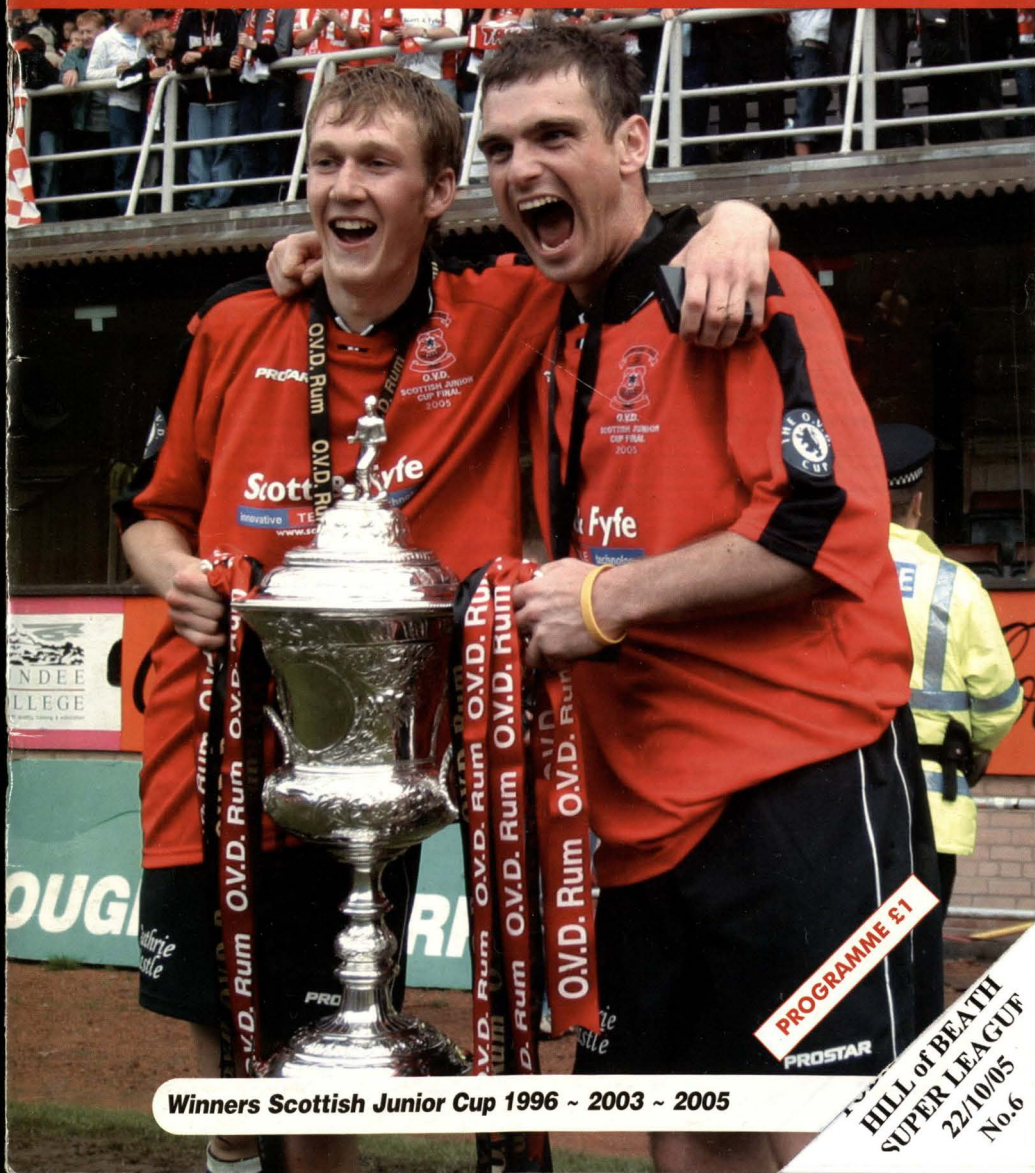

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters for this afternoon's East Super League match against Hill of Beath.

Our opponents today picked up form after an indifferent start to the campaign and have shown that they are capable of beating any team in the league. Their manager Jock Finlayson is the longest serving manager in the east of Scotland and has won nearly every honour available to his beloved Beath. 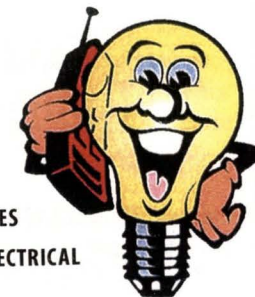



## Does Gus hold a world record?

Well, maybe not a world record but a pretty unusual occurrence, nevertheless because when Gus Malone cracked in Tayport's second goal at Kinnoull last week, he was notching his first goal for Tayport since 1982 - before some of his present teammates were born!

His last competitive goal for the club was on the 6th November 1982 for Tayport v Lawside FP on the Canniepairt. Port won 2-1 that day in a Midlands League match with Gus scoring both goals from his midfield role.

The team that day was Gus Charity; Andy McRobbie, Phil Smith, Alan Hart, Rab Downie, Gus Malone, Jim Bissett, Ronnie Whitton, Allan Harte, Ian Howe, Malcolm Graham; Subs were Micky McPherson and Ronnie Stewart. Ronnie Whitton might still kicking a ball about in Australia but the rest have long retired.

Gus was transferred to Brechin City the following week for £100.

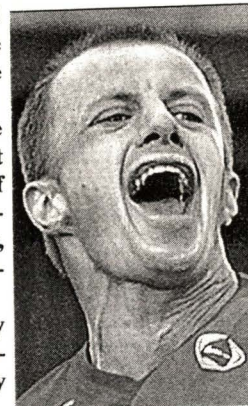

Not that the Edinburgh Evening News thought so. In an early season preview, their columnist described them as being amongst the favourites to be relegated.

Despite losing their opening two games, Hill of Beath quickly dispelled any such thoughts, embarking on a seven game unbeaten league run which was ended by a surprise 1-0 defeat by Linlithgow Rose in their last Super League outing.

Drainage improvements at Keir's Park meant that Hill of Beath played their first six games away from home. The highlight of their four subsequent games, all at home, was the 2-1 defeat of league leaders Whitburn on 24th September. Former Bathgate striker Andy Roberts (pictured) got both goals that afternoon and further goal threat today will come from Martyn Thomson whose opportunist goal put 'Port to the sword in the Redwood final.

It's all gone pear shaped since then, however, with a surprisingly comprehensive 3-0 defeat at home to Camelon, which put paid to Hill of Beath's Scottish Cup challenge at the first round stage, followed by the Linlithgow defeat. Last Saturday there was a third successive blank with a 0-0 draw at home v Fauldhouse in the Fife & Lothians Cup before Haws went through in a penalty shoot out. Despite these recent glitches, long serving manager Jock Finlayson always has his players fired up to play Tayport and today will be no exception.

Injuries and suspension have restricted Keith Burgess' options during the last couple of weeks and, although Gareth Dailly is available again, Derek Wemyss will definitely still be absent. Roberto Morris, Robbie Henderson, who had to be taken off v Kinnoull at half-time, and Scott Peters could be back in contention but doubts will be Frazer Fitzpatrick, Martin Grant and John Knox, none of whom managed to train in midweek, while Grant Paterson has made himself unavailable. Sean Christie has been back in training and could feature. With all these ifs and buts, the manager's selection will be a late one.

The club's last two Super League fixtures have resulted in four points, a healthy return given the stature of the opponents. Linlithgow Rose and Lochee United are, of course, the two previous champions, but it is the inaugural title winners, Tayport, who now look best placed to challenge at the top of the table.

When Linlithgow visited the Canniepairt three weeks ago, a predictably tight affair ensued. In a goalless draw, 'Port shaded the play, but also came out on top in the red card count. Early in the second half, Gareth Dailly reacted angrily to a foul and this reaction led to his prompt dismissal. Rose forward Colin Allison evened the score with two bookings, but, on full-time, in his own half of the field, winning a free kick, Roberto Morris was, strangely, given his second caution of the game, this one for diving.

In itself, a draw was a decent outcome, although Tayport badly needed a win and what better place to get it than Thomson Park. Gary Middleton took his Tayport tally against Lochee United to six with the opener, while Steven Stewart drilled home a great strike just after the break, putting Keith Burgess' men firmly in command.

There followed a brief spell of United pressure, yet, even without Derek Wemyss and Roberto Morris, the defence coped well, and Frazer Fitzpatrick's goal was only

breached by a speculative Calum Hardie shot. Several chances to seal the win were passed up before Robbie Henderson broke away to clinch it.

The triumph clearly acted as a tremendous lift and, despite numerous absentees, 'Port were motoring at Tulloch Park, when Kinnoull provided the opposition for a Findlay & Co. Cup tie. Two up at the interval, through Barry McNaughton and veteran veteran Gus Malone, followed swiftly by Gary Middleton's extremely close-range effort, it was shaping up to be an enjoyable afternoon.

'Noull, however, lost the plot, and, in a crazy five-minute period, found themselves four men short. McNaughton and Martin Grant added further goals, albeit with little satisfaction. In terms of the red cards, one thing led to another for the hosts. There is maybe a case for introducing a two-minute time-out after an ordering off. Not only would a manager be able to re-organise his line-up, the remaining players would also have an opportunity to at least try to calm down. That may well have prevented the ridiculous situation which befell the Tulloch Parkers in the wake of Robbie Holden's dismissal.

Let's hope today provides more good fare, with a return to the traditional eleven against eleven, which doesn't seem to happen very often these days.

The **Evening Telegraph's** Junior page (14/10) had plenty Tayport interest, featuring a competition to win two Tayport FC season tickets and building up the following day's match at Kinnoull. The main photograph was an excellent and perfectly symmetrical team group of Kinnoull. Given Kinnoull's long unbeaten run, Junicus reckoned it was the pick of the day's card.

The **Fife Herald** (14/10) had a comprehensive preview of the Kinnoull tie which included an interview with Keith Burgess who outlined his options for replacing his injured defenders, Wemyss and Morris.

The **Perthshire Advertiser** (14/10) expected a good crowd at Tulloch Park for a tie against a Tayport side of which "it's been said aren't the team they were last season".

The **Perthshire Advertiser** (18/10) headlined "Off Day for Noull". The paper didn't beat about the bush and reported that Kinnoull had been "thrashed" and a game which they had been so looking forward to, had turned out to be a nightmare. "Holden was ordered off in 57 minutes and by the 61st minute, he had been joined in the pavilion of shame by three of his teammates"

The **Evening Telegraph's** (17/10) sub heading was simple and to the point - "Port go nap as 'Noull lose plot'". The **Tele** headlined on Lochee United's 4-1 win over a Broughty Athletic side which contained six ex-Thomson Parkers. It was a black day for the Fed, making reference to Paul Blackwood's hat-trick for the Bluebells and the fact that Ray McKinnon received a red card. Davie Evans got Broughty's consolation.

The Tayport website ([www.tayportfc.com](http://www.tayportfc.com)) reported that it was a pity the game and a pleasant afternoon had ended amidst controversy, but it was all of Kinnoull's making. Referee Banks, it noted, was blameless, having handled the first half extremely well and was left with little choice thereafter.

In the **Edinburgh Evening News** (17/10) Linlithgow v Musselburgh cup tie was the main story with Paddy Flannery's contribution after coming off the bench to score two goals in a 3-0 win, earning praise from reporter Mark Bonthron. Flannery reckoned that the win would kick start their league challenge with Rose "certainly not out of the title race yet"

Junior Scotland boss and **Evening Times** columnist Jim O'Donnell was coming in for a bit of stick this week on the web. A few contributors thought that he is too biased in favour of his former club Pollok, even bringing the 'Lok into a report on the OVD Cup draw in which they didn't feature. It was pointed out that, as Pollok is the club with the biggest support and it is a Glasgow paper, then the coverage is justified.

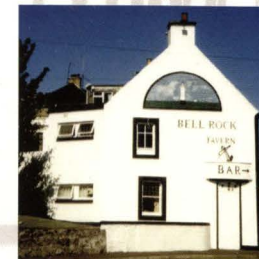
