



FAVOURITES Tayport are still on course for another OVD cup triumph after seeing off the last hope from the West of Scotland.

The Taysiders' early pressure was repelled by ex-Well defender Brian Martin. But Cambuslang almost took the lead in five minutes when a William Galloway piledriver was parried by Fraser Fitzpatrick and Derek Carmichael's shot on the rebound struck the post.

The Wee Gers threatened again but Carmichael's drive went over.

The goal came in 15 minutes when the lively Sean Christie crossed for Barry McNaughton to drive past Craig Rowan from 18 yards – with the keeper appearing to think the ball was going past.

ball was going past. Cambuslang fought back and Paul Burns forced Fitzpatrick into a save

from 18 yards.

But the Glasgow side found it difficult to sustain attacks against the experienced Tayport defence where Scott Peters and John Ward were prominent.

In 35 minutes Galloway put Paul Brown through but the big striker was foiled by Fitzpatrick coming quickly off his line.

Tayport suffered a set-back in 40 minutes when Christie was forced to limp off and he was replaced by Ralph Hunter.

By half-time the crowd swelled to around 1,500, Cambuslang's biggest gate for a decade.

In 46 minutes Fitzpatrick had the save of the game from Paul Burns' drive.

Hunter brought Tayport back in 50 minutes but his long-range effort sailed over.

Fitzpatrick was in great form and was at his best in 55 minutes when he cut out a dangerous free-kick from James Coulter.

EAST OR WEST, WHO'S BEST?

In his column in the (Glasgow) Evening Times last week, Junior Scotland team boss Jim O'Donnell previewed the Cambuslang v Tayport game, pointing out that 'Lang were the last surviving West club in the competition. Was the power base of the Junior game moving east, questioned Jim.

"The very thought provokes widespread horror on this side of the country, said Jim in his column and, even if Rangers were to fall to 'Port, leaving an all-east semi-final, could this really be construed as compelling evidence of the in-roads made by forming the East Super Leagues? "Sorry", said Jim, "got to be a few more seasons of similar imbalance for that to be believed" he added.

Of course, he's right, time will tell. Nevertheless things are changing and the domination of the Junior game by the West is now history. Is it just a coincidence that the first all-east last four in 117 years is hard on the heels of establishment of the Whyte & Mackay East Superleague?

Which takes us on to the 2004 Final. With an all-East final, the oft uttered cry this week, has been "Surely it will not be at Firhill". Well, there has been no indication to the contrary, with the suggestion that there is a three year contract with Partick Thistle.

Carnoustie v Glenrothes at Firhill, for example, would probably attract less than half the attendance of a full house final at McDiarmid Park. One would imagine, therefore, that a change to the east coast would be a tempting proposition.

Two semi-final replays this afternoon with Glenrothes v Sauchie and Hill of Beath and Musselburgh vying for the chance to join Tayport and Carnoustie in the semi-finals.

If we get the results before the end of today's game, we'll make an announcement on the p.a. system. What a boost for the Kingdom of Fife, never mind the Whyte & Mackay Super League if Glens and Haws were to join Tayport in the semis.

At the time of writing, the semi final Carnoustie v Musselburgh or Hill of Beath is pencilled in for McDiarmid Park, Perth on Friday 23rd April while our tie v Sauchie or Glenrothes is down for Starks Park, Kirkcaldy the following week, 30th April. These are speculative at the moment but, by the time you're reading this, the dates and venues should be finalised.

Media matters

Whilst we concede that the *Evening Telegraph* generally does a good job for the Junior game with its coverage on a Monday and Friday, the other DC Thomson publications, the *Sunday Post* and *The Courier* leave much to be desired. Saturday 20th March was unique in Junior Football history in that four clubs from *The Courier's* catchment area featured in each of the Scottish Junior Cup quarter final ties. One would have imagined that the *Courier's* Sports Editor would have picked up on this and instructed a feature on what was an unprecedented occasion. But no, nothing special, the usual articles, one for Tayside edition featuring Tayport and Carnoustie and a separate article for the Fife edition, featuring Haws and Glens.

Then on the Monday afterwards, *The Courier* had three different articles on the Juniors, the Super League article reflecting on the solitary game that was played, supported by a league table that hadn't been updated with the scoreline of the game featured. What's worse the same table appeared the following week—again out of date. Still, it had us above Linlithgow!

The Sunday Post's efforts to cover Junior football continue to be nothing short of abysmal. Carnoustie Panmure, upset the odds to get to the last four and strike a tremendous blow for east coast Junior football in front of a bigger crowd than any Bells Scottish League second or third division match, yet it warranted only a couple of lines. Similarly last week, Tayport join their East League neighbours in the last 4 after appearing in front of a near 1,600 crowd and again it's a couple of lines. Full marks to its rival the Sunday Mail who managed a lengthy reports each week, supported by an excellent action photos.

The *Evening Telegraph* (Monday 22nd March) still cannot seem to come to terms with the fact that there is no longer a Tayside JFA, and the quote attributed to East Region secretary Jock Myles wishing Tayport and Carnoustie well, yet making no mention of two of his other East Region clubs, Hill of Beath and Glenrothes, wouldn't go down particularly well in central and west Fife.

Whilst Monday past's *Courier* coverage of Tayport's win at Cambuslang was pretty pathetic, *The Sun* and *Daily Record* had superb coverage. *The Sun's* Scott Campbell cottoned on to the fact that Sean Christie holds the record for being the youngest ever player to play Senior football in Scotland when he turned out as a 15 year old for Forfar Athletic. *The Record* filled its football supplement's back page with great photographs of the tackle which saw Sean Christie carried off plus a match report from Scott Kopel.

Of course history was made, when, for the first time in over a century, Cambuslang's defeat meant there would be no west coast representatives in the semi-finals. Not unexpectedly then, there was no Junior coverage in *The Herald*. Would that have been the case if a Glasgow team had got through? I think not. And to think, that newspaper dropped 'Glasgow' from its masthead and claimed to be a national paper. Pull the other one!






