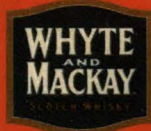

TAYPORT v LINLITHGOW ROSE

Deposed Super League champions Linlithgow Rose are our opponents this afternoon as the clubs go head to head in an attempt to secure the league runners-up spot. This is Rose's penultimate Super League fixture, their final game is away to Bathgate, who, incidentally, are also our last game opponents, on the Canniepairt on 18th June.

It's basically winner takes all this afternoon. Indeed, if either Rose or Tayport win their final fixtures, then they will finish runners-up to Lochee. A draw today would be more to Tayport's advantage than their opponents, as 'Port have two home games to go. Lithgae, though, would have the benefit of the points in the bag.

When the sides met in the Super League in November at Prestonfield, the Edinburgh Evening News had the following to say "when Linlithgow Rose and Tayport go head to head, there tends to be fireworks...and the latest clash of the junior football giants didn't disappoint". Rose lost their composure that afternoon, with three of their players sent for an early shower by referee Colin Brown. Rose boss Jim Sinnet didn't agree with the ref that day, but the referee supervisor must have. Mr Brown was this week promoted to the SFA's Senior list!

By recent standards, Rose fans will see this season as a disappointment, and as usual in such circumstances, there have been rumours that the Sinnet jacket is on a shoogly nail. As usual, the rumours look to be well wide of the mark.

On Wednesday this week, Rose confirmed their standing in the East Region by reaching the final of the Kia East of Scotland Cup

with a thrilling 4-3 win over St Andrews United, and now meet Newtongrange Star in the final a week today. Nitten beat Bathgate 2-0 in the other semi-final. Colin Allison was the Prestonfield hero with a hat-trick. Stuart McArthur netted the other goal.

Tayport hoped to get some action behind them on Wednesday evening but their cup-tie at Violet was postponed. Manager Burgess was set to select those players who hadn't been in action at Tannadice on Sunday but whether he sticks with that plan today remains to be seen.

Regardless, there is no doubt there will be changes, Brian Livie, for example, is unavailable. Referee today is Mr Terry Brunton, who was in the media spotlight last month following the incident which saw North End boss Gary Strachan banned from football for ten years.

Rarely, if ever, can the Junior game have the local press, **The Courier, Evening Telegraph and Fife Herald** was excellent, as was the coverage in the **Daily Record and Sun**. **The Record** and the **Tele** both had pretty comprehensive supplements which provided interesting reading. The **Fife Herald** provided an in depth preview and coverage over three pages.

But, oh dear, what about **Archie McPherson**? It's perhaps churlish to criticise when the guy probably only sees a few Junior teams a season, but didn't he come away with some nonsense at times. Let's face it, there's no excuse for getting Patty and Wardy mixed up! **Archie** probably thinks he's too long in the tooth to be doing homework, but that was where he fell down on Sunday - lack of preparation.

The profile of the Juniors was given a further boost with the pre-final comments from SFA supremo David Taylor, that he felt the top Junior clubs should play in the qualifying rounds of the Tennents Scottish Cup. Newspapers, such as the **Sunday Express**, not noted for addressing Junior issues, picked up on the story.

However it was all in vain, with the tail wagging the dog at Wednesday's SFA meeting and the proposal failing to get sufficient votes. Tayport boss Keith Burgess didn't pull his punches in a **Daily Record** article on Thursday, reporter Gordon Parks describing Keith as 'damning in his assessment of the verdict'. SJFA secretary Tom Johnston, too, was scathing in his comments saying, 'we cannot legislate for the self interest of clubs'.

But, back to the Final. The build up in

the local press, **The Courier, Evening Telegraph and Fife Herald** was excellent, as was the coverage in the **Daily Record and Sun**. **The Record** and the **Tele** both had pretty comprehensive supplements which provided interesting reading. The **Fife Herald** provided an in depth preview and coverage over three pages.

It all helped the big match build up, but it was the reported comments of Lochee boss Eddie Wolecki which raised the pre-match temperature and which were alluded to by the STV commentary team and journalists in the Saturday and Sunday press.

In **The Sun** (28 May) Eddie stated "We know all their players and things like set pieces inside out". Dismissing the stick that saw him branded as arrogant, Eddie responded "I don't care, but I think it's more confidence than arrogance".

The Final itself was well covered by the press. The locals and the tabloids had their usual pretty comprehensive coverage, but it was the national broadsheets which gave the Junior game's profile a major boost. **The Scotsman, Herald** and even the **Daily Telegraph** gave the Final prominent coverage. Neil Drysdale in **The Herald** had John Ward as his top man. Describing Wardy as 'an absolute rock of solidity', he added 'he [John] oozed assurance, and if I may be allowed to borrow from a famous Dundonian's tribute to another, less worthy character: Sir, I salute your indefatigability and fortitude'. **The Herald** spoiled things, though by putting in a library photo of some other footballer.

SNIFFING ABOUT THE O.V.D. CUP FINAL WITH THE SNOOT



Is it a record? Knocked out in the first round of the OVD Cup but a winner in Sunday's Final. That's Tayport boss Keith Burgess and his assistant Stewart Williamson. The Tayport management duo were in charge of Glenrothes for the first round of this season's competition and, when they went out to Sauchie after a replay, being in charge of a winning side at Tannadice come the end of May would have been furthest from their minds. Funny old game football!

When the OVD Cup arrived in the Bellrock Tavern on Sunday night, the outpouring of joy and cheering was such, that regulars had heard nothing like it before. It seemed like the roof would come off, said one punter.

Radio Scotland's '90 minutes' host, Jim Spence was in Tayport on Monday afternoon, recording interviews in the Tayport Arms for that evening's programme. After interviewing Tam Maloney and Roddy McCafferty, Jim spoke with the club secretary and some of the players who had gathered for an impromptu barbecue in the beer garden, to reflect on the previous day's triumph.

It was probably quite appropriate that Tony Christie was belting out 'Amarillo' on the Tannadice PA system as the final whistle sounded at Tannadice. Tony holds the distinction of the only person to have been No 1 in the pop charts who has had a pint in the Tayport Arms. That's something the Beatles and Elvis Presley never managed! For the record, Tony popped in for a pint of Tennent's Lager in March 1976.

The Tayport chairman, vice-chairman and secretary took in the St Andrews United v Hill of Beath match on Monday evening and the first person they met was Lochee manager Eddie Wolecki and his adviser Malcolm McFadyen. Eddie conceded that the gamble of playing Thompson, Thomson and Durno, whilst not fully fit, had not come off. Unmoved by the stick he had taken in the media, Eddie felt that the occasion had got to his players, despite his efforts to deflect the pre match attention on to himself.

There was almost universal praise for the manner in which the Tayside Police (mind you, there were plenty of them!) had handled the event, and also for the Dundee United staff who proved to be extremely efficient and helpful.

It wasn't only the footballers that were training on the East Common a week past Thursday. Members of the Tayport Instrumental Band were also going through their paces on the Common that evening, in preparation for leading the victory parade on Sunday evening. Their practice was not in vain and we record our appreciation of their efforts.

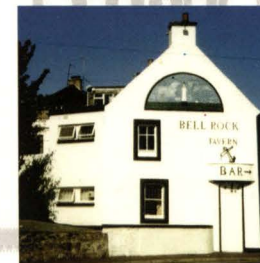
