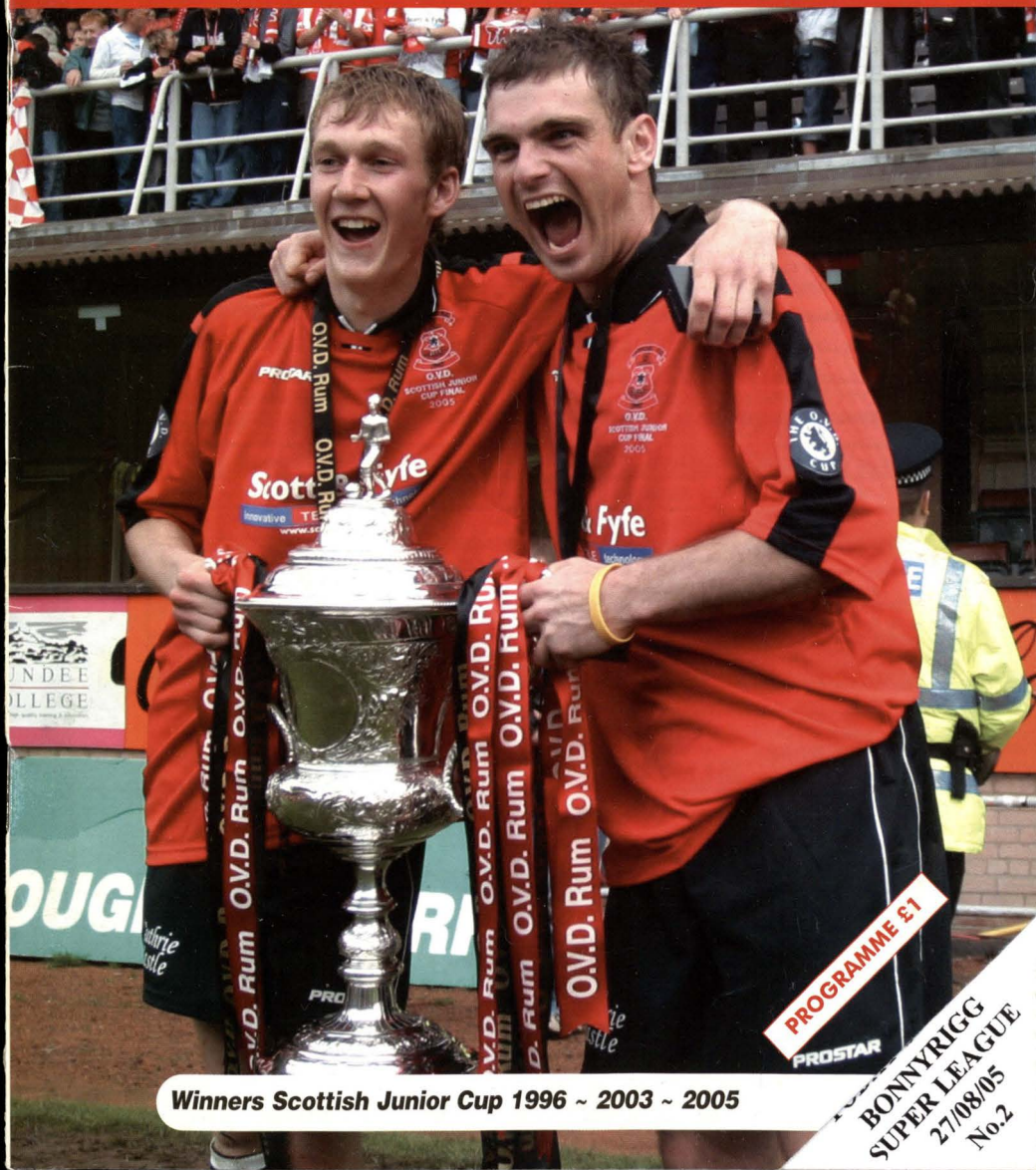

TAYPORT v BONNYRIGG ROSE ATHLETIC

After a promising pre-season and an impressive start to the campaign, we came unstuck at Whitburn last Saturday and, although there was improvement on Wednesday past at Carnoustie, the 90th minute goal which we conceded, effectively cost us second top spot in the Super League. It meant we had to settle for a point when it looked, for over an hour, that we had three in the bag. Not one person in Laing Park, apart from the referee, thought the free kick that led to the goal should have been awarded to the home side.

Mind you, if we thought we were hard done by, what about Everton? Switching on the TV later that evening we witnessed another travesty and a worse refereeing howler when referee Collina disallowed Duncan Ferguson's goal v Villareal.

It's Bonnyrigg who are our visitors this afternoon and they arrive at the Canniepairt seeking to secure their first win of the season after three defeats and an opening day draw. It's not the form which one expects from Bonnyrigg, considering their form in the Super League to date, and the fact that there are rarely wholesale changes to the playing personnel from one season to the next.

There are three new faces in the squad, however, Grant Killin, a striker from Penicuik, Graeme McCaul, a midfielder who plied his trade most recently with Albion Rovers and the versatile Paul Harvey from Tranent.

Although striker Lee Bailey has moved into management, assisting Ben Honeyman at Arniston, there will still plenty of the old guard on duty today, for example international keeper Stevie Ellison and ex-Brechin City midfielder Paul Riley. The attacking threat, as ever, will come from last season's top Super League scorer Sean Grady and Steve Laidlaw, who came off the bench last week to net the consolation goal in the 3-1 home defeat by Hill of Beath. The most familiar face in the Bonnyrigg line-up, however, will be John 'Chalkie' Elliott (right), now in his second season with his home town club after moving from Tayport. A class player, Chalkie has lit up many a game with his spectacular shooting prowess.

Tayport will be hoping to put the form, which has seen them take only a point from their last two games, behind them and will not be deceived by the current lowly league position of their opponents. Barry McNaughton and John Knox both missed out on Wednesday through injury but could be back today. Steven Stewart's presence was missed when an injury kept him inside at half-time v Carnoustie and he will be a doubtful starter. Robbie Henderson was left out at Laing Park and will be anxious to get back into the starting line-up.

Such is the intensity of the Super League, even at this stage of the season, this can be billed as a crucial encounter for both sides.

Treatment table news is that Barry's ankle is getting stronger every day but John Knox has a groin strain and may be doubtful for today's match.

On the transfer front, Ralph Hunter has still not appeared at Tayport and, although Sean Christie has asked to stay on the list at present, he will be considered for team selection as usual. We are always looking to improve our squad and if quality players become available, we will endeavour to bring them to the Canniepairt. We are very happy with the squad which we have at our disposal but, if we lose any of the above players, we know that they will have to be replaced with new faces. New recruits Bryan Duell and Craig Brown have fitted in very well and, given time both will be great assets to Tayport FC.

In the Royal British Legion Pairs at Scotsraig Bowling Club last Sunday, former 'Port amateur player Richard Rennie and former TFC groundsman John Ewing lifted the trophy. Said Rich, after a couple of celebratory shandies, "we thought we would have had some competition from Andy Phin, but he was nowhere and we strolled it!"

This season will be the last season the Scottish Junior Cup, first played for in 1886, will be sponsored by OVD Rum. The rum firm, which has backed the tournament for 18 years during which OVD has had several changes of ownership, has decided that 2006 is to be their last year of sponsorship. For the majority of that time the competition has been dominated by Tayport FC and the OVD name will forever be associated with Tayport's success during that period.

Issue 98 of Dundee United's official club magazine 'Tangerine & Black' devoted two full colour pages of text and photographs to Tayport's Scottish Junior Cup win. The article recognised that the standard of the top level of the Junior game is at least as high as SFL Division 3 and probably on a par with some clubs in the second division. The writer reckoned that commonsense should prevail and that the more ambitious junior clubs should have access to the SFL through a pyramid system. A parting comment from United chairman Eddie Thompson welcomed the SJFA back to Tannadice for the final any time they wished.

Andy Phin, doyen of the Tayport support, may be celebrating his 75th birthday next month but that doesn't mean that the former Cobbies Inn landlord takes it easy. The other weekend he had stints helping out behind the bars of the Bowling Club, the Bell-rock Tavern and on his old beat in Cobbies

East Region clubs were pleasantly surprised this week when copies of the minutes of the Association meetings arrived by e.mail. All clubs aren't yet accessible by e.mail, but it's a sure sign that things are moving in the right direction.

The early season fixture list didn't have any games listed for Saturday 17th September, as Dugout Cup ties were planned for that day, but it's understood that Tayport, who aren't playing in the Dugout, will have a Super League fixture. That's also likely to be the case on Saturday 1st October with Tayport receiving a bye in the 1st round of the Scottish Junior Cup which is scheduled for that day.

Ex- SJFA president John Reilly resigned from the East Region Management Committee in protest over the postponement of the Jeanfield v Arbroath Vics game through the failure of the Association to provide a referee. "It would never have happened under Jock Myles' administration", said Reilly in *The Courier* (15/08/05). No doubt the beaks will be scrutinising JR's comments.

Another whose comments stirred some interest was Lochee boss Eddie Wolecki who told *The Sun* (13/08/05) "I'm not just building a team to win things this season—I'm building a team that can dominate for years to come"

Arbroath SC manager Jim Lowe mentioned in *The Courier* that things were moving forward at Seaton Park and welcomed the committee's decision to introduce win bonuses. If it was to be an incentive, then it didn't work—SC were thumped 7-1 by Forfar West End in their opening league game!

The *Fife Herald* (19/08/05) provided excellent coverage of Tayport's opening two games. Ok, the headline was a bit corny "*Tayport's first goal was a gem by Duell*" but the report was accompanied by a photo of Bryan slotting the opening goal of the season past Arniston keeper Elder.

The report of Wednesday's win over Lochee managed to beat the deadline to get a back page slot where the main feature was a preview of the Whitburn game.

The *Evening Telegraph* (19/08/05) had it's usual comprehensive coverage, with match previews, all the tables and fixtures and three colour photos, one of which was Gareth Dailly firing in a free kick as the three man Lochee wall protected their crown jewels.

In another of the photos former Tayport skipper Sean Wilkie accepted the Tayside Premier League flag from the Association president.

The third photo was of Jock Myles presenting the Evening Telegraph-sponsored Jock Myles Trophy, a newly inaugurated award to be presented to the Tayside Junior Personality of the Year at the end of each season, a further example of the Tele's commitment to the Junior game.

The *Edinburgh Evening News* (19/08/05), in previewing the day's Super League card, had Bonnyrigg down for a banker win. Two games into the season the paper dismissed Hill of Beath as prime relegation candidates. A bit off the mark as the following day's result proved.

Bo'ness to realise their promise?

Bo'ness United have a set-up and support which is what the Super League is all about, but for two seasons now, the Newton Park club has failed to make any significant mark on the Super League. There have been occasions during this period when manager Jim Sandison's side have looked real championship contenders, but equally there have been times when they have looked very ordinary. Their win at Linlithgow on Wednesday put Bo'ness a point clear at the top of the league and perhaps this season they are set to mount a serious title challenge. A home match v **Arniston** today should see them bag another three points. **Arniston** won their local derby at home to Bonnyrigg on Wednesday but a win at Bo'ness would be a major surprise.

Whitburn are a point off the top and going well but there have been similar stories in the last two seasons with promoted clubs setting the early pace but being unable to sustain their early season form. **Glenrothes** have made a steady start and will put Whitburn's aspirations to the test.

Promoted **North End** have not been setting the pace but they have been setting some sort of record, losing all four opening league games by a 1-2 margin. The Dokens will be hoping this trend can be reversed at home to **Linlithgow Rose** today. Lithgae were given a fair trouncing on their most recent visit to Dundee, losing 5-1 to Lochee, and having gone down in mid-week, will be anxious to avoid losing any more ground.

Bathgate Thistle brought in a host of new signings and have signalled their intentions of mounting a serious challenge for the title having flattered to deceive in each of the past three seasons. Bathgate have yet to lose a goal this campaign, but have hardly been prolific at the other end with only two goals - both matchwinners, nevertheless - in three games played. A home game v **Carnoustie** is this afternoon's attraction at Creamery Park and it would be a bold decision to back against a Thistle win.

Lochee United are at home to **Hill of Beath** who have recovered to some extent after two opening defeats. Lochee have a lot to live up to, given manager Eddie Wolecki's pre-season pronouncements, but came from behind on Wednesday to take three points from their game v North End and will be confident of overcoming Haws at Thomson Park this afternoon. A draw is perhaps the better bet.

All results should be on the Newsline (01382 552755) shortly after this afternoon's game. The profile of the Super League seems to be going from strength to strength and the powers that be should be able to capitalise on this situation. One issue which requires to be addressed is ensuring that clubs from the same area are split home and away. Today, for the second time in three weeks, we have three Tayside based clubs at home. Last week five of the six Lothians clubs were at home and it's the same next Saturday. It doesn't help clubs' gate receipts when neutral supporters have five games from which to choose in the Lothians and three within the space of a few miles on Tayside.

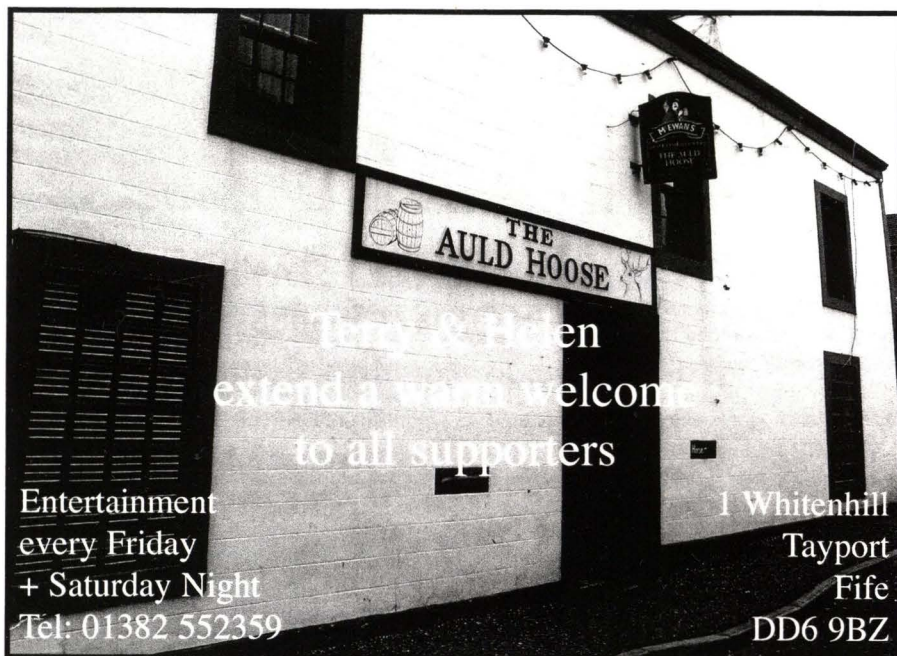

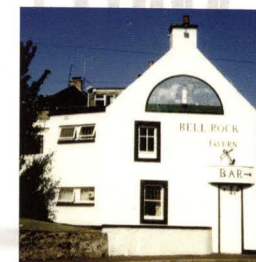

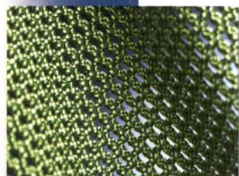
