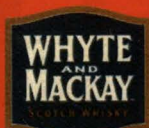

Who's going up.....Who's coming down?

Most folks in the Junior game agree that the emergence of the Super League has taken Junior Football in these parts on to a new level. And clubs are eager to get a piece of the action. Today's opponents Kinnoull are no exception, as they enter the second half of their Tayside Premier campaign in pole position for a Super League place.

The situation for the clubs chasing the three feeder league top spots has, however, become farcical. Nine months of the season behind us and a mere ten weeks of the season to go, yet some clubs have the bulk of their league programme yet to play. Harp have 14 games to go, Rosyth in the Fife league, have only played four and have another eighteen to squeeze in. And it's not much better in the Lothians. Nothing to do with postponements, it's all down to the ridiculous league cup set-ups with which these clubs kicked off their season.

So, who's going down and who's coming up? At present Thornton and Camelon look favourite to make an immediate return to the District Leagues. Arniston, with three games in hand, are coming into a bit of form and could worry Oakley and Carnoustie, the others currently in the frame.

In the Tayside League it's as tight a race as it's ever been with, in theory, the entire division in contention. Montrose and Forfar West End, with games in hand over Kinnoull, look to have a slight edge, but any side which puts three or four wins together will be right up there.

In Fife, look no further than Hill of Beath. Rosyth Recreation could be a threat but they'd basically have to take the six available points off Haws when the sides meet. Lochore Welfare, with Dundonians Andy Heggie and Gavin Tinley playing key roles, have dropped one game in seven. A win against St Andrews today would give them real hope of staying the course.

A late run by any one of half a dozen Lothians clubs could bring promotion but Musselburgh, Whitburn and Sauchie look best placed.

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters to Canniepairt for this afternoon's Dug-out Cup quarter final tie against Kinnoull Juniors.

He has already shown in his last two appearances, of what he is capable, scoring on his debut against Oakley and performing very well last week at Camelon.

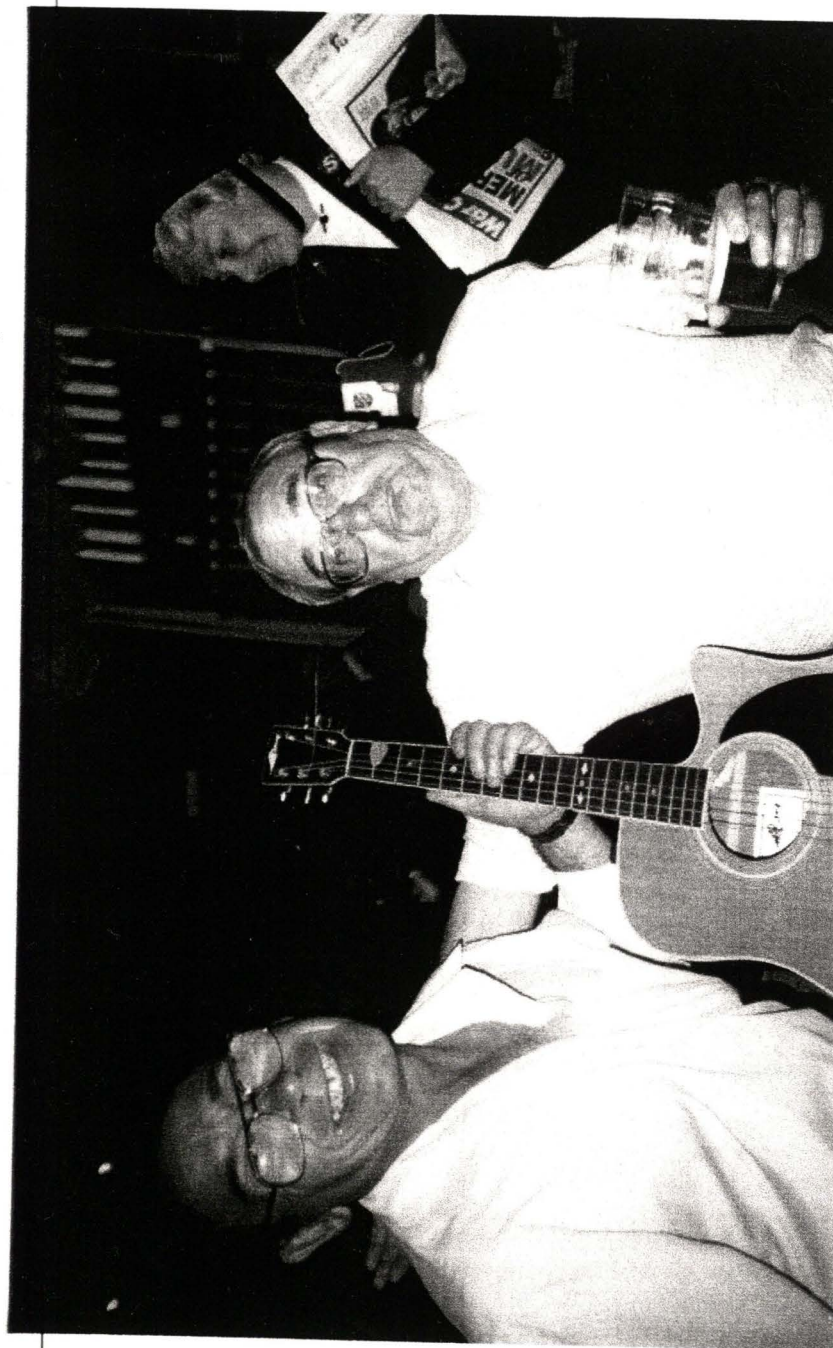

RENFREW v TAYPORT
FRIDAY 22nd APRIL
KICK-OFF 7.45pm



The dust has settled somewhat on the decision to send Tayport 87 miles through to Love Street, Paisley, home of St Mirren FC to play their semi-final tie against Renfrew..... but the bitterness remains.

Quite understandably, Tayport fans have been incensed by this decision. There have been letters to the press, articles expressing astonishment in the local newspapers and postings - from west coast based fans - on Junior websites universally condemning the decision.

One would imagine that Tayport, given the fact that they have been forced to travel substantial distances on Friday evenings for semi-finals on six previous occasions, might have been given greater consideration.

Basically, the venues had been selected prior to the draw taking place. Renfrew, regardless of their draw, were always going to be at Love Street, and at least one of the two East representatives was going to be playing at McDiarmid Park, Perth. Tayport drew the short straw.

The SJFA's reasoning was that Tayport is a poorly supported club, whereby Renfrew would attract a good attendance at a ground only three miles down the road from their own ground. We'll see.

The facts don't really bear out that logic. In the semi final of 2001, Renfrew managed to attract 3,425 to Love Street for their meeting with Auchinleck Talbot. At Dens Park for the other semi-final, Carnoustie attracted just short of 5,000 against Shetleston, who had a poor support.

Tayport have never had the chance to show what they can attract playing on their doorstep i.e. Tannadice and Dens which are both about 6 miles from Tayport. The closest Tayport have been to home was last season, thirty miles away at Kirkcaldy, when 3,080 turned out.

As the manager, Keith Burgess, said, we'll play anywhere but, once again, it is disappointing for the fans. Although, for the fans, the build-up for the 22nd has begun, the players and management will be putting the Scottish Cup to the back of their minds as they tackle the three matches in the interim.

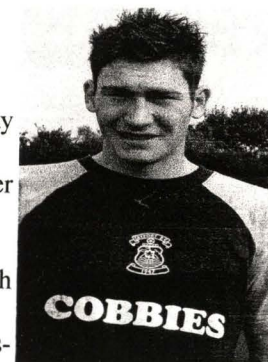

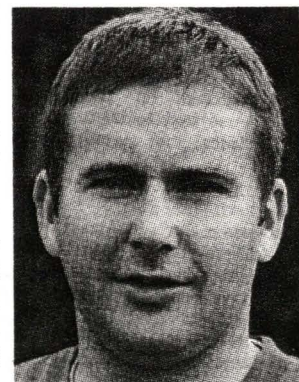
DUGOUT CUP (the North/Tayside Cup) quarter final tie TAYPORT v KINNOULL

This will be the first competitive meeting between Tayport and Kinnoull for over six years. In that time the Perth club have languished in the lower divisions, but today's meeting brings to the Canniepairt a club with a new determination, a new vision. No longer are Kinnoull prepared to just make up the numbers. A Super League presence in Perth is probably overdue and Kinnoull will see this afternoon's tie as an acid test of their ability to make their mark in the top division.

It's not only that factor, however, which will give this afternoon's game its edge, there's a place in the last four of the North/Tayside Cup at stake and that's the target for the teams this afternoon.

It's a competition which has been dominated by holders Tayport, particularly since the turn of the Century, with four wins to their credit in the new Millennium. That's a further incentive for the Tulloch Park club who will field a number of players, well familiar to Port supporters.

Mike Whyte was in excellent form in the 'Noull goal last week and, although former North End central defender Colin Sinclair is unlikely to be risked because of a hamstring problem, Sandy Ross is a resolute performer in the heart of the defence. Alan Cameron (pictured) has been regularly amongst the goals, including what proved to be the winner last week against Arbroath SC, and also providing a goal threat is the effervescent ex-Port player Barry Gardiner.



A newcomer to the Kinnoull ranks this season is former Pollok player Jimmy McPhee whom former Tayport gaffer Dave Baikie took a look at a few seasons ago but McPhee is injured and will likely miss out. Kinnoull manager Scott Brown welcomes several players back today and will have his troops well prepared for today's game.

Two players no doubt relishing this afternoon's encounter are Tayport's Ross Gunnion and Robbie Henderson, both of whom hail from Perth. Another player anxious to feature will be keeper Duncan Bruce who starred with Kinnoull last season. Tayport boss Keith Burgess, who fielded a fairly youthful XI at Camelon last week, will ring the changes once again and could hand Duncan the No.1 jersey against his old club.

Today's tie goes into 30 minutes extra time if level after 90 minutes and, if still level, the we're into penalty kicks.

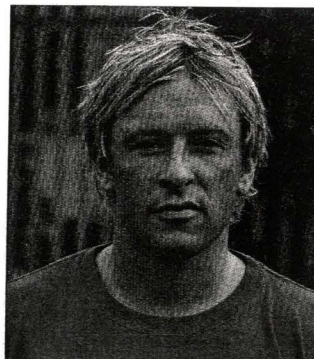

The newcomer quickly gained recognition from the Tayside Juniors' Under 23 team selectors, when, along with Allan Ramsay, he won a place in the side which lifted the Scottish Under 23 Cup with a win over the Central Region in September of that season.

Remarkable record

Barry had a remarkable record in his one season at The Canniepairt. In 33 games, incredibly, he was on the losing side on only two occasions, 1-0 and 2-1 cup tie defeats from a St Josephs side doing their utmost to wrest from 'Port, the mantle of Tayside's No.1.

Barry's best spell came in the autumn of that year when he scored in five games out of six.

He played three times against Kinnoull, the team for which he now plays, winning 4-0, 6-0 and 7-0. The other Perth based side, Jeanfield Swifts, didn't fare any better against Barry's 'Port, losing 5-0 in the game which sparked off the youngster's goal scoring run mentioned above.

Since leaving the Canniepairt seven years ago, Barry has moved on and travelled the globe. He has been in the USA and also played in New Zealand for a season. But he's back on home soil now, turning in decent performances for Kinnoull as the Tulloch Park club bids to become the first Perth club to taste Super League football.

an extract from Meadowbank Thistle's (now Livingston) programme v Kilmarnock on
8th April 1989 which features Tayport assistant manager Stewart Williamson

This Is My Dog Fight

says Stewart Williamson

When club captain Grant Tierney was transferred to Dunfermline Athletic for a record fee, manager Terry Christie moved fast to secure the services of John Inglis as a replacement for £30,000. Yet after just four games John found himself displaced by a player who has since excelled in the number five jersey. STEWART WILLIAMSON has spent three months proving himself an able centre half, a role which he claims is somewhat alien to him.

"I'd played centre half three times before," he reveals. "Terry asked me how I felt about playing centre half and I said if he gave me a strip I'd play anywhere. The rest, as they say, is history. I've been quite lucky because Watty just talks you through games. He's been a big help to me."

Modesty prevents him saying so, but Stewart's performances in the heart of the defence could prompt many to nominate him as a candidate for the Player of the Year award. Stewart is merely prepared to admit his performances have been 'okay'. "I suppose if they were bad then Terry would have dropped me out the team," he adds.

Longer-established Thistle supporters will recall that Stewart is no stranger to playing centre half for us. One of his previous experiences in that position was in a one-off trial for us here against Stirling Albion in May 1982. "There's a wee story to that. I don't know if Peter Godfrey was working or what but Thistle were short of a player so they phoned Billy Brown, the manager of Musselburgh. He phoned but couldn't get hold of me. So he went up the town hunting for me. This was on the Saturday morning but he eventually got hold of me at one o'clock. I jumped at the chance to play. We lost 1-0 unfortunately although I quite enjoyed it. Terry said he would have signed me then but I think he was looking for someone with a bit more experience.

"That was one of my first Senior trials. Actually it was my first if you exclude the week I was at Dundee United for full time training. I was 16 at the time and didn't think I was good enough. I played a few trials with East Fife then Cowdenbeath. Hibs wanted me to go on trial but Cowdenbeath offered me signing terms.

"I was at Cowdenbeath for six seasons in all. Six seasons and about nine managers! I quite enjoyed it. It was a good experience. I was captain there

for a few games in my first full season but John Clark took all the responsibility off me when he became manager. I was also the captain for the three seasons before I left."

One of the highlights of his career came during his spell at Central Park when Cowden twice held Hearts to draws in the 1983/84 League Cup tournament. "If there had been an away goals rule we'd have won," he reflects. "0-0 in the first leg at Cowdenbeath on the Wednesday night and 1-1 after extra time in the return at Tynecastle. We lost an early goal but survived a lot of pressure to equalise only to lose on penalties. I've got a few fond memories of the Tynecastle game - I gave away a silly penalty (which John Robertson missed) and got booked as well for hitting one of my new team mates, Donald Park! These games were a good experience for me."

The deal which brought Stewart from Central Park was a protracted one which dragged on for almost all of last summer. "I got into a wee conflict with Cowdenbeath but it turned out well in the end," says Stewart of the move which cost Thistle £4,000 plus top-scoring striker Allan McGonigal. "The challenge brought me to Meadowbank more than anything else. To see if I was good enough to play in the First Division. I love to win, I hate losing, I always give 110% every game but it just wasn't working out for me at Cowdenbeath. I don't think I played very well for my last two seasons with them. When Meadowbank came in for me I jumped at the chance."

During the course of the interview with Stewart he continually used the phrase "we're too good to go down" with regard to our short-term fortunes. "I can honestly say I'm used to this sort of position because the team I've always played with has been down at the bottom. I've been in a few bad teams with Cowdenbeath and this is my dog fight. We're too good to go down. I keep saying that but if I didn't believe that I wouldn't be here. This is a transitional period for Meadowbank and if we can get over this season I think we'll be pushing for honours next season.

"I'm out trying to impress every week. Not just scouts, I'm trying to impress the management so I can get a game the following week. I'll be out there giving 110% every week. It took me six years to get out of the Second Division and I don't want to go right back there."
