



TODAY'S GAME

The inaugural season of the Whyte & Mackay Super League in 2002-03 was acclaimed a big success, but few could have predicted the exciting contest we have this season.

We're into May and four teams are still in the championship hunt, whilst another four are in the midst of a battle to avoid the two remaining relegation spots.

All four of today's Super League fixtures will have a direct bearing on the outcome at both the top and bottom of the division. To keep their hopes alive, Hill of Beath must win at home to Bathgate while a win at home to Lochee United in their last game would give Kelty a bit of breathing space. Arniston v Linlithgow is a crucial game for both clubs. Defeat for either could be a blow from which neither side might recover, particularly Arnie who have their final three matches away from home.

This all makes this afternoon's game a crucial one for Tayport. Home form in the league has not been too inspiring, with only seven goals in as many games from the programme to date. However players with proven goalscoring records, such as Davie Evans and Sean Christie, have the ability to cause problems for the best of defences and, if Tayport can turn on the style, as they did in the corresponding game at Bo'ness earlier this season, then the home fans will be in for a treat.

McNaughton, Peters, Craik and Stewart were left out of Wednesday's starting line-up against Forfar Albion. However, the experienced quartet will be in line for a return this afternoon. Christie and Ramsay took knocks but both should be in contention for a place. Gareth Dailly is on holiday and will be missing but Derek Wemyss has been getting closer and closer to fitness and, if handed a jersey, will be anxious to prove that he's ready for action.

Bo'ness, although now out of championship contention, will be keen to secure a victory in order to finish as high in the table as possible in their first season in the Super League. It's an experienced Bo'ness squad, which will be looking to mark the club's first ever visit to the Canniepairt with a win.

" TAYPORT MUST FIND CHAMPIONSHIP FORM AT HOME"

says DUNMORE

It seems an age since the last edition of the programme, although everyone is well aware of what has happened in the interim.

Last Friday, of course, saw Tayport reach a second successive OVD Scottish Junior Cup Final, thanks to a narrow win against fellow Fifers, Glenrothes, at Starks Park.

'Port won the huge match by a solitary, late goal. There could only have been one scorer. Birdie again emerged as the hero, which must be more than just coincidence. Credit, also to Sean Christie, for his supporting role in the historic counter which sets up the first ever all-Tayside Region final.

The Canniepairt outfit also reached another inter-regional final, by virtual of a fairly comfortable win at Montrose Roselea, in the semi of the NCR Trophy. Allan Ramsay, Scott Peters and Brian Craik were all on the scoresheet, to earn another crack at Lochee United.

The Bluebells have been making life tough lately. Amazingly Tayport failed to clinch a victory in three visits to Thomson Park, over an eleven day period. One East Super League point was secured but there were also two cup exits. The North End Challenge Cup has been relinquished, while Dave Baikie will have to wait another year before getting his hands on the Redwood Leisure Cup.

In itself, the drawn league match against Lochee United was not disastrous, but the defeat at Bonnyrigg, a few days later, was a severe blow to Tayport's title hopes.

Sean Grady's last minute strike gave Rose the distinction of becoming the first team to complete a Super League double against Tayport, having won 2-1 on the Canniepairt back in November.

The results at Lochee and Bonnyrigg render today's fixture all the more important. Given that four of the remaining games are here, on the Canniepairt, Tayport must find championship-winning home form, very quickly indeed.

Media matters

The Daily Record continues to do a good job for the Juniors but reporter Gordon Parks (Monday 3rd May) hadn't done his sums, suggesting that North End were too close to the drop zone for comfort. Something of an understatement, given that, with one game left, they are three points and ten goals behind Oakley who also have one game to play.

The Courier has come in for some stick for its coverage of the Juniors, but no faults for its coverage of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup semi-final at Starks Park. A header on the front page and a major report and photos dominated the back page.

The Record did OK. At least they managed to get a report and a photo in Saturday's edition. Despite The Sun's Scott Campbell being at the game and carrying out interviews etc., there was no coverage at all in the editions on sale in Fife. Maybe too late for our edition or maybe a distribution problem, but disappointing just the same.


Shock! Horror! *The [Glasgow] Herald* managed a good wee report - with teams - in its Saturday edition.

The *Glenrothes Gazette* had a major preview on the Starks Park semi-final last week, putting its stablemate the *Fife Herald* well in the shade. Very disappointing because we understand the Fife Herald had taken very comprehensive copy from its local man but chose to publish a restricted and very badly edited version.

STV showed highlights of Tayport's Starks Park semi-final and the brief clip caught most of the significant goalmouth action but their reporter managed to get Ross Gunnion and Sean Christie mixed up in describing the Tayport goal. Quite difficult to do, considering their names are on the back of their shirts! Birdie and Baiker were interviewed post-match and both gave a polished performance.

The Sunday Post (2nd May) (which surely will have to think about improving its Junior coverage next season) reported that Dundee United had offered Tannadice Park as an OVD Cup final venue. Monday's Evening Telegraph picked up on this and reported that United were to speak to the SJFA. However it became clear in Tuesday's Evening Telegraph that the offer had fallen on barren ground and Firhill was confirmed as the venue.

Wednesday's *Evening Telegraph* published a letter from Frank Hughes of Tayport FC's Travel Club. Frank questioned whether or not sponsors OVD had been consulted over the final venue issue and also pointed out how this area had missed out on the boost to the local economy which a final at a local venue would have brought.

BO'NESS UNITED

Bo'ness United are potentially one of the biggest clubs in Junior Football. Pre-war, Bo'ness was a Senior club and in their early post-war days as a Junior club, they attracted massive crowds to their Newton Park ground. One match against Irvine Meadow in 1950 saw almost 18,000 squeeze into the ground.

Such is the enthusiasm for the game in Bo'ness that their local derby with Linlithgow in the semi-final of the Scottish Cup last season attracted an attendance 7,343 to Livingston, although many observers claimed there were many more in the stadium.

It's understood that a local cup-tie between Rose and Bo'ness, planned for next midweek, has had to be postponed as the local constabulary needed 14 days notice to police the game.

Bo'ness failed to get into the Super League at the first time of asking, but made their debut this season and have probably been quietly satisfied with their progress. Although they cannot now win the championship following last Saturday's 1-0 defeat at Hill of Beath, they can have a say who does, with a game against Arniston in addition to this afternoon's match.

Bo'ness played Arniston in a midweek cup-tie, winning 3-1 after extra time, so their current form is good.

Probably the reason the Newton Park side have been unable to mount a sustained challenge is the horrific injury list with which they have had to contend this season. Three players, Derek Yeats, Graham Donald and Gordon Abbot, for example, suffered cruciate ligament damage.

There are a few players struggling with knocks following the games last Saturday and Wednesday but there's every chance some of them will be shaken off by this afternoon.

Included in the squad will be high profile signings Kevin Thomas and George O'Boyle, who both played at the highest level with St Johnstone. Prior to that Thomas was at Hearts and O'Boyle was a big money buy for Bordeaux and Dunfermline. Both have been out of action recently through injury and, should either make it today, it's likely to be O'Boyle.

Former Hearts and Airdrie player Jimmy Sandison is the man in charge at Newton Park where he's assisted by former Airdrie team mate 'keeper John Martin whose son, John Jnr., a striker, is the club's most recent signing.

This is the last league game on the road for Bo'ness and they will be seeking to maintain the form which has seen them score in all but two games, including wins at Bonnyrigg and Lochee United.

MAY 1981

Twenty three years ago Tayport, then an amateur club, were one of the top clubs in the Midlands Association and from 2nd May to 6th May The first XI played three games, losing 3-2 at Dundee YMCA in a cup-tie and 3-1 at YM Anchorage in the league but sandwiched in between was a 1-0 league win over SMT on the Canniepairt.

Tayport's team that Monday evening was Richard Callandar, Ian Noble, Alan Hart, Bobby Wilson, Ronnie Stewart, Stewart Gibson, Jimmy Downie, Peter Cuthill, Alan Paterson, Ian Howe and Bruce Burnett. Rich Rennie and Kenny Smith were substitutes. Cuthill got the goal from the penalty spot.

The following evening the Alliance XI were in action on the Canniepairt, drawing 2-2 with St James.

The Alliance line-up was Alan Clark, John Aitken, Rab Burns, Rab Downie, Colin Gray, Bobby Waddell, Rich Rennie, Ian Ness, Colin Doherty, Sandy Hamilton, Brian Simpson, Frank Feechan and Doug Henderson. Simpson and a Doherty penalty counted for Port. Incidentally, it was good to see many of these lads at Starks Park on Friday

Eight of the players in the above teams, including Richard Rennie who somehow managed to feature in all three, were to turn out for the club's Fife XI a week later, drawing 5-5 at Wemyss in the Usher Cup. It wasn't unusual in these days of running three teams for the club to play eight games a week in April and May. All three on Saturday, Midlands on Monday and Wednesday, Alliance on Tuesday and Fife on Monday and Thursday. If it was tough for the players, it was torture for the committee!

The committee consisted of E.Beat, A.D.Oswald, F.Bremner, K.Coutts, S.Davie, K.Smith, R.McMillan, S.Ritchie, D.Herd, R.Waddell. There required to be a ballot at the AGM that season and four nominations were unsuccessful. However the constitution was changed at a SGM shortly afterwards and the committee was augmented by three co-opted members, D.Ayre, R.Watson and Brian Burnett.
