

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP TAYPORT v FORTH WANDERERS

Rarely can there have been a more intriguing game on the Canniepairt than this afternoon's OVD Scottish Junior Cup 5th Round tie against Forth Wanderers. It's got fairytale potential. Forth, heading fast towards oblivion when current team boss exCeltic man John Clifford took over in 2000, versus the Cup holders. It's Super League Champs versus a team which finished last season in the wilderness of the Central second division. Even when the cup was drawn back in the autumn 2003, the teams were at the opposite end of the spectrum. Tayport, amongst the favourites, Forth amongst the clutch of 500/1 outsiders. However, football being the game it is, we find both clubs one game away from the quarter finals of one of the world's oldest football competitions.

Forth Wanderers are on a roll and have emerged as real candidates to cause a cup upset. Their recent form has been excellent. They arrive here on the back of a ten game unbeaten run and are unbeaten at four Scottish Cup opponents' grounds already this season, with wins at Greenock, Annbank and Yoker and a draw at Dunipace. So, any thoughts that it's their notorious pitch at Kingshill Park which pulls them through can be put out of the mind.

Each side has two survivors from the last time the clubs met at Canniepairt in 1994, Forth have keeper Alan Colquhoun and Crawford Wright while Tayport have Grant Paterson and Steven Stewart. Colquhoun, it will be recalled, was the Shotts Bon Accord keeper who denied 'Port the last time we lost an OVD tie on an opponents' ground, back in 2000.


The former Glenafton player, veteran No.7 Neil Rowatt, will again be a key man for the Lanarkshire side who could give Darren Sneddon and John McNulty starting berths. Both have warmed the bench these last two weeks. Forth have never failed to score in their eight game run to this stage of the competition and the men they will be looking to continue that run and add to their fifteen goals will be six goal Kris Jarvie and his strike partner Vinnie Weightman, who has three goals to his name.

With the same line-up named in successive weeks, the odds are Dave Baikie will make changes today. Allan Ramsay and Sean Christie, both of whom came on as substitutes last week, Gareth Dailly, Ross Gunnion and Ben Honeyman will all be looking for a starting place. John Elliott, just back in training, won't be fit.

It's the same referee as last week, Mr Finnie from Edinburgh but it's different assistants, Mr McGeachie and Mr Watson.

Today's tie has to be played to a finish, with extra time and penalty kicks if necessary.

With stakes so high, spectators can expect both teams to give their all this afternoon and an exciting contest can therefore be anticipated.

Media matters

The cup-tie against Arniston prompted unprecedented national newspaper coverage, outwith Scottish Junior Cup finals, for Tayport. The *Edinburgh Evening News* had full page features, illustrated with large action photos of Scott Peters and Barry McNaughton. The back page of the *Daily Record's* 'Winner' pull-out also had a full page colour illustrated feature and *The Sun's* leading Junior story on Monday 26th January was of Tayport's win, supported with two photos, one of which was of Barry firing home the winning goal.

The *Daily Record* must be commended for the effort put into its Junior coverage. Monday's 'Winner' pull-out had a cracking photo of Dundee referee Bill Hornby flashing a red card at a clearly unbelieving Roddy Grant, one of five Linlithgow Rose players who were given red cards—four during the 4-1 defeat by Hill of Beath and one after the game. Forth v Tayport was reported in the Record by a relatively new name in sports journalism, Carnoustie Panmure's Scott Kopel. The report was accompanied by a photo of Barry McNaughton and his skipper Steven Stewart having a cuddle following Barry's goal.

Wednesday's edition of the *Daily Record*, devotes a couple of pages to the Junior game in its 'Sportsweek' pull-out, which is published in five regional editions. There was a big splash on Kevin Heenan a few weeks ago and this week there was a two page colour feature on Tayport's Scott Peters which no doubt raised a few chuckles amongst his team-mates.

With bad weather ruling out competitive action in mid January, the *Fife Herald* still managed to provide 'Port with the back page headline announcing, "Port's legendary striker returns to Canniepairt" It referred, of course, to the return to Tayport of Dave Reilly who re-signed for the club after being released by North End.

The *St Andrews Citizen*, stablemate of the *Fife Herald*, as well as reporting on the fortunes of St Andrews United, has this season carried a report on Tayport matches. The respective match reports, which normally contrast greatly in style, on next Saturday's Redwood Leisure tie, should make for interesting reading.

Once again there was no contest between the *Sunday Mail* and *Sunday Post* for Junior coverage last weekend. The Mail had six match reports, a photograph and League tables. In comparison, The Post's coverage was pitiful and clearly needs to be revamped.

The *Lanark Gazette* did its bit to rally the Forth area troops for last Saturday's tie. The back page carried a preview, in which Wanderers boss John Clifford stressed the importance of a good home crowd saying 'Tayport will not for one minute like coming here....we are full of confidence'.

The *Glasgow Evening Times* did a fairly sizeable piece in last Wednesday's edition on today's game. Said boss Clifford "People will be writing us off at their peril...the never-say-die spirit in our dressing room might just see us come through....possibly we were in awe of Tayport's reputation as cup holders....I detect a lot less apprehension around now that we've seen them for ourselves at close quarters....this one could go all the way to extra time and penalties, that's why I'll be putting in some spot kick practice at tonight's training session"

TODAY'S VISITORS

FORTH WANDERERS

It's happy 100th birthday to our visitors to the Canniepairt this afternoon. It's exactly a century since the Lanarkshire club was founded. How appropriate, then, that Forth should be making such an unexpected splash in the Scottish Junior Cup. Football has a funny way of coming up with uncanny coincidences and Wanderers' run in their centenary year is something which no one at Kingshill Park would have dared predict as another season in the West Region's basement division got underway in August.

Forth were celebrating their 90th anniversary season when they first visited the Canniepairt ten years ago, going down 4-0 to 'Port after a 1-1 draw at Kingshill Park in a first round tie.

Such was the rundown state of Kingsmill Park, Forth last week, that it was probably hard to imagine that Scotland and Rangers legend Willie Waddell once graced the Kingshill turf as did former Scotland keeper George Woods, in more recent times It's because of problems with their ground that Forth were forced to play away from home from time to time and in 1999 played Scottish Cup ties at Lesmahagow's Craighead Park

However, it's relatively recently that the Forth ground was populated by its record crowd when 2,324 squeezed in to see a Scottish Junior Cup quarter final win against East Kilbride Thistle. That was in 1981 when Forth were unlucky not to reach the final. Pollok, who went on to beat Arthurlie 1-0 in the Hampden final that season, beat Forth 1-0 in a replay following a 2-2 draw.

Despite having a proud tradition of Junior football for 100 years, Forth have had relatively little success. When members of the Lanarkshire League, there were local cup wins in 1914, 1947, 1948 and 1960 and a Lanarkshire Championship in 1966. Since becoming part of the Central JFA, Forth won the Division One flag in 1980 and collected the Central League Cup, their last piece of silverware, in 1985.

The current cup run is without doubt the highlight of the last ten years which have, without exception, been spent in the lower divisions. It might all have been different, however, if in 1993, Forth hadn't missed out on promotion to the Central Premier Division by a miserly two goals. Level on points with Larkhall Thistle, Forth's goal difference was inferior by two. From there on, it was invariably a lowly league placing until they finally succumbed and were relegated to the bottom division in 1999 where they have stayed since.

Things have picked up this season however and the current run of ten games unbeaten is the best for many, many seasons. It's a rich vein of form which has caught the imagination of the locals and our visitors today can expect to have their biggest away following for some time.

Today's fifth round replay will be Tayport's first competitive match on the Canniepairt since the goalless draw against Arniston Rangers, in the previous round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup.

That clash perhaps didn't quite live up to it's 'Match of the Day' billing, although there was no denying the quality on show. So closely matched were the sides, that a single goal always looked like settling the tie, and it eventually came with just ten minutes of the Newbyres Park replay remaining.

Barry McNaughton was, of course, the hero, slotting home Kevin Heenan's low cross, to finally silence the famous Arnie choir.

That goal set up the tie against Forth, with McNaughton again on the scoresheet. His counter, coupled with the dismissal of the home team's Jim Gallacher, seemed to provide a steady platform on which to build a victory last weekend.

The determination of the hosts, the poor state of the playing surface and ill-fortune, however, all ensured that events would not go according to plan.

Grant Paterson's own goal put Forth back on level terms and brought about this afternoon's decisive contest. To be part of this year's quarter final line-up will be a huge incentive, for both camps. The 'Port support will be hoping for a similar result to the one recorded in Portlethan, a fortnight ago when Tayport ran out 5-1 winners against locals Parkvale. A brace from Ralph Hunter and singles from Brian Craik, Scott Peters and Kevin Heenan provided a smooth passage into the quarters of the NCR Trophy, with a 'Vale goal and a late snowstorm, being the only negatives of the trip north.

THE ROAD TO ROUND FIVE

ROUND ONE

Tayport receive a bye and miss out on a 1st round tie in defence of their title. At Greenock, Forth with ten new signings this season, cause an upset with a 1-0 win, **Craig Campbell** grabbing the vital goal in the 89th minute.

ROUND TWO

Wilson's XI from Aberdeen are no match for Tayport on the Canniepairt, going down 4-0 thanks to doubles from **Hunter** and **Heenan**.

Forth lead 2-0 at half-time through **Weightman** and **McNulty**, but Annbank score twice in the last 15 mins to force a replay in Ayrshire. No problems second time round for Forth who win 3-1 with goals from **Kris Jarvie** (2) and a **Neil Rowatt** penalty kick.

ROUND THREE

Tayport fail to sparkle and are held to a goalless draw on the Canniepairt by Kirkintilloch Rob Roy. Manager Baikie rings the changes for the replay and is rewarded by a devastating performance. Four goals in short period midway through the first half ends the Rob Roy challenge. Morris, McNaughton, Peters, Dailly and Heenan score goals of the highest quality.

Forth draw Yoker at home and are held 2-2 (**Jarvie** and **Rowatt**). The press write off Forth . but again the Lanarkshire lads silence the doubters with a 3-1 win at Yoker through goals from **Jarvie**, **Ward** and **Weightman**.

ROUND FOUR

Tayport are again drawn at home and it's billed as the tie of the round when fellow Whyte & Mackay Super League contenders Arniston Rangers come calling. It's an exciting tie but ends goalless. The replay at Gorebridge looks to be heading the same way until Barry McNaughton converts a cross from Kevin Heenan for the only goal in 83 minutes.

Forth are drawn away to Dunipace, who are a division above then in the Abercorn Central League. Wanderers perform creditably at Denny and, although falling behind, equalise with a **Neil Rowatt** header to take the tie back to Kingshill Park. The replay is delayed by a snowstorm but any thoughts of an abandonment are dispelled when the sun comes out. Said Forth gaffer John Clifford, "I could tell Dunipace players were freezing and didn't want the game to go continue, so I just told my players to keep going" This they did, and went through to round five for the first time for almost 25 years with a 2-0 win, goals coming from **Jarvie** and **Weightman**.

OVOSCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP REVIEWED

What an incredible afternoon it was for the OVD Cup last Saturday. A series of spectacular defeats blew the tournament wide open and come half past four there was the realisation that, with most of the 'big guns' out, it could well be the year of the underdog.

Out went Linlithgow Rose. Finalists for the last two years, beaten 4-1 at Hill of Beath. The Rose had invested heavily in an attempt to repeat their 2002 success and wrest the cup and Whyte & Mackay Super Leaguefrom Tayport's grasp, but found bottom of the Super League Haws too hot to handle. Linlithgow, however, pressed the self destruct button and finished the game with seven men. Referee Bill Hornby from Dundee was at the centre of the controversy but, by all accounts, he didn't get too much wrong.

Out went Glenafton Athletic. To go to New Cumnock and win a fifth round OVD tie is a tremendous result, particularly when you've only notched up one league win in fourteen attempts and are firmly fixed in the relegation zone., but that's what Glenrothes managed. Suddenly memories of 1968 and 1975 come flooding back to the New Town now that there is a realisation that they are but two games away from the final.

Out went Kilwinning Rangers. Relegation was supposed to have taken the edge off Carnoustie Panmure's game and a lengthy wait to play Blantyre should have found them rusty. Not a bit of it! The Gowfers surprised many by the quality of their play and put another nail in the Ayrshire's OVD Cup coffin. Prolific marksman Ralph Brand showed that he can get goals against the top sides as well as against weaker teams that he has been facing regularly in the district league.

Out went Maryhill. Last season's semi-finalists were again well tipped but went the same way as Pollok in an earlier round when they lost out to Jamie McCarroll's free kick for Cambuslang Rangers. Two significant scalps for the wee Gers

Into the frame come Sauchie, regarded by many as the dark horses of this season's competition. Their 3-1 win at home to Rutherglen Glencairn wasn't without controversy, with the Glens fans feeling they wuz robbed. After Sauchie had gone ahead, Glens quickly equalised through Scott Smith but were immediately reduced to ten men when teammate Ross Donaldson was ordered off, apparently on the say-so of a referee assistant for gestures to the crowd during the goal celebrations. The handicap of being down to ten men ultimately cost then dearly and the hosts ran out fairly comfortable winners.

.....and that leaves three places to be settled today.

Around 900 were attracted to the Lothians derby between **Newtongrange Star** and **Musselburgh Athletic** which ended in a goalless stalemate. Pre-match entertainment was provided by the Nitten pipe band and that, apparently, was the sum total of the day's entertainment. Also having to settle matters today are **Kilsyth Rangers** and **Kilbirnie Ladeside** who drew 1-1 in Ayrshire last week, the home side getting what was described as a dubious equaliser. Regardless of which team goes through, it would mean that the West Super League Premier and First Divisions, effectively the cream of the Ayrshire and Central Junior clubs, would have only one representative in the last eight—probably for the first time in the competition's 118 year history.

The balance of power in the Junior game -on the field at least– has swung to the East, a huge boost to the new East Region restructure and to sponsors Whyte & Mackay who have backed the change. The draw for the quarter finals will be made on Scotsport between 5pm and 6pm tomorrow.



OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 1st round FORTH WANDERERS v TAYPORT

It was almost ten years ago when today's opponents last met, when drawn together in the 1st round of the 1994/95 competition.

The first game was drawn 1-1 at Kingshill Park on 15th October 1994. Before a reported crowd of 222 in damp and misty conditions, Tayport took the lead through Dave Reilly in 37 minutes but Pat Daly levelled for the Central League side eight minutes after half-time. According to the records, Tayport started well but faded badly after the break and were probably lucky to survive.

The following week the teams locked horns once more at a very misty Canniepairt, this time before an attendance of 353. Tayport made only one change, Gary Maher coming in for Steven Stewart in midfield. Tayport ran out 4-0 winners with goals from Hamish Mackay (2), Dave Reilly and Jimmy Hunter.

The archives record that Hamish was in impressive form with two goals, an assist and an effort which came off the bar while Jimmy Hunter's goal was piledriver. A goal ahead at half-time, once Tayport got No.2, it was all over, according to the report. The Forth fans must have been a hungry lot, as the pie shop sold out of pies and bridies. The programmes also sold out.

Dundee FC Supporters' Club Memories

The archive article in the last Port Prog on the DFC SC rekindled a few memories and Tayport committee member Tom Borland recalls his days with the club.

The club was funded by a weekly sweepstake (Sunday Post Pontoon). The payment, 1/- per week, was collected by Mrs Forbes from Banknowe who called for the money every Friday. When trips were organised, it was usually to smaller grounds like Love Street, Rugby Park, Firhill or Central Park and on the odd occasion it was Tynecastle. The bus was usually a 45 seater which cost members 2/- (10p) each.

Of the 45 who usually travelled, five men (Jack Mathers, Arthur Cooper, Charlie Cooper, Peter Harley and Tom Borland went to the game and 39 women and Jackie Cooper went shopping! On the return journey, if Milnathort was en route, the bus would stop for a fish supper then an hour at a local hostelry. There was always a sing song which carried on to the bus and all the way home.

Tom adds, what he describes as a piece of useless information, and who are we to argue, when he recalls that, on one trip to Tynecastle in 1966, his mother-in-law, as usual skipped the football to go shopping in downtown Edinburgh and took the opportunity to purchase her outfit for Tom's wedding.
