TODAY'S GAME

CHALLENGE CUP
ROUND 2

TAYPORT v DOWNFIELD



This afternoon we welcome Downfield to the Canniepairt for the first time since June 2004. Back in our early Junior days, meetings of Tayport and Downfield were occasions to savour and captured the imagination of the local Junior fans. The reason being that Downfield were top dogs on Tayside at that time and Tayport FC was the emerging force in the game.

Adding spice to these occasions was the fact that manager Dave Baikie had joined Port from Downfield, having served his coaching apprenticeship there under the Grier brothers. A number of players with Downfield connections e.g. Mark Spalding, Kevin Thoms, Jimmy Hunter and Andy Sommerville also found their way across the water to become part of a club which was ultimately to usher Scottish Junior Football into a new era.

Despite being backed by a then vibrant social club in Balgowan Avenue, Downfield's challenge to the newcomers couldn't be sustained and, as a new century beckoned, the Spiders slipped back into mid table mediocrity and further, eventually dropping out of the local game's upper echelon into Tayside Division One in 2004.

It was to be the springboard for a revival, however, and following a decade with little to cheer, the Division One Championship and promotion to the Tayside Premier Division was achieved last season. Such was the Downfield committee's ambition to get back amongst the leading lights, that a poor start to this campaign saw the title winning management team relieved of their positions. Dave Baikie, at the time without a post, was approached to take over the Spiders' reins but, after giving the matter serious consideration, declined the invitation.

The committee then turned to another experienced campaigner, John Clenaghan, formerly of Forfar West End, to take over team affairs. Clenaghan has steadied the ship, of that there's no doubt, and John will see today's game as a measure of both how far he has taken his new charges and where he needs to strengthen his side to meet the challenges that lie ahead.

Tayport have stuttered a bit over the holidays and until that second half v Violet the other day, one wondered from where the next goal was coming. With a Scottish tie v Renfrew looming next week, Tayport will want to get things together and today's local cup tie will provide a strong examination.

Out of the Tayport squad goes John Knox who has been transferred to St Andrews United. Ronnie Kenneth although cup-tied in the Scottish, is available for today's game and could feature from the start. A big blow to Port is the absence through injury of Roberto Morris but this is tempered by the return to training after injury of Scott Peters.

A measure of Downfield's topsy turvy times is the fact that, of today's squad, only keeper Neil McConnachie, Andy Payne, Greg McMaster and Aaron Thomson survive from the squad that played here 18 months ago.

The game goes straight to penalty kick if the game finishes level, as it did when the sides last met here on league business in 2002.

SPIDER SNIPPET

In 1985 Downfield reached the semi final of the Scottish Junior Cup but went down by the only goal of the game to Pollok at Dens Park. In the Final Pollok won 3-1 against Petershill at Hampden after a 1-1 draw in front of a crowd of 9,000.

Downfield were formed in 1912 and play at Downfield Park in Kirkton which has a reported capacity of 4,000 and hosted a record crowd of 3,500 for a Scottish Junior Cup tie against Hurlford United in 1968.

They have enjoyed success over the years - in particular in the sixties and in the late eighties/early nineties. In the latter period they were a dominant force on Tayside as evidenced by the fact that between 1987 and 1990 they won three Tayside Premier League titles in a row. In the early nineties the Spiders were probably the main challenger on Tayside to Tayport. However, since then, until a couple of seasons ago, they were regularly finishing in mid-table in the Tayside Premier Division until 2004 when they dropped down to the First Division.

There was an immediate return to the top Tayside League when they won the First Division last season. Their experience in the OVD Scottish Cup last season was brief when they lost to St Andrews United in a round one replay. It was something similar in both the KIA East of Scotland Cup and Redwood Leisure Cup with first round defeats at Bathgate Thistle and Kirkcaldy YM respectively - the latter on penalties. Locally Downfield reached the second rounds of the Findlay & Co Cup and the North End Challenge Cup and the semi-final of the Red House Hotel Cup.

With an elongated League Cup competition Downfield have only played two league matches in the current term from which they have gained one point. In the D J Laing League Cup they finished bottom of their section after eight matches behind Kinnoull, Montrose Roselea, Forfar West End and Arbroath Vics. In the local cup competitions Downfield went down 3-1 at Super League Loches United in the First Round of the Findlay & Co Cup while their visit to the Canliepairt is as a result of their 5-1 victory at Arbroath Vics in the first round of the Challenge Cup.

A win against Forfar Albion in the Preliminary Round of the Redwood Leisure Cup resulted in Downfield visiting Recreation Park at Rosyth where they went out following a penalty shoot out in the First Round. In the Dugout (North/Tayside) competition they lost 1-0 at Arbroath SC in the First Round.

In the third round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup the Spiders lost at Clydebank following their second round win against Forfar Albion in a replay.

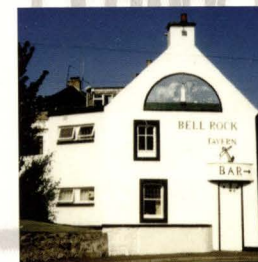

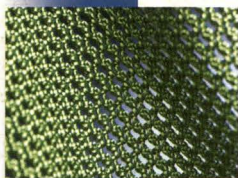

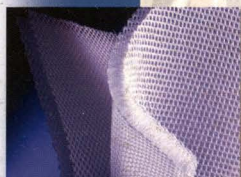
