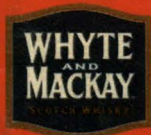

# TODAY'S GAME

**WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE Round 12  
TAYPORT v GLENROTHES**

This will be the third meeting of Port and Glens on Canniepairt where the visitors have the unique distinction of having a 100% league record, winning on both their previous visits to Tayport, 2-0 in the inaugural Super League season and by 2-1 last season.

It's a monkey that Tayport would gladly be happy to get off their back but, of course, today's encounter has been given added interest by the fact that, until four weeks ago, Tayport manager Keith Burgess and his assistant Stewart Williamson, were in charge at Glenrothes.

Into the hot seat at Glenrothes has come Peter McQuade who will be looking to get his Glenrothes Super League career off to a flier in the first league game under his stewardship here this afternoon. The new gaffer already has a win under his belt following the new town's 2-0 local cup win over Kirkcaldy YM last Saturday.

In terms of points dropped, Glenrothes are the best placed of all the clubs in the division to mount a Super League challenge. To do so, they have to win their games in hand, starting this afternoon. With convincing wins at Bonnyrigg and Oakley already this campaign, allied to their track record at Tayport, Glens will be confident of getting a result.

Although they have an adequate replacement in Gary Mitchell, the absence of keeper Clive Guppy, out with a broken arm for the last few weeks, has been a blow to the Warout side who will also be minus the talents of defender John Ovenstone who has recently been transferred to Alloa Athletic. The experienced Benny Andrew always provides a goal threat while Martin Grant, who has notched a number of goals from the penalty spot this season, is a threat in dead ball opportunities.

Tayport will be buoyed by their performance in the OVD Cup last week and the fans will be looking for more of the same. Nothing short of a win will do if the tenuous hold on a title challenge is not to disappear.

There was a refreshing attacking slant to Tayport's play against Formartine, a quality clearly appreciated by the Canniepairt faithful, with Craik, Middleton and Henderson all looking to cash in on the chances set up by Dailly, McNaughton and Peters. It's a milestone for John Ward who makes his 200th appearance for Tayport this afternoon.



## PORT PROG SPEAK TO KEITH BURGESS

Keith, this will be an interesting occasion for you this afternoon. What are your thoughts at meeting your former club so soon after leaving the Warout?

Well, we had to cross swords at least twice this season, so as far as I'm concerned, the quicker the better, then we can go our separate ways.

**You took Glenrothes from the Fife Regional League into the Super League and established them there. When did you take the post at Glens and what sort of squad did you inherit?**

I was appointed at the start of 2001/02 and inherited a team that had good players but perhaps lacked a little belief. They just needed one or two players in the right places and someone to organise them into a team with a bit of ambition.

**You brought them that belief and instilled the ambition?**

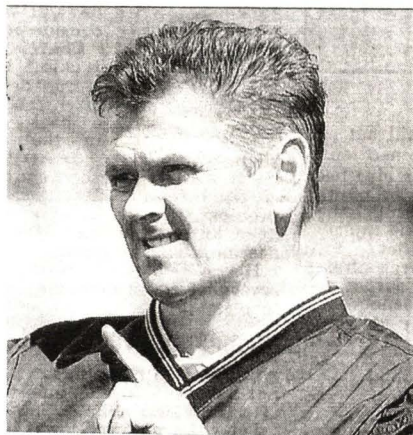
Midway through last campaign and into the start of this one, we were starting to believe that finally we were a force with which to be reckoned. Myself and Stewart were delighted with the start the team had made, reaching the dizzy heights of second place after 5 games. However financial restrictions and a lack of ambition by some of the committee gave us and the players the impression that the club were just happy to survive in the Super League with no thoughts of actually winning it.

**What were your thoughts when you became aware of Tayport's interest?**

I was absolutely delighted and knew, should I be offered the post, it would be hard to say no.

**In your time at Glens, you had a pretty good record against 'Port (2 wins, a draw and a 1-0 defeat in four Super League meetings) What do you put this success down to?**

Hard work and a new found desire by the players to be a force in the Junior game. We gave young players a chance to show what they could do. This, aligned to the fact that the more experienced players like Guppy, McPhee,



Andrew and Allan were taking more responsibility during the build up to each match.

**Did you know much about the Tayport, the town, before you moved to the Canniepairt?**

I'd only been here once before, playing for BT Scotland against the Scottish Fire Brigade at Canniepairt, after which we retired to Dave Baikie's pub, at the time, the Tayport Arms.

**Three games and a friendly played. What do you think of the show so far? Anything surprised you? Shocked you? Disappointed you? Pleased you?**

I'm a very positive person anyway, but, for me we've had a steady start but things have now gone up a gear as the season heads into the second half, and I think the last two outings have reflected that. What has surprised me most has been the whole positive mentality of the players, committee and supporters to see then team perform at the highest level every week. Disappointments? I was disappointed at not taking full points from the Carnoustie and Linlithgow games after playing them off the park. What's pleased me most has been the friendliness of the people of Tayport towards myself and Stewart. We knew that Dave Baikie was looked upon as 'Mr Tayport', but I think that the club is always bigger than the individuals within. I was also pleased by how hard the players work on the training ground. Shocked me? The amount of times I've had my photo taken by Jimmy Abernethy, Tayport's superfan!

**A bit about yourself now, You live and work in Edinburgh. Isn't the driving a chore?**

No. I just enjoy driving. It gives me time to think about the game before and after. Also if we've had a bad day, I can get all my frustrations out of the way before arriving home. I'm married to a gorgeous blonde called Sharon and we have two kids, Vanessa (11) and Olivia (7) who all love football.

**Hobbies?** I play a bit of golf, enjoy motor racing and love a night out with the boys.

**Stewart Williamson's your right hand man. When did that team become established?**

Stewart and I met and became best mates about 15 years ago when Stewart joined BT. He became my assistant at Glenrothes two years ago, after many years of trying to persuade him to take a step into coaching. We work, coach and socialise together, but most of all we trust each other in everything we do and, along with Derek Carr and Norrie Marshall, I believe we can achieve more of the success with which Tayport FC has been associated over the years.

### TAYPORT FC TAKES HEED OF EFFECTS OF GLOBAL WARMING WARNING

Sir David King, the Government's chief scientific adviser has confirmed reports that the Greenland ice-cap is melting and that parts of the ice-sheet had retreated by 30 feet in the last two years, compared with 10 feet between 1890 and 1950. We're being told to prepare 'for a complete realignment of the coastal zones'.

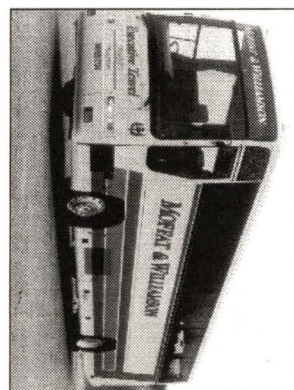

# SUPER LEAGUE

Although there was only one fixture last Saturday, the result, a 5-0 win for Bonnyrigg at Thornton Hibs, saw Tayport slip a place to fifth, Bonnyrigg moving into fourth top slot. Thornton remain fourth from the bottom but their goal difference is now the worst in the division. Thornton's defeat increases the pressure on the Memorial Park side to get a result at bottom place Arniston today.

Bonnyrigg, surprise winners at Thomson Park earlier this season, will be anxious to chalk up a double over Lochee United today to avoid the Dundee side stretching their lead at the top.

Linlithgow, at home to Carnoustie, will be hoping to take advantage of a Lochee slip-up in order to narrow the gap at the top. Carnoustie, however, are unbeaten in four and will not be daunted by the task which awaits them at Prestonfield.

Oakley go to Bo'ness and, although they had a good 4-1 OVD win at Tranent last week, the Blairwood Park boys will find the BUs a very different proposition.

There's only one league fixture, Arniston v Camelon, scheduled for Saturday week but there's a full card down for the 27th November when Tayport go to Bonnyrigg. If our league games today and on the 27th, go ahead as scheduled, we'll have played more league games at this stage of the season, than in any season since 1992/93.

The winning time was 2:09:27. The best 10k time was 30:33, best half split was 1:04:17 and the best 20ml split was 1:37:44.

The good news for Sean, apart from raising all that money for the National Kidney Fund, was that he finished 4hrs 26 seconds faster than the last home who came in on 9:59:58.

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to both sets of supporters for this very important Super League encounter, with both teams needing the points to maintain their challenge for the championship flag.

Today is obviously a strange game for Stewart and myself, with the visitors to the Caniepairst, our former charges, Glenrothes, who will add more than a little spice to the match.

We set out to be very offensive and had a game plan of attacking them down the flanks, where we thought they might be a little vulnerable, hoping that Dailly and McNaughton could take advantage of this possible weakness. This they did to great effect, creating the all-important first half goals.

More exciting football continued in the second period and we ran out worthy winners, although a dubious late penalty awarded for a John Ward challenge in our box, gave them a consolation goal.

We look forward to a favourable draw in the next round, but today's game is uppermost in our minds and we know that the Glenrothes players will be out to impress their new manager on his first Super League outing.

We have been more than happy with the way our current form has been gaining momentum and look forward to this afternoon's tough encounter. With similar backing to that which we received last week from the Tayport support, we know that we can deliver the results which are required to regain the league crown.

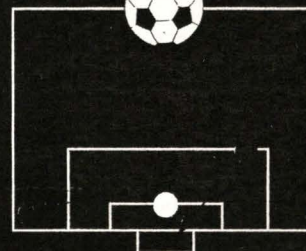

# media matters

*Offside* gave the Junior game its biggest exposure this week with the appearance of Lochee Harp's Davie Taylor in drag on Monday evening's programme (BBC 1). Whether it's the sort of exposure the Junior game would wish to attract, is another question.

The classic encounter at Prestonfield and the preview of last Saturday's OVD tie took up the back page of the *Fife Herald* last Friday (5/11). And quite a splash it was, too, complete with a good action shot (courtesy of the *Linlithgow Journal & Gazette*). Sharing images from newspapers which are members of the same publishing group has got to be applauded.

The *Linlithgow Journal* (5/11) had a colour action shot from the game in its report of the match. Reporter Vic Wood acknowledged that the Referee got most of the big decisions right and commented "The basic fact is that Tayport looked the likelier lot throughout".

The Journal reported that three supporters buses were heading for Forfar for Linlithgow's OVD tie at Forfar Albion.

I know we labour the point, but the *Sunday Post* continues to do itself no favours with its coverage of the Junior game. Clearly little thought goes into its presentation when, directly below the list of OVD results, is a piece of narrative which repeats around ten of the scorelines with no scorers or even comment. What a waste of space.

What isn't a waste of space, however, was *The Sun's* coverage of the Junior game on Monday. Tables, results and fixtures, match reports and photographs all compressed into reporter Scott Campbell's page. The Cumnock v Bellshill tie was the main attraction but there were several other matches covered. Bo'ness, we learned, had set a new club record with their 11-0 hammering of Lossiemouth United up on the Moray Firth at their Highland League neighbour's Grant Park. If there was to be any indication how seriously Bo'ness are taking the OVD Cup, it is the fact that the official party travelled up north on Friday and stayed overnight in Grantown-on-Spey.

Both Monday's *Evening Telegraph* and *Edinburgh Evening News* (Nov 8) had holders Carnoustie Panmure as their featured OVD match. The clubs agreed that the opening goal of the game, a penalty to Panmure, was "soft" in the *Tele* and "dubious" in the *News*. Manager Willie McGinlay was proud of his charges, however, saying "I was pleased with our performance. We knew it would be hard and the players will take a lot from this game..."
