

TAYPORT v LINLITHGOW ROSE



Rose arrive at Canniepairt looking for 8th straight league win

Linlithgow could be excused from entering today's Super League game brimming with confidence. After all, they top the division, have just won the South League Cup and are in the semi final of the Scottish Cup. It's not the first time they have arrived at the Canniepairt in this frame of mind, however, and gone away empty handed and that, of course, will be Tayport's intention today.

Last season was a miserable affair for Rose so they had a clear-out and brought in a new coach - ex Hibee Gordon Rae - and a virtually new team. It's likely they will start with only two of the side which started at the Canniepairt in the corresponding game last season, Gordon Herd and Iain Gallacher. Not so, Tayport whose selection today is likely to come from a squad which includes seven of those who won 3-0 at Prestonfield in the sides' first ever Super League meeting way back in August 2002.

Linlithgow may have won seven league games on the trot but they've not yet shaken off the challenge of Bonnyrigg who are still in the chase after their rather fortuitous win at Thomson Park last week.

Prestonfield boss Jim Sinnet reckons getting back amongst the silverware by winning the League Cup against Armadale last Saturday has taken some pressure off his team. Rose were 3-0 and 4-2 up before a last minute penalty gave the Premier Division side a glimmer of hope but it proved too little too late.

Although Euan Donaldson and Ian McSween appeared as substitutes in the cup final last week, Sinnet could stick with an unchanged line-up to start today. Top marksman Brian Carrigan has been amongst the goals this season, he wasn't on target last week, Stuart McArthur (2), Gordon Herd and Keith Hogg bagging the quartet against Armadale.

Tayport felt hard done by at Hill of Beath last week with the gale blowing down the park playing a significant role in the outcome. Haws literally never got near Tayport's goal in the second period but Tayport failed to make a breakthrough at the other end with the wind behind them. It was a day when they missed the dead ball skills of the absent Chris Webster, with a series of corners and free kicks failing to trouble the home goal.

Tayport have major selection problems. Murray McDowell is still out through suspension Murray Urquhart, missing through injury last week, could miss out again and injury could also mean Grant Paterson's 800th appearance is postponed. Chris Webster should be back in contention for a jersey.

In terms of obtaining a result, hosts Hill o'Beath coped best, as they ran out 2-1 winners. The Haws notched two early goals in a storming start to the game, during which time Frazer Fitzpatrick made a couple of outstanding stops.

Soon, Tayport settled into the contest and actually made some headway against a ferocious wind, creating a few decent chances. Derek Wemyss and Bryan Duell, for instance, were both unfortunate to see efforts blocked and cleared.

Duell did find the net, on 26 minutes, beating Marc Graham from the penalty spot, after Robbie Henderson had been fouled inside the area.

Thereafter, the visitors seemed rightly content to reach half-time with that 2-1 scoreline.

In the second half, it was all Tayport, pressing constantly for an equaliser. Hill o'Beath dug in and defended their goal and there was to be no breakthrough. Best opportunity fell for Duell, deep in injury-time, but it was not to be, and three more points slipped away.

At least Tayport have, for the first time ever, made some progress in the East of Scotland Cup, defeating Penicuik on the Canniepairt, a fortnight ago. Following a goalless opening forty-five minutes, a galvanised 'Port took control after the break, with strikers Robbie Henderson and Ronnie Kenneth both notching doubles to ensure that Frank Conway made a winning start to his tenure as Tayport gaffer. Penicuik prevented Frazer Fitzpatrick from recording a clean sheet, though, courtesy of a second half wonder-goal.



During the 60's, the casual Saturday afternoon stroller on the East Common Tayport, was invariably greeted with the enthusiastic shouts of 22 participants and the cajoling wails of the somewhat less-numerous non-combatants scattered along the touchline!

Those were the days of the pitch by the "wee widdy", the solid, square (netless) goalposts, an occasionally-marked playing area and the old green "strippy" with very little in the way of facilities other than a multi-purpose

It was toward the end of the decade and into the early 70's that the renaissance of football in Tayport began,

A group of enthusiastic young men took Tayport Amateur Football Club by the scruff of the neck and began lalmost imperceptably to revamp the image of the club both on and off the field. Local success at 1st and 2nd XI level was the Investible follow-on to the efforts of the perceptive fellows who now formed the committee. ground. In years past, even before yours truly was in short breeks, this area had beer little more than wasteland and indeed further back, in the days of brown photographs our bovine friends roamed and ruminated in pe

After a few seasons in residence, the sever hard-working officials and friends of Tayport Amateur Football Club had brought about changes that they themselves could hardly have dared contemplate. The area exclusily started to resemble a football ground, with banking on two sides providing a natural "emphitheetire and a new, solid pavillion with facilities seasond to none is a mateur football."

DAVE TOSNEY — A very experienced last line of defence. Dave has had a very successful amateur, career. Was a key figure in the Auchterhouse side which domina@ad the local amateur scene in the seventies and latterly starred for the Riverside Athletic team. DOUGIE BERRIE — Experienced midfielder who was a teammate of Tosney's at Auchterhouse in the halvoon days of that club. Was with Forfar West End last season. Work committeents mean that Dougie isn't always

GRANT PATERSON — Left back. Also recruited from Riverside Athletic. Had a spell with St. Johnstone. Skilful ball player who was honoured by Amateur Scotland last

MARK SPALDING — Defender signed from Downfield with whom he had been one of the club's longest serving players. One of three Tayport players fixed up from Tayside champions Downfield.

GARY CHRISTIE — Speedy, tricky winger and a real crowd pleaser. Was a regular scorer for an East Craigle side who last season led the First Division for much of the

DAVID REILLY — Striker who can play equally well in midfield. Spent some time with Forfar Athletic before moving back to the amateurs with Lawside FP with whom he caught the eye of the international selectors.

DAVIE RAE — Versatile type of performer who can play equally well at full back or up front, Davie never gives less than 100%. One of the quintet of players who were with the record breaking Riverside outfit last season. Misses the start of the season through suspension.

GRANT CUSHNIE — Another of the former Riverside men, Grant is a polished midfielder who scores more than the normal quota of goals for a midfielder. Paying the penalty for playing so many games towards the end of the seasor and collecting cautions which see him, sitting on the touchline for the first couple of weeks of the season. WILLIAM COVENTRY - Billy was with St. James last

season when he attracted the attention of several senior clubs. Plays in midfield form where he has shown in pre-season games that he can take a bonnie goal. KEVIN THOMS — One of the Tayport signings which cause a few raised ayebrows in Tayside Junior circles. A striker, Kevin came from Downfield with whom he was the Region's top goalscorer in 1987/88 and 1988/89.

FRANK DOLAN — An uncompromising central defender, Frankie was a teammate of Billy Coventry at St. James last season and was one of co-managers Baikie and GEORGE MALONE - One of the best known figures in th Tayside Juniors, George was an outstanding player for Lochee United with whom he was capped for Junior Scotland. Likely to fill a central defensive role for the

ions now, Gary is a left-sided striker whose direct style of play has tormented many a full back. Previously had a spell with Downfield before rejoining Riverside

SEAN WILKIE - Signed in the close season after being released by Brechin City. A talented defender who has youth on his side. His senior experience will be a major asset to the side.

GRAEME IRONS - With Forfar West End last season with whom he was the player/manager for a spell. Graeme is a very experienced midfielder who knows how to take a goal. Will miss the start of the season through injury.

DAVID BARIE — Probably one of the best known names in Tayside Junior Football, Dave is sampling management for the first time, having prepared himself for such a move by getting SFA coaching certificates. A prolific score in his years with Broughty Athletic, Lochee United and latterly Downflield, Dave was capped by Junior Scotland and picked up virtually every local Junior honour. Described in a match programme only this year in this way: "Over the years I have watched Junior Football I have never seen a better striker than this mar Pootball I have never seen a better striker than this man. The Courier last Friday had another pot at "the ridiculous fixture planning" which sees Lochee United going in to the following day's game v Bonnyrigg at Thomson Park playing catch-up, with 7 games in hand over Linlithgow. 


