

TODAY'S GAME WHYTE and MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE TAYPORT v DUNDEE NORTH END

North End have struggled since the start of the season, with team selections hampered by injuries and unavailabilities. Manager Paul Reilly, the former Tayport defender, has not had his troubles to seek. There were a number of transfers out of experienced players during the close season and the replacements perhaps haven't quite adjusted to the pace of the Super League.

The Dundee side are staring up at the rest of the league and even the staunchest Dokens' fan must surely be fearing the worst. A haul of seven points and nine goals from the first half of the season is relegation form, given that Carnoustie were relegated with 26 points last season.

Still, statistics like that will not be foremost in the minds of the North End party today. They'd be happy to go down with a smile on their faces if they could have Tayport's scalp on their belts. Putting one over Tayport is the all the motivation North End require this afternoon.

It's that determination to cause an upset and capture Monday's headlines in the Evening Telegraph that will drive the Dokens on today, hopefully providing at the same time some entertainment for the fans.

The clubs, of course, had contrasting fortunes last Saturday. Whilst Tayport were running riot before a near five hundred attendance at Rob Roy, the Dundee club were surrendering all three points to Oakley United, losing 1-4 before a handful of fans at North End Park.

Dokens' keeper Andy Stewart was ordered off after conceding a penalty kick in the line of duty against Oakley and the loss of their talented No.1 allowed the Fife club to open their account and take control. It was a decision that had North End supremo John Reilly seething.

the former SJFA President had a go at the man in the middle. According to *The Courier*, the decision to send off Stewart was described by JR as 'absolutely shocking'. Stewart, though, can play today.

Dave Reilly, the Tayport legend of the 1990s, had announced his retirement at the end of last season, but such have been the personnel problems at North End that DR has been persuaded to return and has been pretty much a regular this season. Another former Tayport star, Sean Wilkie, has missed much of the season through injury and this hasn't helped the Dokens' cause. Yet another former 'Port legend, although from the club's amateur days, Gus Malone, was brought in from Carnoustie earlier this season to add defensive stability to the North End line-up but injury has seen the veteran miss out on recent games and there are question marks as to whether he will recover sufficiently to help the cause.

Tayport reverted last week to virtually the side which lifted the cup - Ramsay for Mitchell being the only change from the Firhill line-up - but it remains to be seen whether Manager Baikie will make changes. Ralph Hunter is still out injured but those others who missed out at Adamslie Park will come into contention for a place if the manager decides to change things around.

There will be one definite change. John Ward is suspended. The big defender received a one match ban following an alleged post match comment to the referee at the conclusion of the Bonnyrigg game. Derek Wemyss looks the most likely replacement.

It's a big game for both sides and the fans this afternoon should be the winners.

Pick of the press this week was the **Sunday Mail** photograph and report on the 5-1 Scottish Cup win at Rob Roy which is featured elsewhere in today's programme.

Friday's **Courier** told us that Lochee United's swapped their usual rigorous Thursday training to take it easy, enjoying the leisure facilities of a local hotel. After being dumped out of the Scottish Cup two days later, they won't be trying that again!

The *Fife Herald* in their match preview, quoted Dave Baikie as expecting Rob Roy to engage a similar game plan as they had employed at the Canniepairt, attempting to frustrate 'Port. Spot-on. A guy on the *Scottish Juniors e-group* later criticised Rob Roy boss for attempting to do exactly that.

Rob Roy boss Mick Oliver used the columns of the *Kirkintilloch Herald* to issue a plea for the locals to turn out in force for the replay and get behind their team.

Third Round Results

FROM THE ARCHIVES

15 YEARS AGO 17th DECEMBER 1988

As 1988 drew to a close, Cumnock were on the way to lifting the Scottish Junior Cup, having taken the scalps of Forfar West End and Jeanfield Swifts in the 2nd and 3rd rounds respectively.

North End were having one of their best seasons in the Scottish Cup, reaching the last 16 only to go out by the only goal of the game at Kilbirnie.

The Tayside scene was being dominated by Downfield and Forfar West End. The only regional competition involving Tayside clubs, the North/Tayside Cup, was in its inaugural year. It would be Deveronside's cup that season, the one and only occasion on which a North side has lifted the trophy to date.

At Tayport the club was still a season and a half away from Junior status and was running two amateur teams, the first team in the Midlands Amateurs and the second string in the East Fife Amateurs.

On 17th December the Midlands XI was three games in to an eleven game unbeaten run. The following team accounted for Hillside Boys' Club by 4-2 on the Canniepairt - Paul Hunt; Davie Blair, Micky McPherson, Alan Hart, Steve Rollo, Gordon Ogilvie, Neil Clark, Gibby Valentine, Bruce Burnett, Jimmy Anderson, and Andy Heggie. Paul Thackeray and Bryan Fitchet were the substitutes. Heggie (3) and Ogilvie were the scorers.

According to the archives it was a fine day weather-wise. The match summary reported "dreadful start with the loss of a first minute goal but got things together thereafter to take both points against poor opposition"

In contrast to the 1st XI, the Fife XI were struggling and, on the back of eleven successive defeats, failed to get a side down to Methil to play a league match against Brig United and thus lost the points. Two players called off in the morning, another two didn't finish their work in time for the early kick-off and another failed to put in an appearance. Failing to raise a side was a rare occurence for the club.

Incredibly Tayport used 81 players in their 39 Fife XI fixtures that season.

Only one player, Lyall Clark, made more than 20 appearances and Andy Heggie and John Fernie were joint top scorers with six goals each.

Among the 81 who turned out that season were several familiar names such as Kenny Cameron, Grant McLean, Ian Howe, Ian Mathers, Kenny Smith, Stuart Davie, Abby Oswald and current St Andrews United manager Colin Downie. In fact if you lived within a couple of miles of the park and had a pair of boots, you probably featured that season!

Gareth Dailly made it four nil by the half hour. The remainder of the match was somewhat predictable. The Rabs were reduced to ten men, but worked hard in the second half, forcing a consolation goal in the final minute.

All that seemed to do, though, was provoke a reaction from the visitors, who netted again, through Kevin Heenan, who now goes top of the Tayport goalscoring chart.

Ironically, Kirkintilloch's best chance of causing an upset had been on the Canniepairt. The venue will hold no such fears for today's opponets, however. North End are well used to trips across the Tay and will be utterly determined to pick up the points. Despite being at the bottom of the table, the Dokens represent a real challenge.


