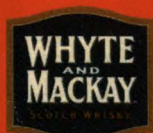

Following the mightily impressive 5-1 demolition of Camelon, at Carmuir Park, Tayport were back on the Canniepairt a fortnight ago, hosting Kinnoull. As was expected, 'Port won the Dugout Cup tie, but progress to this inter-regional semi-final was by no means smooth.

The performance was mediocre, at best, although Gary Middleton's 55th minute penalty looked likely to earn a less than exciting 1-0 win. In injury-time, however, John Ward tangled with an opponent, at great cost. A red card and a penalty were the punishments, and 'Noull scored from the spot to force extra-time.

During the additional half hour, Brian Livie stepped into the limelight, with two vital goals, one of which demonstrated his pace, the other his blistering power. Unfortunately, the major talking point was the fact that Tayport finished with eight men. Scott Peters and Ross Gunnion both walked, for dissent.

Just as it is true that many teams raise their game against Tayport, so

do some referees endeavour to raise their profile. If the same standards were applied across the board, week in, week out, the number of red cards issued would reach ludicrous levels. This said, too many 'Port players have been dismissed lately, and it can't all be down to the match officials.

Anyway, the eight men won through, 3-2, after conceding a late header, and so to the Warout, and Super League action. Ralph Hunter managed to score his first of the season, only for Graham Gartshore to equalise soon after.

Derek Wemyss put the visitors back in the driving seat, with a back-post header, and Duncan Bruce kept them there, with a 75th minute penalty save.

Scott Peters rounded off what must have been a pleasing victory for Keith Burgess, showing remarkable composure in his finish, after having burst forward from midfield.

Cup football returns to the agenda this afternoon, then again on Friday evening. There will be drama aplenty this week.

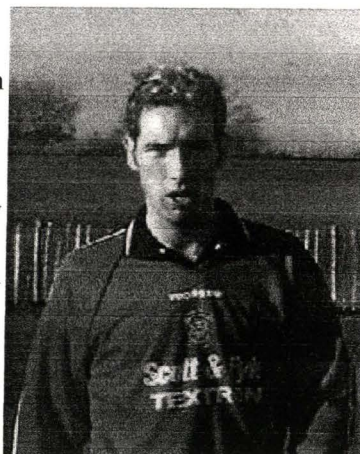

Tayport FC received an apology from Kinnoull FC following our last home game. You may recall the item in the last programme which noted that Lochee Harp had been scolded by the East Region powers that be for not partaking of the hospitality offered them by Newburgh. Well, Kinnoull - at least the manager and players - did the same. What was worse, the manager and his men sat in their bus outside the Tayport Arms eating crisps from the Co-op whilst their committee enjoyed a cool pint, a buffet and a natter in the comfort of the pub. To their great credit, the Kinnoull committee condemned the bewildering actions of their manager and players and phoned Tayport on Sunday to offer an apology.

TAYPORT v MONTROSE

A POTTED HISTORY

- First meeting was October 1994 when Tayport won 3-0 on the Canniepairt in the North/Tayside Cup
- One of the scorers that day was Mike Gray, a Crail lad, who had a relatively short stay at Tayport, playing 21 games.
- The teams have met previously on 14 occasions, 7 at home 7 away
- The biggest attendance, 208, witnessed the biggest winning margin between the sides, 8-0 in April 1996 in a league match.
- The lowest attendance between the sides was 69 for a league game at Broomfield in January 1996 Brrrr
- The lowest attendance at Canniepairt was 99 for a DJ Laing cup tie in April 2001
- It took Montrose eleven games to score their first ever goal against Tayport, in a 2-1 Findlay Cup defeat at Broomfield in March 2002
- The only time to date that Montrose have avoided defeat in the 14 games between the sides, was the 1-1 draw in the Herschell Trophy match at Montrose in 2002. Tayport won the penalty shoot-out.
- Tayport have scored 51 goals to Montrose's 2 in the fourteen previous fixtures between the clubs
- Dave Reilly, with six goals, is Tayport's top scorer in games between the sides.
- 24 different players have scored for Tayport in matches against Montrose
- Before today Montrose were still looking for their first goal on the Canniepairt.
- There are no players who have played for both clubs
- Dave Reilly, who could be on today, has scored the only hat-trick in matches between the clubs, back in March 1995
- Six of Tayport's current squad have found the mark v Montrose, D.Reilly, Peters, Paterson, Ramsay, McNaughton and Ward

Montrose Roselea arrive here this afternoon in the rudest of health. Indeed a visit to the Canniepairt could never be less daunting for a side enjoying one of their best ever spells of form at this level. Although less than half way through their Tayside Premier League programme, the Broomfield Park side are currently best placed for a step up into Super League football for next season. Semi-finalists in the Dugout North/Tayside Cup (we meet at Montrose on 7th May) and are bidding for a semi-final place today in another Regional competition.

If that's not sufficiently impressive, throw in the fact that they've won eleven of their last 13 games and are this afternoon defending a 100% record away from home in 2005. But what should sound the most chilling warning that Roselea are not a side to be underestimated this season, is the fact that they have already taken two impressive scalps from their two previous visits to Fife this year, Redwood wins at Oakley United and Glenrothes in rounds 2 and 3.

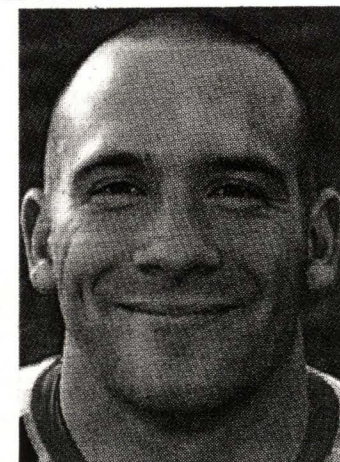
Montrose's management duo of Dave Balfour and Roy Gill, had a hard act to follow when the long serving Mike Simpson retired at the end of last season. The new men at the helm required a sizeable pool to sustain their challenge this season following a quite dreadful injury list earlier in the season. Included amongst the recruits at the turn of the year, were two talented players from the Aberdeenshire amateur ranks, striker Jai Clayton and midfielder Wayne Keith.

Although the goals have been fairly well shared out this season, Chris Masson and Eric Watson have been getting their share. Chris Simpson (pictured) is just back from injury to add a further goal threat.

Montrose warmed up for today with a 5-0 win at home to Blairgowrie last week, Scott Findlater getting a double and, although red carded last week, Eric Watson is available for today, his offence being a double yellow.

Suspension will, however, rule out John Ward for a second week, but Ross Gunnion returns. Frazer Fitzpatrick, Grant Paterson, Gareth Dailly, Robbie Henderson, Sean Christie, Dave Reilly and Gus Malone were also absentees last Saturday at Glenrothes but could all be in contention for a jersey this afternoon.

TAYPORT'S GREATEST EVER SON?

He never played for Tayport FC and probably never saw Tayport FC play but he was born in Tayport and passed away a couple of weeks ago.

Colonel Gordon Russell Simpson was born in Tayport on January 2 1917 and, to warrant a full page obituary in *The Times* last week, he must surely be one of Tayport's most famous ever sons.

After seeing first light of day in sleepy wee Tayport, Gordon Simpson became a war hero, chairman of the Edinburgh Stock Exchange and later, the chairman of the General Accident Corporation.

During the Second World War, Gordon Simpson won two DSOs as a tank commander in Italy, during 1944 & 1945, and was instrumental in securing one of the few bridges over the Arno at Florence which wasn't blown up by the Germans.

AN IMPORTANT GAME FOR BOTH TEAMS

Montrose Roselea's visit to the Canniepairt this afternoon is something of a unique occasion, the Broomfield Park side having played this fixture here only six weeks ago. Unfortunately Referee McCorquodale called the event to a premature halt at half time on that occasion because of weather conditions - the first time a game has ever been abandoned on the Canniepairt.

Tayport led 1-0 through a Jackie Devine goal at the time the game was abandoned but the goal and the scoreline have been scrubbed from the records and we start all over again, level at 0-0.

We've both had five games since then. Roselea went down 0-2 to Forfar West End in the PA Cup, drew 2-2 at home to Kinnoull, went down 1-0 at Harp and lost 1-5 at home to Downfield, all in the league before coming good last Saturday with a 4-2 win at Jeanfield Swifts in the Whyte & Mackay Cup.

In contrast we went down for the first time this season at home last Saturday and will be determined to bounce back with a win this week. Defeats at home haven't been too frequent, indeed a 0-1 defeat from Forfar Albion in September 1992 has been the only occasion to date on which we have lost out in 48 Division One matches on the Canniepairt since being promoted in 1991.

Montrose have completed their home league programme and after this afternoon have only to travel to Lochee United and Carnoustie. Two points today would confirm Montrose's first division safety although, in reality, they look fairly safe now. 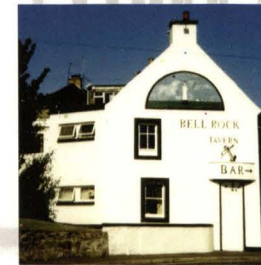

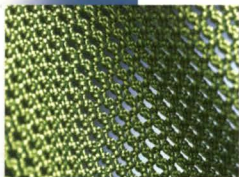
