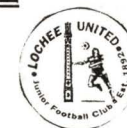



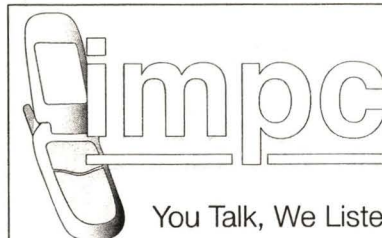

# TODAY'S GAME



WHYTE & MACKAY SUPERLEAGUE  
TAYPORT v LOCHEE UNITED



In what has been a very fragmented start to the Super League season, Tayport and Lochee United meet in the first of the season's derby matches.

For Lochee, they will be out to maintain their 100% record - one win out of one - a 4-1 home victory over Bo'ness United, who, coincidentally have been Tayport's only Super League opponents at home to date. The fact that game was 10 weeks ago, merely serves to illustrate just what a hotchpotch this season's campaign has been to date.

Today's game was only sprung on the clubs at the last minute when last weekend the Match Secretary realised he had scheduled league cup quarter final ties before the section was finished! Hardly the build up for what is the teams' biggest match of the season to date.

Tayport's league double over Lochee last season was a fairly significant factor in Port's championship win on goal difference from a hapless Bathgate side.

Lochee disappointed last season and for much of the campaign flirted with relegation before pulling clear at the end to finish one place above the drop zone.

It was a situation which saw United dip into the coffers to secure some new faces including Gareth Dailly from Tayport and ex Port striker Gary Middleton from Montrose. And a big bonus for this season has been the return to action of central defender Jonathan Thompson.

It's another last line of defence for the visitors with Russell Brown being brought back from Violet to replace Iain Ross who moved to East Fife in the close season.

Although they have yet to be severely tested, Lochee, apart from last week's blip, have started the season well scoring goals for fun, rattling in two eights, three sixes and a seven, indeed they've never failed to find their opponents' net.

Things went awry last Saturday, however, when Turriff came down from the North and scored a shock 3-2 win over the GA North/Tayside Cup holders at Thomson Park. Lochee didn't go out with a whimper, though, finishing the game with seven men after Middleton, Krobot, Macmillan, and Blackwood were sent for early showers. It's likely that the last two will miss out today through suspension.

Tayport also tasted defeat last Saturday, losing in the league for the first time this season, 1-2 at Whitburn. It was obviously a disappointing result for the good Tayport support at Central Park but the performance wasn't all bad and the manager will be looking for his players to bounce back. He will be looking for his players to up their strike rate but will have to do so without the likely unavailable Robbie Henderson whose goal at Tannadice sixteen months ago effectively ended the Dundee team's Scottish Cup dream. Lloyd Young will be out for some weeks after breaking a foot falling from a ladder at work while niggling injuries could well rule out Chris Webster and Allan Ramsay.

The first four seasons of the Super League have demonstrated just how keenly contested is this competition. The stakes are high and both sides will be anxious to avoid losing ground. A hard fought encounter will hopefully keep the fans enthralled for 90 minutes.

## Keith Burgess writes.....

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters to the Canniepairt for today's Whyte & Mac-kay East Superleague match against Lochee United.



Our opponents today come into the match in good form, scoring goals freely in their league cup section but, like ourselves, they must be feeling totally frustrated at the lack of Superleague matches.

Tayport have now played four league games, but United have only had one outing so far, beating Boness by 4 goals to 1 at Thomson Park a few weeks ago. I'm sure Ray McKinnon will agree with me that the lack of consistent top class Superleague opposition does not help in our job of trying to get a settled side to sustain a league championship challenge.

Hopefully next year the powers that be will see sense and re-think the league cup format, as I don't think that this year's format was a success.[*something of an understatement here - Ed.*] Maybe if teams just played each other once in their section there would be an improvement.

Since my last programme piece, we have beaten East Craigie by 4 goals to nil in the league cup, and had our first league defeat away to Whitburn last week. The Craigie game was very low key, but gave us the chance to play some of the players who had missed out at Camelon the previous week, and play some players who were returning from injury.

For me the most encouraging thing to come out of the Craigie game was the performance of 16 year old Malcolm Downie, who showed great quality on the ball and a willingness to regain possession when we had given the ball away. Although still very young, we can already see a bright future in the game for Malky, following in the footsteps of his dad Jim, who was by all accounts an ex-

cellent player in his day.

Last week at Whitburn, we totally dominated the game from start to finish creating four or five decent chances but only scoring once through Ronnie Kenneth late in the game, after gifting Whitburn two easy chances to score, due to poor defending in our own 6 yard box. On both occasions we were guilty of allowing a cross into the area, and not picking up our opponents as they attacked the far post. A problem that we have now worked on at training during the week and hopefully won't encounter again.

On a positive note, I thought that we played well and deserved to come away from Central Park with a victory. We looked strong defensively and controlled the middle of the park for long periods. The only thing that I felt we lacked was a cutting edge up front on the day, and a bit of luck in front of goal, where there always seemed to be a Whitburn player blocking our route to the net. But we worked our socks off on a very heavy park and our players must be applauded for their efforts of trying to play football and win the match for us.

On the injury front Lloyd Young has a broken right foot due to an accident at work and will be out for 6 weeks, but Allan Ramsay and Robbie Henderson may be available after missing the last couple of games with niggling injuries. Fraser FitzPatrick and Malcolm Downie are both unavailable due to family holidays.

It's a tough one for us today against our Tayside rivals, but I'm sure with your support we can overcome last week's disappointment and get back quickly into a league challenging position.

No doubt either as to where their allegiances now lie, so an intriguing afternoon awaits.

The home side, of course, will be looking to recover from the disappointing reversal at Whitburn. On this visit to Central Park, 'Burn did not create anything near the number of chances they carved out a year ago, yet they did produce a goal in each half, through Colin Strickland and Kenny Hannah, leaving Tayport with an uphill struggle.

Ronnie Kenneth and Barry McNaughton both tested the 'keeper in the first half, while Derek Wemyss also went close. Other openings came and went but not until the 90th minute did 'port register, when Ronnie Kenneth headed home a fizzing Ross Gunnion cross.

Unfortunately, Keith Burgess's side were unable to snatch a late, late equaliser. If only they had taken the lead when on top in the first half. Taking the lead against East Craigie, however, proved far more straightforward.

Just fifteen seconds into the League Cup sectional tie, a fortnight ago, Duncan McLean found the net from the edge of the area. That strike was later followed by a spectacular Murray Urquhart volley, an early contender for Goal of the Season.

Into the second half, Derek Wemyss calmly side-footed home the third counter of the Canniepairt stroll, while Bryan Duell rounded things off from the spot, after Duncan McLean had been felled.

There was also a penalty at the other end, but, almost inevitably, given his past record, Duncan Bruce made the save, thus joining Frazer Fitzpatrick on three clean sheets for the season to date.

Another one today would be ideal, but by no means easy. Unless, that is, the Bluebells have forgotten what it's like to play a Super League fixture! It must be said that the situation they find themselves in, seven matches behind Linlithgow, is absolutely ludicrous. And we thought Tayport were being harshly treated.

### COMMENT

'The Luck of the Draw' & 'The Romance of the Cup' are time honoured clichés but is it not time the SJFA had a look at the format for the OVD Cup and play a Preliminary Round?

No disrespect meant, but should there not be a seeded draw at the preliminary stage to bring the original entry down to 128 clubs and make tomorrow's draw the first round proper?

The 74 clubs which would compete in the preliminary round could be drawn from the bottom leagues of the respective regions and the bottom half of those regions with just one division.

What's the point?

Well, two points spring to mind immediately. (1) Big guns like Camelon and Kilwinning (one of which will make their exit today) wouldn't be absent from the competition while the likes of Fochabers haven't yet kicked a ball in the competition. (2) Top division clubs are likely to have longer seasons, so this way they might have one or two games less while the bottom division clubs can comfortably accommodate another one or two games.

It would appear to be a good enough system for the European Champions League, the Scottish FA Cup and the English Cup so maybe it's worth a try here.

## media matters



The **Evening Telegraph** continues to lead the way on the local scene with its comprehensive Junior football coverage on Mondays and Fridays. It must be said that elsewhere too, the coverage of Junior football has greatly improved in recent times, taking advantage of email and digital photography. Outwith the metropolis, the **Fife Herald** and **Perthshire Advertiser** lead the way in north Fife and in the Big County with their coverage.

The profile of the game has been enhanced by the coverage afforded it by **The Sun** and **Daily Record**. In Glasgow, the **Evening Times** looks after the Juniors on a daily basis, but can't hold a candle to the exposure provided by Edinburgh's **Evening News**.

Tayport's last two visits to capital country have seen their game previewed on the Friday as match of the day and then given mega coverage on the Monday.

Monday this week was no exception, with two full pages devoted to Whitburn v Tayport at Central Park including four photographs. John Gilmour covered the game and noted that, although "they [Tayport] had the bulk of possession, all too often they missed badly or keeper Walker, who was producing a man of the match performance, kept them at bay". The reporter summed up thus "Overall it was an impressive win for Whitburn.....Tayport had the bulk of the play but when chances fell to them, they failed to cash in..." Whitburn manager Derek Strickland said, "That was a great result for us but I still feel we can play better" The **News** included another eleven Junior match reports in its coverage, each one containing the line-ups.

**The Sun** (21/10/06) carried an interview with Mark Bradley, Linlithgow's capture from Bathgate. Delighted with Rose's move to the top of the table, albeit with several games in hand, he ruefully recalled having to play catch-up last season with Bathgate. Said Bradley "It's hard having to win your games in hand and there's no margin for error. Tayport won the league sitting in the house." Mark explained why he moved from Creamery Park. "That's the place to be [Bathgate] if you're in it for the money, but I wasn't bothered about that any more, I just wanted a regular game",

Lochee United got top billing in the **Evening Telegraph** on Monday (23/10/06) - but it was for the wrong reasons! **Bluebells see Red** said the headline in glorious colour, as Lochee lost the place with referee Jeff Banks and ended with seven men as they went down 3-2 to Turriff at Thomson Park. There was little sympathy from manager Ray McKinnon. "If we had kept eleven players on the park, I think we would have won, but when you start mouthing off to referees, you run the risk of getting red cards", said the Thomson Park gaffer.

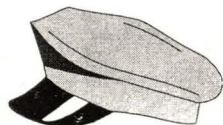

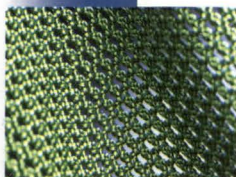

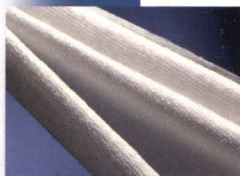
