

" FIVE GOALS CONCEDED IN TWO GAMES IS MOST UN-TAYPORTLIKE"

says DUNMORE

On the face of it, seven goals in two away fixtures would normally be seen as an indication of winning form. The concession of five, however, is most unlike the Tayport we know and love.

There was something of an escape at Simpson Park on Saturday, after Jeanfield had taken a potentially giant-killing lead, in the North/Tayside Dugout Cup. Gary Middleton's fortuitous goal on the stroke of half-time proved vital, and once Robbie Henderson equalised, with his first goal for the club, there was only going to be one winner. John Ward maintained hero-status, by forcing Tayport ahead, while Henderson capped an encouraging second half display with a neat header. At least Saturday provided a win; sadly lacking in the Super League. Three weeks ago, Bonnyrigg were allowed back into the game, via a needlessly conceded penalty, after Ward, (who else?) had headed an opening goal.

The trip to Thornton's Memorial Park, one week later, was billed as Tayport's opportunity to get back to winning ways. All had seemed well at the break: the visitors two up, through a Dave Reilly header and a fine Middleton strike. What followed, though, was almost beyond belief. The locals knew their pitch and made the most of that advantage, surging forward to net twice in the space of a minute, at the start of the second period, to stun their opponents and their opponents' supporters.

Much relief greeted Wardy's "winner". Unfortunately, defeat was not on Thornton's agenda and back they came, again, notching the afternoon's sixth goal, in the final minute of what neutrals would have described as a thrilling encounter.

The Mark Ness counter represented a crushing blow to Tayport's morale. A win today, however, against Lochee United, would have totally the opposite effect.

It's as near a local derby as we are going to get in this season's Super League when our neighbours from across the water call this afternoon. Lochee arrive with an enhanced reputation which has been earned with some splendid performances over the past twelve months. Not splendid enough to pick up either of the 'big two' but sufficient, nevertheless, to lift the Redwood Leisure Trophy. Manager Wolecki will be well aware that a lack of consistency has been his side's Achilles heel.

The defeat at home to Bonnyrigg last Saturday would not have been in the manager's script and he will be anxious to get his side back into a winning vein to maintain his title challenge. The Dundee side lost Steve Leahy and Callum Hardie from last season's squad. Both are in America. Into the pool this season come midfielder Paul Durno from Arbroath, defender Gary Davidson (Newburgh), midfielder Colin Watson (amateurs) and left-back Graham Thomson (Montrose). In additioin there have been the high profile signings from the Seniors, Andy Dow (Aberdeen, Chelsea) and Philip Hagen (Raith Rovers). Ex-Violet player Hagen came on as substitute last week but is likely to start today.

As ever, the key player for Lochee will be ex-Tannadice star Ray McKinnon and the main goal threat comes from Kris Ward and Ross Kiddie. Kiddie, it will be recalled, opened the campaign with a brace of goals which downed champions Linlithgow in their first game in defence of the Super League title. Rock at the back will be Jon Thompson and his aerial tussles at both ends with John Ward should be a feature of this afternoon's play.

Tayport will show changes from the side which won in Perth last week with a place likely to be found for Scott Peters who is back in training. Gareth Dailly took a knock which necessitated his substitution at Jeanfield but he should have recovered and be available.

A host of would be starters -Wemyss, Craik, McNaughton, Gunnion, Henry, Christie and Livie - had to cool their heels on the bench last week. All will fancy their chances of getting a starting jersey today.

Robbie Holden has been sold to North End but, contrary to reports, Kevin Heenan has not signed for the Dokens and remains with Port, although he is still injured.



Media matters

The FIFE HERALD (10/9/04) added bit of colour to its back page report of the Thornton Hibs game with the match report illustrated by two action photos from Memorial Park. The report, too, was pretty colourful with adjectives such as 'crazy', 'utter disbelief' and 'shambolic' peppering the account of Port's 3-3 Super League draw at Thornton.

The EVENING TELEGRAPH (10/09/04) reported that the top scorer in the Whyte & Mackay Super League will receive the Dave Mitchell Memorial Trophy, which has presented to the East Association by the former Lochee United stalwart's widow.

The two Sunday tabloids, the **POST** and the **MAIL**, continue to provide vastly different coverage of the Junior game. The **SUNDAY MAIL** had six match reports and the feature was supported by a pic from the Kilwinning v Pollok game. Both Tayport and Lochee games were featured. The results page carried all the Junior results, with the exception of those from the North Region, in a clear and well structured manner.

The SUNDAY POST results panel was, quite frankly, a shambles with amateur results, East Senior results and Junior results all mixed up together. Six Junior games were reported, all featuring clubs from the former Tayside Region, including the Tayport and Lochee games.

The EVENING TELEGRAPH'S Monday Junior page provided good coverage of the games in the Dundee, Perth and Angus areas with a good balance of quotes, scorers, photos, results, fixtures and the Super League table.

According to the press last week, the Tayside/North Cup, seemingly overnight, become the Dugout Cup. However there was hardly a fanfare of trumpets or reams of glitzy press releases to announce that the competition, formerly known as the Zamoyski, North End Centenary, Concept and NCR Cups, had a new sponsor. There was a hint in one newspaper that the sponsor is something to do with a sports business up North but further information has been scarce.

Two former Tayport players from last season, travelling companions Ben Honeyman and Chalkie Elliott, have featured prominently in match reports since their departure from The Canniepairt.

The weekend newspapers were united in their praise of Elliott's match winning performance for Bonnyrigg against Lochee last week. Ben Honeyman, followed up his goalscoring sub appearance against Tayport the other week by doubling the dose the following week at Linlithgow. The following week, however, the EDINBURGH EVENING NEWS described Ben as having 'a very quiet game' as Arnie went down at home to league leaders Bathgate.

ROW THE AREANS

10 YEARS AGO - AUGUST 1994

In the late summer of 1994 Lochee United arrived at the Canniepairt as Second Division Champions and were destined to finish 3rd, after Tayport and St Josephs, in the Tayside A.T.& T. Division One in 1994/5. An appearance in the semi-final of the Scottish Junior Cup at Tannadice later that season, gave promise of greater things to come - but it was to be something of a false dawn, with the United unable to sustain the standards which they had set for themselves, and they have had to settle for mid-table mediocrity since.

On a fine afternoon on 27th August 1994 a crowd of 178 watched "...an absolutely cracking match which had everything—great goals, controversial refereeing, penalty conceded (by Sean Wilkie), two off (Mike Gray and Andy Sommerville) and a winner from Sean whilst down to 9 men. Phew!"

That's how the archives described Tayport's 3-2 victory with goals from Hamish Mackay(2) and Sean Wilkie.

In the Lochee line-up that afternoon were two players likely to be in Tayport colours this afternoon- Frazer Fitzpatrick and Jim Henry. No survivors from the Thomson Park squad here today but Tayport still have Paterson, Stewart and Reilly playing + Mel Irons on the coaching staff.

The teams lined up as follows - Tayport: F.Mann, G Miller, G. Paterson, M.Gray, A Sommerville, S.Wilkie, S.Stewart, G.Maher, H.Mackay, D.Reilly, E.Cameron. Subs J.Hunter and G.Irons.

Lochee United: F.Fitzpatrick, R.Mitchell, C.McNaught, R.Graham, G.Milne, S.Downs, J.Smith, R.Smith, J.Henry, M.V.DerToorn, C.Brown, A.Gallacher, W.Mearns.

The result kept Tayport at the top of the league with a better goal difference than St Josephs who also had full points from their opening three games.

The positions were unchanged 23 games later, with Port pipping Joeys for the title on goal difference. This was thanks in no small way to Lochee taking a point against the odds in an end of season 3-3 draw with Joeys which presented the championship to Tayport.

THE REVIEW

Carnoustie supreme Dave Laing will not take kindly to his Scottish Cup winners languishing at the foot of the league and, unless there is improvement shown soon, then we can no doubt expect changes.




