

LINLITHGOW ROSE 2 TAYPORT 2

IN junior football's match of the day, the two former East Super League champions, Tayport and Linlithgow, shared four goals in an incident-packed encounter at Prestonfield on Saturday.

It was a case of two points dropped for the visitors, as they played against only nine men for the final 20 minutes.

Midweek signing Martin Grant, formerly of Glenrothes, was handed his Tayport debut and, within three minutes, created the opener for Bryan Duell, who knocked a first time effort beyond home 'keeper Pinkowski.

Gareth Dailly then had a couple of shots blocked as 'Port looked to extend their advantage, and the dismissal of Rose full-back Ryan Jordan, for a double bout of dissent, should have enhanced Tayport's hopes.

Instead, Linlithgow snatched an equaliser on the stroke of half-time, when dangerman Gordon Herd ran at Roberto Morris, forcing his way into the box, and slotted the ball past the recalled Frazer Fitzpatrick, into the corner of the net.

After the break, the Canniepairt outfit had the better of the exchanges, going close through Dailly, Steven Stewart and the mightily impressive Martin Grant.

There was, however, a stunning sucker-punch, when Herd again raced clear.

UNLIKELY

This time, Ross Gunnion forced the forward out wide, but his eventual cross found strike partner Paddy Flannery, whose header looped over the helpless Fitzpatrick, giving Linlithgow an unlikely lead.

Flannery's joy was short-lived, though Lifting his jersey in celebration of the goal, the former Dumbarton player collected his second caution of the afternoon, his first having hear for livered. having been for dissent.

On 70 minutes, Tayport's pressure paid off, with Derek Wemyss pounc-ing to fire home his first goal of the season, to make it two apiece.

Manager Keith Burgess then sent on John Knox and Gary Middleton, as Port sought to make the most of their numerical supremacy.

Knox himself had one shot on target, while another substitute came

close to grabbing the headlines.

Midfielder Scott Peters, previously been unavailable due to work commit-

ments, returned to training in mid-week, providing a huge lift to the club. Initially on the bench, an injury to Brian Livie prompted a first half appearance for the powerhouse, but it was late in the game when he almost made his mark.

Unfortunately, a volley and a backpost header were both off-target and the contest ended all-square.

The last-minute dismissal of Bryan Duell, for a high challenge on the goalkeeper, was indicative of Tayport's frustration at a fourth con-



Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters for this afternoon's very important East Super League match against Linlithgow Rose.

The game is the only Super League match in the Region today and a win is vital for both sides, as Linlithgow look to lift themselves up into the top five and we look to take over second spot in the league, and to get within a point of early leaders Whitburn.

As always, matches against the Rose are tight affairs with total commitment from both sides who have, over the past six or seven seasons, dominated the East Junior scene. We cannot afford to lose players during a game or for future matches in this very tight league. Gary has apologised to everyone at the club for his behaviour and realises that, just as he has started to play to the form we expect from him, he now faces a ban and a fight to regain his place in the team.

On a more positive note it was great to see Barry McNaughton back from a lengthy injury absence and I think his presence on the park on Saturday brought a calmness and control to the team, just when it was required.

Stewart, Derek, Grant and myself have been encouraged by results recently. Although not playing at our best, we have ground out results against other title contenders and now it's all about getting results and putting points on the board. With our form picking up as we go into the winter period, and with the Scottish Cup just around the corner, we all know that this when Tayport kick into life.

This week we welcomed back Grant Paterson from holiday and Bryan Duell from suspension, but we will be without Derek Wemyss, who is on holiday for ten days and the suspended Gary Middleton.

Let's all get behind the team and hopefully we can encourage them to win the vital three points against one of the other title favourites.

TODAY'S GAME

WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE ROUND 10/22 TAYPORT v LINLITHGOW ROSE

It's the meeting this afternoon of what are generally recognised as the two top clubs of the Whyte and Mackay Super League since its inception. Games between Port and

Rose have frequently turned out to be epics, so the fans will be looking for some more of that this afternoon.

It's a second league meeting of the season already, a situation brought about by the clubs receiving byes in the first round of the Scottish Cup. Only four weeks ago that first game lived up to its reputation for thrills, spills and controversy. Both sides reckoned they should have taken the points, but, given that they were down to ten men by the end of the first half and nine early in the second period, Linlithgow were probably the happier of the two, in that they did get a point.

Much has been made of Linlithgow's injury troubles this season and there's little doubt that this situation has contributed to their relatively poor start. Nevertheless they have shown that they are still a team to be reckoned with, and only two weeks ago, were only a whisker away from dumping league

leaders Whitburn. Two very late goals gave the Central Park side a point when all had looked lost for Burnies

As we saw at Prestonfield at the beginning of the month, the main Rose goal threat comes from their striking duo of Gordon Herd and Paddy Flannery (pictured).

The recent return of midfielder Ian Gallacher, following a long spell out injured, is a plus for manager Jim Sinnet, but he has missed, through injury, the experienced Danny Smith and Mark Whyte.

Keeper Steve Pinkowski, from Partick Thistle, one of six close season signings, was taken off injured last week v Arniston and if he fails to recover, his replacement Jamie Swinburn will keep his place. Other new faces in Rose colours are Scott Murphy (Bo'ness), Les Byle (East Fife), Keiran McGuinness and John Fallon (both Bellshill) and Keith Hogg (Glenafton)

Tayport will definitely be without Gary Middleton (suspended) and Derek Wemyss (holiday), so manager Burgess will be forced into making changes. Whether he changes the system as well, remains to be seen.

There could be starting places for Barry McNaughton, who returned as sub last week for his first appearance of the season, and Bryan Duell, also a sub at Glenrothes. Martin Grant is an injury doubt but full backs Grant Paterson and Ross Gunnion will come into contention for a place and a possible replacement will be required for Martin Grant who has been on the treatment table this week.



It's well recognised that the East Super League is the tightest of competitions with a couple of wins or defeats on the bounce, sending a club either zooming up the table or plummeting into relegation trouble. Incredibly, 70% of games to date have been drawn or settled by the odd goal.




