

FINDLAY CUP SEMI-FINAL

TAYPORT v CARNOUSTIE PANMURE



Whilst Tayport have the Redwood Leisure Cup Final next Saturday against Lochee United at Glenesk Park, today is Carnoustie's last chance of getting their hands on some silverware this season. That will be incentive enough for the Laing Park side which has had a disappointing season by their own standards.

The league campaign saw them finish just above the danger zone, but in reality, which club didn't. Cup defeats were by Dundee Violet (twice), Hill of Beath on penalties, Bonnyrigg in the Scottish and ourselves in the Redwood Cup.

Since joining the Tayside Junior FA in 1990, Tayport have played against Carnoustie on more occasions than any other club. In fact this will be the 50th meeting of the pair. The early days saw Tayport notch some victories by sizeable margins, the first four encounters between the teams bringing Tayport four wins and nineteen goals.

It wasn't all one way traffic, however, in those days as the inconsistent Carnoustie notched up the two wins which long stood as Tayport's worst ever defeats, 5-2 on Canniepairt in 1994 and 6-3 at Westfield Park in 1997. Sizeable, they might have been but they were the only two defeats suffered by Tayport in the first 30 matches between the teams.

Davie Laing's emergence as the main man at Panmure brought greater consistency to the Gowfers and recent encounters between the sides have invariably been closer affairs, the zenith of which was the Angus sides Scottish Cup final win on a penalty shoot out in 2004.

This season the sides have been unable to be separated in the league with two 1-1 draws being the outcome. Four more points for Panmure would have given them a healthy finishing spot, but for Port it would have seen them sitting here today as title favourites.

At Laing Park back in August, a late Graeme Christie goal levelled Steven Stewart's early strike for Port. In the return down here, Jim Collier's early effort for the Gowfers was cancelled out by Robbie Henderson.

Tayport called the shots in April with a 3-1 win at Laing Park. Ralph Brand drew the home side level after Bryan Duell had opened for Port, but late goals from Steven Stewart and Ronnie Kenneth, who moved from Laing Park to Canniepairt during the January window, sealed the tie for Tayport.

Both teams will have their selection options curtailed by injury or suspension. Panmure's Webster misses out through suspension but Tayport's Dailly, sent off on Wednesday, will be available today but will miss the cup final next Saturday. On the visitors' injured list are Ogilvy, Wilkie, Anderson and Maher. For Tayport Stewart will definitely miss out but Livie could return. Striker Ralph Brand returns after suspension to the Gowfers' line-up but Jim Collier is cup-tied.

There will be a minute's silence prior to this afternoon's match in memory of former Carnoustie treasurer Tom Fenwick who died this week, aged 86. Tom was the last surviving founder member of the club which was established in 1936.

THAT WAS THE (LEAGUE) SEASON, THAT WAS

Looking on the bright side, Tayport can still win the Super League. Looking on the realistic side, we'll finish as runners-up, for a third year in a row. It's amazing how fortunes have fluctuated over the past few months, during which time both Bathgate and, to a lesser extent, Whitburn, seemed likely to run away with the title.

April's draw at home to 'Burn all but ended Tayport's hopes and with the Central Parkers hitting a major slump, Bathgate held all of the aces. Until, that is, Scott Peters popped up with a last-gasp winner at Creamery Park, thus reviving Tayport's hopes.

When North End were beaten on the Canniepairt and 'Gate dropped points to Arniston, the tables had turned. If 'Port could collect six points from the last two fixtures, Thistle would have to win all four of their remaining games. A tall order for the Scottish Cup finalists.

So, back in a position of strength, it all went horribly wrong. Glenrothes equalised with a late corner kick a fortnight ago, then, at New Dundas Park, a seemingly rejuvenated 'Port went into a two-goal lead, only to see all of the good work undone in the closing stages. Now, for Tayport, nothing more can be done. Bathgate need to gain three points from three games, as well as a couple of goals in the goal-difference column. It's no certainty, but let's not build up our hopes.

Highlight of the campaign was surely the 3-2 win at Bathgate, but, until then, there hadn't been much to get excited about. Well, maybe the 3-1 win at Thomson Park.

The low point? Some might say the four-nil drubbing against Dave Baikie's Bo'ness, although that could be marked down as a freak result. The great disappointment of the season has been the club's home form. It had all started promisingly enough, with wins against Arniston and Lochee United on the Canniepairt, but, after that, too many draws, not enough wins, not enough goals.

Reflecting on those games, everyone connected with the club would shake their heads in disbelief at the points which have been lost. To be fair, though, the league is an exceptionally tight one and the vast majority of teams have been even more careless with points. It's just that expectation levels at the club are so high.

Tayport only completed league doubles over three sides this season: Lochee United, Arniston and North End, two of whom have been relegated. Whitburn, Bonnyrigg, Linlithgow and Carnoustie all managed to avoid defeat against 'Port, with Whitburn's display back in August most impressive. Tayport were fortunate to escape with a 3-2 loss, as it could have been much worse.

At least that was a match that will be remembered. A lot of 'the others were just mundane. Best not to dwell on it. After all, only three defeats in a 22-match programme can't be that bad. Not quite champions, but not far away.

Scottish Junior Cup Final Disappoints Once Again

Few would disagree that Sunday's Junior showpiece between Bathgate and Auchinleck Talbot was rather disappointing, as has been the case fairly consistently over recent years. And few would disagree either, that the better team won the cup.

What the final will be remembered for are two of the most unusual goals ever scored in a final, particularly the opening goal from Stevie Mallan which was as bizarre as they come. McVey's own goal to equalise was an absolute corker. Many would have expected the Talbot heads to go down after that, but the Ayrshire men finished strongly to take the cup back to the west.

The attendance, officially given as 7,469 was the best for around twelve years, but was again the subject of much debate on the internet with every contributor, almost without exception, claiming that there were very many more in the ground. One can assume that only the paying customers are counted, the balance of the attendance being made up with a substantial number of sponsors' guests and SJFA officials' guests.

The pre-match build-up seemed to be dominated by media articles on Bathgate manager/owner Willie Hill and below we reproduce one such article which appeared in The Herald.

Willie Hill, the multi-millionaire backer of Bathgate Thistle, who will contest Sunday's OVD Junior Cup final with Auchinleck Talbot at Rugby Park, has called for the Scottish Football Association to create a pyramid structure, which would allow leading junior clubs to follow Gretna's example and join the Scottish Football League.

Hill, who recently paid Stefan King, the nightclub owner and entrepreneur, £11.75m for the front half of the former GPO building in Glasgow's George Square, is frustrated by what he describes as the "self-interest" of Scotland's lower league clubs in thwarting the ambitions of junior clubs like Bathgate and claims their actions are stifling the development of the sport in the country. Hill, who has recruited a crop of former senior players to his ranks, while encouraging West Lothian talent to flourish, is pressing for the creation of a national junior superleague, which would effectively become Division 4 of the SFL.

It would be the catalyst for a system where such as East Stirlingshire were not allowed to languish at the foot of the Third Division every season without being punished. "The present situation is restraint of trade," he said. "We must be the only country in Europe which does not encourage proactive clubs, such as Bathgate, to climb the ladder, I have no doubt that, if Tayport, Auchinleck Talbot, Whitburn, Linlithgow and ourselves were allowed to take on the teams at the bottom of the [SFL] third division, we would beat them on a regular basis.

'You have to wonder why the SFL doesn't sort out this issue, because it cannot be doing the game any good to have Firs Park [home to East Stirlingshire] closed to the community for 95% of the time, for their players to be paid £10 a week, and for them to be last in the league every year," said Hill. "It is ridiculous that Bathgate could win the Junior Cup and the East Superleague in the next fortnight, yet it takes us nowhere. Do you think Brooks Mileson would be interested in building up Gretna and bringing them headlines across the world if he was stuck in the same boat?

"I propose that a new tier be established in the next two or three seasons which allows promotion and relegation from the junior superleagues into the SFL. I do not expect to win this battle easily, given the self-interest which exists among some [SFL] second and third division sides, but I'll not shirk the challenge."

The Herald understands that some high-profile junior clubs are prepared to pursue the matter in the European Court, alleging that the current Scottish structure prevents them from realising their potential and results in stagnation

SNIFFING ABOUT THE WITH THE SNOUT



Why is it that referees can nitpick over two goalkeepers in a match wearing the same colour of jersey, when they consistently ignore substitutes lining the touchline or parading behind a goal with the same colour of tops as one of the participating teams. It's time the match officials got their act together on this one.






