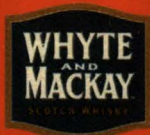

Based on goalmouth action, last Saturday's Super League match was a game of one half, the first, and, even then, there was only one goal to celebrate.

The solitary Gary Middleton strike came just as many of the 'Port support headed for their half-time tiffin, but, the goal was worth the 45 minute wait.

One thing which is abundantly clear in Middleton's play is that he is never afraid to shoot. When this particular opening presented itself, following a Robbie Henderson pass, the searing shot was always destined for the back of the net. Just as well, because all previous attempts, by several players, had yielded no return. Gareth Dailly, for instance, managed to get on the end of the two best chances, yet managed also to spurn both, from close range. It simply wasn't his day in front of goal and neither was it Tayport's.

When a team keeps a clean sheet, though, one goal is enough to win the match and, at this stage of the campaign, that is the bottom line. Another such victory today, against Arniston, would be more than acceptable, as it will move 'Port another step closer to either Linlithgow or Lochee United, or both. Keeping the focus on the Canniepairt, however, let's hope Tayport finish the year in style, or, at the very least, with another three points.

TAYPORT v ARNISTON RANGERS



For Tayport, 15/22 Super League games will have been played at the close of events this afternoon and for Arniston, it's exactly half way at 11/22. Today's match is crucial for both clubs. For Tayport, there is no margin of error, as victory is essential if Lochee, Linlithgow and a title challenge are to be kept in sight. Arniston are battling for their Super League existence and will require to double, in the second half of the campaign, their haul of points from the first half if they are to avoid the drop. Rangers will be only too aware that Carnoustie were relegated on 26 points and also realise that it would be particularly hard to get back into the Super League from the fiercely competitive Lothians District League. There is, therefore, great incentive for both clubs and it looks as if we could be in for a keen contest this afternoon.

Arniston may be sharing the basement of the Super League table with Oakley United but their form suggests that their league position is somewhat false. Indeed, apart from ourselves, they can boast the best defensive record in the division.

Last Saturday Arnie looked to be taking both points from their encounter with Linlithgow Rose when they led the champions by 2-0 with 85 minutes on the clock. It didn't happen, though, and Rangers had to settle for a 2-2 draw. It was a morale boosting performance, nevertheless, and as Arnie defender, the ex-Glasgow Rangers stalwart Scott Nisbet said "...there are plenty of positives to take out of the game, and we have to make sure we build on the performance".

Arniston don't boast a big pool of players and it will be stretched again this week. Hat-trick star of the OVD win at Stonehouse Violet, Wayne McIntosh, became the second player in successive league games to be ordered off when he was shown a red card v Rose and therefore misses out today. One player who should be in the Arniston line-up will be Ben Honeyman who was with Tayport last season. Ben notched the Arniston goal in Tayport's 1-1 draw at Gorebridge earlier in the season and reports suggest he has been in good form of late and has continued to be amongst the goals.

Apart from Dave Reilly, Tayport should report a clean bill of health, but it remains to be seen whether the manager will decide to make changes. The competition for places has never been fiercer but, it's likely that any changes will be kept to the minimum.

It's the last game of the year and not since 1993 have Tayport gone into the New Year on the back of a defeat, so we don't want that to change.

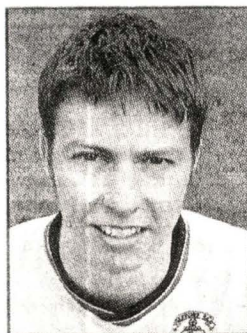

The respective match reports of the Scottish Cup meeting between Tayport and neighbours St Andrews United in the *Fife Herald* and *St Andrews Citizen* (both 9/12) were never going to see the match in the same light. There is little doubt that the *Herald* carried the more objective account of proceedings. Saints reckoned they "crashed out on the turn of a card", referring to the ordering off of Jimmy Nairn for two yellows in the first half, the second of which the *Citizen* described as 'harsh'. Both reports agreed, however that the ordering off was the only point of note in the first half. And both also agreed that Tayport coasted home after their two early second half goals.

The *Evening Telegraph's* Junior page (13/12) had as its main report, the gallant, yet unsuccessful, efforts of Newburgh in taking Lochee United to penalty kicks in the Redwood Leisure tie at Thomson Park. It wasn't the best of performances from Lochee, according to *Junicus*, but he went on to point out that victories in their next two league games v Linlithgow today and Tayport on January 8th would set the Dundee side well on the way to the Super League title.

The Sun (13/12) had as its headline 'Melee Xmas', making reference to the carry-on at the end of the Maryhill v Culter OVD replay when the respective managers allegedly indulged in some mutual bad mouthing. From the tone of the report one got the impression that Culter had taken defeat a trifle badly.

The *Edinburgh Evening News* again had great coverage with three games receiving featured coverage, plus another 10 games in the 'Junior Round-up'. Main report went to the Arniston v Linlithgow Super League affair where a "large crowd witnessed an entertaining clash". The photo caught Arniston subby Brian Murray in an extremely acrobatic pose as he clashed with Lee Dair of Rose.

The *Daily Record* had a colourful Junior page which carried a super photo of Gary Middleton celebrating his goal v Thornton. The pic accompanied Scott Kopel's match report in which Gus Malone was quoted at length on the differences following the transition from Baikie to Burgess.

The *Record* also had a report on the Wishaw v Hill of Beath replay. The reporter must have referred to an old notebook when he described Hill of Beath as 'Fife big guns'. Maybe at one time, but Haws are now plying their trade in the Fife District League, with several Fife teams in the Super League now laying better claim to the 'big guns' mantle.

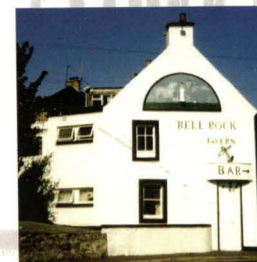

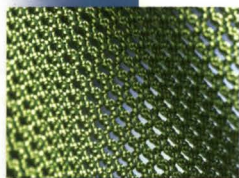

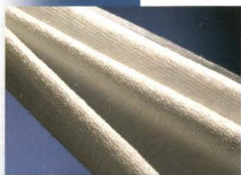
