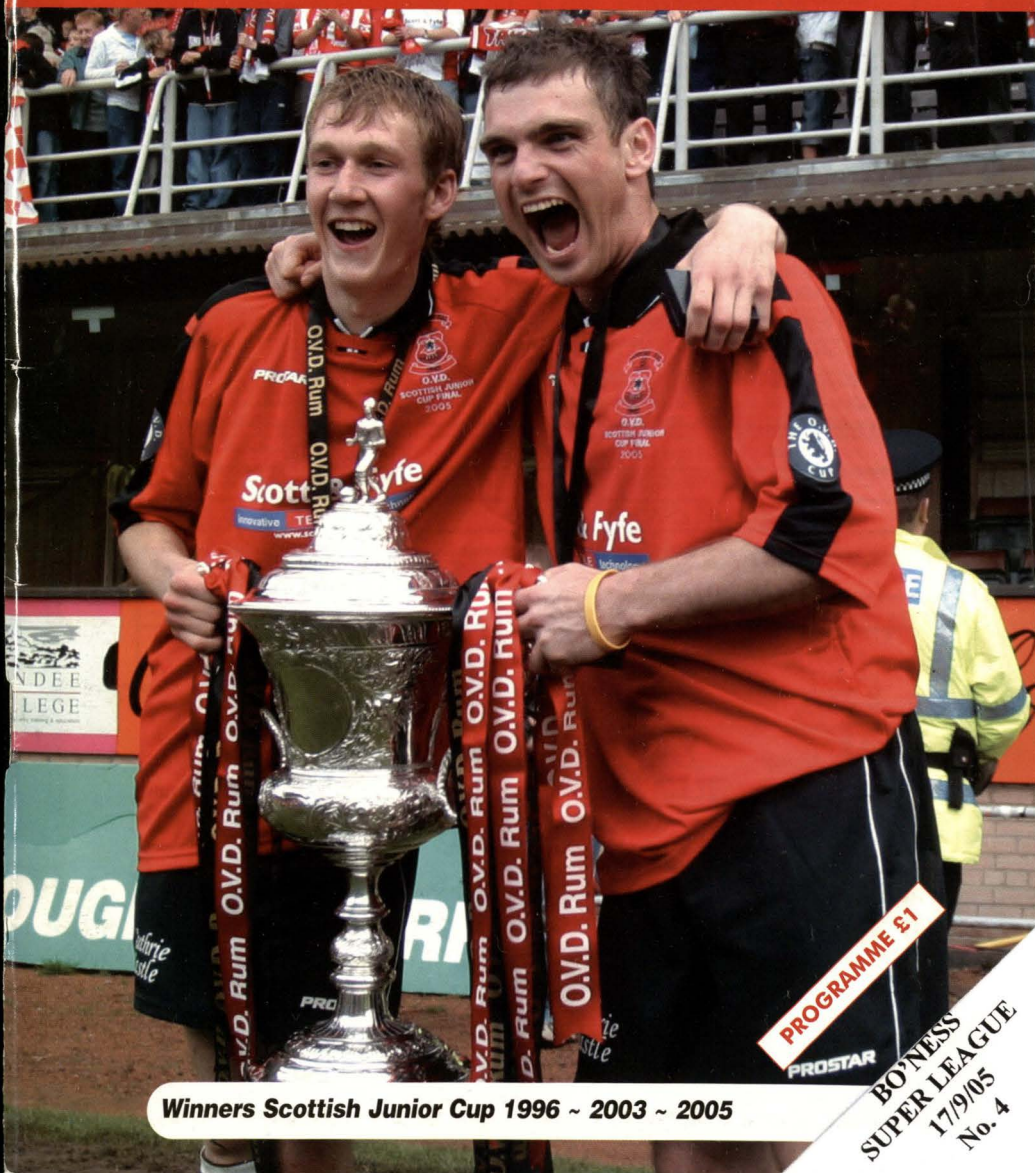

TAYPORT v BO'NESS UNITED**

Tayport and Bo'ness both started the season well, but both teams' early season form has deserted them in recent games. Well, if not form, then certainly results. United haven't won in four and Tayport in five.

When local rivals Linlithgow Rose were put to the sword, in the second of the midweek games, it looked as if Bo'ness were set for a roll, but two draws and a defeat from leaders Whitburn since then has disappointed the Newton Park faithful.

Bo'ness will likely only have seven of the squad which won 2-1 here in the corresponding game in August last season, having recruited half a dozen new faces during the summer break.

Keeper David Orr joined up from Stenhousemuir to replace 35 years old Mark Cairns who, along with another seasoned campaigner Peter Cormack, moved to Arbroath.

The striking potential of Manager Jimmy Sandison's team has been enhanced by the addition of Mark Anthony from Linlithgow, Alan Ward from Sauchie and Charlie Brigain from Musselburgh. Brigain got off the mark early on, scoring in Bo'ness' 4-0 pre-season friendly win over Cowdenbeath whilst Ward has also been paying his way and is the club's top scorer with five goals already in the Super League.

Despite a niggling injury which has plagued him in recent games, former Republic of Ireland, Bordeaux and Dunfermline striker George O'Boyle (pictured) is an ever present to date and has weighed in with a couple of goals. There's still no word on another prominent ex-Senior, Kevin Thomas, who would appear to have deserted the club.

Defender Gary Brown and the elegant Kevin Donnelly were both left on the bench last week when United shared four goals with Glenrothes, but both could be recalled for today's encounter, with manager Sandison set to make changes as he seeks to rekindle the side's early season form.

Like his opposite number, Keith Burgess will be looking for his charges to get back to their winning ways. He has seen his team lose and draw twice in the last three weeks, on each occasion from potentially winning situations, and will be anxious to get in front and stay there.

Barry McNaughton hasn't been seen in action so far this season because of injury but could be back today to provide the spark the team has lacked. Ross Gunnion will be available after missing last week but top scorer Bryan Duell is out through suspension and Grant Paterson is on holiday.



from the archives june 1977

In the halcyon days of the British Championship, it became something of a tradition for the predecessors of today's Tartan Army to take in Scotland v England at Wembley every second year.

It was always a boisterous time, to say the least, but in 1977, things got kind of out of hand, with the celebrating Scots invading the park in recognition of a famous 2-1 victory.

It will be recalled that the goals collapsed and huge swathes of turf were cut and taken back home as souvenirs.

Indeed legend has it that a piece of Wembley turf was transplanted at the Canniepairt where the pitch had not long been laid. (well, we did have several members at the game)

Reproduced below is the editorial which appeared in *The Scotsman* newspaper on Monday 6th following the match.

The aftermath

In no way can Saturday's scenes at Wembley be defended. The damage done to turf and goalposts was a lamentable despoliation of a famous football ground; it brought disrepute to the whole of Scotland and robbed our excellent team of the *succes d'estime* which so convincing a victory should have won them. Instead, only the memory of wrecked goalposts, scarred turf and alcoholic excess will recall Wembley 1977. Yet the reaction in some quarters has been somewhat hysterical, and worse deeds have been perpetrated in the name of football than Saturday's bacchanalia. There was little personal violence, either inside or outside the ground, and the mood of the Scottish supporters throughout the weekend was boisterous and good-humoured, though regrettably uncouth. The London police, perhaps to be faulted for not having taken decisive steps to stop the invasion in the first instance, thereafter behaved with the wonderful equability for which they are famous, and it is not to be doubted that their calmness prevented drunken revelry from turning, à la Barcelona, into something much uglier.

A pity, therefore, that the London Press could not have mustered a like maturity or have matched the endearing tolerance of so many ordinary English folk on whose hospitality the Scots made such unreasonable demands. Already on Saturday morning, with little provocation, the papers were hostile and in two cases outrageously hostile. One commentator (unconsciously prescient) called for the Scots to be "ground into the turf," and another said that apart from their usefulness in world wars they were best kept behind Hadrian's Wall. Yesterday a paper even so normally sensitive as the "Guardian" indulged in a passage of anti-Scottishness so extreme and so all-embracing that had it appeared in these columns, with English substituted for Scottish, then it would undoubtedly have produced charges of racialism from Mr and Mrs Norman Buchan. Scots may have behaved like bulls in a china shop but they had been baited.

Such sentiments are old. Indeed the "Guardian" goes right back to Dr Johnson. Nor is fierce Scottish partisanship anything new; the Hampden Roar predates the SNP, and rude songs about the English are part of the warp and woof of football rivalry. It is therefore unfortunate that Mr McElhone should have brought party politics into the affair. The problem is how to keep the beast of football patriotism on the terracing and in some sort of control, and this will not be achieved by equating it with a perfectly legitimate political movement. Indeed, the effect may rather be the reverse. Drink remains at the heart of the matter. Mr McElhone's working party may propose useful restrictions and prohibitions, the courts may get tough, Wembley may buy a new fence, and Mr Fletcher may propose a reparation fund (although Wembley is presumably covered by insurance). But until we can achieve the more radical aim of persuading our football supporters to bring moderation to their drinking and sanity to their partisan spirit, then they will continue to lose us friends around the world.

After a good start, both sides have let points slip in recent weeks so, today three points are vital in the chase to catch and overtake runaway leaders Whitburn. Gary Middleton, Scott Peters, Robbie Henderson and Lloyd Young all pushed themselves to complete the match and that certainly helped what was a decent performance against a team that I consider to be the best side we have faced this season. Over the piece, although disappointed, I will admit, that, in the end, a draw was probably a fair result.

This afternoon, we will be looking for a good start to the match with an improved performance that lasts the entire 90 minutes, but most of all, a victory to put an end to our recent run of draws. Let's get behind the team as usual, and hopefully, enjoy the game

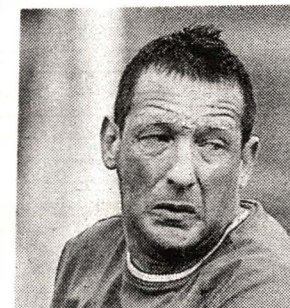
