

The last three Saturdays have seen Tayport record 4-0, 3-0 and 2-0 wins, respectively. First up were Wilson's XI, as the OVD Scottish Junior Cup holders began the defence of their coveted crown, on the Canniepairt. Ralph Hunter and Kevin Heenan both notched braces in a somewhat routine victory, although only one goal had separated the teams at the interval. With a few potential winners exiting the tournament, it was pleasing to see 'Port make such comfortable progress, at the expense of an ambitious outfit wIth nothing to lose.

The ultimately disappointing Euro 2004 play-off put paid to competitive fixtures a fortnight ago, but that did not stop Dave Baikie's men from entertaining Lochee Harp in a friendly. Hunter and Heenan were again on the mark, as was fellow forward Ben Honeyman, who opened the scoring inside a minute.

Honeyman was also quick off the mark last weekend, netting in the seventh minute, when 'Port travelled north to meet regular NCR Trophy opponents. Sunnybank. A second goal, courtesy of Ralph Hunter, secured the holders' passage into the next round, although despite controlling the match, Tayport had Frazer Fitzpatrick to thank for the relatively straightforward nature of the win. Fitzpatrick produced three or four quality stops to keep the 'Bank at bay.

So, as far as the cups are concerned, there is a degree of normality. The same cannot be said of Tayport's league form and certainly cannot be said of the previous Whyte & Mackay Super Leage match, which took place on the Canniepairt almost a month ago. During Bonnyrigg's visit there was an early missed penalty, Ralph Hunter's opener was cancelled out by John Harvey, Barry McNaughton was taken out of the game by a brutal challenge from Steve Raynes, while Grant Paterson and Sean Christie were both red-carded in the aftermath of the foul on McNaughton, all before the interval.

The fact that none of these incidents represented the major post-match talking point shows just how incredible referee Colin Brown's final two decisions of the encounter actually were. When Brown waved away Ben Honeyman's clear-cut penalty claims, most spectators must have been convinced he had done so to avoid further controversy. He must surely have been content for the game to finish all square. For the official to then award Bonnyrigg a spot kick, for what seemed a legitimate challenge on John Ward's part, simply beggared belief.

For the Tayport contingent in attendance that day, the conclusion of the Bonnyrigg match will never be forgotten and will always be accompanied by the shake of the head, a sense of bewilderment and a feeling of anger that the nine men who performed so admirably, for the entire second half, left the field with nothing.

TODAY'S VISITORS WHYTE and MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v KELTY HEARTS

It's Kelty Hearts' first visit to the Canniepairt on Super League business, having moved into the top division in August after finishing top of the Fife District Division last season.

Kelty, like ourselves, are relatively new to the Juniors, having joined in 1980 but, again like ourselves, have made a significant impact.

Kelty dominated Fife Cup football in the 1980s, winning the Fife Cup on four occasions, the Cowdenbeath Cup on four occasions and the Dryburgh Cup in 1982. Kelty went on to dominate league football in the nineties picking up five Fife League Championships and ended the decade on an all-time high with an appearance in the 1999 OVD Scottish Junior Cup Final.

Alas, just as was the case with Tayport on their first appearance in the final, the day which had captured the imagination of west Fife ended in Firhill disappointment. Kilwinning Rangers were the victors that day by a solitary goal in front of an attendance of 7,525.

After experiencing the OVD high, Kelty's form waned somewhat and they missed out on the inaugural Whyte & Mackay Super League in 2002, finishing a disappointing 5th in the Fife League.

It had always been the Kelty Hearts' ambition to play Super League football. Back in the early 1990s, when an article in 'The Courier' suggested that Tayport might be behind a breakaway 'Super League', Kelty was the first club on the phone on the lines of" we're with you, when does it start? "

Missing out on the first Whyte & Mackay Super League was a huge disappointment to the ambitious Kelty committee. This disappointment of missing out, then seeing the Super League get off to a good start was the impetus which Hearts' needed to kick-start that ambition and, in season 2002/03, all Fife opposition was swept aside by the Central Park club to earn a place at the top table.

In the knowledge that adjusting to the pressure pot that is Super League football, would not be easy, Kelty's game plan, based on tight defence was well conceived, but even the management team was pleasantly surprised with the early season form which saw Hearts top the table.

It was a proud and pleasantly surprised committee and management which looked at the newspapers to see their club sit proudly at the top of the pile, separated by an entire division from their local and, until then, more illustrious rivals, Hill of Beath Hawthorn.



THE BAIKER'S BIT

Today is the first opportunity I've had to air my views on that ill-fated home league encounter with Bonnyrigg Rose and, no, it wasn't April 1st, it was November 1st and, yes, I said I'd air my views on the game but I can't can I? Big Brother may decide to throw the book at me.

I recall many years ago - six to be precise - an ex-referee told me a story. He was down on a course at Inverclyde and part of that course was a lecture demonstrating just how much influence and bearing a referee can have on the outcome of a game. During the lecture, the referees' supervisor



showed an incident which happened just a few minutes into the game. After showing the incident, he stopped the film and asked the audience their opinion and what decision they would give. The audience of referees voted unanimously that the incident definitely warranted a sending-off. As they rolled on the film, it was revealed to be the Scottish Junior Cup Final. The player who committed the offence was not sent off in that first few minutes and, in fact, went on to score two vital goals and win the cup for his club. What the referees' lecturer was trying to get over was that referees' decisions can, and do, have a major influence on the outcome of matches. Their errors can cause great pain to players, managers, clubs and their supporters. November 1st was one of those days.

The outcome was that we lost the game and the services of two of our players for two games, something which we got away with, in that we recorded two victories. However it's something which I cannot condone, nor accept. Good discipline wins games. Poor discipline loses games. The evidence is there for all to see. Since the end of August we've had two reverses and in both encounters we lost players in the first period, so lessons, hopefully, will be learned.

Today we have Kelty Hearts as our visitors for this Super League game and I'd like to welcome both their players and officials to Tayport. Kelty led the division throughout August and September. Why? Because their attitude and workrate was of a high standard. I feel we've still a way to go to get to the standards of which we are capable, but I genuinely believe that a victory this afternoon can go a long way to achieving the standard we desire. Success, however, is only gained through work and discipline. Produce these qualities today, then success can happen.

The sponsor's name in red was virtually illegible on the black & white striped strip.


In *The Sun* this week, former Tayport and Kelty Hearts striker Billy Spence, now player/manager at Rosyth Recreation, was touting big ex-Hearts, St Johnstone and Bo'ness striker Ian Ferguson for a Junior Scotland call-up. Understandable, I suppose, in the euphoria which followed Rec's shock 4-3 win at Arniston in the Fife & Lothians Cup.

The Evening Telegraph reported on Monday that the heavy OVD replay defeat sustained by Arbroath Vics at the hands of Maryhill was in no small way down to the fact that the Vics' keeper, a star in the first game, missed the replay after breaking a leg in Amsterdam whilst following Scotland. TODAY'S GAME WHYTE and MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE TAYPORT v KELTY HEARTS

It's been a roller coaster of a year for Tayport as far as league football on the Canniepairt is concerned with incidents, shocks and controversy all in good supply. For Kelty, their 12 months of league football has been unsurpassed. A Fife title and a dramatic debut in the Super League has given the Central Park faithful plenty to crow about.

These ingredients add up to what should be an entertaining match this afternoon.

Kelty's last two outings have both been against East District high flyers Camelon and have seen the Super League club experience mixed fortunes. Second half goals from Adams and Winiarski saw today's opponents progress to the 3rd round of the OVD Cup in a tousy affair which saw the match official flash no fewer than 11 yellow cards. It was different story last Saturday when the Falkirk side exacted revenge with a 3-1 win in the Fife and Lothians Cup. James Adams, who had been the thorn in Camelon's side the previous week was the Kelty scorer.

The defeat could well see manager John Steel tinker with a line-up which has seen little change in recent weeks. Stevie Brown could return in place of Dean Walker and there could be a place for Kevin Webster. There could also be the temptation to bring back Steven Gardner in goal at the expense of Martin Parkyn.

Tayport have Grant Paterson and Sean Christie free of suspension and, although Allan Ramsay stands a chance of making a return after being injured in a friendly a couple of weeks ago, it's too early for Scott Peters to get a starting jersey. Scott only restarted training this week after being out since the end of last season.

Brian Craik, who appeared from the bench, Ross Gunnion and Derek Wemyss all missed out at Sunnybank last week and will be patiently waiting for a recall.



Little activity recently, with only two fixtures last Saturday and only Tayport v Kelty this afternoon.

Hill of Beath scored a crucial win at home to Glenrothes, a win which gives the Haws a lifeline in their efforts to avoid the drop. An early goal from Darren Wright gave the home side the cushion they needed and all the pressure was then on Glenrothes. With a record of only nine goals in ten games, it was always going to be tough against another side desperate for points. Any pressure on the home side was finally relieved when Martyn Thomson hit a second goal late in the game.

It must be stressed these were the prices prior to last Saturday, so expect Bonnyrigg's odds to have tumbled and Oakley's to have lengthened.

The recent Guy Fawkes Bonfire and Firework Display held on the Canniepairt proved to be one of the best in recent years, with a spectacular light show illuminating the night sky. The club's thanks go to those who attended and those who assisted the committee in building the bonfire and putting on the display.

At Sunnybank last Saturday, officials of the home club were telling Tayport officials of their plans to celebrate, next year, the 50th Anniversary of their Scottish Junior Cup win, a 2-1 victory over Lochee Harp at Hampden Park in 1954. It was the first (and to date, only) occasion that a North club had won the Junior Cup. Sunnybank are expecting six members of their side that afternoon to be present at a celebratory dinner and are anxious to have as many of the Harp team as possible attend. 2004 is a big year, too, for the Beechwood club who, as well as celebrating the 50th Anniversary of their Cup Final appearance, are also celebrating their centenary.

St Andrews United have gone for the fans' choice with the appointment of their new manager. Ex-Glenrothes boss Colin Downie, a firm favourite at Recreation Park as a player in the 1970s, was the choice and has got off to a good start, taking Saints to the last 64 of the OVD at the expense of North high flyers FC Stoneywood. Colin, of course played for Tayport Amateurs for a spell in the mid 1980s, including three tour matches in Belgium. That was one thing about Colin - he was a good tourist!

Former Tayport striker Davie Evans was the key man as Raith Rovers reached the semi-final of the Reserve League Cup on Tuesday. Davie scored once and was brought down for a penalty which gave Rovers a 2-0 quarter final win over Davie's former club Arbroath.

FROM THE ARCHIVES 5 YEARS AGO 28th NOVEMBER 1998

Back in November 1998, Tayport were in the midst of a very hot streak. With 16 wins and a draw since the start of the season, Tayport, then under the stewardship of Andy Sommerville, were in magnificent form as they lined up to meet Forfar West End on the Canniepairt. Tayport had netted 66 goals for the loss of only 4 but it was a disappointing attendance of 133 who anticipated a further goal deluge.

And they were not disappointed. Five goals went into the West End pokey that afternoon and two were scored by Brian Craik, one of four survivors from that match in Tayport's pool for this afternoon's game.


