"Super League thoughts on the back-burner as today's teams go for OVD glory"

Today's OVD Scottish Cup clash is, undoubtedly, Tayport's biggest game of the year, thus far. Not that there has been a great deal of competition. 2004 began with a friendly fixture, at RAF Leuchars, against Coupar Angus, which 'Port won by the expected comfortable margin.

There was a similar rout last Saturday, when the competitive action got underway. Bankfoot Athletic were the opposition for a Findlay Cup-tie on the Canniepairt and the hosts eased to a 7-1 win. Gareth Dailly, Barry McNaughton and Ben Honeyman all netted in the first half, as did Bankfoot's Derek Sturgeon, who provided his side's consolation goal on the half-time whistle.

The visitors still had 45 minutes of Tayport pressure to endure and were power-less to prevent Steven Stewart from helping himself to a brace of goals after the interval. Honeyman also completed a double, with the scoring being rounded off in farcical fashion by the unfortunate Perthshire men, who contrived to score a somewhat ridiculous own goal.

No such gifts either side of Christmas, however, as Dave Baikie's troops had to work extremely hard to clinch maximum Whyte & Mackay East Super League points on consecutive Saturdays. North End visited on the 20th December and it took a slightly fortuitous goal from Steven Stewart to finally break down the Dokens' defence. During the second half, the skipper guided Ross Gunnion's right wing cross goalwards and the ball eluded the visiting keeper and crept over the line, off the post. The inevitable complaints from the North End players were, thankfully, waved away.

The following weekend there was again no margin for error, and another solitary late strike was enough to clinch victory. Again Steven Stewart was the hero, just when hosts Oakley looked like earning a goalless draw. Only a few minutes remained when Stewart gathered possession, around thirty yards out and the midfielder connected beautifully with his left foot. On such occasions the back of the net is a regular destination for the speeding football, and this was certainly the case at Blairwood Park. Keeper Brian Potter was helpless as the shot flew into the top corner, for a goal which, fittingly, sent Tayport to the top of the league.

Today's visitors, Arniston Rangers, have the Canniepairt outfit in their sights, though, with a couple of games in hand. However, thoughts of the title race will be very much on the back-burner this afternoon. A place in the last sixteen of the "Scottish" is the priority and both teams are well capable of securing that berth. An entertaining contest is very much on the cards.



TODAY'S GAME

The notoriously noisy Arnie Army will have been flexing their vocal cords in anticipation of this afternoon's tie (why is it always the away fans who are the more vocal in big Junior matches?). They certainly look like having something to shout about with today's tie rightly billed as the tie of the round.

This is the sixth meeting of the sides, the third in the Scottish Cup, and those who can recall the previous five meetings between today's combatants, will agree that if today's fare is up to the standard of that dished up previously, then we are in for an exciting afternoon.

Since that first meeting back in the 1996/97 5th round, our visitors today have undergone a complete change of personnel, but Tayport still have four of that side in today's squad—Grant Buist, Allan Ramsay, Grant Paterson and Steven Stewart. A goal from the prolific Dave Reilly edged Tayport into the quarter finals en route to a second successive OVD final that February afternoon.

Arniston are having their best season for some time and some of their performances this season have had their fans waxing lyrical, the 4-1 first round thumping of short-priced West Super League side Arthurlie, springs to mind. The one real blemish on their record this season, to date, was the 3-4 home defeat by Rosyth Recreation in the Heinekin Fife & Lothians Cup. The Arnie lads, by all accounts, took their opponents too lightly and paid the penalty.

No chance of that this afternoon. Arniston are aware they threw away the points when Tayport returned from Newbyres Park with a 2-1 win back in September, and will thus be intent on gaining some revenge today.

Unavailable for selection for the visitors this afternoon are defender Colin Inglis and seven goal Darren Pryde. Both players were suspended earlier this week for ordering off offences in the last round against Johnstone Burgh.

The loss of these players should not prove much of a handicap for the Lothians team who tend to shuffle their pack from week to week anyway. They will, however, be wanting to see big Scott Nisbet back in the side today. The big former Glasgow Rangers player who sat out last week's cup-tie wim against West Calder is a significant influence on the team. His aerial ability is always a threat, particularly when getting on the end of teammate Colin Nicol's prodigious shies.

Tayport look to have a full pool available although Ralph Hunter, who has been out with a leg injury and Kevin Heenan, out of match action with a broken nose, could be a bit short of match practice.

This afternoon's referee is Mr Willie Gilfillan from west Fife whom fans will recall was assistant at last season's OVD Cup Final. His assistants are also from the Fife Association.

This is Tayport's 90th Scottish Junior Cup tie and for Paterson, Stewart and Ramsay, it's 83, 56 and 54 ties respectively. A lot of experience there!



FROM THE ARBINES

Whilst the fortunes of Tayport Football Club were at a low ebb in the 1950s and 1960s, not so the fortunes of Dundee FC. These were glory days for the Dens Park Club and there was a great interest in Dundee FC in Tayport. Sufficient interest, indeed, to see the formation of a Dundee FC Supporters' Club in the town in the early 1950s. Around 1953, fans flocked to Dens to see the likes of Billy Steel, Bobby Flavell, Doug Cowie and Tommy Gallacher turn out for the Dark Blues.

The Tayport Branch of The Dundee FC Supporters' Club had a vibrant membership which regularly ran buses to away matches. A glance at the books of the club shows that it was a well run and financially healthy organisation. There were weekly sweepies which brought in regular income. For example, Tom Bryson, a current season ticket holder here at the Cannicpairt, brought in weekly donations of around £22 to the Supporters Club. A lot of money 50 years ago.

Donations from the funds were regularly made to needy causes including the Hungarian Relief Fund in 1956 and £10:10/- to the Broughty Ferry Lifeboat Disaster in 1959.

It was a popular away day for the ladies, too. They visited the shops whilst the men folk took in the football. The club even ran a bus on New Years Day1957 to Pittodrie for the Aberdeen 2 Dundee I game at a cost of only £2:1/-.

One of the highlights of the Supporters Club year was the annual bus drives to places like Dunbar and Stonehaven, which were held at the end of the season. And, of course, the trips to Wembley for England v Scotland game every two years during the 1960s. Such trips were the source of many a tale. On one occasion the bus was in a crash which made the headlines in the Sunday papers the next day. And legend would have it that Angus Barbieri, a rather rotund member of the party, couldn't squeeze through the Wembley turnstile thus necessitating the opening of the big gates to allow access to the stadium. Incidentally the cost of the bus for the 1963 game (England 1 Jim Baxter 2) was £119:17:6d.

There would have been some memorable trips during the life of the club. The 13 year old lads on the trip to Tynecastle on 27th February 1965, for example, will never forget Dundee's stunning 7-1 win that day over Hearts. Similarly those who witnessed some thrilling games as Dundee won the 1961-62 Championship, the highlight, of course, being amongst the 26,500 at Muirton Park on 28th April for the 3-0 win which clinched the title. The cost the bus to Perth that day was £1:14/-.

Dundee FC won their last seven games on the run-in to the title and therein lies a connection with Tayport FC. One of the seven games was a 1-0 win over Hibs and the scorer of the only

goal was Bobby Waddell, subsequently a player and manager during the amateur days and a committee member after the club went Junjor.

A further connection with the Tayport DFCSC and the current club? Who else but the ubiquitous Andy Phin, of course, who was a fully paid up member in 1968/69.





MEDIAMATTERS

The *Daily Record's* Wednesday '*Sportsweek'*' pull-out from this week expanded their Junior coverage to two pages and this week's edition brought the club unprecedented national newspaper coverage with a feature on Kevin Heenan. A full page photo on the front page and another full page photo on the Junior pages along with accompanying text. The Record is anxious to develop its Junior coverage and consult with Junior followers. 'If you think the Junior coverage is poor, then do something about it and get your opinions in to the Record', the newspaper says.

The *Fife Herald's* new editor has been as good as his word. On his appointment as the first editor of both the Herald and *St Andrews Citizen*, he promised to give Tayport FC a higher profile in his publications and he's delivered.

The Sunday Mail, like its weekday stablemate, the Daily Record, has improved its coverage but has been badly let down by its distributors. The editions on sale in Dundee and Tayport last week carried no Junior coverage whatsoever, Highland League football taking its place. Not too many Wick Academy fans in this neck of the woods to appreciate the coverage.

This, despite the Mail sending a photographer to Thomson Park and getting their man in Dundee to file a 300 word report on Lochee United v Oakley United. That's all fine and well if you're a Bluebells fan who lives in High Street, Lumphinnans or Grassmarket, Edinburgh. Unfortunately most of the Lochee faithful reside a bit closer to High Street Lochee.

The *Perthshire Advertiser* provides an excellent service to Junior followers in and around the Fair City, with extensive coverage on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The Tayport v Coupar Angus friendly which heralded the New Year was the subject of a fairly lengthy report. The PA continued with an article on Kinnoull's ambitions. Scott Brown, the Kinnoull boss was quoted as saying that the Tulloch Park club chairman and committee have made no secret that Super League football is their ambition. Brown continued '...if commitment has anything to do with making this dream come true, there's no shortage of that from the Tulloch Park committee room'. Kinnoull, the PA reports, are starting to get things together and two players playing a significant role with the Perth club are Tayport farm-outs Robbie Holden and keeper Duncan Bruce. Robbie is regularly amongst the goals and Duncan's performances have been outstanding according to the newspaper.

The Courier still can't come to terms with the fact that there is no longer a Tayside or Fife JFA and we're now all East Region JFA. Despite Tayport receiving a civic reception from Fife Council last year, according to The Courier, after Kelty went out of the Scottish Cup, there were only three Fife clubs - Haws, Lochgelly and Glens - left to contest the fourth round.

In the *Edinburgh Evening News* this week Edinburgh United boss Jimmy McLaughlan slammed the referee for awarding Bathgate a controversial injury time penalty which brought them level in the sides' Brown Cup-tie and gave the Creamery Park club the opportunity to win the penalty shoot-out. Even Bathgate official Bert Leslie was quoted as saying that Edinburgh were harshly done by.

Since moving to Raith Rovers, Davie Evans, Tayport's top scorer over the past two seasons, has had something of a lean time but he was back in the team the other week for the win over Falkirk, receiving rave notices from the *Fife Free Press's* reporter who gave him 8/10 in the match ratings.




