Two tremendous results within the past week have ensured that this afternoon's game is of crucial importance to Tayport in defence of our title. Four successive league games without a win, culminating in the home defeat by Glenrothes last Wednesday seemed to have conspired against us being in at the death, but a six pointer at Linlithgow and a six goaler at North End have kept us on the title support machine.

With the league championship trophy shined up and ready for presentation at Prestonfield last Saturday, there were few who could have dared to hope that Tayport would get the vital winner. The way things had gone in the previous 90 minutes, it seemed that fate had decreed that we weren't to win the game. But, where there's life, there's hope and Davie Evans grabbed the injury time goal to ensure we lived to fight another day. And fight we did, to produce a win of the highest quality at North End Park on Wednesday.

Arniston, our visitors this afternoon, have been in the title frame virtually all season but now can only finish third top, a point behind Linlithgow and Bonnyrigg, currently placed first and second respectively and with their programmes completed.


Arnie, too, had a good league win on Wednesday evening, winning at Bo'ness by the only goal of the game scored by Keyvan Karami's in the first half.

It's the Gorebridge team's final game of the season this afternoon and they will be anxious to out on a high (not as anxious as Linlithgow, mind you!). Their record on the road is good, winning seven out of ten and not conceding a goal in six of these games. That's the magnitude of the task facing 'Port today. Further to that, Arnie have three goalkeepers - and they all played on Wednesday evening! Two of the keepers, Bennett and Kirkwood, shared the No. 1 jersey, while Fraser Elder came on as an outfield substitute.

May thought that, with the departure of defender Wes Mitchell and striker Ross Barnes to Australia, in April, Arniston might struggle but they've kept things together and they showed in the OVD cup games v 'Port earlier this season, they are a well organised side and this will no doubt be demonstrated this afternoon.

Tayport will be without Gareth Dailly who broke an ankle at Linlithgow last week, and there are doubts over John Ward whose hamstring injury has caused him to miss the last two games, as well as Roberto Morris who limped off in midweek.

Regardless, of the team manager Baikie puts out, the players know that the stakes could hardly be higher and the fans will be willing their side to give their utmost to keep the dream alive.

Where to begin? Firhill, I suppose. The OVD Scottish Junior Cup and a place in the history books were there for the taking. Close to seven times out of ten, Tayport would have beaten Carnoustie Panmure. The disappointment that this would not be such an occasion will live for years to come.

The Gowfers, it must be said, were never going to defeat Tayport though, at least not in the conventional manner. But credit where it's due - Carnoustie defended stubbornly and took their penalties well. It's just a pity that, with so much at stake, the burden falls on individuals, rather than on the team as a whole.

As everyone is aware, there was a further hammer blow in Tayport's next outing - the Whyte & Mackay East Super League loss to Glenrothes. A disastrous early goal and a second half winner allowed the Glens to avenge the Stark's Park reversal, with John Ward's penalty goal merely emphasising his calmness under pressure (If only he could have taken all of our spot kicks at Firhill....)

Events seemed to be conspiring against Tayport and the pattern continued last Saturday until around quarter past four. Already without Ward and Roberto Morris, Scott Peters only lasted 27 minutes at Prestonfield before being harshly dismissed. Gareth Dailly's excellent free kick provided a lift, but yet more woe was in store. A soft penalty for the Rose and a late 'Port goal chalked off had the home support in title party mood. 'Thank Evans for Davie', as they say in the papers!

There was another dose of drama on Wednesday evening, at North End Park. An abundance of goals and red cards made for an absorbing contest. Thankfully, the goals, too, were red in colour.

Dave Reilly was the star of the show, notching a brace and orchestrating the Tayport attack. Defender Derek Wemyss also netted a double, with one apiece from Barry McNaughton and Ralph Hunter taking the tally to six without reply. All very promising and no less than Tayport deserved.

Another bright spot in an otherwise gloomy month was the sweet victory against the much vaunted Lochee United, which saw the NCR North/Tayside Trophy return to the Canniepairt, for a third successive year. Honourable mention must go to the goalscorers: Grant Paterson, Scott Peters and John Elliott, while Steven Stewart lifted the first silverware of his captaincy.

DAVE REILLY IS NOW TRULY OF LEGENDARY STATUS DR hits the 500 mark

Few who witnessed Davie Reilly's display in Tayport's epic win at Linlithgow last Saturday were probably aware that it was the legendary striker's 500th game for the club. Never a man to make a fuss, DR just got on with his job. However, to put in a shift as DR did last Saturday in a team down to ten men for over an hour, is quite remarkable considering that Davie is now in his 41st year.

In his ten years at Tayport (1990 - 2000 + 2004 to date), DR amassed the grand total of 364 goals, two as recently as Wednesday night v North End, including 20 hat-tricks, a record never likely to be broken.

Dave moved to North End in 2000 before re-



turning to the Canniepairt earlier this year after being freed by the Dokens. The club will no doubt be marking Dave's milestone in appropriate fashion.

When some reporters come on the phone, it's almost excruciating listening to their attempts to sound knowledgeable about our game, having sated themselves on an exclusive diet of SPL football for the previous ten months.

To be fair, though, the *Sunday Herald* and *Scotland on Sunday* did a couple of major pieces on Tayport, although both couldn't get away from the Senior angle, putting the Baiker in the shop window. Birdie, having played for both Carnoustie and Tayport was featured and also highlighted was the decision not to have the final played at a more convenient (for the fans, that is) location. The Tayport secretary predicted the lowest crowd ever - and he wasn't wrong but was taken to task by his SJFA counterpart for reported comments in this vein.

Ronnie Scott in the **Sunday Post** featured Allan Ramsay, highlighting his OVD pedigree and his Carnoustie - Tayport connection, as well as pouring scorn on the decision not to have the match on Tayside.

The Courier and Evening Telegraph did a good job in the run up to the final with loads of articles and features - many in colour - and there's little doubt that the local press coverage in the build-up stirred up interest in the game which seemed to be somewhat lacking during the early part of the week.

Pride of place, however, must go to the *Fife Herald* (and *St Andrews Citizen*) whose pre - match and post match coverage of the final was extensive with quality copy and some excellent photos, particularly the one on the front page of veteran fan Mary Walker and the back page photo of the seven cheerleaders.

Back to earth last week, though. *The Sunday Post* back to it's best. A hugely important and enthralling match at Linlithgow, peppered with incident merits one line. Unbelievable! *The Sunday Mail* gave the game its place however with a substantial report and photograph, as did the *Edinburgh Evening News* on Monday which carried a photo of Ross Gunnion, clearing off the line from Mark Anthony with Frazer looking on helplessly.

Monday's *Courier* dropped a major clanger, when it erroneously reported that Broughty Athletic and Arbroath SC had been relegated. There would have been a few who would have choked on their cornflakes when they read that one! A correction and apology appeared on Tuesday.

This past month has been what can only be described as a roller coaster for all concerned at our club. Since the last edition of our programme we've ebbed and flowed through seven games, winning and losing cup-ties, cup finals and vital league games. I'm obviously biased but I've no doubts in my mind we were the better side in all seven games, but in the games against Bo'ness, Carnoustie and Glenrothes, we failed to turn our outfield superiority into goals.

There's no doubt that our deep sense of disappointment in losing out in the Scottish Cup Final, the circumstances and the way it happened had a profound effect on us all and had a direct influence on our reversal against Glenrothes. We were now in a dark tunnel with no way out and having to travel to Linlithgow Rose, who only required a draw to win the Super League title. In our state of mind, it wasn't going to be easy but just as it was in the Glenrothes game, there was a pivotal moment that I felt turned our fortunes. In the Glenrothes game it went against us. At 1-1 their goal keeper had a fantastic reaction save from a Ralph Hunter strike. Within a minute they scored what proved to be the winner. For me the pivotal moment in the Linlithgow game was, in fact, one that should have been a disaster, the unfair dismissal of Scott Peters. I believe, at that moment, our players made a decision that, no matter what was going to be thrown at us, we weren't going to lose any more. Of course we emerged from the tunnel to deservedly win the game. We finished the game with nine men. Unfairly, in my opinion and of course the win gave us a very remote glimmer of hope, or at least we'd prolonged Linlithgow's wait for celebrations. And really, that's all we can do at this stage, take one step at a time. All I want from our players is to go out and work to gain a win. I can't ask any more, although they gave me a bit more than a win at North End and once again, they've left Linlithgow still wondering and waiting. This afternoon, once again, all I can ask for is a win. Do that then we've given ourselves a chance. Where there's a will, there's a way!

FROM THE ARCHIVES

THIRTY YEARS AGO - 5th JUNE 1974

Back in 1974, Tayport FC, then an amateur, club ran two sides in the Midlands Amateur FA. On this very date thirty years ago (it was a Wednesday), the 1st XI was playing its final game of the season on Esplanade Broughty Ferry - the final of the Gray Trophy against Broughty United.

Tayport had disposed of Kelso, Monifieth Tayside and NCR en route to the final and hopes were high that they would finally win a cup competition. However they were again destined to be bridesmaids, with the Ferry team running out 3-2 winners.


Tayport's line-up was Phil Callander, Frank Leslie, Graeme 'Spider' McLaren, Ron Fleming, Ian Mathers, Lindsay Ancell, Jim Scott, Abby Oswald, Ian Howe, Stewart Ritchie, Doug Henderson. Subs were Brian Burchell and Gordon Hughes. Oswald and Ritchie were the scorers.

Several are still involved with the club, Oswald is secretary, Mathers and Howe run the youngsters coaching sessions at the Canniepairt on Saturday mornings and both turn out for the Veterans XI along with Henderson.

A look at the minute book of thirty years ago gives an interesting insight into the club at that time. The May meeting was held in the Tayport Arms on a Saturday night.

- the club collected waste paper as a fund raising venture but storage was a problem and the Town Council was to be approached for assistance.
- It was noted that, at the recent tournament in Belgium, Doug Henderson had been voted the tournament's most sporting player.
- The club had received a Sports Council grant of £5,500 to help fund a new pavilion. The club had to find £2,500. Means of raising this sum and seeking guarantees was discussed. It was moved that the club abandon the current plans and go for a small wooden structure instead but this move was defeated with the committee voting to proceed as planned.
- A fund raising sub committee comprising Jim Lindsay, Ian Rae, Ian Mathers and Bunter Robertson was established.
- The Player of the Year Social was to be held in the Tayport Arms on 11th June and tickets were priced at 20p - and this included a raffle ticket!
- A Coffee Morning was fixed for 29th June and a Summer Prize Draw with a top prize of £50 was set to be drawn on 17th July.





A record low attendance of 3030, less than at our semi-final v Glenrothes, and Firhill was sparsely populated, both ends empty and the two main stands with as many seats empty as filled. The surface - not for the first time - was criticised as being rutted and bumpy. As a player said after last Saturday's game at Linlithgow - what a difference a good atmosphere and a great surface makes to a player.

A hard, bruising game but Tayport must rue the chances they missed * Why on earth didn't STV pull the plug [on the Grand Prix which overran] and take us to Firhill. What a bunch of wimps! * Grudging congrats to Carnoustie who contributed little or nothing to the game as a spectacle. Hard luck to Tayport who were by far the more creative side. A pity their finishing was off * It was good to see they [STV] had Junior pundits in the studio rather than someone who doesn't know the junior game * It was disappointing they [STV] missed the start of the match, especially for the players' families, friends and club supporters * No disrespect to the teams who, I'm sure, wanted to put on a show for the fans but this was poor fare.
