Well, maybe not a world record but a pretty unusual occurrence, nevertheless because when Gus Malone cracked in Tayport's second goal at Kinnoull last week, he was notching his first goal for Tayport since 1982 - before some of his present teammates were born!

His last competitive goal for the club was on the 6th November 1982 for Tayport v Lawside FP on the Canniepairt. Port won 2-1 that day in a Midlands League match with Gus scoring both goals from his midfield role.

The team that day was Gus Charity; Andy McRobbie, Phil Smith, Alan Hart, Rab Downie, Gus Malone, Jim Bissett, Ronnie Whitton, Allan Harte, Ian Howe, Malcolm Graham; Subs were Micky McPherson and Ronnie Stewart. Ronnie Whitton might still kicking a ball about in Australia but the rest have long retired.

Gus was transferred to Brechin City the following week for £100.

TODAY'S GAME

WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE ROUND 12/22 TAYPORT v HILL OF BEATH HAWTHORN

It's the meeting this afternoon of what are generally recognised as the two top clubs in Fife. There have been dips in their supremacy in central and west Fife and none more

so than in 2003/2004 when they found themselves relegated from the Super League. It was a blow to Haws' pride but the Keir's Park club bounced back to regain their Super League place for this season.

Of course they served notice of their ability to compete at the top level when they defeated us by the only goal of the game at St Andrews to lift the Redwood Cup last June in the midst of our nine games in seventeen days sequence. Not that the Edinburgh Evening News thought so. In an early season preview, their columnist described them as being amongst the favourites to be relegated.

Despite losing their opening two games, Hill of Beath quickly dispelled any such thoughts, embarking on a seven game unbeaten league run which was ended by a surprise 1-0 defeat by Linlithgow Rose in their last Super League outing.

Drainage improvements at Keir's Park meant that Hill of Beath played their first six games away from home. The highlight of their four subsequent games, all at home, was the 2-1 defeat of league leaders Whitburn on 24th September. Former Bathgate striker Andy Roberts (pictured) got both goals that afternoon and further goal threat today will come from Martyn Thomson whose opportunist goal put 'Port to the sword in the Redwood final.

Sean Christie has been back in training and could feature. With all these ifs and buts, the manager's selection will be a late one.


