

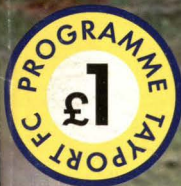

Second round
TAYPORT v THORNIWOOD UNITED



It's not often Tayport go into a Scottish Cup tie on the back of two successive league defeats, indeed it's never been the case. It's actually eight and a half years since we lost two league games on the bounce.

Whatever the reasons, whatever the circumstances that we've lost the last two games, Tayport players will stand up and be counted this afternoon when we meet a Thorniewood United side, similarly positioned and anxious to end a run of three successive defeats.

For Thorniewood, the poor run in October has been all the more disappointing as it followed an unbeaten nine game run during which the Uddingston side were emerging as strong title contenders in the West League Central Division Two.

Our visitors are convinced, however, that these results have merely been a glitch and the players are capable of much better. What better stage to prove that, than here today they reckon.

The fans could be the winners this afternoon as Thorniewood have been scoring for fun this season, at an average of something like four strikes per game. Even a failure to record a win in recent weeks, hasn't preventing the Robertson Park outfit from exercising their opponents' goalkeepers. It was August, some 14 games ago, when they last failed to find the net.

Top scorer John Fallon was injured in last Saturday's defeat by Stonehouse Violet and carted off to hospital with a nasty head injury. There were fears that Fallon would miss out today but the injury wasn't as bad as first feared and he'll be in his usual No 7 jersey this afternoon.

Injuries, illness and suspension have given the Tayport management major concerns this week. A broken foot keeps Lloyd Young out, illness will again see Robbie Henderson miss out and Derek Wemyss is suspended following the most controversial of red cards last week. The injured Steven Stewart, taken off at half-time last week, has been added to the list of those unavailable as has Craig Brown, who damaged a cartilage in his brief appearance last Saturday. Chris Webster and Allan Ramsay missed the Lochee game through injury and there are doubts whether either will have recovered sufficiently to take part today. Add the fact that Ronnie Kenneth was on the treatment table this week and is far from certain to take part, and one can see those who do take the field will have their work cut out.

We look forward to an enjoyable afternoon's entertainment which has for so long been the hallmark of one of the world's oldest football competitions.

The Tayport / Brechin City Connection

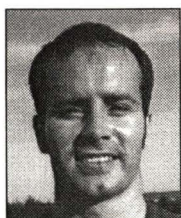

TODAY'S VISITORS THORNEWOOD UNITED



Although our visitors this season are celebrating 60 years in the Juniors, even to aficionados of the Junior game in Tayside and Fife, they are one of the less well known Junior clubs. That's probably because, since they moved from the Juvenile ranks to the Juniors in 1946, success has been fairly limited.

In the league, a Division Two championship in 1992/93 and another short lived promotion to Division One as runners-up in 2004/05 is the extent of the league success in recent years.

A run to the 5th Round of the Scottish Cup two years ago, defeating Arnis-ton and Kinnoull on the way, was the best run for a number of years. United have had their cup moments, however, appearing in the Scottish Cup quarter finals in 1950 and 1956

Thorniewood, whose home ground is Robertson Park in Viewpark, Udding-ston, South Lanarkshire, are making their first visit to Tayport this after-noon. We welcome them to Fife's most northerly outpost and trust they will have a pleasant visit - although not too pleasant!

Thorniewood currently play in the Central second division of the West Re-gion JFA, which was formed from the amalgamation of the Ayrshire Jun-iors and the Central Juniors in 2002.

In this season's competition Thorniewood were drawn at home in the 1st round to Dufftown who were sent back up to whisky country smarting from a 5-1 defeat. Goals that day were scored by Paul Stevenson (2) John Fallon, Terry Markey and Chris Queen.

Most of the players in the Robertson Park club's squad today have been re-cruited from the amateur ranks. A good team spirit abounds within the club where the attitude to today's tie is, we've nothing to lose, so let's give it our best shot.

Uddingston is not only the home of Thorniewood, it's also the home of Tunnocks, manufacturers of those magnificent caramel wafers and tea cakes. Appropriately enough, Tunnock's are Thorniewood's main sponsors.

DUSTING DOWN THE COBWEBS

A visit from a team from Uddingston to Tayport brings back memories of a Tayport team's last encounter with a team from these parts - a Scottish Amateur Cup 5th Round tie v Parkside in January 1978.

Memories of that epic 3 x game tie came flooding back when we played at Arthurlie in a Scottish Junior tie earlier this year, virtually 28 years to the day of the second replay in Uddingston. When the conditions at Arthurlie were described as the worst in which we had played, the few veterans of the Amateur Cup tie were heard to recall that conditions at Barrhead weren't nearly as bad as those experienced at Parkside. Nothing could be!

Tayport were defending a 22 game unbeaten run since the start of the season when the unknown Parkside arrived as a first foot on 7th January 1978. Tayport led 1-0 at half-time through a Jimmy Downie goal but the visitors from Lanarkshire forced a replay with a second half equaliser.

The teams had to wait three weeks for the weather to relent and allow the replay to go ahead on 28 January on a pitch which had just thawed out from heavy snow and was a sea of mud with much of the surface under water. In fact there was a stream running down one touchline and at one corner it wasn't just over the boots it was up to the knees! A goodly number of locals with copious supplies of Commotion Lotion, provided an atmosphere just a trifle less sedate than the lads from Tayport were used to.

Having waited three weeks and travelled through, the referee thought he'd better declare the pitch playable so the teams just had to get on with it. On what wasn't a day for fancy dans, a fantastic contest ended 4-4 after extra time in what was generally acknowledged to be Downie's finest hour. Jim ploughed up and down the middle of the park revelling in the conditions so much so that Blantyre Vics were looking to sign him.

No penalty kicks to settle a tie after two games in those days and Tayport lost the toss for hosting the third and decisive game so had to return to Parkside. Terry Scanlon replaced the injured Jim Downie for the third game which saw Tayport go down by 2-1, Gordon Hughes netting the goal.

Tayport's players in the three games were Bobby Nicol, Bobby McMahon, Ian Mathers, Ronnie Fleming, Doug Henderson, Ian Dobie, Mike Clerihew, Jim Downie, Steve Braid, Ian Howe, Gordon Hughes, George Ritchie, Peter Wilson, Terry Scanlon, Stuart Davie and Ian Brown.

Interestingly, around eight of these players still take in games at The Canniepairt from time to time and Bobby McMahon, now in Winnipeg, Canada, only last week purchased a couple of bricks for the Supporters' Wall.

Yes, Parkside '78, etched forever in the memory of all who were there.

*Thorniewood are co-bossed by John Fallon, the former Motherwell player, who is the father of the club's top scorer of the same name.

* Thorniewood run Under 19 and Under 21 teams, both of which act as feeders to the Juniors.

* Thorniewood's last silverware was the Central League Division 2 Championship in 1993

* Thorniewood's largest home attendance is the est 4,000 who watched the Scottish Cup tie at home to Shotts Bon Accord in 1955.

*That was topped by the 6,100 who watched the Scottish Cup 2nd replay v Lugar Boswell Thistle at neutral Bellshill a year later.



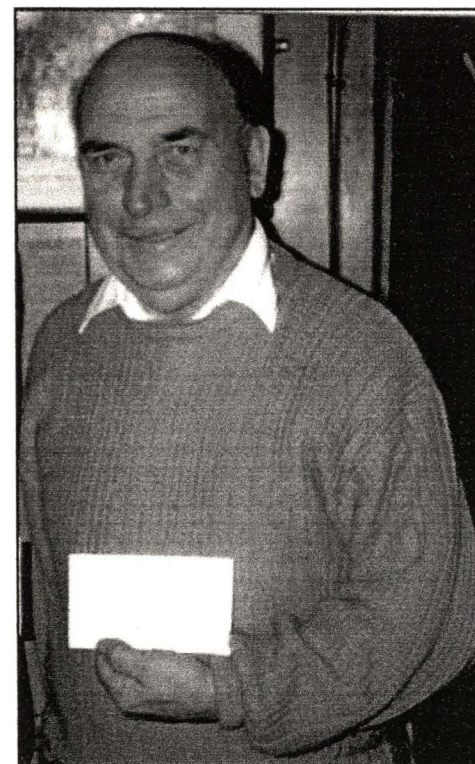

He hadn't tried to gain an advantage by sneaking onto the park, he knew the referee was watching him. He clearly didn't know the referee, though. For Krobot to be dismissed for that misdemeanour was ludicrous.

Anyway, back to the football. The second half was fairly even. Tayport had more possession, Lochee had a couple of clearer opportunities, but there were no further goals. Hopefully, with an improved performance, 'Port can make amends this afternoon.

Tayport is set to be buzzing next July when it is planned to stage an inaugural Ferryport Festival with a whole host of activities planned over a two week period.

"The home side - who are virtually at full strength, with Chris Webster the only cause for concern", it said, but we knew all week we'd also be without Allan Ramsay, Frazer FitzPatrick, Robbie Henderson, Lloyd Young and Malcolm Downie. If only the correspondent had picked up the phone.....

The Sun on Saturday had a big splash on the possibility of the Juniors getting a share of the Tennents Scottish Cup action next season and interviewed Roberto Morris, illustrating the piece with a pic of a grinning Bob with the Scottish Cup on his head.

Friday's **Evening Tele** led with another piece on the farcical situation with the League Cup quarter final draw, two of the ties of which have been held back thanks to an administrative blunder.

In the preview of the Brody v East Craigie game, Fed boss Kenny Cameron reckoned his side's win over Tayport was the big turning point in his season, as they looked to stretch their five game unbeaten run.

The Edinburgh Evening News on Monday concentrated on the Bathgate v Bo'ness Super League game at Creamery Park. The game had a bit of added spice in that Chris McFadyen, signed by Bathgate from Linlithgow on the eve of the game, had actually agreed in midweek to sign for Bo'ness before changing his mind. Touch of the Maurice Johnston? Needless to say he was roundly booed by the Bo'ness faithful every time he touched the ball, according to reporter John Gilmour. Hill of Beath boss Jock Finlayson saw his side go out of the League Cup on penalties against Glenrothes and, although he conceded the better side had got through, Finlayson, in time honoured fashion, still 'raged', describing it as Haws worst performance of the season, adding that the Warout Stadium pitch was a disgrace.

Blue Heaven was the headline in then Dundee edition of the **Tele** on Monday, referring, of course, to Lochee's win at the Canniepairt accompanied by a photo of the jubilant Lochee players celebrating the game's opening goal.

The other main story was the surprise defeat of Carnoustie by Lochee Harp. Tayport's Scottish Cup legend Birdie Craik was amongst the goals again but it was a disappointing debut for new Panmure assistant boss George O'Boyle who was standing in for the unavailable Ian Flaherty

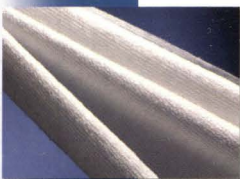

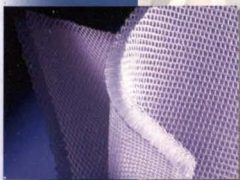
