# SUPER LEAGUE



## SUPER LEAGUE IS AS TIGHT AS EVER

With the Whyte & Mackay East Super League pretty much at the halfway stage, indications are that it's going to be as tight as the competition we experienced in 2003/04 when three clubs shared top place on the same points and there was a mere 20 points between winning the championship and being relegated.

If *Whitburn* can be brought back into the pack, then seven or eight clubs will see themselves as having a good chance. Although, the title is not beyond them, it was probably the threat of relegation rather than a fading title challenge which prompted the *Bo'ness* committee to show manager Jimmy Sandison and his assistant John Martin the door and replace them with Dave Baikie and Mel Irons. One wonders if Jimmy and John would still not have been in charge had *Hill of Beath* not hit two late, late goals to take the points in a 2-1 win last week against a *Bo'ness* side which finished with nine men.

Whitburn showed their mettle in returning with three points from a 2-0 win at *Carnoustie*. Most folk at the Canniepairt would have preferred a Gowfers win, but there was some cheer from Prestonfield where previously unbeaten *Bathgate* lost a first half lead to go down 2-1 to *Linlithgow*. Two goals in the last ten minutes from Keiron McGuinness, his first for the club, did the damage and kept Rose in the title chase.

*Arniston's* bid to climb into midtable was thwarted at Thomson Park where *Lochee United* ran out 5-4 winners in the championship's top scoring game to date.

There would be few happier managers on Saturday night than *Glenrothes'* Willie Garner who saw his side win 2-0 at home to *Bonnyrigg*. Benny Andrew grabbed both goals for the Warout side who could even afford the luxury of a missed penalty. It's a result which gives Glens real hope of climbing clear of the dreaded bottom three slots.

Hope of climbing clear of the drop zone looks a forlorn for *North End*, even allowing for the three games in hand which they have over the teams nearest to them. In the 0-3 defeat against Tayport last Saturday, it was clear that the management team has their work cut out, even allowing for the opportunity to bring in new blood during the January window.

This afternoon's only league fixture pairs North End with Hill of Beath in Dundee. A good win for Haws would propel them into third spot while three points for the Dokens would provide an ever so slight ray of hope.

TAYPORT v KELLO ROVERS

Cup holders Tayport kick off their sixteenth Scottish Junior Cup campaign this afternoon looking to extend a seventeen game unbeaten home run in the competition against a Kello team visiting Tayside for the first time since 2001, when they went down 2-1 at Kirrie Thistle.

Kello manager Bill Sim is an experienced campaigner having played with Kello and Queen of the South before going on to manage Threave Rovers and Annan Athletic. He led both clubs to South of Scotland League titles, before taking a break from the game prior to accepting an invitation to take over the hot seat at Kello. Bill, his assistant Stevie Houston and coach John Wilson, are in the midst of a re-building job, placing the emphasis on youth, particularly from their own locality.

6'6" goalkeeper Andrew Leishman, a regular in the side, is only 17 and a year older is Jamie Ferguson, a defender signed from Queen of the South. Another 18 year old, midfielder Kris Doolan, is full time - not with Kello, though! He's a local authority community coach attached to Kilmarnock.

Two midfielders with senior experience are 23 year old Scott McQuade, who was with Rangers and spent season 2000/01 in England with Wolverhampton Wanderers, and Rodney Paterson who was also with Rangers.

Top scorer in the Kello squad is Neil McGinn who was at Hibs as a youngster, but he kind of lost his way and failed to fulfil the early promise he had shown at Easter Road. McGinn didn't play last week, but manager Sim sees the striker as an ace in his pack and is anxious to have him fit for today.

One Kello player who has first hand experience of Tayport is defender Martin Bell who was a substitute in the Lugar Boswell side which went down to Port in last season's quarter final tie in Ayrshire. Prior to moving to the Juniors, Bell had a dozen or so games for Gretna in their inaugural season in the Scottish League.

As holders, Tayport's is the scalp every club wants and Kello are no different. It's the 10/1 cup favourites against the 100/1 outsiders. The visitors have nothing to lose and they will be well psyched up for what should be a keenly contested tie.

Football is littered with upsets and Tayport's management will be well aware of the dangers of underestimating their opponents.

Duncan Bruce is likely to keep his place in goal and, with Derek Wemyss a week or two away from a return to action, Bryan Duell is again likely to be asked to take a defensive role. Gareth Dailly will be back in the pool after being unavailable through work commitments last week. A lingering injury and his newly acquired paternal responsibilities will see Scott Peters miss out again.

Almost certain to be included in the pool and poised to make a record breaking appearance will be Grant Paterson who would be turning out in a Scottish Junior Cup game for the 98th time, which, of course includes six appearances at the final stage.

## **SNIFFING ABOUT THE WITH THE SNOOT**



Never having been drawn to play Petershill in the Scottish Junior Cup over the past 16 years, Tayport missed, for ever, the chance to play at this 'classic' Glasgow Junior Stadium. Petershill Park in Springburn possessed an atmosphere which evoked memories of the halcyon days of Junior football in the West. The bulldozers have moved in, so it's now gone forever. Tayport players, Scott Peters, Roberto Morris and ex player John Ward, along with Lochee United's Ian Ross, had the distinction of being the last players from this side of the country to play there when they represented Scotland there towards the end of last season

Gary Middleton's goal v North End last week takes him joint top of the club's Super League goalscorers. Smokey is on 16 goals, the same as John Ward (now Cowdenbeath) and Brian Craik (now Lochee Harp). Robbie Henderson's brace v Dokens takes him into double figures and sixth top spot.

Dave Baikie's appointment as Bo'ness boss in succession to Jimmy Sandison, the second Super League manager to be shown the door this season, means that Baiker will be in the opponents' dugout against Tayport for the first time when the sides meet later this season.

The Scottish Junior Cup has been on loan from The Canniepairt, taking centre stage at the Scottish Football Museum at Hampden Park these last few months where it has been the cornerstone of a short term museum display on Junior Football. Tayport, despite, the club's relative youth, features fairly prominently in what is a pretty impressive display. Many of the Port Support are featured, as one of the exhibits is a big colour photograph of the Tayport support in the 1993 final at Firhill.

Clydebank have had to switch their OVD tie on Saturday against Dalkeith to St Anthonys' McKenna Park, Cardonald. Clydebank, homeless after the situation which ultimately cost them their Scottish League status, are tenants of Drumchapel Amateurs who have a Scottish Amateur Cup tie scheduled.

The *Evening Telegraph's* coverage of the Juniors is the envy of junior followers throughout the country and in recent weeks, Tayport has had its share of the coverage. The Super League column on 24 October was accompanied by an excellent action photograph of Port v Hill of Beath with a healthy port support straining at the barrier in the background.

Friday's preview (28 October) also had a good photo from the game which featured Ross, Roberto, Barry and Chiel.

Junicus, the Tele's Junior football correspondent was at North End Park on Saturday past and he reported that if Dokens fortunes don't improve by Christmas, then a few players could be shown the door by Manager McLaren. Junicus reckoned the gap in class v Port was all too obvious and it would be a brave man who bets on the Dokens avoiding the drop.

The *Courier* had a similar story, with the North End gaffer intimating that the club's wages restructure meant that players would be hit in the pocket if they didn't produce the goods.

The *Courier's* review of the Dugout Cup reported that Arbroath SC suffered a day to forget, losing 7-1 at home to Parkvale. It wasn't that forgettable, however, there was an apology the following day pointing out the score was actually 2-1.

The *Fife Herald* (28 October) report on the draw with Hill of Beath, gave Manager Burgess the opportunity to slam his players for the wrong choice of footwear, given that many of the players repeatedly lost their footing.

In the match preview of the North End game, the Tayport boss made it clear he would expect nothing else but victory

against the Dundee team. He did point out that a number of players would miss out through injury and gave a run down on the situation in that respect.

The *Edinburgh Evening News's* John Gil-mour reported that Jim Sinnet's tactics of getting his strikers to run at the Bathgate defence paid off, allowing Linlithgow to extend their unbeaten run to five games whilst at the same time ending Bathgate's unbeaten Super League record with a 2-1 win. Bathgate boss Willie Hill wasn't too down, pointing out that he had four big players out and that their first defeat had to come some-time.

The *Internet* had a lot of exchanges on the Jimmy Sandison sacking but the breaking news on Thursday night was the appointment of Dave Baikie as Sandison's successor.

Baikie is well known throughout the junior football world after his success with Tayport Juniors. David will begin his work on Tuesday night at training. Senior players of the club will run the team for Saturday's Scottish Cup match against Maybole Juniors."

On asking Baiker for a quote he told the Port Prog "News travels fast. I only agreed two hours ago! I'm looking forward to a new challenge. Bo'ness are a club who should be challenging for honours. Hopefully I can make a difference."

## PROGRAMME ARCHIVE November 1990

Tayport first met an Ayrshire side in their inaugural season in the Juniors when Muirkirk Juniors visited the Canniepairt. Kevin Thoms and Gary Lamont netted for Port in a 2-0 win in front of an attendance of 110. Here we reproduce two pages from the programme that day.

### "The Baker's Bit"

I would like to begin by welcoming our support and the players and officials of Muirkirk to the Canniepairt this afternoon. The past month has seen us play five games giving us two wins and three draws. The first two games were the Cup-ties v Larkhall. In the tie at home I felt that we played quite well considering that we had no match practice for three weeks prior to the tie and Larkhall were probably more than happy to take us back to their ain midden to complete the job.

I had the feeling that the Larkhall players realised that we were a fair side and it certainly showed in the first half of the replay which we completely dominated. We were unlucky not to have had the game sawn up by the interval. I said to the players at that stage that one goal in the second half would do the trick and seal Larkhall's exit and so it transpired when 'Thomser' slotted his second. It was, as far as I'm concerned part of the 'growing up' process for our team. A tremendous result.

The good away form was continued at Bankfoot in the Zamoyski. A very good team display with Christie and Reilly coming in. Both showed the attitude we're looking for as did every player that day.

Our next game was a friendly against Stenhousemuir at Ochview. We lost a bad goal with a minute to go to give then an unimpressive 2-2 draw. A couple of minutes prior to that a 'young trialist' substitute should have made it 3-1 to Tayport but left the post. The management decided to give the lad another run and put him on for the last ten minutes at Arbroath Vics. In the league last Saturday. His headed goal one minute from time certainly impressed me!

I've yet to discuss the matter with Peter and Ronnie but if they know anything about the game they must agree with me that the lad has a great future with the club as long as they keep him and his zimmer well oiled!

The game against Vics. saw us give a very ordinary side two gift goals in a game which we totally dominated from start to finish. I know it's a well worn cliché in the game but if it was a boxing match it would have been stopped but I'm afraid that football doesn't work that way. The silky boxers in our game win very little, only the boxers with the 'killer punch' succeed in football. As far as I'm concerned in football the penalty box is the ring. That's the area where the damage is done. You've got to have players capable of finishing the job — the boxer with the killer punch. Let's hope that we see an early knockout today!

Other recruits this season were Paul Slowey (21) left-winger or defender from Blantyre Vics., Joe Hay (20) a striker from Renfrew, other front men, Kenny McLeod (24) from Baillieston, Phil Connor (22) from Dalry Thistle and John McGuire (20) a right winger from Armadale.
