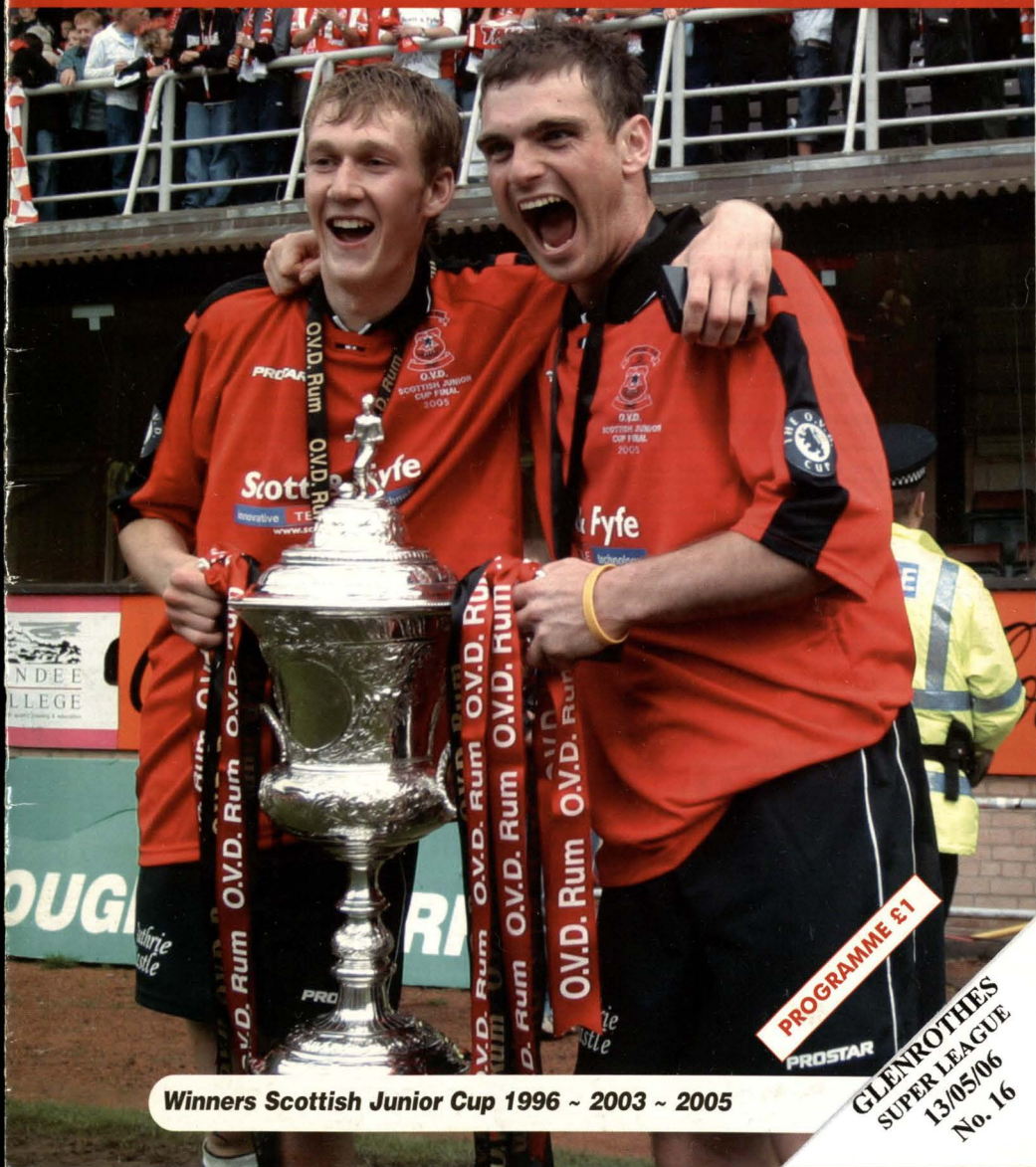

Glenrothes at home today and suddenly it's our last home game of our league season. It's a game which, only a few weeks ago, seemed would be only of academic interest. However, our win at Bathgate, which stifled any early hopes of title celebrations, followed by Bathgate's loss of five points in two games since, has changed the complexion at the top of the league.

The top of the league position changed for the first time this year on Wednesday evening when we lost our pole position thanks to Kenny McMillan's own goal which gave Hill of Beath the points v Lochee United on Wednesday past. The 1-0 win puts Haws one point clear of Tayport, although that's the Keir's Park side's campaign now complete.

Only a few short weeks ago Glenrothes, faced with successive games v Bonnyrigg, Linlithgow and Arniston, seemed to have a very tough task to claw their way clear of the relegation zone. Draws v the two Roses and three points from last week's 3-2 encounter with Arniston has given the Warout side a great chance of escaping the drop.

Glenrothes have guile and experience in abundance to extricate themselves from the situation in which they find themselves. And we shouldn't be misled by regular press reports which seem to suggest that the Warout Stadium resembles Holby City! Despite the injury problems, Glens seems to grind out the results when they are needed.

Last line of defence, keeper Clive Guppy, has fought his way back from a horrific injury which would have finished the careers of most keepers, to re-establish himself as one of the Super League's top No.1s. Ryan McCallum, a scorer last week, has done well since signing from Cowdenbeath during the window and as ever, Murray Urquhart will be a tower of strength for the visitors. Billy McPhee, who had one of the goals v Arnie, was taken off injured and looks to be absent today. Mark Buist missed out last week, but should be sufficiently improved to take a jersey today.

Manager Willie Garner was well pleased with his team's gutsy performance last week saying 'we are still in the mix and full marks for the lads for hanging on [v Arniston]. First half we were fantastic but overall the performance was only okay and it was a close call in the end'

Apart from Gus Malone who has been on the treatment table all week following a training ground injury the previous week and ex Glens man Martin Grant, Tayport look to be reporting a clean bill of health.

Scott Peters, Allan Ramsay, Steven Stewart, Brian Livie and Robbie Henderson, none of whom started the 5-0 win at Dundonald last week, all look up for selection today

Ten years ago this weekend, Tayport FC created history by winning the Scottish Cup. The Holy Grail, as it's often described, had eluded Tayside clubs since Dundee Violet's triumph in 1929.

THIS WEEKEND IS THE 10th ANNIVERSARY of TAYPORT'S FIRST SCOTTISH CUP WIN

As the years rolled on, it looked as if there was a jinx on local clubs, with Harp, in 1954 losing the final, and Downfield, Carnoustie Panmure and Lochee United all subsequently falling at the penultimate stage.

Since joining the Juniors in 1990, Tayport FC had emerged as a force in the local game and when we reached the final at Firhill in 1993, only to lose 1-0 to Glenafton, it appeared that local clubs

were destined never again to savour the thrill of a cup win.

All was to change that famous Sunday afternoon at Motherwell's Fir Park when, after a goalless 90 minutes, two extra time goals from **Stevie Ross** brought the cup to Canniepairt for the first time.

The win sparked off mammoth celebrations in the town, which will be long recalled by all those lucky enough to live their dream.

When he netted a hat-trick in **chory** on the Canniepairt in only have dreamed that this triumph seven months later, the wee striker signed in the close season from North End. **Keith Nicolson** and **Gary Maher** (2) had the other goals.

Lochgelly Albert were next to fall to the Tayport sword, by the same scoreline on the Canniepairt. **Hamish Mackay** (2), **Barrie Gray** (2) and **Dave Reilly** had the goals.

In the third round in December, we were held 1-1 by the now defunct **Baillieston** on the Canniepairt with **Hamish** getting our goal. Dave Baikie could see that we were lacking something and persuaded the committee to shell out a few grand to Lochee United for **Jim Henry**. Jim's registration was literally at the 11th hour on Saturday morning at the SFA's Park Gardens.

Jim turned in a virtuoso performance that day in our 3-0 win, the three goals coming from the three amigos, **Mackay**, **Ross** and **Reilly**.

A 1-1 draw (**Dave Reilly**) at home to **FC Stoneywood** from Aberdeen in the 4th round in January didn't augur well, but Tayport's growing away-from-home reputation was enhanced with a 3-1 win in the replay, thanks to a double from **Dave Reilly** and a rare **Grant Paterson** goal.

Aberdeen Bon Accord on the Canniepairt was a favourable draw in the fifth round and the 2-0 win was comfortable, **DR** hitting his sixth and seventh goals of the campaign,

Another home draw in the quarter final brought **Kirkintilloch Rob Roy** to town. Strikes from **DR** and **Stevie Stewart** gave Tayport a narrow 2-1 win and a trip to Fir Park to meet **Auchinleck** in the semi final on 12th April.

Steven Stewart's goal was the highlight of a 2-0 win, **Stevie Ross** adding the other goal to put Tayport into their second final in four years.

1996 - A Vintage Year for Port

The backroom staff

DAVE BAIKIE was the manager who brought together the squad of players, many of whom were to subsequently become household names in football circles on Tayside and further afield. Baikie joined the club from Downfield as joint manager with Peter Marr in 1990 and took over the reins in his own right for season 1991/92.

Baikie led Tayport to the '96 triumph and finals in '93 and '97 before leaving to manage Arbroath FC with considerable success. He returned to the Canniepairt in 2001 and led the club to two further Scottish semi-finals and a final before being lured to Cowdenbeath in 2004. He then took the manager's post at Bo'ness United in 2005 before accepting an offer to manage East Fife earlier this year. Baikie stays in Tayport.

GRAEME 'MEL' IRONS, assistant to Dave Baikie, joined the club as a player in 1990 after a spell as player/manager at Forfar West End. In recognition of his advancing years, his off the field role developed and he became an important cog in the Tayport managerial wheel. Mel joined Baikie at Arbroath and has been his assistant at all his posts since. Stays in Dundee.

GED REILLY, Goalkeeping coach who had had vast experience of the Junior and Senior game and was brought on board by Baikie to give keeper Fraser Mann that extra edge which would always be worth a few points or cup ties in a season. Retired after leaving Tayport to concentrate on golf. Stays in Dundee.

GEORGE MALONE, George was persuaded to rekindle his career at its twilight stage in 1990 and this proved to be a master stroke by Baikie. After his playing career finally ended, he became a somewhat reluctant coach but served the club well until 1997 when he retired from football to concentrate on chasing a white ball around Scotsraig. Stays in Dundee.

JIMMY HUNTER, Had joined the club in 1990 from Downfield after Baikie recognised the need to increase his midfield strength. Stayed on as coach after effectively hanging up his boots in 1995, a role in which he continued until 2000. Stays in Dundee.

ANDY BELL, Physiotherapist who joined in 1993 after a long career in the senior and junior game. Spent some seven years at the Canniepairt before moving to Lochee United who shared his healing talents with Dundee Stars Ice Hockey Club. Stays in Dundee.

The Committee

The committee who oversaw the club's initial Junior Cup success in 1996 isn't greatly different from today's committee. Still serving are Chairman **EDDIE STEWART**, vice-chairman **ALASTAIR OSWALD** and secretary **ALBERT OSWALD** who between the three of them have chalked up over 100 years on the committee, **JOHN ANDERSON**, **SANDY McDADE** and **BERT IRVINE**. All are Tayport residents.

ROSS MACMILLAN retired as treasurer a couple of seasons ago after lengthy service as player, manager and club official. Ross stays in Tayport and is a regular spectator, home and away. Match Secretary in 1996 and committee stalwart for many years before then, **DAVIE AYRE** retired from that post in 1997 but since then, has hardly, if ever missed a Tayport match, home or away. Davie, a former Port resident, now stays in Dundee.

LAWRENCE BEVERIDGE came off the committee in 1998 but is still a keen follower of the club's fortunes and stays just round the corner from the Canniepairt.

BOBBY WADDELL had previously served the club as a player and manager after a lengthy spell in the Seniors which had kicked off as a member of Dundee FC's Championship squad of 1961/62 and continued at Blackpool, Bradford Park Avenue, East Fife and Montrose. Deedle, who came off the committee in 1997, is another who lives in Tayport and still attends at the Canniepairt.

ALEX SPENCE, who resided at Tayport Caravan Park after moving through to the east coast from central Scotland, moved to Guardbridge where sadly, he passed away a few years ago. Came off the committee in 1997.

SUPER LEAGUE

The Super League is once again turning out to be an incredibly tightly fought competition. What the SPL would give for a similar finale to their season? Indeed, with only 13 of the 132 games still to be played, Whitburn are in the amazing position, with four games to play, of being capable of both being relegated and being champions. A unique situation, surely.

As things stand at the moment, Whitburn, along with Hill of Beath, Tayport and Bathgate can finish as champions. Arniston will be relegated along with North End, but which club will be the third to take the drop? Seven clubs are still in danger - Whitburn, Bo'ness, Linlithgow, Carnoustie, Lochee United, Bonnyrigg and Glenrothes. These clubs are all still in the frame.

Much will be sorted out this afternoon, however, with Bonnyrigg v Bo'ness, Lochee United v Bathgate, Whitburn v Carnoustie and ourselves v Glenrothes.

Joining the Super League from Tayside next season, despite their mauling from Harp last Saturday will almost certainly be Kinnoull. A draw at home to only rivals Montrose Roselea in Perth on Saturday would be sufficient to get the champagne corks popping. Even if Roselea spoil the party, there's another chance in their final fixture v Dundee Violet to collect the required points. The nerves will certainly be jangling at Tulloch Park this afternoon. Kinnoull play at the Canniepairt on Tuesday evening when we meet in a Challenge Cup quarter final tie. The Perth lads will be out to avenge our 5-0 Findlay Cup win earlier in the season.

The Fife representative for next year's Super League hasn't yet been determined, either. Oakley are favourites at the moment but St Andrews United are making a late bid to pip them. Rosyth, now back under the management of Billy Spence, can still make it, but Kelty's chances hang by the most slender of threads. There was a big Fife card last night, so the position will be changed. The top game last night was at Kelty where St Andrews were the visitors. Saints pretty much had to win that one and hope that Oakley slipped up v Kirkcaldy.

In the Lothians, the big game was Penicuik v Fauldhouse last night. A win for Penicuik would see them going right to the wire with Camelon for the step up to the Super League.

Definitely exciting times in the East Region.

Tayport's Scottish Cup conquerors Auchinleck Talbot clinched the West Super League title for the first time during the week and can now look forward to next week's final v Bathgate at Rugby Park, Kilmarnock. The match is live on TV but a healthy crowd is expected to attend, with understandably the vast majority favouring the Talbot.
