TAYPORT v OAKLEY UNITED

Champions of a tough Fife League last season saw Oakley spring back into the Super League after only one season downstairs and player / manager Willie Newbig-

ging (pictured) was under no illusions that it would be tough a going. Said Willie in his pre-season address to the Oakley faithful "We are a small rural club and finances are limited, so it would be fair to say that there are not many new faces at the club, but I feel that the squad which won the championship last season deserves a chance to prove that they can play and compete at this level. I have faith in them and I know that they will not let me or themselves down." And it's fair to say that he's got a fair response from his



charges and they are holding their own in the league, although Willie will have his sights on bettering Bo'ness' final points total (Bo'ness can only total 23 points at best). The target, therefore, will be ten points from a possible eighteen in the run-in to the end of the season. He'll be telling his guys in the away dressing room that challenge starts this afternoon with three points from today's game.

It's been a fairly miserable run since Oakley dropped two points by conceding a couple of goals to us in the dying seconds of a 2-2 draw at Blairwood Park in the first game of 2007. Three defeats and a draw has been the Super League tally since then but by all accounts the Os were very unlucky to go down 2-1 at Hill of Beath last Saturday.

Ryan Ewing is Oakley's top scorer in the Super League this term and he was the man who netted both goals against Tayport in January, a feat he has managed on a further two occasions in the League this season.

Tayport have blown hot and cold over the past few weeks. The performance v Camelon wasn't one of the best of the season, it's fair to say, but, although there were only two goals v Forfar West End in midweek, many more scoring opportunities were created. Brian Livie, who missed out through work on Wednesday, could be back today, and there could be starts for Ramsay, Gunnion and Kenneth who were rested in midweek as well as possibly some action for Downie.

Today's Visitors Oakley United

Oakley United haven't featured in many Port Progs as their visits to The Canniepairt have been fairly infrequent so, courtesy of Oakley's excellent website, we trace the history of the west Fife club

Oakley United came into existence on Sunday 5th April 1964 at a public meeting held in the Community Centre Oakley, by a vote of 10 to 8 it was decided that a new Junior club previously playing as "Comrie Colliery Junior Football Club" would by be formed and would be known as OAKLEY UNITED FOOTBALL CLUB.

With that agreed, the grand sum of £369 could then be transferred from the account of Comrie Colliery Junior FC into the coffers of the newly founded Oakley United.

22nd August 1964 was a red letter day for Oakley United when they played their very first match - versus LOCHORE WELFARE. The gate was £8-3/- and after expenses Oakley kept £3-6/4d. Unfortunately, nobody has yet traced the score in that first game. Incidentally, one of their players in those early days was a young goal-keeper called William Newbigging, father of today's Oakley United player/manager of the same name.

It took Oakley seven years to make their mark on Junior Football winning the Cowdenbeath Cup" in 1970/71 season, and the Fife Junior Championship the following year. Oakley went on to win the Fife League on 5 further occasions.

Researching the club minutes uncovered a number of gems. For example, in Dec 1966, Aberdeen Sunnybank were so appreciative of Oakley's hospitality during their 2nd round Scottish Cup match that they sent Oakley a box of KIPPERS!

Another item of interest was the Minute which showed Dunfermline Athletic legend Jim Leishman was at Oakley for a short time – a very short time! An entry in the minute book dated 3rd March 1981 mentions his agreement to join Oakley as their Manager and on the 12th March 1981 it mentions his letter of resignation ... not even long enough to write a verse of one of his infamous poems.

Trophies and titles came on a regular basis over the next few years and in 2001/02, Oakley won promotion to the newly formed "Super League".

In their first season 2002/03, finished in seventh place, staying up on the very last day after beating OVD Scottish Cup winners Tayport, who had been crowned inaugural Super League Champions only 5 days previously, 1-0 on the Canniepairt, thanks to Callum Graham who slammed the ball into the net after Craig Morrison had tested Tayport keeper Frazer Fitzpatrick

Oakley survived for another two seasons in the top league but were relegated at the end of the 04/05 season.

However, Oakley's first season back in Fife football was a successful one, winning the Fife League Cup beating Kelty Hearts in the final and more importantly, bouncing right back to this season's Super League by winning the Fife League for a seventh time.

PROGRESS REPORT

SCOTTISH CUP now sponsored by CITY LINK

Linlithgow Rose made it comfortably into next month's Scottish Junior Cup final with 4-1 win over Arthurlie in the first semi-final staged at St Mirren's Love Street last Saturday in front of a 2,777 crowd - at least that's the number that paid. The other semi-final between Kelty Hearts and Kilwinning Rangers is taking place this afternoon on Hamilton Accies' New Douglas Park's synthetic turf.

With neither side in their respective Region's top division, Linlithgow are understandably odds on favourites to lift the cup.

EAST of SCOTLAND CUP sponsored by John Walker

Incredibly the most prestigious tournament after the Scottish Cup is only at the last sixteen stage with last night's 3rd round draw pairing Tayport with Rosyth on the Canniepairt, probably on May 12th. (see elsewhere in the programme for full draw.) The outstanding 1st round tie was played on Tuesday of this week when Lochee United, having suffered three Super League defeats on the bounce, crushed North End by 8-1, less than a week after North End beat Scottish Cup semi-finalist Kelty Hearts 4-2 on their own patch.

SUPER LEAGUE sponsored by Whyte & Mackay

Bonnyrigg Rose shot themselves in the foot big time with a 2-1 defeat at Carnoustie on a day when a win would have taken them a point clear of Linlithgow at the top of the table. Linlithgow beat Camelon 1 - 0 last night and can now only lose the title. Pity about Bonnyrigg slipping up, because they've still to come to Canniepairt and they might have arrived here needing three points for the title. That scenario would have made the Tayport treasurer a happy man!

Defeat for Kinnoull at Lochee United today would confirm their relegation and, although Bo'ness are favourites to join them, Lochee, Camelon and Oakley will have to get points on the board.

At last we have a date - FRIDAY 27th APRIL - for the Final against Lochee United at Laing Park, Carnoustie. Kick-off is 6.45pm and the final goes to penalty kicks if it's all square after 90 minutes.

With that match on the horizon, it is important that Frank Conway's outfit produce a positive display in today's Super League fixture against the ever-resilient Oakley United.

One week ago, Camelon certainly proved themselves to be resilient opposition, holding Tayport to a goalless draw, despite playing for around 85 minutes with ten men. Forward, Graeme McLaren, who had netted in the season's previous encounters, received his marching orders for comments made to the referee.

Try as they might, things just did not click into place for the hosts, however. Murray McDowell's header, following a corner kick, was as close as 'Port came to a breakthrough, but the Mariners were saved by the woodwork.

Then, on Wednesday evening, there was a Challenge Cup quarter-final against Forfar West End. It was not until the second half that Tayport deservedly took the lead, top scorer Bryan Duell firing home his fifteenth of the campaign. Murray Urguhart doubled the advantage, only for West End to pull one back, almost immediately. ON THE ROAD WITH THE EASTER FOOTBALL BONANZA

Joe Kimmet took time out from a family Easter break at Haggerston to take in the Central Midlands Football League's Easter Football Bonanza. What's that, I hear you say. It's a groundhopping weekend which attracts a diverse array of football followers from builders to social workers, from doctors to fire fighters.

The Central Midlands League's Easter Football Bonanza has now become an important part of the season for the Groundhopping fraternity. The concept of attracting Groundhoppers to a selection of games over Easter was initiated around ten years ago, but the Central League's management committee has organised one in the Doncaster/ Nottingham area for the last four years.

Folk even set up their own stalls selling football programmes and memorabilia.

Although most travel between grounds by car, there are special buses laid on. The weekend kicked off at Edlington Lane, Doncaster with Yorkshire Main v Thorne Colliery drawing 1-1 in the Vipond Fire Protection Premier Division.

It was then on to Askern for Askern Welfare v Appleby Frodingham [that's a name and a half!], in the Buckingham Insurance Supreme Division, kicking off at 1.45pm. The Frods were no match for the Askern lads who won 5-0.

Next stop for a 4.45pm kick off was another Vipond Fire match at Dunscroft, Doncaster for Hatfield Main v Louth United where the home side edged it by the only goal of the game.

The bandwagon upped sticks and moved on to the final match of the day at Scrooby Road, Bircotes for another Vipond Premier game, Harworth C.I. v Welbeck Welfare at 7.45pm.. Home team again finished on top, this time by 2-1.

The same league provided the next game, Heanor Town v Radcliffe Olympic at the civilised time of 2.30pm and the game provided the only away win of the tour, Olympic winning 2-1.

The 'Bonanza' weekend was wrapped up at Wharf Road, Pinxton where Pinxton FC met Blidworth Welfare in a Vipond League game at 6 pm, the local side winning 2-1.

The 7 x match advanced package ticket cost £20 and this included admission to all 7 grounds and 7 match programmes. Joe didn't mention what a 7×10^{-5} x pub pint package cost.

Joe reckoned the Askern v Appleby Frodingham game was the pick of the weekend, five goals for the home side and another five efforts back off the woodwork. Best pint? Although, by his own admission, not a connoisseur of fine ales, Joe reckons *Funfair Showman's Gold*, a golden ale brewed by Funfair of Ilkeston Derbyshire was the pick of the tour.

Seven games in two days, Joe managed to bring his total to nine before heading back north to Haggerston, the Northern Counties East league Premier Division game between Maltby Main FC and Hallam FC at Rotherham and the Championship match between Barnsley and Birmingham City.

Quite a tour for Joe who had to rely on public transport and lifts from others on the tour as his car had been commandeered by Fiona back at the holiday base.

Plenty soccer to report in the **Fife Herald** last week, Frazer Fitzpatrick was hailed the hero in the report of the Challenge Cup tie win at Arbroath SC last Wednesday, scoring the decisive penalty after saving four of Arbroath's efforts in the penalty shoot out which took 'Port into the last eight.

Questioning Frank Conway on the size of his pool, the Tayport boss told the **Herald** reporter that he was disappointed not to have brought in anybody before the transfer deadline but he didn't want to sign someone just as a stop gap. 'We're looking at the long term picture', said Frank.

The **Herald** gave pride of place last weekend to Cupar Hearts and their 3-0 Scottish Amateur Cup quarter final victory over Oban Saints at Duffus Park. Former 'Port striker Steve Hutcheon had two of Cupar goals in a tie watched by an estimated 600 crowd plus the pipes and drums of the Cupar Pipe Band.

In the **Evening Telegraph** on Friday evening, Lochee United boss Ray McKinnon thought his team's chances of overtaking league leaders Linlithgow Rose were slim. After the 2-1 defeat by Bathgate they were non-existent.

The Edinburgh Evening News had a two page colour spread on Linlithgow's Scottish Cup victory. Linlithgow manager Jim Sinnet was in typical ebullient mood after the game. Said Sinnet, 'It's just a pity that this game wasn't on television - the two teams really did justice to the Junior Cup...we fancy our chances in the final and there's no doubt we'll be hot favourites'. Confidence or what?

Reading the **Dunfermline Press**, one would have been forgiven for thinking that Kelty Hearts had already triumphed in their semi-final, which is being played this afternoon. 


