

### Harry Reports....

Harry Watson, originally from Forres and now residing in Gateshead, whom we met whilst on tour of the North East of England during pre-season, and who attended our game at Glenrothes earlier this season, has posted the following report of Crook Town v St Blazey from Cornwall. Port fans will recall we played Crook on that trip, winning 4-1. They've been going well since and are now in the last 16 of the FA Vase.

#### 21 January 2006 CROOK TOWN V ST.BLAZEY (FA.VASE Round 4)

TODAY I DECIDED TO GO TO THIS FA VASE MATCH IN SOUTH WEST DURHAM INVOLVING CROOK TOWN FROM THE  $2^{\rm ND}$  DIVISION OF THE NORTHERN LEAGUE AND ST.BLAZEY FROM CORNWALL WHO HAD ONLY BEEN BEATEN ONCE AND WERE IN  $4^{\rm TH}$  POSITION IN THE SOUTH WESTERN LEAGUE. THEY HAD WON THE SOUTH WESTERN LEAGUE 6 TIMES OUT OF THE LAST 7 SEASONS.THIS WAS AN 850 MILE ROUND TRIP FOR THE AWAY SIDE.

I WENT INTO THE CLUB HOUSE FOR A QUICK DRINK BEFORE THE BIG EVENT AND SPOKE TO ONE OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE SAINTS WHO SAID THE CLUB WAS SPONSORED BY A LOCAL FIRM AND THEY HAD FLOWN UP FROM EXETER TO NEWCASTLE AT 8 IN THE MORNING AND THEN TAKEN A BUS TO CROOK. WHILST HE WAS SPEAKING A COUPLE OF LADS FROM ST.BLAZEY CAME IN . THEY HAD DRIVEN TO CROOK, A MERE 7 HOUR JOURNEY!

AROUND 400 SPECTATORS, ABOUT 5 TIMES MORE THAN CROOK NORMALLY GET FOR A LEAGUE MATCH, WERE IN THE WOLSINGTON ROAD GROUND WHEN THE SIDES RAN OUT. THE WEATHER WAS MILD FOR THIS TIME OF YEAR BUT THE PITCH WAS STILL MUDDY AND RUTTED.

ON 4 MINUTES IT WAS NO SURPRISE WHEN CROOK TOOK THE LEAD WHEN ROY ALLEN BEAT THE OFFSIDE TRAP AND ALTHOUGH FORCED WIDE BY A DEFENDER, STILL GOT HIS CROSS IN WITH THE DANGEROUS MILROY BLASTING THE BALL PAST MURPHY FROM POINT BLANK RANGE.A COUPLE OF MINUTES LATER ST.BLAZEY NEARLY EQUALIZED BUT FORWARD JUSTIN HARRINGTON, WITH A FREE HEADER, PUT IT OVER THE BAR. THE ACTION NEVER STOPPED AS ANOTHER FINE MOVE FROM CROOK SAW MILROY'S RISING SHOT SAVED BY MURPHY. ALTHOUGH ST.BLAZEY WERE ALWAYS DANGEROUS ON THE BREAK CROOK DESERVEDLY WENT IN LEADING 1 - 0

THE TOWN STARTED THE SAME WAY AS THE FIRST HALF BY TAKING CONTROL AND IT WAS NO SURPRISE WHEN THEY SCORED A 2<sup>ND</sup> ON THE HOUR, WHEN A LOW VOLLEYED SHOT FROM PAUL STOUT CREPT JUST INSIDE THE POST. THE GAME WAS OVER A MINUTE LATER AS ROY ALLEN BEAT THE OFFSIDE TRAP, ROUNDED MURPHY AND SLOTTED THE BALL IN TO MAKE IT 3-0. ST.BLAZEY TRIED TO GET BACK INTO THE GAME BUT IT WAS TOO MUCH AND CROOK WENT INTO THE LAST 16 FOR THE FIRST TIME EVER.

AS I DROVE HOME I REFLECTED ON £4 WELL SPENT ON A VERY ENTERTAINING MATCH.

THE PROGRAMME FOR THE GAME COST A £1 AND HAD 46 PAGES INCLUDING 18 PAGES OF ADVERTS. THERE WAS NOT TOO MUCH TO READ. IT HAS THE USUAL TEAM PEN PICTURES, 2 PAGES ON GLYNN HOOPER (ST.BLAZEY)TRAVELLING 450 MILES A WEEK TO TRAIN AND PLAY FOR HIS HOME TOWN TEAM, A QUIZ, HISTORY OF THE CLUB AND THE 4<sup>TH</sup> ROUND DRAW OF THE FA VASE. IT ALSO INCLUDED.RESULTS, FIXTURES AND A WEEKLY ROUND UP WHICH GIVES ALL THE SCORES FROM THE NORTHERN LEAGUE FROM THE PREVIOUS WEEK. THERE IS ALSO A PIECE ON DEAN GORDON (EX MIDDLES-BROUGH) WHO PLAYED A FEW MATCHES FOR CROOK AND HAD JUST SIGNED FOR BLACKPOOL.

As soon as the draw was made this afternoon's tie was dubbed 'tie of the round'. Maybe because the sides met in the final of last season's Redwood Cup, maybe because it's a meeting of Fife's top two teams, or maybe it's because none of the other ties have caught the imagination.

Out of the Scottish, out of the Fife/Tayside and out of the Fife & Lothians Cup means today's game is win or bust for the Haws if they are to retain an interest in anything other than a couple of local cups between now and the end of the season. It'll not be a stroll in either of these cups, either, with St Andrews and Glenrothes to be faced in the next rounds. It's a situation which will have the Keir's Park side fired up this afternoon.

Manager Jock Finlayson identified weaknesses in his squad during the first half of the season and took action to strengthen his hand as soon as the window opened, signing former Kelty striker Craig Reynolds from Rosyth for a reputed £4,000, midfielder Gary Lamont from Whitburn and defender Darren Davidson from Glenrothes. Reynolds was cuptied last week as Haws went down 1-0 to Whitburn in the Fife & Lothians Cup.

Moving out of Keir's Park was striker Andy Roberts who moved back across the Forth to join up with Dave Baikie at Bo'ness. Roberts is currently top scorer for Hill of Beath and his record of 25 goals in 56 appearances was quite impressive. Manager Finlayson will be hoping Roberts' replacement can find the road to goal and end this year's current drought. Indeed they have had more players sent off in 2006 that they have scored goals!

Hill of Beath are strong on experience with seasoned campaigners like defender Ally Gray, ex-Dundee United and Brechin City striker Martyn Thomson, who netted the winner v Tayport in the Redwood Final, and former Stenny, Clyde and East Fife keeper Marc Graham.

Like their opponents Tayport have transferred a striker during the transfer window when Gary Middleton moved to Montrose FC, bringing in Duncan McLean from the Gable Endies in his place. Duncan came off the bench to make his first appearance for Port last Saturday and will be in line for a starting jersey today.

Steven Stewart is a big injury doubt and Robbie Henderson could again be struggling through injury. Alan Ramsay and Ross Gunnion, both missing through work commitments last week v Arniston, will be back in the frame but Lloyd Young is still on holiday.

Today's game will be decided on penalty kicks if the teams are level after 90 minutes. Three of Haws' five cup ties to date this season have been settled this way.

Last week at Arniston was a dull affair on a rain sodden park that was bumpy and muddy, which didn't suit our passing game. Too often passes went astray or were overhit and frustration set in, with some players struggling with the underfoot conditions and Arniston's very direct style of play.

But, instead of building on the early lead, we lost a poor goal ten minutes later when we failed to stop a cross into the box and Ross Barnes rose unchallenged at the back post to head past Fitzy. We felt we could have done more to prevent the cross coming in and certainly should have had one of our big defenders attacking the ball better. The rest of the half was pretty even but we created a couple of great opportunities to re-take the lead but failed because of Arniston's good defending and unusually bad finishing by our guys. Although it was not all one way traffic. We got a fright when Arniston struck a post on the 35 minute mark, only for the ball to rebound and land in Fitzy's arms.

The second period was similar to the first but we just got the feeling that we were starting to boss the game and after a couple of substitutions we went for the win that would put us three points clear at the top of the league. With ten minutes to go Roberto Morris took a quick free kick to our impressive debutant Duncam McLean who spotted Gareth Dailly's far post run, and delivered a great pass which Gareth expertly sidefooted past their keeper for the winner.

Although not entirely happy with our performance, we are delighted to have won a match on a pitch that was more like a ploughed field than a Super League surface. It only goes to show that, when we have to, our lads can dig deep and get the results when other teams might have accepted a draw, They must be praised for their efforts and hard graft last Saturday, but we will expect the same effort this afternoon against Jock Finlayson's side. Let's all get behind the team today.

It's been a good couple of weeks for Tayport, who have now won four consecutive matches, in four different tournaments. Even better, the last two wins have come in the two competitions which define the junior season.


A fortnight ago, 'Port saw off West table-toppers Renfrew, to reach the last-sixteen of the 'Scottish'. There was a significant tactical triumph for the management team, whose decision to play a back-three was more than vindicated, as the holders bossed the game throughout.

Frazer Fitzpatrick did have one key save to make, midway through the first half, but, otherwise, Tayport dominated. An error from the visiting goalkeeper led to Barry McNaughton's winning effort, although, on balance, nobody could deny that the result was justified.

It was a satisfying debut for McLean and a very satisfying win for 'Port. For the three title-chasers, the pressure to win games is mounting and the recent past suggests that one of the trio is probably better equipped than the others. Time, however, will tell.

Scottish FA chief executive ast season

David Taylor told BBC Sport: "The early rounds of the Scottish Cup could do with more teams to make it more attractive for everyone involved.

"The juniors now have superleagues and perhaps the winners and the Junior Cup winners could be invited."

Taylor, himself a former junior player, was speaking at the draw of the OVD Junior Cup.

Clubs from the Highland League and amateur leagues already take part, but he hinted that their participation could also be expanded.

The draw for the last 16 stage of the OVD Scottish Cup got it's fair share of exposure in this week's press, probably moreso because the two bookies' favourites were drawn together.

Keith Burgess s interviewed in *The Sun*, played things low key but this issue. commented that 'it's as tough a draw as we could have expected'.

Even the BBC are getting in on the act now. The article reproduced on the left appeared on the BBC Sport website this week. It was an opportunist article, given that SFA chief executive David Tavlor had made the draw but it does serve to keep 'change' on the agenda.

It's going to happen sometime. We had all the squealing and squawking when Super Leagues were first proposed and the dinosaurs who continually held things back for years were proved to be wrong.

The SJFA, played a strong hand on that issue, It's time the Scottish Executive took a hand in this issue.

Arthurlie manager Frank Lynch gave his thoughts on the Scottish draw, to The Evening Times.

He said: "It's the tie of the round by a mile, yet, by the same token, it's an easy one for me as a manager. "With all due respect, if we'd drawn Kirkcaldy YM then the pressure would very much be on us to go through, which is not the case against Tayport. And somehow I don't see me needing to motivate our players too much." "Only a fool would dismiss a Tayport squad boasting tried and trusted OVD campaigners such as Roberto Morris, Steven Stewart, Scott Peters and Grant Paterson in their ranks."

However, the Lie gaffer reckons his team will be the ones having a slight edge going into the contest.

"At this stage, a home draw is as much as you can ask for and, in that respect, I'm sure Tayport would much prefer to be in our shoes."

#### **EDDIE BRINGS NEW APPROACH TO LINKS PARK**

During the last few years, new Montrose manager Eddie Wolecki saw his somewhat controversial managerial methods bring an East Region challenge from Lochee United, culminating in an East Super League title last season. This success saw Wolecki in the frame when a Senior managerial post become vacant and Montrose FC, who had been suffering one of the worst periods in their history, gave Eddie his chance.

The following article by Gable Ender which appeared in a recent Montrose FC programme will be of interest to followers of the Junior game.

#### A CONVERSATION WITH EDDIE WOLECKI & THE NEW COACHING TEAM

I managed to catch up with Eddie, Ewan Peacock (first team coach), Malcolm MacFayden (Performance Analyst & Sports Psychologist), and Mark Murray (goalkeeping coach), at the end of their first week with the club, the day the Berwick match was sadly postponed. Here's the transcript of our chat, which is quite revealing on the new approach that they will bring to Montrose FC.

Gable Ender: A couple of you have been players at Links Park. What's it like being back

Eddie Wolecki: Well, the new stand was here when I was a player at the club, and the facilities are much the same. But it's good to see so many familiar faces still here. It makes settling in to the job much easier.

GE: There's been a lot in the papers this week about the 'scientific approach' you have to the game. Can you explain what that is, and how it differs from the approach of a more traditional football manager?

EW: How long have you got? (Laughs) ...well..the first difference is that we don't practice just for the sake of it. Practice without specific aims is just pointless. We make our training specific to the way we want the team to play, we don't train just for the sake of it. Ewan Peacock: Training is also about monitoring the fitness of the players, about recovery from the last game, and preparation for the next. That's where things like cryogenics come in (Gable Ender looks puzzled), that's ice baths, not pleasant, but they aid quick recovery. Our aim is to get the players at their highest peak performance wise for the game, then take them through quick recovery afterwards, before preparing for the next game.

Malcolm McFayden: Our approach is all about analysis. There's a continuous cycle; of recognising problems, evaluating them, addressing them, and moving on to the next one. Everything we introduce to the players has been researched thoroughly, and has been shown to work.

GE: So, what system do you favour? 4-4-2? 3-5-2?

EW: To be honest I don't favour a particular system. We adapt the needs of the team to each individual game. I'd say we favour a particular methodology rather than a system; that is, we keep possession of the ball; we make it very hard for the opposition to get it back; when we don't have the ball, we work very hard to get it back. I'm in favour of passing, free flowing, attacking football played at pace.

EP: I suppose what you could say is that the team will have a good work ethic, both offensively and defensively. Everyone will be clear on what job it is they have to do, and how we expect them to do it.

GE: All of you have been working hard in the Junior scene over the last few seasons. Have you been keeping an eye on Division Three in that time, or have you some catching up to do now?

EW: No, we haven't looked much at Division 3 up until now. At Lochee, we were concentrating 100% on the Superleague, and it would have been folly to divert our attention elsewhere. But now, at Montrose, we are 100% focused on this division and on how to turn our opponents over. I had three ex managers compile a dossier on the league for us, and we

received detailed comments on all the third division teams, including Montrose. Some of those comments made for interesting reading!

GE: You are completing a sports science degree at Abertay University in May. Have you plans for other employment outside the game?

EW: That's true, my degree finishes in May. Taken together, we must be the most educated team of coaches in this league. I'll have to wait and see what happens with that. I have some part time work with Abertay at the moment, but I imagine the job here at Links Park will fill up the rest of my week.

GE: What other managers have influenced the way you all see the game? EW: Well, I think we've picked up a lot from looking at Arsene Wenger's methods at Arsenal..

EP: ..yeh, I was lucky enough, when I was studying towards my coaching badge, to work alongside Jose Mourinho. I found his ideas really interesting, not just in their own right, but also for the huge contrast between his methods, and those recommended by the SFA. It's an important point, this. Look at the top European managers. Mourinho never played at the top level. Gerard Houllier only played amateur football, and ended up as a schoolteacher for a while. Similarly, Rafa Benitez never played at the highest level, nor did Wenger. All these guys have sports degrees qualifications, though.

MM: I find that it's important to have education as well as experience. The two go hand in hand. Education on its own, or big name experience on its own, is rarely enough.

EW: Sometimes you see clubs where results on the field are allowed to paper over the cracks in the way that the team plays. There can be far too much focus on short term results, at the expense of the performance of the team, and that is more damaging in the long term. In saying that, of course, all of us are here to be judged on results. But it's the quality of our work with the players that will produce good performances, and in turn the results will come.

GE: You've had a chance to take the squad in three training sessions now.

Are there any players you have in mind to bring in?

EW: Well, I wouldn't like to be too specific just yet. What I can tell you is the type of player we will look to bring to the club- we'll be looking to sign players who can add height, strength and pace to the team. I like technically good players, and those who have a good character to bring to the dressing room. We see ourselves as building for the long term here- we will take our time to build a team for the long term at Montrose. That's not just on the park, too - I have still to appoint an assistant manager here. I have approached someone, and will wait for his answer- I feel he's the right candidate, so am happy to wait until the end of this season if necessary.

GE: Let's fast forward to May 2006. The season is over. What league position would you be happy with-what do you want out of the remainder of the season? EW: (laughs), I'd love a couple of tickets to the Champions League final! What we'd want to see at the end of the season is a consistency of performance on the park, and a strong base for us to build on for next season. We want to see a buzz in the squad.

EP: Good performances and a good atmosphere in the dressing room will reap its own benefits in terms of results. We'd like to see good results and performances, built up from our work in training and on matchdays.

EW: I tell you something else- this manager's office is going to become 'lived in' very quickly. At Lochee, when I started there, the manager's office was basically a neglected wee room where you changed before a training session. By the time we left Thomson Park, it was buzzing, with folk coming and going all the time, conversations, ideas being exchanged. That's what I want to create here at Links Park, too.




