

TAYPORT v RENFREW



When the East Super League leaders meet the West Super league leaders, then it's got to be billed as the match of the day. Throw in the fact that Tayport are cup holders and eliminated today's opponents at the semi-final stage last season, then we have the ingredients for what should be a cracking encounter.

With Renfrew, the then holders, losing their grip on the cup thanks to a late Derek Wemyss goal in a 5th round replay in 2002 on the Canniepairt, there will be no lack of incentive on Renfrew's part to get the Tayport monkey off their back.

Renfrew can still call on eight of the players who participated in that tie, but the fact that only Hammond, Farquharson and Barr, who played in the first game at Western Park, are likely to start today, is an indicator that Renfrew have substantially strengthened their squad.

Of the 14 Tayport players who participated in that tie four years ago, only Ward (Cowdenbeath), Craik (Lochee Harp), McGlashan (retired) Kenneth (cup tied) and Evans (Broughty) are absent from Port's squad for this afternoon's tie.

Despite the most recent meeting being only nine months ago, there are several changes in the personnel of either team. Tayport's new faces this time round are Martin Grant, Craig Brown and Bryan Duell. Representing Renfrew against Tayport for the first time will be goalkeeper Kenny Meechan, Mike Brogan, Greg Millar, Michael Harvey, Fraser Chisholm and Stuart Robertson.

Manager Billy Peacock has had a good look at Tayport and will have his strategy for the tie well mapped out. Gordon Smith and Richard Barr have been amongst the goals and indeed have scored more than half the Renfrew tally for the season between them. They are both flying at present. Barr took Cumnock apart with a hat-trick in last Saturday's 4-1 win in Ayrshire while Smith, who added the other, could even afford the luxury of missing a penalty.

Although Tayport go into the tie on the back of a 3-1 win over Downfield which was probably more comfortable than the score might suggest, they will require to switch into cup-tie mode early on and sustain that approach for the duration of the tie. Tayport may have been made favourites by the bookies - but so were Celtic last Sunday!

It is no easy job to predict Tayport's starting line-up, but there will be no John Knox who was transferred to St Andrews United last week, no Ronnie Kenneth, cup-tied with Carnoustie and Robbie Henderson is a major doubt. There are several permutations for a line-up, but whatever it is, it'll have to be effective if Renfrew are to return west empty handed.

'Port Make the Letters Page!

Not often that football is a topic in the letters page of the Fife Herald but yesterday's edition has a contribution from, of all people, an Auchinleck supporter.

We've reproduced the letter below and also part of the original article to which the writer refers, part of a feature which was a review of Tayport FC's fortunes during the year.

As you will note, the Editor put the writer straight by pointing out that the article was clearly referring to the 18 OVD years.

Nobody would want to take away the magnificent achievements of Auchinleck, but the major part of this success was prior to the 'OVD Years'.

AS the latest year in the Tayport success story draws to a close, it is time to review another 12 eventful months, during which time the club again claimed the major prize in Scottish junior football.

The OVD Scottish Junior Cup triumph, at Tannadice Park, was undoubtedly the highlight of 2005.

To see Tayport run out at such a prominent local football venue, in front of nearly 7000 fans truly made the heart swell and the performance, to which rivals Lochee United had no answer, ensured yet another memorable night of celebration in the town.

REPUTATION

That 2-0 victory, with strikers Gary Middleton and Robbie Henderson on the scoresheet, saw Port further enhance their reputation as the team of the 18year OVD era.

Three cup wins and a total of seven final appearances betters any other club in the country, with Auchinleck Talbot on two wins from three OVD finals the next best outfit.

Cup record

Sir, — While visiting family in Cupar at New Year, I picked up the *Fife Herald* dated December 30, and was pleased to see the back page devoted to junior football. I was, however, horrified to read the claim that Tayport has the best record in "The major prize" in junior football.

Auchinleck Talbot first won 'The Cup' in 1949 by beating Petershill, in front of a crowd numbering 68,000. Since then they have won it a further five times making a total of six times out of seven finals. They have the best record in junior football and I believe Petershill come second.

Tayport are a fine side and a credit to junior football, but I am sure that they would not wish to be credited with an honour to which they are not entitled. For commercial reasons the name of the competition was changed to the OVD Cup but the major prize in junior football is, and always has been, the Scottish Junior Cup.

For the sake of accuracy I trust you will bring this correction to the attention of your readers. — Yours, etc.,


