

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP ROUND 6

TAYPORT v CLYDEBANK

Today promises to be one of those great cup-tie occasions that we have experienced many times during the past 16 years. Clydebank may not have a recent pedigree to compare with some of the clubs who have played their part on those memorable occasions, but it is a club with a chequered history over the past forty years or so. Well, it is, if you count the original Clydebank, which became Airdrie United, and today's Clydebank FC Limited which rose like a phoenix from the ashes, created and run by a limited company with fans having a big say. It's a club thirsting for football success.

A huge support is expected to follow our visitors to the Canniepairt and the noise generated by the visiting support and the many flags and banners will be testimony to that. Despite their Central District League status, Clydebank are one of the top half dozen best supported Junior clubs in the country.

Their form this season has been good and manager Budgie McGhie, a stalwart of the former senior Bankies for many years, has put together a side with the principal aim of going for promotion. However, that ambition is on the back burner this afternoon with his team only two games away from a Scottish Junior Cup Final appearance.

A glance at their results this season shows that they give very little away and apart from a 5-2 league Cup defeat by Maryhill away back in August, the odd defeat suffered has invariably been by the most slender of margins. In their 24 competitive matches this season, only twice have they failed to bulge their opponents' net.

Like Tayport, they were without a game because of last week's freeze but will have focused on reports of Tayport's recent games. Experienced players such as central defender Brian Harkin and striker Billy McLafferty won't be fazed by the occasion. McLafferty was with Renfrew last season but missed out on meeting us in the Love Street semi-final through injury. Clydebank will likely look to the workrate of Mark Hailstones and the craft of Gordon Lappin to carve out the chancers for Ryan Scobie who netted the all important goal v Bonnyrigg in the last round.

Clydebank had a representative taking copious notes at Craigie Park when we were last in action but nine players who didn't start that game are in line for a return this afternoon. Just what the selection will be is anybody's guess. Twenty different players, in fact the entire squad, have started for Tayport in their last three games v Arthurlie, Arbroath SC and East Craigie.

Ronnie Kenneth, cup tied with Carnoustie, will miss out and there is a doubt over Martin Grant, but otherwise there should be a full pool available. Included in that pool are seven players who have together appeared in over 400 Scottish Cup ties for Tayport.

This afternoon's referee is Tom Robertson from Loanhead and his assistants, Tom Carter and David Ferguson, are from Edinburgh. The tie lasts 90 minutes with a replay if the sides finish level. TV cameras are here to record the game for STV's Scotsport.

Airdrie United, a name despised by Bankies' fans, effectively took over the franchise and continued in place of Clydebank. At this time the club was reconstituted and joined the West Region Juniors.

The Bankies carry a large, colourful and noisy support and by all accounts, all leave has been cancelled and all their troops have been mobilised for their trip to the eastern outpost that is the Canniepairt. Supporters are expected to arrive from all corners of the British Isles to witness their favourites' historic quarter final appearance.

Media matters



Tayport haven't been far from the headlines since the last home programme with the Arthurlie tie and the 6th round meeting with Clydebank capturing the limelight, both in print and on the web. Throw in the Bo'ness registration carry-on and the Chris Tawse walk-out at Lochee United and there's been plenty to write about.

The Sunday Mail, Daily Record and Evening Telegraph all gave the Arthurlie tie extensive coverage with the accompanying photographs perfectly illustrating the incredibly muddy and waterlogged conditions under which the tie was played. All three publications featured superb photographs.

The Sunday Mail's Kevin McGoldrick thought that 'holders Tayport sent out a chilling warning to their rivals with a stunning attacking display'.

The Sun had an excellent OVD Junior Cup Special and carried reports on all the ties. Gareth Dailly and manager Keith Burgess were quoted, as was 'Lie manager Frank Lynch. Lynch gave credit to Tayport but wired into referee McWilliams and his assistants, claiming they got all the major decisions wrong with three major calls going against the home side.

Jim O'Donnell in the *Evening Times* reported that Arthurlie's gaffer Frank Lynch, although unhappy at a couple of decisions, acknowledged that Arthurlie had no one to blame but themselves for 'losing the plot and conceding two ridiculous goals'.

Not surprisingly the Edinburgh Evening News' main feature on Monday past was the 3-2 Super League win by Bathgate over Linlithgow Rose. It was a win which strengthened greatly Bathgate's chances of taking a first ever title but Thistle's assistant manager Paul Jack wasn't getting carried away. Reporter Mark Bonthrone put it to the former Airdrionians captain that his side had taken a massive step towards the championship but Jack warned that there was still a lot of hard work to be done. The competition has hit the headlines for all the wrong reasons. The revelation that Bo'ness United - 4th favourites - had been




ejected from the competition for fielding ineligible players in previous rounds reverberated throughout the Junior game. It's a horrendously high price to pay for what was an administrative error. Apart from the financial loss of the gate receipts from at least one game v Auchinleck, the supporters of one of the best supported clubs in the game will be shattered.

Auchinleck Talbot, therefore, take their place in the semi-finals for the first time since 2001.

Tayport v Clydebank arguably now becomes the tie of the round.

Other East Super League Cup survivors, Bathgate Thistle are at home to Beith and will be confident of progression. Indeed, if the Creamery Park club is to get a return on its substantial investment in putting this season's squad together, then anything other than a win will be unacceptable. Beith will have noticed, however, that Thistle's recent form has been a wee bit shaky and shrewd manager Denis Gray will fancy his chances of an upset. A repeat of the form that demolished St Andrews in the last round could just give the Ayrshire team the chance of an upset.

The remaining tie is an all west affair between two outsiders. Homeless Petershill, who are riding high in the West Super League Division One, meet Irvine Meadow at Ashfield's Saracen Park. Irvine Meadow, like Petershill, a club with a proud Scottish Cup tradition, are having a superb season in the Ayrshire District League and have bolstered their cup hopes with a couple of decent signings during the window.

There's no doubt the topic of the last week has been the Bo'ness question. Rather than try to explain what we know, we've copied verbatim this article which appeared in the Edinburgh Evening News.

Bo'ness booted out of Scottish Juniors Cup

* Bo'ness lost their appeal to the SFA earlier this week

BO'NESS UNITED were today contemplating whether to lodge an appeal * after being thrown out of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup for fielding unregistered players. The decision to expel them from the junior game's premier competition was taken at a hastily-arranged emergency meeting of the Scottish Junior Football Association last night. The Newtown Park side had been scheduled to face Auchinleck Talbot in the quarter-finals of the tournament next month, although the Ayrshire giants will now receive a bye into the last four. The drastic action was taken against the East Region Super League outfit after it was discovered the number of unregistered players who took part in the first four rounds "ran into double figures".

It is understood that Bo'ness sent away details of the players to be registered for the 2005/2006 season to Hampden in the summer and assumed that was the end of the matter. However, the SFA automatically sends both the player and club a letter confirming their registration once the process has been completed and it insists it didn't receive any correspondence from Bo'ness. Alarm bells should have rung at United when the confirmation slips failed to arrive but, for whatever reason, the matter was not chased up meaning only the players signed during the January transfer window - David McInally, Andy Roberts, Andy Carlin, David Morrison and David Wilson - were eligible to play.

"The offence Bo'ness have been found guilty of is a serious one and on investigation we found the number of ineligible players used ran into double figures," said Tom Johnson, secretary of the SJFA. "Bo'ness were at the meeting to represent themselves and they insisted they sent off the player registration yet the SFA didn't receive them. "We always send out acknowledgements when we receive player registration details and the onus is on the club to chase the matter up if they don't receive them which Bo'ness didn't do. "Mr Lapsley, the Bo'ness secretary, suggested at the meeting that there had been mitigating circumstances in his personal life at that time which may be why the matter wasn't followed up. "However, the fact remains that the acknowledgements were overlooked and we didn't feel that we had any other option open to us other than to expel them from the competition."

Bo'ness have the right to appeal the decision although with the quarter-final dates looming next month they have just seven days to do so. Should Bo'ness choose to go down this route, however, it is unlikely that they will be successful given the seriousness of their offence. And manager Dave Baikie admitted today that he has been left absolutely devastated. He said: "It's really hard to take that, through no fault of the management team or he players we find ourselves out of the most important competition in junior football. I'm absolutely gutted as I feel I have a bunch of players who could have won the tournament and I feel as though I know what I'm talking about as I've been there with other clubs. "There's obviously been a mistake somewhere along the line and I honestly don't know if that has come from our end or the SJFA's. "All I do know is that the players don't deserve this as they have been tremendous since I took over at the club."

There still remains the possibility that Bo'ness could be deducted League points and/or thrown out of other Cup competitions with the matter now to be referred to the East Region Junior Football Association. However, Johnson believes that Bo'ness have now been suitably punished. He said: "The matter has been dealt with by the SJFA and my belief is that it wouldn't be fair to have two kicks at them for the one offence, even if it does involve other competitions."

Bo'ness United secretary David Lapsley was unavailable for comment when the Evening News tried to contact him. [It's understood that Mr Lapsley has since resigned]

It's the biggest match of the season to date, with Clydebank arriving for an OVD Scottish Junior Cup quarter-final, and the national competition has dominated our thoughts over the past month or so.

The cup holders, however, took control. A Bryan Duell penalty and a couple of excellent Gareth Dailly deliveries had 'Port 3-1 up the break.

Lie thought they were back in the contest when Gary Wilson converted a penalty at the start of the second half, but, in the push for a leveller, the home side became bogged down in the Dunterlie Park quagmire.

The appalling conditions did not deter the Canniepairt men. Scott Peters grabbed the all-important next counter, to restore the two-goal margin and, from then on, it was about strength of character, allied with ability.

Those traits were certainly in evidence in the closing minutes, when both Bryan Duell and substitute Robbie Henderson found the back of the net with cracking strikes, leaving the hosts completely dazed by the turn of events.

Still on a high from that incredible 6-2 result, 'Port had more mundane matters to contend with the next Saturday, at Arbroath. ASC put up some stubborn resistance, but Steven Stewart, Derek Wemyss and Robbie Henderson were on target in a 3-0 win. Unfortunately, Lloyd Young, with a second half penalty, was ever so slightly off-target, although progress in the Redwood Leisure Cup was already assured.

In the Findlay Cup last weekend, the goals flowed at Craigie Park, at least during the first half. Ronnie Kenneth's brace took his total Tayport tally to 75, in 80 appearances, then Brian Livie and Bryan Duell also netted. Duell was on the score sheet again later on, but the second period will be best remembered for various misses.

Three wins on the road, with fourteen goals scored definitely suggests that Tayport are on form and long may that continue.

AFTER CHECKING THE WEATHER FORECAST MY WIFE AND I LEFT GATESHEAD AT 10 AM AND THREE AND HALF HOURS LATER ARRIVED AT RAINY BARRHEAD THE MATCH WAS A 2.15 KICK OFF AS THERE ARE NO FLOODLIGHTS AT ARTHURLIE'S GROUND, DUNTERLIE PARK, MEETING ABBY OSWALD THE TAYPORT SECRETARY, I HANDED HIM SOME PROGS. HE WAS WORRIED THE MATCH MIGHT BE CALLED OFF THROUGH A WATERLOGGED PITCH BUT THE REF LET IT GO AHEAD. I PAID £4 FOR MYSELF AND £2 FOR THE WIFE. BOUGHT SOME PROGS AND HAD A PIE AND BOVRIL BEFORE TRYING TO GET SOME SHELTER UNDER THE STAND WHICH WAS THE ONLY COVER IN THE GROUND. THE RAIN HAD ALMOST STOPPED AT THIS TIME, JUST BEFORE KICK OFF BUT THE PITCH LOOKED QUITE BOGGY. THE MATCH KICKED OFF AND BOTH TEAMS WERE ON THE OFFENSIVE FROM THE OFF WITH THE CONDITIONS IDEAL FOR THE ATTACKERS AND SO IT PROVED. IN AN EXCITING AND EVENTFUL GAME, FULL OF INCIDENTS, TWISTS AND TURNS AND GOALS GALORE IN THE MOST ECITING GAME I HAVE SEEN THIS SEASON. I WILL REPORT ONLY ON HOW AND WHO SCORED THE GOALS AS I WOULD NEED A BOOK FOR ALL THE CLOSE CALLS.

ON 5 MINUTES ARTHURLIE TOOK THE LEAD. A QUICK BREAK LEAVES THE TAYPORT DEFENCE EXPOSED AND BRIAN MCKEOWN ON THE LEFT SIDE OF THE PENALTY AREA SHOOTS FOR GOAL. HIS SHOT LOOPS OFF A DEFENDER AND DROPS
BEHIND FRAZER FITZPATRICK (G/K) TO GIVE THE 'LIE THE LEAD.
ON 15 MINUTES A FREE KICK FROM 25 YARDS FOR TAYPORT IS TAKEN BY GARETH DAILLY (RELATED TO SCOTLAND'S CHRISTIAN DAILLY) AND HIS FREE KICK
IS HEADING FOR THE RIGHT HAND POSTAGE STAMP CORNER BUT IS BRIL-

LIANTLY TIPPED OVER THE BAR BY KEEPER KRIS ROBERTSON.
THERE ARE CLOSE CALLS AT BOTH ENDS BEFORE TAYPORT ARE GIVEN A
PENALTY WHEN ONE OF THE ARTHURLIE DEFENDERS NEEDLESSLY BRINGS
DOWN A TAYPORT FORWARD. BRYAN DUELL CALMLY SLOTS THE BALL
AWAY FOR 1-1.

3 MINUTES LATER A DAILLY CORNER EVADES 2 DEFENDERS AND COMES OFF ROBERTSON AND DROPS JUST INSIDE THE POST TO MAKE IT 2-1 FOR THE PORT.

ON 37 MINUTES A STUNNED ARTHURLIE GO 3-1 DOWN AS A MOVE DOWN THE RIGHT AND CROSS ONLY SEES MARK McSHANE'S HEADER DIVERTED PAST THE KEEPER WHEN UNDER PRESSURE.

IT WAS 3-1 TO PORT AT HALF TIME WITH GARETH DAILLY, I THOUGHT, OUTSTANDING WITH HIS PROBING, TACKLING AND DISTRIBUTION CAUSING ARTHURLIE ALL SORTS OF PROBLEMS. THE RAIN AT HALF TIME HAD TURNED INTO A DOWNPOUR AND THE CROWD OF JUST OVER 800 WONDERED IF THE REF WOULD CALL THE GAME OFF.

THE 2ND HALF STARTED WITH ARTHURLIE PUSHING FORWARD TO TRY AND GET BACK INTO THE GAME AND IT WAS NO SURPRISE WHEN A CROSS FROM THE RIGHT CAME OFF A DEFENDER'S HAND AND GARY WILSON BLASTED THE BALL PAST FITZPATRICK TO MAKE IT 3-2 AND GAME ON AGAIN.

ARTHURLIE KEPT PUSHING FORWARD BUT IT WAS TAYPORT WHO SCORED THE NEXT GOAL WHEN THEY BROKE AWAY AND THE BALL WAS LIKE A PINBALL MACHINE BEING BLOCKED 3 TIMES BEFORE FALLING TO SCOTT PETERS AND THE BALDING MIDFIELDER DROVE HIS SHOT PAST ROBERTSON TO MAKE IT 4-2.

ON 65 MINUTES ARTHURLIE WERE REDUCED TO 10 MEN WHEN A HORRIBLE CHALLENGE BY SUB. ALAN WADDELL SAW HIM RED CARDED.

'LIE KEPT PUSHING FORWARD TO TRY AND GET BACK INTO THE GAME BUT KEEPER FITZPATRICK WAS HAVING AN INSPIRED GAME. THE CHANCES THAT DID COME THEIR WAY WERE NOT CONVERTED AND THE PUDDLES ROUND THE TAYPORT GOALMOUTH ALL STOPPED THE 'LIE FROM SCORING.. IT WAS NO SURPRISE WHEN ON 85 MINUTES PORT SCORED A 5TH WITH DUELL SCORING HIS 2ND. HE TWISTED AND TURNED THE DEFENCE BEFORE CHIPPING A DELIGHTFUL LOB PAST A BEMUSED ROBERTSON FROM 20 YARDS. THE SCORING HADN'T FINISHED AS SUB ROBBIE HENDERSON ON A GREAT RUN SAW HIS 18 YARD SHOT CANNON OFF THE UNDERSIDE OF THE BAR AND DROP OVER THE LINE FOR AN INCREDIBLE 6-2 VICTORY TO TAYPORT.

THE ACTION NEVER STOPPED THERE AS A SUPPORTER SAID SOME THING TO KEEPER ROBERTSON AND AT THE END OF THE GAME HE WAS HELD BACK FROM THE SUPPORTER, OTHERWISE I THINK HE WOULD HAVE CLOBBERED HIM.
