



EAST of SCOTLAND CUP 3rd ROUND (sponsored by John Walker) TAYPORT v ROSYTH

This will be the third competitive meeting of today's teams, the previous two encounters, Redwood Leisure ties, both at the Canniepairt, going Tayport's way in 2003 and 2005.

Rosyth are having an excellent season and, as we move into mid May, they are still fighting on four fronts, with their sights firmly on promotion to the Super League, the Redwood Leisure Cup, Maloco & Associates Cup and, of course, the East of Scotland Cup.

In the league there's a tough run-in but three of Rosyth's four remaining games are at home. Despite their 2-1 midweek league loss to Scottish Cup finalists Kelty Hearts, we can still expect a team at the top of their game this afternoon.

Giving the game an extra edge is the fact that one time Tayport striker Billy Spence is the visitors' manager. Billy was one of Dave Baikie's 'Dad's Army' recruits in 2001/02 when the now East Fife gaffer was needing some short term experienced cover. Billy, incidentally, had a pretty good record at 'Port with five goals from only four starts and nine sub appearances.

The main goal threats come from the prolific strike force of former Carnoustie Panmure frontman Jon Kelly and Tam McGeorge, who has averaged just under a goal a game since joining the club from Kelty in 2003, plus the free kick expertise of Andy Lawson who had 10 appearances for Tayport in 2000.

Tayport have had a disjointed spell in recent weeks with the well documented record of four successive defeats being halted on Monday evening with a 3-1 win over Downfield here on the Canniepairt. Derek Wemyss, injured on Saturday, missed that one and also Wednesday's defeat at Lochee. Murray Urquhart also missed the Lochee game through injury and is a big doubt for today. We're sure to be down to the bare bones today so each player will have to give that wee bit extra.

Today's referee Mr Duncan will need no introduction. He's been the man with the whistle in Tayport games three times in the last nine days. Today's game will be settled on penalty kicks if all square after 90 minutes.

TODAY'S VISITORS

ROSYTH FOOTBALL CLUB "THE REC"



The Past

The Club was originally formed as a Junior Club in 1919 but went "Senior" in 1926. The spell as a senior club saw them win the Scottish Qualifying Cup (North) in 1932. The Club rejoined the Junior ranks in 1946 but went into abeyance in 1957. The return to Junior football in Rosyth in 1992 was the result of Dunfermline's Jubilee Athletic moving to Recreation Park and changing their name to Rosyth Recreation. The "Recreation" part of the name was dropped in 2006.

The Present

Rosyth qualified for the East Premier League by finishing third in the Fife League last season. They currently lie in fourth position in the Premier League with thirty points from eighteen matches. Promotion to the Super League remains possible but following defeat at Kelty Hearts on Wednesday evening there is now a dependency on Kelty dropping points in their remaining eight matches.

Rosyth's Scottish challenge did not get off the ground with a $1\,$ – 0 defeat in the second round at Lochee Harp – at that time, of course, managed by Messrs Conway and Gilzean! Our new management team have crossed swords three times in total with Rosyth this season with a record of two wins (both at Beechwood) and one defeat at Recreation Park. There was also an early departure for Rosyth from the Fife & Lothians Cup courtesy of a 2-1 home defeat by Newtongrange Star while a single goal defeat at Ballingry Rovers was suffered in the second round of the Maloco & Associates Cup.

The Central League Cup saw Rosyth pitched in with Super League Hill of Beath and Oakley United in a five team section. The Rec came second in the section behind the Haws and then progressed to the semis with a comfortable 5-2 win at Scone. A closely fought battle with Glenrothes in the semi-final saw the teams finish all square with the Glens progressing to the final after a penalty shoot out. Ten matches in a Cup competition only to lose in the semi-final!

Rosyth travel to Lochee United (date tbc) in the second round of the Redwood Leisure (Fife/Tayside) Cup after disposing of Forfar Albion in round one. A further visit to Ballingry is scheduled for next Thursday in the third round of the Kingdom Kegs Cup. This follows a win on penalties in round two against Kirkcaldy YM. Rosyth's progress in the East of Scotland Cup and their visit to the Canniepairt today was achieved by defeating Crossgates Primrose 4-0 in the first round. This was followed by a 2-0 win against, leaders of the South League, Sauchie in round two.

The Players

With the advent of the Premier League Rosyth recognised the need to strengthen and their first move was the capture of the widely experienced Kevin Bain (pictured right) who was signed from East Fife but spent many years at Dundee. Kevin will always be remembered as captain of the Scottish under 16 team which won through to the final of the World

Cup in 1989 only to lose to a Saudi Arabian side most of whom appeared to be a bit older than 16!

Rosyth also swooped for the Perth-based Carnoustie trio of Jon Kelly, Stevie McAllister and Martin Maher. Jon was, of course, top marksman in the Super League last season and has kept this momentum going with nineteen strikes to his credit so far this season in 33 matches. Just prior to the transfer deadline the experienced Gary Kelly was taken on loan from East-Fife. Unfortunately due to a lung infection it is unlikely that Gary will appear again this season. The new signings have blended in well with players who were on the books of Rosyth. These include the much experienced ex-Linlithgow goalkeeper, Greg Logan and the prolific marksman Tam McGeorge. Tam has notched 84 goals in 113 appearances for the Rec. Twenty of the goals have been scored this season.



The Rosyth squad includes two players who have been on the books of Tayport. Manager Billy Spence, still registered as a player, made four starts and scored four goals in the 2001/02 season for the 'Port while Andy Lawson (pictured left) had two spells at Tayport in 2000 and 2001 either side of a sojourn in Australia. Andy made his 150th appearance

for Rosyth in the defeat at Kelty in midweek.

There are a number of younger players in the Rosyth squad who have made an impact this season. None more so than Mark Morrison (20), signed from Stenhousemuir two years ago, who has developed immensely in the current season under the guidance of Kevin Bain. Another benefiting from Kevin's experience is Kris Vaughan (20) who signed for Rosyth at the same time - again from Stenhousemuir.

SUPER LEAGUE sponsored by Whyte & Mackay

Linlithgow need five points from their last three fixtures at home to Lochee United and away to Hill of Beath and Whitburn to take the title. Failure by their only rivals, Bonnyrigg Rose, to take full points from games v Hill of Beath, Bathgate and Tayport on the Canniepairt next Saturday would make Linlithgow's task even easier. Bonnyrigg will take heart, however, from Bathgate's spectacular collapse last season. As Sir Alex might say, it's squeaky burn time at Prestonfield. Already relegated Kinnoull, buoyed by their first win of the season on Wednesday past, stand between Oakley and a major step to safety when they meet this afternoon in Perth.

Two goals behind, 'Port stormed into a 3-2 lead, thanks to a scintillating five minute spell, midway through the second half, in which Ronnie Kenneth and Chris Webster both netted against their former club. The joy was short-lived. Cracking finishes from Aaron Conway and substitute Ralph Brand meant Carnoustie would claim all three points from what became an enthralling game.

A win was paramount against Downfield, on Monday, and came courtesy of Ronnie Kenneth, Brian Livie and Chris Webster, whose goals earned Tayport a place in the Challenge Cup final.

Little respite for the players, though, as there was another fixture on Wednesday, this time at Thomson Park. 'Port could not build on the Downfield result, going down 2-1 to Lochee United, in a Super League encounter. Middleton again came back to haunt his former team-mates, with a brace, while Barry McNaughton counted for the Canniepairt outfit.

All things considered, there was an encouraging degree of endeavour shown in that match, so, hopefully, things can start to get better.

Today's opponents are very well known to lan and myself having played against them 3 times with our previous club. Billy Spence has put together a very good side, which shows with their cur-

After 17 years of making headlines for their winning exploits, Tayport FC are still making headlines when they're not winning! A disappointing series of five defeats in an 18 day period gave the local press plenty of copy. Given the club's profile, headlines such as "Champions Shocked By Record Defeat" in the **Evening Telegraph** weren't exactly unexpected.

"Final defeat completes Port's miserable week", ran the Fife Herald. "Port put to the sword" was another as the defeats piled up.

Of the 5-1 home defeat by Oakley, the **Herald** commented that "The scoreline beggared belief. Only Carnoustie had ever scored as many goals against Tayport (5-2 and 6-3) while only Bo'ness had beaten Port by four clear goals. Said **The Herald** "The result was a calamity for the Super League champions, but immense credit should go to Oakley who must surely go on to retain their top flight status"

The fact that the Scottish Juniors' International team was playing an international against the Republic of Ireland went unnoticed in the local press. Scotland went down 4-2 and the Edinburgh Evening News carried a sizeable report and a photograph. The report was penned by a scribe who doubles as a West Lothian club committee member and the fact that Lothians folk still can't seem to get their heads round the fact that the East Region continues north of the Forth was evident in the report which stated that "two of the East Region's four representatives got a start". Which of course was nonsense because there were six East Region players in the squad. The reporter had failed to acknowledge that the two keepers, Alan Fleming and Marc Graham came from Kelty Hearts and Hill of Beath respectively. For the record the four mentioned were Joe Mbu (Whitburn), Gordon Herd (Linlithgow Rose), Sean Grady (Bonnyrigg) and our former player John Elliott (Bonnyrigg).

All the players got a run, a situation which contributors to a Juniors' website reckoned caused the team's downfall. Well, suppose it was just a jolly anyway, so you can't really blame manager Jim O'Donnell for giving everybody a cap. Mind you, bringing on a conveyor belt of subbies didn't seem to affect the Irish, they fielded 18 players to the Scots' 16.


