

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP



The OVD Scottish Junior Cup quarter final ties didn't quite go to plan with the major hiccup being the home defeat of bookies' cup favourites Pollok, by fellow West Super League Premier side Renfrew. An attendance of 1,477 at Newlandsfield saw 'Frew win through by the



odd goal in five. Having lost their last six league games, including a 6-1 drubbing from Cumnock, few could blame the bookies for making Pollok odds on favourites. However, that's football and there were few at Pollok who would fail to acknowledge that the visitors deserved their win.

At Troon, Maryhill looked set to take their hosts back to Glasgow for a replay when Troon's Martin Graham had the misfortune to put the ball in his own net. It was pretty typical of Troon's luck this season. Stuck near the foot of the West Super League, a place in the last four for the first time in their history would have been a welcome distraction for the Portland Park club.

Lochee United and Arthurlie replay this afternoon after drawing 1-1 at Thomson Park. United took full advantage of the quarter final limelight, ensuring there was plenty pre-match publicity, in the hope of taking advantage of the absence of Senior football in the city. Lochee even produced a rare match programme for an occasion that attracted an attendance reputed to be around the four figure mark.

On a cold afternoon, many of those assembled on the grassy hillside had made an early exit, confident that Jon Thompson's early first half header would be sufficient to take Lochee through. With United pretty much controlling things in the second half, few could blame them, but it ain't over until the fat lady sings, as they say, and a last gasp equaliser saw Arthurlie salvage a replay at Barrhead.

It will be recalled that in 1993, Tayport had been written off after drawing 1-1 at home with a strong Arthurlie team which included a young James Grady, now with Dundee United, but won the replay 3-0. So write off Lochee at your peril. That all-local semi-final tie could still come out of the bag yet. Especially if the discs/balls have been in the freezer!

The draw is on Football First tomorrow (check listings for time). Is there a chance, perhaps, that the powers that be will get a classy-looking velvet bag and four decent-sized balls and a wee rack on which to place the balls, thus to giving the draw a wee touch of professionalism?

Tayport had been expected to get through at Lugar and did so in the end, but there were anxious moments. A upset looked on the cards when Lugar, urged on by a sizeable and noisy local support, took a first minute lead. However the ease with which the goal was cancelled out within a minute, ensured that perhaps Lugar's confidence

had suffered more damage than had been done to Tayport's. By midway through the second half it was the Tayport support which was singing with the home side and their fans subdued by a professional Port performance.

A fourth successive appearance in the semi-final (not three as mentioned on TV and in Monday's Evening Telegraph) awaits Tayport on either Friday 15th April or Friday 22nd April. Linlithgow (at Almondvale), Maryhill (at Broadwood) and Glenrothes (at Starks Park) were the previous semi-final opponents in the new Millennium.

STATOIL Quadrangular Tournament

Tayport players John Ward, Scott Peters and Roberto Morris are still in line for places in Scotland's squad to play in the STATOIL Quadrangular Tournament in Glasgow on 28, 29 and 30th April.

There's a further trial game at Creamery Park, Bathgate on Tuesday 22 March, kick-off 7pm which will feature the three 'Port players.

The Tournament itself involves Isle of Man, Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland and Scotland. Scotland's games are scheduled for Thursday 28th April v Northern Ireland at Arthurlie's Dunterlie Park , kick-off 7pm; Friday 29th April v Republic of Ireland at Petershill Park, kick-off 7pm; Saturday 30th April v Isle of Man at Newlandsfield, Pollok, kick-off 3pm.

TAYPORT MONOPOLISE THE OVD SEMI-FINALS

Since Tayport joined the Junior ranks in 1990, 27 clubs have reached the semi-final stage of the competition, fourteen of which have been on only one occasion. Eleven of the 27 are from the East Region. No North Region clubs have reached the penultimate stage during this period.

Tayport top the semi-final table with seven appearances, closely followed by Auchinleck on six. Arthurlie can join Talbot on six if they overcome Lochee this afternoon. Glenafton have five, Kilwinning four, while Pollok and Maryhill have three appearances each.

Just a thought ...

OVD quarter final goals have long since become an established part of STV's junior football coverage. To the casual observer this must appear a treat for the country's thousands of junior football fans. Yet for most, cramming 13 goals from four matches into two minutes and forty seconds, was another missed attempt at taking junior football seriously.

That the cliché-ridden embarrassment that is Scotsport's junior cup coverage needs an overhaul is surely beyond question. If you had discussed Tayport on national television as much as Jim Delahunt would you not be tempted to actually go and watch a game of football there? Archie MacPherson was once the voice of British Eurosport but has long-since been unseated by a new generation who take their job seriously. These commentators rely heavily

on a wealth of pre-prepared statistics which, although not comparable with a first-hand knowledge, at least allows them to inject a little interest for the casual viewer. And then there are the pundits.

Those wheeled out for the occasion seem to regard research as something best left to scientists. Their in-depth knowledge suggests little more than a quick chat with a journalist friend who once went to a Linlithgow versus Hill of Beath quarter final.

Loss of television coverage would undeniably dent the prestige of the competition, so this criticism is intended to be constructive and positive. In this age of celebrity there must be someone ready to become Scotsport's face of junior football. It would require a dedication to attending junior football matches on a weekly basis, and, other than a starring role on cup final day, the return would be a handful of brief appearances to add some worthwhile content to the draw or highlight packages. Today's Game Tayport v Oakley United

In the first season of the Super League, Oakley visited newly crowned champions Tayport, needing to win to stay amongst the elite. This they duly did with a 1-0 win which propelled them four places up the table, relegating Carnoustie Panmure instead.

Last season Oakley again flirted with relegation, amassing two fewer points but still avoiding the drop by finishing one place off relegation.

Another Houdini act is on the cards this season but, if there is any club which is geared up for a last ditch battle to avoid the drop it is Oakley.

That's what will give this afternoon's match its edge, as the inconsistent Oakley embark on a mission to collect the ten points from a possible twenty-one which should ensure safety. Indeed, a decent run of form could see Oakley climb rapidly into the top half of the league.

For Tayport, a win would see them move up to third, even second if Thornton were to win at Bo'ness, but a defeat or a draw would mean consolidating a disappointing mid table position.

Oakley's good work a fortnight ago, when they cuffed Thornton by 4-1 was undone, to some extent, last Saturday when they went down 2-0 at home to Carnoustie. Inspirational player/manager Willie Newbigging may not be as fleet of foot as he once was, but he still wields a telling influence as his three 'assists' v Thornton would testify. Following the Carnoustie loss, Newbigging bemoaned the fact that his team had plenty of the ball but lacked a cutting edge.

This is Tayport's first league fixture since 8th January and they will be looking to build on their good cup form of recent weeks. Manager Burgess will have his players made well aware of the threat posed by Oakley, emphasising the importance of picking up three points.

It's likely that some of the players who didn't start against Lugar will get the nod today. Allan Ramsay, whose last game was at Beith, is on the road to recovery and might claim a place on the bench. John Knox, ordered off v Glentanar, will sit this one out.

Tayport could have an addition to their pool this afternoon. The club has been in negotiations during the week, and there is the possibility that the player could be listed as a trialist. Tayport can make two 'joker' signings outwith the transfer window and could take advantage of this facility.

Media matters

Tayport has had it's share of press, TV and radio coverage this week. The brief highlights of the Lugar cup tie came over well on **STV's Football First** programme on Sunday at lunchtime and it's probably fair to say that, of the four ties covered by the cameras, Tayport' v Lugar was the pick of the bunch. The support for Tayport at Lugar was excellent and it was good to see the giant flags conspicuous on TV.

Tayport boss Keith Burgess was on *BBC Scotland's* midweek football phone-in, giving opinion on the breaking news that the SFA's 93 members clubs will be asked to vote on junior participation in the Tennent's Scottish Cup. The Record also reported that Thornton had "booted out" midfielder Ken Renwick who had failed to turn up for Hibs, game against Bathgate.






