for the club, both sides recording 2-1 victories. For the first team it was to be a successful season, winning their way into Division One where the team was to stay for 25 years.


