

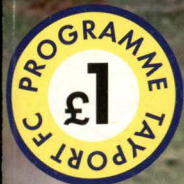

TAYPORT v PENICUIK ATHLETIC



It may be February and although we've already celebrated Robert Burns' birthday and St Valentine's Day is next week, we take this opportunity to wish you all a happy new year, this East of Scotland tie being our first home match of 2007.

Penicuik Athletic are our first foots and we welcome them to the Canniepairt for the first time. Although, it's the visitors' first visit to Fife's most northerly outpost, several of the Penicuik squad have played here with previous clubs.

A place in the next round of the East of Scotland Cup is at stake today and the fact that there is currently no cup sponsor makes little difference to the prestige of the competition, which is second only to the Scottish Junior Cup in scale.

Penicuik's are one of the association's most ambitious clubs and their record since re-forming in 2002 is fairly impressive. It was third time lucky in 2005 for promotion from the bottom division. After two successive seasons finishing in third place in the Lothians Division 2, Penicuik last season lifted the title and ran champions Camelon close to finish runners-up in Division 1 and thus secure a place in the newly created Premier Division, the feeder for the Super League. Penicuik have become well used to travelling this season, their league programme alone guarantees eight trips north across the Forth.

Although injury will deprive Penicuik of the services of Brian Ryrie, Andy Seaton and Kevin Milne, it will be an experienced and fairly settled team which runs out today. Defender or midfielder Dougie Hope was with Dave Baikie at Arbroath and there was a time when the current East Fife boss was looking to bring him to the Canniepairt, but he ended up at Linlithgow. Midfielder Jack Lynch, has been over the course with Arniston and others who have played at the Canniepairt are defender Keith Salton (Bo'ness) and striker John Harvey (Bonnyrigg Rose).

Harvey was Athletic's top marksman last season with 32 strikes and he's again leading the list with 13 this season. Also among the goals has been Martin Cameron and early season acquisition from Newtongrange Star, Ryan Gay who has netted in each of his club's last three matches. In fact, goals have been very plentiful for Penicuik recently and you've got to go back something like eleven games since they last drew a blank, a period during which they have averaged almost three goals a game.

Tayport should be boosted by their win at Bonnyrigg last week and the home fans will be anxious to see this form repeated today. There are sure to be changes in the home line-up. Derek Wemyss, a scorer last week, will be missing as will be midfield dynamo Murray Urquhart. Both are on holiday. Steven Cook, our recent loan signing from Arbroath had a sound debut last week and Port fans will be looking for Cooky to fill the gap left by the sale of Lloyd Young to East Fife.

Skipper Roberto Morris is still some way from fitness, so Brian Livie will probably return to partner Bryan Duell in central defence with Barry McNaughton likely to be restored to midfield.

If all square after 90 minutes, the tie goes straight into a penalty shoot-out.

TODAY'S VISITORS PENICUIK ATHLETIC

Penicuik has long had an association with the beautiful game, with the origins of football in the Midlothian town traced back to 1882 but Penicuik Athletic was formed in 1888 with the club playing in the Senior East of Scotland League after it was founded in 1893.

In 1904, Penicuik joined the Junior association and first made their mark nationally when reaching the Scottish Junior Cup semi-final in 1910. In the 1930s the club reverted to Senior status and the East of Scotland League, becoming champions in 1931/32.


In 1950, Penicuik moved from their original ground at Hays Park, now the site of a supermarket and Health Centre, to a new ground at Eastfield Park. The club returned to the Juniors and in the 1960s enjoyed their greatest Scottish Cup success to date, reaching the semi-final in 1966 only to lose 1-0 to Bonnyrigg Rose at Tynecastle. In 1970 Hampden beckoned and 14,255 saw Athletic go down 1-0 to Blantyre Vics in the final after a 1-1 draw.

Penicuik built on the euphoria of the cup run to enjoy a successful period locally and, as seemed to be the case throughout Junior football in the Seventies, Athletic were wooed by the brewers and a social club was built. However the club's fortunes waned in the 1980s and the social club went to the wall leaving a legacy of debt.

The Football Club was next to take a hit, going into abeyance in 1991 when Eastfield Park, which had been used as security for loans, had to be sold to pay off the creditors and a supermarket was built on the Eastfield turf.

Strident efforts to find a new ground were eventually successful and Penicuik Park opened in time for the club's re-entry to Junior football in 2002/03. Despite the club's best attempts, they missed out on promotion during their first two seasons back in the game, but there was to follow two straight promotions which have taken the Midlothian side into this season's newly established Premier Division after finishing runners up to champions Camelon.

Penicuik has at least two connections with Tayport. Manager Keith Burgess was enjoying his second spell as a player at Penicuik when the club was forced to withdraw from the Juniors in 1991 when they lost their ground. The other connection goes back a bit further to the 1950s when our senior Honorary President Andy Phin turned out for them in 1952 whilst working in Penicuik.

It's been six weeks since Tayport last played a competitive match on the Canniepairt, when Bathgate visited on Super League duty on the last weekend of 2006. The champions recorded three valuable points that afternoon, despite going behind to a Fraser Love goal, midway through the first half. Midway through the second, Bryan Duell equalised with a powerful far post header, then, ten minutes later, Chris Webster forced a winner, after a scramble in the area.

Next up was a trip to Oakley, again on league business. Again Tayport trailed, this time to two Ryan Ewing goals. These counters came on 52 and 66 minutes, so there was still time for a comeback, but not a winning one. An own goal, following a Lloyd Young corner and a late Robbie Henderson header earned a share of the spoils.

Four points from two fixtures represented a positive return, but the Scottish Junior Cup then came to dominate our thoughts. The fourth round tie at Camelon was twice postponed, before eventually being played a fortnight ago. For a change, Tayport actually opened the scoring, when Robbie Henderson tapped home after Bryan Duell had drilled a dangerous ball across the face of goal.

Unfortunately, the match soon turned in Camelon's favour. The Carmuir Parkers levelled the score, although there seemed little to suggest that 'Port would exit the competition, until the Mariners netted direct from a corner kick, in the 70th minute. A third Camelon goal quickly followed, before two red cards, one for Murray McDowell and one for Chris Webster, borne of frustration, completed a miserable day for the club.

So, no record-breaking sixth successive semi-final appearance, but still plenty to play for and climbing the Super League table was on the agenda at Bonnyrigg. First half goals from Derek Wemyss, three minutes, and Bryan Duell, a stunning volley towards half-time, earned a big victory, which will play a big part in restoring confidence. Hopefully, a first ever win in the East of Scotland Cup, against Penicuik today, will also help in this regard.

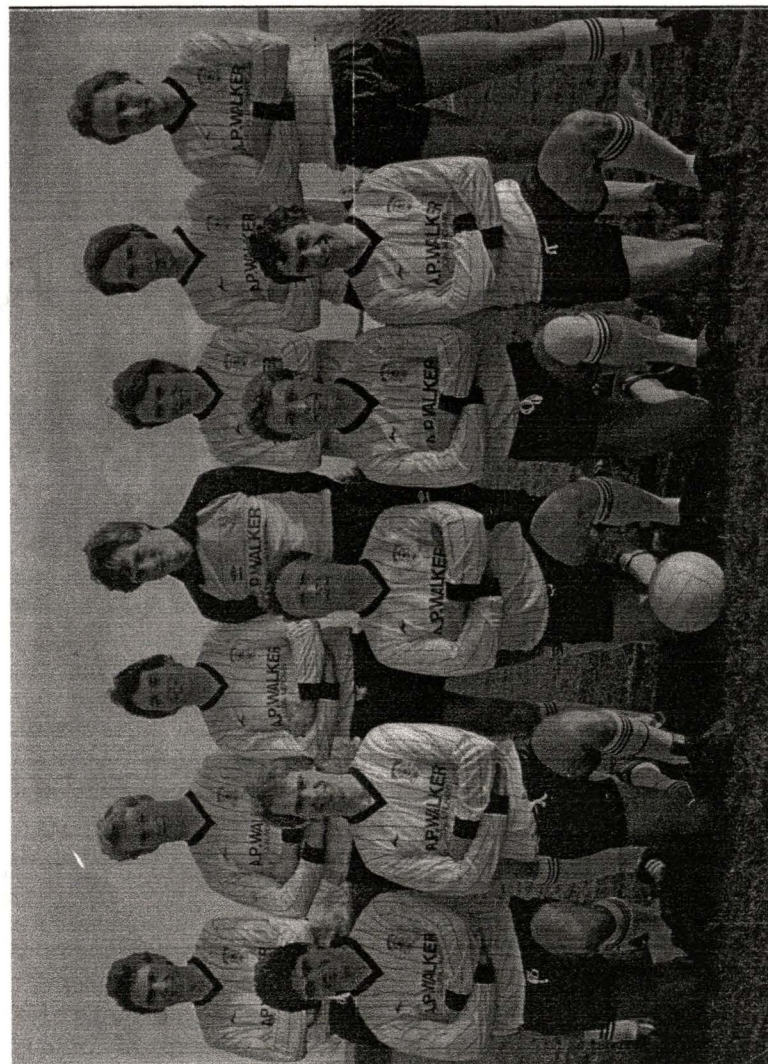

media matters



Bell Baxter's superb treble rugby triumph did Tayport a favour last week by grabbing the **Fife Herald's** back page headlines. It was a timely week for Tayport's Scottish Cup defeat at Camelon to be relegated to the inside pages! The Fife Herald reported that Tayport had made a great start to the game but by the end noted it was a bitterly disappointed set of Tayport players that trudged off Carmuir Park, having exited the Scottish before the semi-final stage for the first time since 2000/01.

The photo in the Fife Herald was courtesy of its stablemate, the **Falkirk Herald**. The Falkirk Herald reporter really loved this win. The headline read 'Ta Ta Tayport' and the report was peppered with phrases like, *Mariners broadside silences the big guns.....Fife giants sent crashing out of the competition..... Mariners were cruising through to the last 16..... Tayport have NEVER beaten Camelon over 90 minutes in the competition..... there was an astonishing scene when Dewell (sic) and McNaughton squared up to each other in their own penalty box - an indication that all was not well in their ranks.*

The Falkirk Herald did concede that *Tayport had started both halves well and had strung together some good moves* and that *Tayport's passing game saw them continuing to impress in midfield*. It then went on to say..... *if Camelon's second goal had been a shock to the system, then they [Tayport] were all but paralysed three minutes later....*

Tayport may have been out of the Scottish Cup and second bottom of the league before last Saturday but they continue to provide a good source of newspaper copy. Last Friday's **Edinburgh Evening News** had a near full page preview of the following afternoon's Super League clash at New Dundas Park including a lengthy interview with Rose boss Pat Glynn. Said Glynn "...they [Tayport] haven't done as well this year but they always play well when they come down to us. By their own standards they will probably be disappointed with how things have been going but, as Super League champions, they deserve a lot of respect"

Absolutely splendid coverage of the Juniors in Monday evening's Edinburgh Evening News. Glasgow's **Evening Times** pales in comparison and one has got to wonder what it does to get Scottish Junior Cup draw exclusives. [er just be in Glasgow? - Ed]. The news, as well as covering another 11 games with full line-ups, carried a big report and three fine photos - Fizzie taking a cross ball, Steven Cook and Murray Urquhart sliding into a tackle and an action shot of Robbie Henderson - of Bonnyrigg v Tayport. Rose manager Glynn thought Tayport had the first half and the home side the second but conceded that "Tayport might be struggling a bit by their standards this season but they are still a very good team and giving them a two goal start meant we were always up against it".

The Manager's Page

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters for this East of Scotland first round cup tie against Penicuik Athletic.

Today is a special day for me personally, as this will be the first time that I have been in charge of a team in direct opposition to my first junior club Penicuik, for whom I signed in 1975 at the ripe old age of 17.

I will always have great memories of my five years at the "cuikie" as we won two East Region league titles and many cups in my spell there and will never forget the supporters, team mates and great friends that I made during my time at the Midlothian club.



Being one of the best supported teams in the Lothians, we can expect a decent and very noisy turn-out this afternoon, but also a very difficult game against the up and coming Athletic who are managed by my old friend and team mate Willie McGinlay.

Frazer Fitzpatrick was back to his best, taking crosses and commanding his area, giving the defence confidence to do their job properly.

On the injury front Roberto Morris is slowly but surely recovering from knee ligament damage and Allan Ramsay is playing through the pain barrier with a troublesome Achilles. Barry McNaughton should be okay this week after missing out last week with a kidney infection.

Not available for selection this week, though, are Derek Wemyss and Murray Urquhart, both of whom are on holiday - who said that cheap flights abroad are a good thing?

On a positive note, we would like to welcome new signing Steven Cook to the club. "Cookie" was signed from Arbroath FC a couple of weeks ago to bolster our midfield and if last week's competitive debut at Bonnyrigg is anything to go by, then he will be a great addition to our squad. All the best, Steven, from all at Tayport FC.

Hopefully we can continue our winning ways this afternoon against Penicuik, but it's going to be a tough match, so let's all get behind the team and cheer them on to victory, as your support is vital to our success.

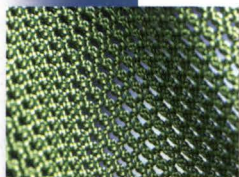
