

TODAY'S GAME

WHYTE and MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE ROUND 3 - HOME MATCH No. 2 TAYPORT v BONNYRIGG ROSE ATHLETIC

Bonnyrigg Rose's last minute goal when the sides met in April at New Dundas Park, not only ended Tayport's proud 20 game unbeaten away record which had stood since the inauguration of the Super League, but also provided an ultimately fatal blow to Port's hopes of regaining the Super League title.

Sean Grady's goal gave inconsistent Rose the three points and a glimmer of hope of winning the title themselves. As it transpired, Bonnyrigg finished level on points with Linlithgow and Tayport, but with a backlog of games to catch up and a better goal difference, Linlithgow, at least, were always going to pip Bonnyrigg. Tayport pipped them too, as it happened. However, it shouldn't be forgotten that Bonnyrigg had a very good season and could justifiably be pleased with matching the points of the champions and runners-up.

All this serves to illustrate that Bonnyrigg will be looking to build on that success and, as such, will be difficult opponents this afternoon.

The ambition of Bonnyrigg in this regard can be shown by their close season recruitments including the acquisition of John Elliott from Tayport in the close season. Chalkie's form at Tayport was, it is probably fair to say, somewhat inconsistent but he did turn in some pretty impressive performances, not least the NCR Cup Final win over Lochee United when he was voted man of the match. Travelling through to Tayport from his home in Bonnyrigg, for matches and training twice per week was a pretty tall order, but Chalkie, to his credit, never flinched at this commitment.

After the experience of Arniston last week, when Ben Honeyman, who was Chalkie's travelling companion for much of last season, netted the late equaliser, home fans will be hoping that John does not come back to haunt his former teammates in similar fashion.

Bonnyrigg opened the 2004/5 campaign in good style with a win over Carnoustie at the new Laing Park, but must have sorely disappointed their home crowd by failing to build on that start, losing 0-3 to Glenrothes.

The loss of central defender Ally Reid, who sustained a broken leg at Carnoustie, can't have helped the Bonnyrigg cause. A further blow to the defensive strategy was created with the withdrawal from last week's game of Tom Graham with a torn hamstring. Also missing today through injury are likely to be Danny Kelly, a midfield player signed from Edinburgh United, and defender James Morrice.

TODAY'S GAME (continued)

As well as Chalkie (pictured), Rose manager Pat McGlynn has fixed up Max Christie, a midfielder, from Alloa Athletic, central defender Jamie Ewart from East of Scotland kingpins Whitehill Welfare and, from the same League, Gary Kennedy, a left sided midfield player from Craigroyston. Bringing the pool up to a strength of 23 are Craig Valentine, a defender from Alloa and Dean Walker from Kelty Hearts. Utility player Dean was the man who, through no fault of

his own, was at the centre of last season's reinstatement fiasco which effectively cost Hearts their place in the Super League.

Regardless of the inconsistency which has cost them points in the past, Bonnyrigg always carry a goal threat through the Super League's top scorer for the past two seasons, Steve Laidlaw, Lee Bailey and John Harvey. There's always back up in the striking department from veteran ex-Dundee striker Graham Harvey (no relation) who also has a coaching role with Rose.



Sean Grady weighs in with his share of goals from a midfield or wing back position and there's experience in midfield in the shape of ex-Brechin City player Paul Riley. Last line of defence for the visitors today will be international keeper Steve Ellison.

Tayport line-up this afternoon without key defenders Grant Paterson and Roberto Morris, both suspended. Ralph Hunter and Kevin Heenan will be missing through injury. Scott Peters' business activities mean that he is still unavailable and that situation is likely to remain unchanged for the foreseeable future.

Dave Reilly's goal last week should see him start today's game and there could well be places in the starting line-up for last week's substitutes, Craik, Henry and Stewart.

It may be only three games into the season, but it's a big game for both teams who have aspirations to be there or thereabout in nine months time.

This weekend sees the transfer window closing. Thereafter, until January, clubs will be restricted in their transfer market activities.

It is known that Dave Baikie has made one or two enquiries and there could be development in this regard.

In charge today is Mr Gilfillan who, in four games during last season, collected twenty two Tayport names in his wee book. It would be nice to think that he was able to keep the cards in his pocket on this occasion. Time will tell.

It's no real surprise that after the opening two games of the campaign, only one side has full points. And to achieve this lofty perch, **BO'NESS** have beaten the OVD finalists in successive weeks. Manager Jimmy Sanderson is chuffed with his start, saying "we have a good squad this season and they are playing the style I want them to play. It was important we won because, had we lost, people would say last week's result [at **TAYPORT**] was just a flash in the pan". Against **CARNOUSTIE**, before a healthy attendance at Newtown Park, two goals from John Martin and a free kick from Scott Murphy had the BUs 3-0 ahead before Steven McAllister notched a consolation for the Gowfers.

BATHGATE are again demonstrating good early season form. Despite going a goal behind and losing hat-trickster of the previous week, Barry Elliot, through injury early on, they followed up a good opening day win over Oakley by taking a point against LOCHEE UNITED at Thomson Park, although Thistle's penalty equaliser from Colin McKinnon was undoubtedly dubious. Lochee impressed their opponents, however, with a Bathgate observer describing them as an excellent looking side, playing some quite delightful football.

Whilst we were being rocked by a late equaliser at **ARNISTON**, three miles down the road at **BONNYRIGG**, **GLENROTHES** were carving out the result of the day, beating the home side by a convincing 3-0. Bonnyrigg had their moments but Glens' keeper Clive Guppy was in inspired form behind a defence which has been strengthened by the addition of Ian Brown who was a first team regular with Raith Rovers last term. It was a result which saw Wm Hill's bring Glens title chances in from 33/1 to 12/1.

THORNTON HIBS unfurled the Fife District title flag before their game with Super League champs **LINLITHGOW ROSE**. Hibs then had the temerity to take the lead but Rose demonstrated the gulf currently between the sides by taking control to eventually run out winners by 4-1.

Although under the cosh for the early part of their game at OAKLEY, managerless CAMELON rode the storm to take control and post their first win of the campaign, sealing a 2-0 win with a last minute goal from Stewart Malcolm. Carmuirs Park had grabbed the headlines during the early part of the week following the dismissal of manager Jim Hardie. Hardie had taken the Mariners to last season's Lothians title but the axe had already been sharpened and one game into this season, a 1-1 draw at home to Thornton, was sufficient for the chopper to be brought out of the locker.

Hardie, probably quite understandably, was not a happy chappy, according to reports. Apparently the decision to part company had been precipitated by a bust up at half-time in the Thornton game when midfielder Gareth Alexander had walked out.

There seems little to inspire this week's column, as Tayport sit with

a meagre tally of one point, after two Whyte & Mackay East Super League fixtures. Just as was the case last year, 'Port opened with a defeat, at home. Bo'ness did the damage on this occasion, scoring in the first half through the talented Kevin Donnelly. John Ward's penalty leveller looked like setting the stage for a comeback, but it was not to be, with Maltese Internationalist Simon Vella heading a late winner. Only then did the true impact of the Roberto Morris dismissal become apparent.

The defender's subsequent suspension also played a role last weekend, when a somewhat depleted squad headed to Gorebridge. 'Port drew their first away game of 2003/04, having taken a second half lead. On Saturday, it was déjà vu, all over again, as Arniston grabbed a share of the spoils in a forgettable encounter. The only highlight for the visitors was Dave Reilly's 366th goal for the club, a header from a Steven Stewart cross.

Ironically, the Arniston equaliser came from another familiar face. Ben Honeyman's Canniepairt career, though, is in total contrast to that of Reilly, yet the striker came off the bench to attain hero status at his new club, with an 88th minute strike.

In terms of the match as a whole, Arniston were a threat, just as Bonnyrigg will be this afternoon. The shock 3-0 reversal at the hands of Glenrothes was surely a blip for the New Dundas Park side. Their two wins against Tayport last season give more of an indication of what will happen if Dave Baikie's outfit are not at their best.

To say I'm disappointed with our performance last weekend is an understatement. I think I would have to cast my mind back many years to recall a poorer display, especially in that first period. We failed to keep the ball and rarely penetrated and, when Arniston were in possession, we were, quite simply, "off the pace". Fortunately they failed to capitalise on our shortcomings. We did improve in the second half but never enough to warrant victory.

I said, prior to the game with Bo'ness, that I believe preparation has such a vital part to play within a successful football club and it was plainly evident in that first half that we lacked that. For various reasons, we started the game with four players who missed training and two players on the bench who'd just returned from holiday. That coupled with suspensions and injuries didn't help matters.

So, we've began our league campaign as we did last term, with one point from two games which isn't good enough, but we are where we are. A victory today will improve our position greatly. That's got to be our focus this afternoon.

I'd like to welcome the players and officials of Bonnyrigg Rose to the Canniepairt this afternoon. I don't need to remind you, and our players, of the last game with Bonnyrigg at Tayport. It will be recalled that Paterson and Christie were sent off within a two minute period prior to half-time.

Thereafter, in that game, the players performed magnificently only to be denied a stonewall penalty to win the game, then to lost the game to a penalty at the death.

As in the Bo'ness game, indiscipline lost us the match, so it's vital that our discipline is immaculate and when we do that, coupled to a workrate which the remaining players produced on both occasions, we can achieve success and three points this afternoon.

THIRTY SIX YEARS AGO AUGUST 1968

Back in 1968, Tayport FC ran two amateur teams in the Midlands AFA. At the start of that season, there were an amazing 38 players on the books and all bar four stayed in Tayport. Tayport didn't have as big a population at that time but such was the interest in kicking a ball about on the East Common, there was little need to bring in 'imports' to field two teams weekly. Thirty six years on, only one of the thirty eight is sadly no longer with us - Kenny Gorham.

For the record those listed as players for that season were Murray Anderson, Dennis Auld, Davie Ayre, Ian Bell, Alan Brown, George Bryson, Phil Callander, Stan Cowe, Jimmy Foulis, Andy Fraser, Brian Ferns, Kenny Gorham, Dave Hastie, Dougie Henderson, Andy Horan, Fred Janssen, Andy Johnstone, Graeme Johnstone, David Johnstone, Walter Kemp, Ronnie Laing, Ian Mackie, Derek McRobbie, Jim Mathers, Ian Mathers, Abby Oswald, Ian Pattie, Dick Pearce, Ron Redpath, Richard Redpath, George Redpath (yes, our most recent Platinum member), Chic Rennie, George Ritchie, Dougie Ross, Jim Scott, Donald Wallace, Raymond White and Ian White

Inevitably, by the end of the season, many of the players were no longer involved and some new faces had come in, for example Eddie Stewart, the club's present chairman, who was transferred from Wormit, Davie Ure, from the RAF and Maurice Flynn.

There was no team manager in those days and the teams were selected by a selection committee. The selection committee at the start of the season comprised Tammy Laing, Abby Walker, Jim Heggie, Ally Doctor and Jock Crawford. However, by the end of the season, only Walker and Laing were left pulling the strings.

There was a 'coach and trainer' - RAF Sergeant Keith Wort. To allow him to take training the secretary had to persuade his girlfriend to babysit, by a strange twist of fate, in the house now occupied by the secretary.

The club chairman was Fred Janssen, the secretary, as now, was Abby Oswald and the treasurer was Phil Callander. The rest of the committee comprised Ian Bell, Ronnie Laing and Dougie Henderson. Responsible for fund raising were Fred Janssen and George Redpath.


