





TAYPORT v BATHGATE THISTLE

In terms of games played, today kicks off the second half of Bathgate's league programme, exactly the same number of games they had played at this time last season. The following three months saw only another two games added to that total.. It was a situation which didn't exactly help them in their quest for the title and the Scottish Cup. Manager Willie Hill put a fair bit of investment into the Bathgate club and he will have been as disappointed as anyone to have missed out on the season's top two prizes last time round.

Willie has brought in several new faces since the clubs last met nine months ago, but injuries have contributed greatly to several disappointing performances. Most disappointing was, of course, the exit from the Scottish Cup at the first hurdle in a replay at Carnoustie but this may be something of a blessing if it means a serious title challenge can be mounted.

That challenge, however, was made more difficult last Saturday with a heavy defeat by the form team of the moment and Super League favourites, Bonnyrigg Rose, although by all accounts, the four goal margin greatly flattered the winners.

Bathgate still retain the core of last season's squad in keepers Rab Balfour and Ross Godfrey, Graeme and Fraser Love, defenders Tony Smith and Alan Neill, midfielders Willie Wilson and Martin Harty as well as the likes of strikers Eddie Annand, Barry Elliot and Rory Grant.

To supplement an experienced squad Thistle have brought in full back Iain Nicholson from Alloa. Nicholson is a key player, netting regularly from deadball situations including twice against Camelon and the winner v Kinnoull, both earlier this month. Striker Chris McFadyen moved in October from Linlithgow Rose, Steven Boyack who has seen service with Rangers, Dundee and Hearts, moved from Stirling Albion and also from the Seniors this season, Stephen Docherty from Airdrie United.

From Ayrshire came Paul Gaughan (Irvine Meadow) and defender Derek Anderson, the former Morton, Hibs, Kilmarnock and Hartlepool player who played for Auchinleck against Bathgate in the Scottish Cup final. The recruitment of two players from Milton Amateurs has been fully vindicated with Jon Tully and Paul Burns both featuring regularly.

Tayport will be under no illusions as to the task that faces them this afternoon and will be intent on plugging the gaps which have cost crucial goals this season as well as displaying the sharpness up front which brought a hat-full of chances at Thomson Park last Saturday.

Injuries and illness restricted Tayport's selection options last week and it looks like it will be the same, if not worse today. Out for a variety of reasons are Morris, Livie, McNaughton and McLean, with doubts over Ramsay, Stewart and Wemyss. On the plus side, Murray Urquhart and Murray McDowell, both of whom missed out at Lochee, should return.

Confusion reigned when **The Courier's** junior notes (Friday 17 Dec) had us playing our league cup semi-final at Broomfield, Montrose, but fortunately the notes the following day had us back on The Canniepairt, but for some reason **The Courier** had us kicking off at 1.45 instead of 1.30. The errors could be forgiven as the paper had plenty coverage both days.

The **Fife Herald** reporting Tayport v Montrose described Murray McDowell's winner as a fine individual goal and Manager Keith Burgess thought "it was a high energy performance from us...we played good football and created chances, it's just a pity that we lost a ridiculous goal, which has happened all too often".

There were photos of Livie, Fitzpatrick and Duell in the Herald which, in previewing the Lochee United cup-tie, noted that "Tayport would have to be at their best to keep up their impressive cup form as Lochee United represented a greater challenge than any of the club's previous opponents"

The **Evening Telegraph's** headline (Friday 23/12) thought the fans would be in for a 'Currie Cracker' (it wasn't wrong) and expected the tie to be Tayport's biggest cup test so far this season. Junicus, the **Tele**'s Junior correspondent, reported Lochee's concern over having only played four league fixtures. Junicus recalled former Juniors' secretary Jock Myles saying "unless clubs have 10 league games in by the turn of the year, they are in serious trouble…"

The Sunday Mail devoted a page to the Juniors, with the main report on the Lochee v Tayport game. Lloyd Young's winning goal was described as a "wondrous shot which completed a stunning hat trick". Two colour photos showed Lloyd tucking away his second of the afternoon and celebrating his hat-trick goal with Barry McNaughton.

Lochee's website contributors concentrated on slating their players, team selection and tactics and had a go at the match officials. Heartening to note, however, that in the clubs' respective forums there was no slagging off of each other, indeed Lochee's webmaster was generous in his praise of Port's display, commenting that the match report was fair and accurate.

We started the game really well with our midfield creating a couple of chances for our strikers, but, as all too often this season, we gifted the opposition an easy opening goal when we failed to deal with a ball through the middle and found ourselves one down in eight minutes. However we responded quickly as Chris Webster delivered a great cross onto the head of Lloyd Young and we were back on level terms after 12 minutes.

The game flowed from end to end with Tayport creating the better chances until another couple of totally avoidable mistakes sent us into the break 3-1 down. In my eyes, undeserved, as we had looked the better team in the first half, but we can't keep giving away soft goals and expect to win matches.

We had a positive half time team talk, with everyone agreeing that if we could keep Lochee on the back foot, then we had a great chance of getting ourselves back into the game. As it turned out we not only got ourselves back in the game but totally dominated the second 45 minutes with great goals from Ronnie Kenneth and Lloyd Young pulling us level within 10 minutes of the re-start.

It was now glory or bust as we threw everything we had at United and we got our reward when Lloyd completed a brilliant hat-trick with a wonder strike from 25 yards as the Tayport support and bench went into wild celebration. There were a few close things at both ends to follow and let's not forget Frazer Fitzpatrick's great double block when Lochee broke away in the dying minutes.

However, all in all, I think we deserved our victory and hope that the win can boost our confidence going into this afternoon's tough encounter against a very good Bathgate side. Only time will tell.

The Canniepairt Diary for 2006

January 2006 was a pretty good month, with no postponements and four games unbeaten. A late Barry McNaughton goal saw off Renfrew in the 4th round of the Scottish Cup on the Canniepairt, but the loss of two goals in the last minute v Hill of Beath at home saw us surrender a 3-1 lead and lose the East of Scotland Cup 1st round tie on penalties and we were out again at the first hurdle. A solitary league game brought all three points at Gorebridge when Gareth Dailly's late goal accounted for Arniston by 2-1.

In a flying start to the New Year, **February** also proved a good month with three wins, a draw and no postponements. The highlight was undoubtedly the 6-3 Scottish Cup 5th round win in a mud bath at Arthurlie. It was arguably the performance of the year in conditions which will long remain in the memories of all who were there. Two points were dropped in a 1-1 draw at home to Carnoustie, one of only two league game to be played in the first three months of the year, home or away. February also saw the lowest attendance of the year, 86 souls at featureless Seaton Park to witness a 3-0 win over Arbroath SC in the Redwood Cup.

Only two games played in **March**, both Scottish Cup ties v Clydebank, a quarter final tie which, given Bankies' recent senior pedigree, caught the imagine of the junior pundits. Steven Stewart's spectacular effort on the Canniepairt gave us a 1-1 draw to salvage a replay at Duntocher where heroics from Duncan Bruce in a penalty shoot-out before a capacity crowd of over 1200, paved the way for our place in the semi-finals.

Into April and the first day of the month was to provide what was ultimately to prove a big, big win when we travelled to Bathgate, probably more in hope than expectation. A win or even a draw, as it turned out, would have been sufficient for the home side to secure the title. If Tayport's title hopes were hanging by a thread before the game, with seconds left that thread had all but broken, until Scott Peters' last gasp winner gave Tayport a 3-2 win and kept lingering hopes alive. The Scottish Cup semi-final performance v Auchinleck at Firhill turned out to be something of a shambles, and despite an early goal, a 2-1 defeat denied Port a fourth successive Final appearance.

In May the championship looked as far away as ever with only two points gathered from our last two games, draws at Glenrothes and Bonnyrigg, leaving Bathgate only requiring to collect a point from home games v Bonnyrigg and Whitburn. Away from the League, there was progress to the finals of the Redwood Cup and Findlay Cups but a miserable show at Harp saw us exit the Challenge Cup in a month in which we played six games. To compound matters, Gareth Dailly's senseless ordering off at Beechwood was to cost him two cup final appearances.

What a fantastic start to **June**! Bathgate had lost 2-0 to Bonnyrigg on 30 May and two days later, the seemingly impossible happened when they were beaten by the same score by Whitburn, leaving Tayport champions on goal difference. The events of that evening at Creamery Park are likely to live long in the memory of the few Tayport fans who never gave up hope

and made the journey to West Lothian. The first of two cup finals two days later should have put the icing on the season's cake but Lochee United cashed in on errors to win the Redwood Cup before a big crowd at Glenesk. Although the season finished on a high when we lifted the Findlay Cup, some of the gloss was taken off our victory with Forfar West End finishing the Cup Final with only seven players.

Reading the newspapers, **July** seemed to be all about the club's decision to part company with assistant manager Stewart Williamson and then the resignation of coach Derek Carr to take up a post at East Fife. Manager Keith Burgess made two impressive close season signings when he fixed up Chris Webster from Carnoustie and Murray Urquhart from Glenrothes.

August was dominated by local league cup games and 14 goals for, none against was the impressive tally from three games. The league campaign opened with a 2-1 win at home to Bo'ness. Local youngster Malcolm Downie became the club's youngest signing.

September brought a mixed bag of results. There was a creditable league draw at Linlithgow but the unbeaten record for the season went in a 1-0 league cup section defeat at Broughty, although the defeat wouldn't impede our progress to the qualifying stages. The month ended with a 1-0 home win over Newtongrange Star in the 1st round of the Scottish Cup, the goal coming from an unlikely source, Ross Gunnion.

Three Super League games in **October** and although the month started well with a sound win at Camelon, our slip was perhaps beginning to show, with defeats at Whitburn and at home to Lochee United.

Three wins out of four in **November** saw progress in the League Cup and Scottish Cup but critically, the only defeat was a frustrating single goal affair at home to a Carnoustie side which was in the process of climbing rapidly from the bottom of the league to the top. Striker Murray McDowell netted at Violet in the League Cup in his first outing as a trialist and was subsequently offered a contract.

Like November, **December** started well with a Scottish Cup win at home (v Kirkintilloch Rob Roy) and there were further cup wins v Montrose and Lochee United in a stirring affair last Saturday. The downside once again was another 1-0 defeat in our only league game played this month to date - this time at bottom of the table Bo'ness. It was a record fourth successive league defeat. Keeper Duncan Bruce was transferred to Kinnoull.

This afternoon completes a year's football and that was the year, that was.



Locked together at three-apiece, both sides looked dangerous, but it was a Tayport player, Lloyd Young, who emerged as the hero. The talented midfielder unleashed an unstoppable strike which flew beyond home 'keeper Russell Brown, for an 80th minute winner and an ever so memorable hat-trick.

Credit too to Lochee, for their part in a Christmas cracker of a cup tie. There is sure to be even more spark when 'Port visit Thomson Park on league duty, but, that's one for the future. Attention today turns to another of our Super League rivals, Bathgate Thistle. Let's hope for another enjoyable afternoon for everyone at the Canniepairt.


