

TODAY'S GAME

NORTH END CHALLENGE CUP Round 1 TAYPORT v ARBROATH S.C.

This will be the first meeting of the sides for over two years. Since the advent of the Super League, our paths have met only once, a 2-0 win for Tayport at Seaton Park in September 2002, in the first round of the North/Tayside NCR Trophy in front of 76 spectators, which turned out to be the lowest attendance of our season. The last meeting here was a 4-2 Tayside League win in January 2002.

SC arrive here this afternoon as Whyte & Mackay Tayside League leaders and their performance will be measured with a place in the Super League in mind. After a sticky start to the campaign, SC manager Jim Lowe has seen his charges put together a good run. The signing of Gary Buick from Carnoustie looks like a good piece of business and a glance at his team list shows a good balance of youth and experience.

Experienced striker Ross Kenny hit a brace when SC recorded a good win 3-0 league win at Blairgowrie last Saturday, so it's a confident visiting team which will take the field today, particularly with the addition of Kevin Durno, who returns after suspension.

Changes are certain in the Tayport line-up with a number of last week's line-up unavailable. Manager Keith Burgess will be glad of a strong pool as he makes up his mind who will replace the injured John Ward and Brian Livie. Big Bobo was on the team sheet last week but was pulled out at the eleventh hour when the injury sustained at Lochee United flared up again in the pre-match warm up.

Allan Ramsay is a doubtful starter and Derek Wemyss is unavailable through work commitments. John Knox, who was cup-tied last week, is available.

One player who won't feature is Brian Craik who was transferred to Lochee Harp yesterday and is set to make his debut for his new club at home to Kinnoull this afternoon. Big Bird will, of course, end up with legendary status at Tayport, given his OVD exploits with the club. We wish him well...... and thanks for the memories.

Media matters

Fortunately, the *Daily Record* doesn't have a huge readership, therefore it's unlikely that too many will have seen this week's feature in 'The Sportsweek' football pullout (Tayside edition), which featured madcap Ralph Hunter along with teammates Ramsay, Wemyss and Craik photographed in Ralphy's pub in Methil - all sitting at the bar bollock naked. If you didn't know better, you'd be excused for thinking you had picked up the Gayly Record by mistake. The quote of the season, however is from Ralph which kind of sums things up "The pub I own is in Methil and that's where I'm from, so I know most of the punters who drink in it and they are as daft as me!"

In the *Evening Telegraph* Tayport and Lochee United have dominated the headlines since the start of the year with banner headlines such as '*Make or break for Tayport*' and '*Bluebells have that title look*' before and after the clash at Thomson-Park on 8 January . On Monday 17th January it was '*Ward emergency - send for Wemyss*' in reference to John Ward's late withdrawal from the team at Beith'. It made good headline but Derek was actually listed in the team before Wardy's withdrawal, a point Derek made in his interview in Monday's *Sun*.

Somewhat mystifyingly, *The Tele* had a photo from Lanark v Lochee United in the OVD Cup but the report was sketchy to say the least, with no Lanark goalscorer named and the fact that Lanark missed a late penalty kick, not reported. Indeed there was little information on the Lanark match anywhere.

The Ardrossan & Saltcoats Herald previewed the Beith v Tayport tie on its back page. Beith manager Dennis Gray acknowledged that he had had them [Tayport] watched and they 'were a strong side in all areas.....however, I think we can win this tie'.

The Glasgow Evening Times in its preview, expected the tie to be drawn '....this is an upset in the making.... Beith's cup form is second to none....verdict - draw'

The Sun's Scott Campbell was at Bellsdale Park, so we knew the Beith tie would be the featured game in Monday's Sun. And so it was, with a six column report and photographs of both goals. Derek Wemyss took all the plaudits and was singled out by the Sun's man for a post match interview.

The *Fife Herald* (14 January) reviewed the Lochee United game and previewed the Beith game. In the review, the reporter thought the winning Lochee goalscorer's *'exuberant celebratory routine was designed to antagonise the stunned Port support'*. In its preview, the *Herald* was the only newspaper to acknowledge that the Beith tie was a milestone, Tayport's 100th in the competition.

A RETURN TO THE CANNIEPAIRT FOR Ex- 'PORT STAR IAN GREIG



It's return to the Canniepairt today for Arbroath SC's Ian Greig who was a popular member of the Tayport FC squad for exactly four years, from August 1997 to August 2001. Ian was signed from SC by Kenny Bunce and returned to his first club during Dave Baikie's second spell at Tayport.

Greigy had quite an amazing record at Tayport, being on the losing side in only 6 of the 107 competitive games he started for the club. Ian also appeared as sub on 32 occasions, giving a total of 139 games during which he scored 16 goals. Had he not taken his holidays at awkward times, there would have been considerably more outings in the red of Tayport.

Ian's first game for the club was a 3-1 win in a league game at Downfield and by coincidence, his swansong

was also a league game at Downfield, on this occasion a 4-1 win. On signing for Port, the club had just embarked on an unbeaten run and it was to be 31 games before Ian was to taste defeat in a Port shirt.

When Ian signed on at the Canniepairt, it was the lure of potential silverware and medals which brought him over the Tay, and he wasn't to be disappointed, collecting 3 championship medals, 3 Regional cup medals and 4 local cup winners' medals. Not a bad haul!

Unfortunately, Ian's spell at Tayport was to coincide in our leanest time in the Scottish Cup, a quarter final replay exit, two 4th round exits and a 3rd round dismissal.

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to both sets of supporters for today's cuptie against Arbroath SC.

After our exploits last week down at Beith in the OVD Scottish Cup, it's back to more cup action in the shape of the North End Challenge Cup.



Our opponents today are having a good season and are, at present, leading the Tayside Premier League, a point ahead of Kinnoull who were one of our opponents in our friendly games over the festive shutdown. We know that we are in for a tough match against a team that has had only one league defeat, so we will be approaching the game with caution. We will, however, be in confident mood after last Saturday's professional performance in Ayrshire.

Down in Beith last week I felt that, although we were not at our best in the first half going up the slope, we defended well and limited the opposition to a couple of half chances and created a few good ones of our own.

It's amazing how a confident keeper can help a backline defend against an aerial bombardment, as we had encountered in the first 45 minutes.

The second half was a different story. We upped our game after the break and bossed matters for the entire second period, scoring two great goals through Wemyss and Henderson and coming close on a few other occasions, eventually running out worthy winners in what we knew was going to be a very tricky match for us.

The only bad things to come out of the match for us was the injury to Brian Livie who did complete the game. Brian has been sidelined for couple of weeks with a bad gash just below the knee. The other downside was the failure of John Ward to make the starting line-up due to ligament damage sustained at Lochee the week before. Hopefully both will recover quickly but we do have quality in depth and I know the guys who come in will more than justify their inclusion.

The support we had at Beith was incredible and I know that with your backing we have a great chance of adding to our already impressive trophy collection. I hope you all enjoy today's match and, like myself, are looking forward to a favourable tie in Monday's OVD Cup draw.

With a 10,000 capacity, McDiarmid Park, Perth has long been touted as a final venue but apparently it does not have the hospitality capacity for SJFA purposes. Sufficiently well appointed to host a full Scotland Rugby International (this season v Japan), but not good enough for the OVD Final, it would appear.



The popular Birdie opted for a move to Beechwood after failing to feature in a Tayport line-up since 13 November. Brian told Port Prog that it was the hardest decision he's ever had to make in football (without a doubt, chipped in wife Clare). "However, it all comes down to football and, at 32, I really need to be playing every week, said Brian. " Moving down a division will give me that opportunity. "Manager Steve Higgins is a personal friend and I hope I can help him realise some of his ambitions for the club.



"It goes without saying that I'll miss everyone at Tayport - players, committee and the fans, especially Mick, Davie & co. "I've had a great time at Tayport, particularly during these last four years. "The players are the best bunch I have ever played with, even those in their 40s! "I wish the club all the best and hope that we can bring the cup back to 'Port.

With the winning goals in two Scottish Cup semi-finals and the Final, Birdie achieved legendary status at Tayport where he played 241 games and scored 106 goals since signing from Carnoustie in September 1998. Brian was a model player for Tayport, displayed great professionalism and played the game with a smile on his face. Although he's moved on football-wise, Birdie, Clare and Naomi are happily settled in Tayport, so we'll still see plenty of the Craiks about the town.

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP



First, some reported attendances from last Saturday's 4th round—Bathgate v Greenock (200); Beith v Tayport (425); Petershill v Bo'ness (550); Linlithgow v Hurlford (750); Kilwinning v Maryhill (396); Pollok v Whitburn (1,400).



Three postponements, three mild surprises, no major shocks and a couple of tremors which resulted in replays, both of which should go to form today. That's pretty much the story of last week's 4th round.

Despite having the lion's share of the game, Bo'ness United made their exit at Petershill, a first half goal and a last minute strike doing the damage. However, all the controversy seemed to be off the park. Allegedly, Kevin Thomas had a pre-match bust-up with manager Jimmy Sandison and refused to be a sub (he wasn't listed in the 16, anyway) and allegedly there was a fight at half-time in the BU dressing room.

Lugar Boswell Thistle won at Newtongrange Star to reach the last 16 for the first time in almost 50 years. Quite a season that was for Lugar in 1955/56. They reached the final where 64,702 saw them lose to Petershill.

Elmwood boss Jim Finlayson would have been apoplectic at the nature of his side's defeat at **Dunbar United** in a tie that should have been very winnable for the Craigie Park men. Deep into injury time the 44 years old Dunbar veteran Jackie Myles crashed a free kick against the bar but the referee ordered a retake. A melee ensued which ended with a Dunbar player being ordered off before Myles crashed the retake past 'Wood keeper Scotland for a dramatic winner.

A first half header from Colin McKinnon put Bathgate Thistle through in a dour affair at home to Greenock. Similarly a single goal from Flanagan took Glenafton Athletic through against 9/1 shots Rutherglen Glencairn.

In Ayrshire a poor Kilwinning Rangers side was never at the races, losing 3-1 to an understrength Maryhill side. Neilston went ahead against 11/1 Glentanar, the North's sole survivors, but had to settle for a 1-1 and must travel to Aberdeen today. Troon boosted the Ayrshire representation with a 3-1 success over Port Glasgow to take their place in round 5 for the first time in exactly 30 years. It was a one sided contest at Pollok where Whitburn had 2 players red carded as they crashed out 5-0. It was exactly the same story at Renfrew where Dunipace were no match for the locals.

Linlithgow Rose steamrollered past Hurlford United who proved to be something of a disappointment against the free scoring Rose who, in winning 5-0, fully justified their cup favourites tag. Very little information leaked out of Lanarkshire where Lochee United's surprise at being held by the Lanark United was only tempered by the thought that things could have been worse. Having recovered from losing the opening goal, Lanark equalised before passing up a gilt edged chance to make round 5 when they missed a penalty late in the game. That's one of two replays which go ahead today along with the three postponed ties - Arniston v Thorniewood, Arthurlie v Musselburgh and Hill of Beath v Blackburn Rovers.

The last competitive home match saw Tayport apply pressure on the Whyte & Mackay East Super League leaders by narrowly defeating Arniston Rangers, thanks to a solitary Steven Stewart goal, the week before Christmas.

Three festive friendly wins followed, but, when the crunch came, disaster struck. 'Port's first official game of the new year was at Thomson Park, and it was a cracker for the neutrals and Lochee Those with Tayport connections, however, are probably still shaking their heads in bewilderment. Ominously, Kris Ward gave the Bluebells an early advantage, only for the Canniepairt men to storm into a 3-1 lead. The injured John Ward earned a penalty, dispatched by Gary Middleton, then Steven Stewart powered up the right flank, forcing Chris Tawse into an own goal. Craig Robertson netted twice during the second period, each strike representing a crushing blow to Tayport's aspirations, leaving, as faras the title is concerned, a proverbial mountain to climb.

Bellsdale Park was also something of a mountain, with Beith's sloping surface evoking bad memories of trips to Thornton. A solid display from Tayport, though, saw them move into the last sixteen of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, for an amazing eleventh time in fifteen seasons. The two goals came within a one minute spell, with quarter of an hour remaining. Derek Wemyss netted the vital opener and this was swiftly followed by Robbie Henderson's low strike, which deceived home 'keeper Keith Ross, ensuring that 'Port would mark their 100th Scottish Cup tie with a familiar victory.

More similar cup triumphs over the coming months, starting today, will see the club enjoy another successful campaign in the national, inter-regional and local competitions. The league? Well, you never know...


