TODAY'S GAME OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 2nd ROUND TAYPORT v COUPAR ANGUS

It's quite a historic occasion this afternoon, as it's the first ever competitive meeting between the two clubs. For thirteen seasons the teams have been avoiding each other.

The season Tayport were promoted, Coupar were relegated so there was never the opportunity for a league meeting and the sides have never been drawn together in a cup tie until today.

Apart from the luck of the draw, one of the reasons for lack of competition between the clubs has been Coupar's tendency to be eliminated at the early stages of most competitions in the interim.

We had to be drawn together sometime, however. Amazingly in 13 seasons of both being in the hat along with another 22 clubs in umpteen local competitions, we come out together when there are 128 clubs in the hat!

On paper the respective pedigrees are a mile apart but Coupar are a fairly settled team whose results suggest they are not far from putting in a promotion challenge. A heavy defeat by Hill of Beath in a recent Redwood Leisure cup tie was a blow but this experience will not have been lost on the Coupar management and we are bound to find the Foxhall club well organised and determined opponents this afternoon.

It's highly unlikely that the Coupar management team will be asking their troops to adopt a cavalier approach to this afternoon's game. It will certainly raise a few eyebrows if they do. It is likely that the game plan will be based on a sound defensive strategy and looking to hit on the break, taking full advantage of breakaways and free kick situations.

Tayport have been short of a few from the pool for several weeks through injury and Roberto Morris' suspension, and this situation has restricted the manager's selection options. Last week, for example, there were basically only a dozen or so fit players.

Long termers Derek Wemyss and Mark Craib are still out, of course, and Gareth Dailly is unlikely to be risked but Davie Evans should be ok this week and Ralph Hunter is getting ever closer to getting back into action. Ralph hasn't kicked a ball in anger since coming off at half-time in the opening game of the season. No wonder the Tayport physio room has been dubbed 'the Ralph Hunter Suite' by his cruel teammates.

Three 'Port Players in North/Tayside Squad for SJFA Trial Match

The SJFA have released the squads for the North/Tayside Select v the East/West Select trial match to be played at North End Park, Dundee on Sunday 17th November. Kick-off 2pm.

TODAY'S VISITORS COUPAR ANGUS

Founded in 1935, Coupar Angus Juniors halcyon period came shortly afterwards in the 1938/39 season when they carried all before them in the Angus Junior League. It was a success story not to be repeated to this day.

Another event never likely to be repeated was the attendance that season for the league decider against Kirrie Thistle when 4,000 fans squeezed into Foxhall Park. It's still the same Foxhall Park today but it's hard to imagine a 4,000 crowd ever being repeated

Coupar's most famous ex-player is Dundee FC, Spurs and Scotland legend Alan Gilzean, although Rangers keeper George Niven was another product of Foxhall Park.

Today the squad assembled by Dundee based management team of Derek Grier and Bob Brankin has been recruited, in the main, from the amateur ranks.

There will be a couple of familiar faces to 'Port fans, though. Strapping defender Billy McGregor played with Kirrie and another defenceman, Paul Jamieson, joined from North End. Keeper Jamie Clark played on the Canniepairt last season when he put up the shutters for Downfield in a league game.

Paul Cooney, one of the two Cooney brothers in the Coupar squad, had an eventful match against Lochee United earlier this season, missing a penalty kick then later being ordered off.

One of the best results of the season for Coupar to date was the Redwood Leisure Cup defeat of current Tayside Premier League leaders Broughty Athletic. Fancied Athletic went down 2-1 at Foxhall to goals from Neil Fleming and Andy Weir. Tayport should note that the PA reported 'this was no fluke'.

A visit to another Premier side, Kirrie Thistle, earlier this season saw Coupar force a creditable 2-2 draw in a league cup tie thanks to goals from Dave Cooney and Paul Jamieson.

Coupar's league season opened with a 1-2 defeat by strong going Scone Thistle but they got off the mark in their second fixture, beating Lochee Harp by 3-1 at Foxhall last Saturday when Paul Blackwood netted a double.


It is unfortunate then, that the encounter will be remembered more for the number of cards amassed, especially for the visitors, who would obviously have been better served by a full compliment of players.

MATCHDAY HOSPITALITY AT THE CANNIEPAIRT



A...B...C... a Tayport Football Club A -Z

Fourth of a series to be continued in forthcoming programmes.

L is for Lunches. Well before the advent of the Juniors and in advance of the second storey being added to the current pavilion, the committee would meet at the pavilion on Saturday morning to prepare for the game. Rather than pop home it became the habit to have a bite of lunch and, with one of the committee something of a culinary expert, this eventually extended to excellent three course lunches cooked on an old electric cooker situated in what is now the referee's room. Unfortunately one day something went wrong with the soup and it turned out lumpy. Being short of the normal kitchen utensils, there was no strainer to hand but our lads have always been innovative and one of the match socks was put to good use. It worked a treat. Indeed one of the players who had arrived early for the game unknowingly sampled the strained soup and declared it to be the best he had tasted. Little did he know it had been his sock that had been used!

M is for MIDLANDS AMATEURS. For fifty four years, from 1947 to 2001 Tayport FC graced the Midlands Amateur Football Association, the area's premier amateur football organisation. Like every club, Tayport had its ups and downs, but win or lose, there are generations of men who have fond memories of their days playing for Tayport in the Midlands, in particular the friendshps they forged and the trips to play away games.

Unlike their Junior successors, the amateurs didn't pick up too many honours. For many seasons in the fifties and sixties the team struggled in the nether regions of the league but from the seventies on, became a club to be respected and provided many players for the Association's representative team and picked up some silverware.

N is for NETS. Playing with goalnets in the amateur game in Dundee and district is a relatively. Not so many years ago nets in the amateur game were reserved for cup finals and the like.

When nets were a luxury, Tayport Amateurs used old fishing nets for goal nets on an occasional basis when, for example, a 'big' club came visiting the East Common in a North of Tay Cup tie. However from 1968 nets became standard equipment for Tayport in every game and eventually the club's proposal that all first team games be played with nets was adopted as a rule by the Midlands Association.

At Tayport, an assortment of nets, of various colours and designs, have been used over the years, culminating in the current style adopted three seasons ago



Gary Lamont and Bomber Harris were substitutes. 3-0 up at half time, 'Port netted through Hamish Mackay (3), Dave Reilly (2), Devine and Lamont. Ian Valentine got the United goal.

The Fife Herald said that 'The Fifers outplayed the visitors in all departments and the ever impressive Hamish Mackay grabbed the headlines again with another well taken hat-trick'

The Cumbernauld News and Chronicle described United as a team which was 'outplayed, outthought and toatlly overrun.' It went on to describe Tayport as 'a fine side, the best United have played against for a long time. They could go further than last season when they reached the quarter finals' The scribe was correct, of course, Tayport went to the final, losing 1-0 to Glenafton Athletic.
