

OVD Scottish Junior Cup 3rd Round Preview

Holders Carnoustie Panmure's grip on the cup will be put to the test this afternoon when Lochee United come calling. The press have been eulogising over Lochee's 'magnificent' football this season, so the Gowfers look to be doomed even before a ball is kicked....but football's a funny game. That said, it is hard to see the home side getting anything better than a replay. Cup favourites Linlithgow Rose travel west to Largs Thistle and would be well advised not to treat the locals lightly. Whether Auchinleck are still a force with which to be reckoned, will be determined by their tie at home v Bo'ness. The East Super team have the quality and experience to go all the way and there will be no bigger test for them.

Commenting on their league meeting last week, Bo'ness reckoned Arniston are a far better side than their league position suggests and if that's the case, Stonehouse Violet should pose few problems. Oakley, too, get a break from the relegation dogfight with a tie at home to Greenock and should progress.

Lochee Harp have a tradition of causing Scottish Cup upsets and that will be their aim at Bathgate. However, away from the pressures of the Super League, Thistle should be able to relax and win with a few goals to spare.

Kelty warmed up for their visit to Pollok with a crushing win over Kirkcaldy last week and will be in good frame of mind to shock the Glasgow giants.

Interesting to note that the three lowest placed odds in Wm Hill's book for winning the cup are from the East Super League.

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP Round 3 TAYPORT v ST ANDREWS UNITED



For the first time in almost exactly 14 years Tayport meet their close Fife neighbours St Andrews United in the Scottish Junior Cup. As was the case in 1990, today is a third round tie, but at Canniepairt, rather than Recreation Park. But more of that game elsewhere in the programme.

The underdogs triumphed that December day and the rest, as they say, is history. The underdogs today are St Andrews with bookies William Hill offering astronomical odds (for a football match) for an away win of 8/1.

St Andrews demonstrated two weeks ago at Recreation Park, that they are a team with undoubted battling qualities allied to plenty skill in certain areas. They will approach this game with nothing to lose and absolutely everything to gain. In addition, there is added incentive for those who have plied their trade at Canniepairt to return and leave in triumph.

Although Tayport had the upper hand in the sides' recent meeting, St Andrews have enough quality and players who have the big match mentality, to show that they are capable of better.

Manager Colin Downie will be hoping that pacy striker Colin Jeffrey has recovered from injury, at least to take a place on the bench. James O'Neill and Jimmy Nairn only made the bench two weeks ago and the vast experience of that duo could see them handed a starting jersey. Aaron Lofting, who had a spell with North End, provides an attacking midfield threat and is particularly dangerous with set piece balls.

Tayport didn't risk Scott Peters last week at Bonnyrigg, and he could still be struggling to pull on his number two shirt this afternoon.

The number three shirt will likely be worn by Grant Paterson, making his 92nd appearance in a Scottish Junior Cup tie. [Is this a record? I hear you say. Well, unless someone can come up with a name to beat it, I would think so]

Allan Ramsay could miss out through injury but Roberto Morris will be fit despite being taken off at half time last week, leaving Manager Burgess spoiled for choice, thanks to the displays of last week's substitutes Brian Livie, Ralph Hunter and Derek Wemyss.

After a couple of weeks out on paternity leave, Brian Craik is also looking to win back his place and Sean Christie is back from USA to stake his claim for a jersey.

For Tayport it's a 99th Scottish Cup tie and it would be good to mark the occasion with a victory and a chance to take the run into three figures.

Media matters

Surprisingly, stable mates, the *St Andrews Citizen* (26 Nov) and *Fife Herald* (Nov 26), despite sharing an editor, had different match reports for the Redwood Leisure Cup meeting between St Andrews United and Tayport. The Citizen report, recognising the extra interest the derby tag had given the game, provided a substantially lengthier report than usual. Different styles of report but pretty balanced accounts, nevertheless. Pity the papers hadn't sent a photographer, though.

In the *Edinburgh Evening News* (26 Nov), Bathgate assistant boss Alan Lawrence, in previewing his team's game v Lochee United, was bemoaning the fact that he had such a small pool from which to select and how a couple of injuries to key players had crippled Bathgate's league challenge.

Just like the sighting of the first swallow, the first frost and hard grounds causing postponements are guaranteed to get the *Evening Telegraph* photographer out to a Dundee ground taking a shot of the groundsman trying to get a fork into the ground and another standing by giving the thumbs down. And sure enough, the photo appeared (Nov 22) with big Jock giving the thumbs down at Beechwood and Harp's Jack Kelly with the fork. The card had been ravaged with only six of twenty games in the Tele circulation area not frozen out.

The *Perthshire Advertiser* reported that plans have been submitted to Perth & Kinross Council by Jeanfield Swifts to build a £500,000 state of the art stadium at Bute Drive, Perth. It will be recalled that Swifts backed out of a previous deal to relocate from Simpson Park after they felt that they were being stitched up by the developer. The planned ground, which will be shared with the Council, will have a 214 seater stand, floodlights and a players' lounge among its facilities.

The *Edinburgh Evening News* reported that Mark Robertson's goal for Bonnyrigg Rose v Lochee United (Nov 13) after only 15 seconds of play, was the quickest goal in Super League history

The main feature in the Junior page in *The Sun* (Nov 27) was an interview with Steven Stewart, illustrated with a photograph of Steven taken at The Canniepairt. Steven told reporter Scott Campbell that he felt the team would be adopting a more positive approach under new manager Keith Burgess, admitting the players had been stung by fans' criticism that the team's approach had gradually slipped into a negative mode.

In their previous home match, Tayport continued the scoring form which had seen them destroy Formartine United, in the Scottish Cup, by netting five in a Super League encounter with Glenrothes.

Keith Burgess must have thoroughly enjoyed the win against his former club, but, more importantly, he will have been glad to claim his first league victory as Canniepairt chief. Gary Middleton and Steven Stewart carried on from where they'd left off in the "Scottish", by notching a brace each in the 5-1 win against the Glens. Stewart's second goal, moments after Andrew had reduced the deficit to 2-1, was the key moment of the game, while John Ward's late penalty was a fine way to celebrate his personal milestone of 200 matches for the club.

Today's opponents, St. Andrews, were next up, in the inter-regional Redwood Leisure Cup. Robbie Henderson marked his first start of the new gaffer's reign, netting twice in the first half, to effectively end the match as a contest. 'Port should have won by a more comfortable margin, but the Saints showed themselves to be a competent side, and their battling characteristics will, doubtless, be on display today, in one of Scottish football's most prestigious competitions.

The Whyte & Mackay East Super League, on the other hand, does not have quite the same history as the OVD Scottish Junior Cup, but there is no escaping the excellent quality of the league. Bonnyrigg Rose are among the top teams in the elite division, so Tayport's 3-1 triumph last weekend, at New Dundas Park, was no mean feat, especially after having conceded a goal inside the first minute.

Port bounced back, though, with Derek Wemyss, Barry McNaughton and Gareth Dailly all opening their accounts for the season. As far as goal-scoring contributions are concerned, the more the merrier.

Last holiday destination - Whitehorse in the Yukon for my sister in law's wedding. Scenery was fantastic.



THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS ST ANDREWS UNITED

St Andrews United have one of the most illustrious histories of all Fife Junior clubs. A grand array of trophies since the club was founded back in 1919, culminating in the famous **Scottish Junior Cup win of 1960**, when the Cup came back to Fife for the first time since 1913 when Inverkeithing triumphed.

St Andrews United's Roll of Honour

Cup wins (39) - Fife & Lothians Cup 1995; Fife Cup 1927/28/29/60/66/89/90; East Fife Cup 1927/28/29; Mitchell Cup 1953/57/66; Fife Shield 1927/28; Martin/White Cup 1921/22/25/26/27/28/36/37/38/39; Cowdenbeath Cup 1958/66/69/91; East Fife Cup 1927/28/29; Express Cup 1959; West Fife Cup 1959/61/62/64.

League titles (7) - 1927/28/29/60/61/65/90

The lowest point in Saints' history was in 1977 when the banner headline on the front page of the St Andrews Citizen newspaper on December 16th read "United Face Cash Crisis - Chairman warns - we need help or we will fold"

They got the help and within five years the club had risen from the depths of despair and could boast new dressings rooms at one end of the ground and an impressive new social club at the other end.

At the time they lost the Scottish Cup tie to Tayport in 1990, St Andrews United were on the crest of a wave. However that defeat seemed to trigger something of a change in fortune. Manager Norrie McArthur and assistant Ernie McGarr had built a good footballing side but their tenure was brought to an end and, since then, the club's fortunes have been at a fairly low ebb, with the prestigious Fife & Lothians Cup in 1994/95, their solitary success,

After the dismissal of Manager Pete Hutton, during last season St Andrews brought in former player Colin Downie, who had been out of the game for a couple of years since being dismissed as Glenrothes boss. Downie set about rebuilding and brought back to Recreation Park a number of players who had previously been on the books. Several, such as James O'Neill and Duncan Caithness, were at Glenrothes under Keith Burgess and there are also connections with Tayport.

Graham Nicoll joined Tayport from Newburgh in 1999 and in two seasons at Canniepairt before Dave Baikie sold him to Lochore Welfare in 2001, netted 19 goals in 27 starts and 35 substitute appearances. Nickers is still amongst the goals as his double in Saints' 5-3 win over Steelend last weekend demonstrated.

St Andrews' manager Colin Downie played 35 games for Tayport Amateurs in 1987-89 and Saints' coach Ronnie Nicoll was with Tayport in the same capacity during the Andy Sommerville era

Manager Downie also has the experienced Jim Hardie in his backroom team. Hardie led Camelon to last season's Lothians title and a place in this season's Super League before being unceremoniously dumped by the Carmuirs club one game into the new season.

Thornton Hibs won a six pointer, 4-3 at home to Oakley United, who have flirted with relegation in each of the two previous Super League seasons and look likely to do so again. John Shields was the Hibs hero with a hat-trick. Oakley manager Willie Newbigging heaped the blame for the defeat on his keeper Roy Ness.

Carnoustie's only bonus from their disappointing 1-1 draw at home to Camelon was the fact that Ronnie Kenneth, returning as sub following a long injury lay off, grabbed the equaliser.

Two Super League games are scheduled for this afternoon. It's a local derby at the Warout Stadium where Glens entertain Thornton Hibs. A win for the hosts would see them leapfrog their neighbours.

At Carmuirs Park, Camelon can take advantage of a drawn game at the Warout by beating Bonnyrigg and leaping above both Fife clubs into seventh place.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT



There's no truth in the rumour that Lochee United are looking for a new transport manager. For the second time this season, United's opponents have been left cooling their heels when the kick off has been delayed by the league leaders' late arrival at their opponents' ground. It happened at Arniston earlier this season and it happened again at Bathgate on Saturday past. Fortunately Bathgate were able to switch on their floodlights to see the game finished after a 20 minute delay to the start. According to the press, the Lochee bus was stuck behind a wide load. Big Jock, the League secretary, was also on the road to Bathgate last Saturday and will no doubt be able to comment first hand on the circumstances when the matter is discussed by the East Executive

At the ripe old age of 41, former Tayport keeper Fraser Mann, is still putting in a shift in goal. Regular North End keeper, the former St Andrews Utd custodian Andy Stewart, has been out injured and big Fraser is deputising between the sticks for the Dokens.

Tayport may be the most successful Junior club in the country over the past 15 years or so, but the club has never yet won a 'Team of the Month' award. The Evening Telegraph reported that the selection as the September 'Team of the Month' was Lochee United. This, despite being humped 3-0 on the Canniepairt in the middle of that month.

St Andrews United won the Scottish Junior Cup in season 1959/60, beating Greenock 3-1 in the Hampden final yet the players which represented Saints that day, amazingly, never played together as a team before or after that match. Incidentally, St Andrews had started the season as 500/1 outsiders to win the cup.

We just hope the referees and their assistants who take charge of matches in the Juniors, were watching the Rosenborg Champions League tie on TV last midweek. The pictures showed the pitch to be largely covered in water, yet nobody seemed to bat an eyelid as the game went ahead as scheduled. We have had examples here of minor puddles - nothing even remotely approaching the scale of that at Rosenborg - causing refs and assistants to go apoplectic, actually putting games off and threatening to put games off unless every last bit of surface water is removed. They usually come away with statements such as the surface is a danger to the players or some other nonsense. The laws of the game are the same Europe wide, so if it's good enough for the Champions League, it's surely ok for the Super League etc.. We'll watch with interest.

Lochee striker Ross Kiddie missed the win at Bathgate after being disciplined by his club following an altercation with a teammate on a night out.


