



TAYPORT v CARNOUSTIE PANMURE

You've got to go back to August 19th for Tayport's last Super League win on the Canniepairt but, to be fair, we've only played one other League fixture at home during the intervening 12 weeks, the recent reversal at the hands of nearest neighbours Lochee United.

In the ultra competitive Super League, wins are everything and a couple of good victories can do wonders for a club's league position. On the contrary, a couple of defeats sends a club plummeting into relegation alley.

Carnoustie Panmure experienced a dismal opening to the campaign when three successive defeats saw the Laing Park outfit installed as the bookies favourites for a bottom two placing come the end of the season. The bookies had Panmure at 5/2 for their visit to Oakley and another blank days seemed on the cards. However, it was to be the turning point of the season for the Gowfers and a 2-1 win sparked off a run of three wins on the bounce to send our visitors today soaring up the table, from relegation candidates to title challengers.

The last two weeks have been taken up with two tough games in the Scottish Cup v Bathgate and late goals in both games secured a morale boosting passage to the last 64 at the expense of last season's beaten finalists.

Tayport's fans have been subjected to a mixed bag of results over the same period. A rather unfortunate loss at Whitburn was followed by a pretty disappointing display v Lochee United. The cup win over Thorniewood caused a few flutters but against Violet last week, the win was wholly comprehensive. During the course of these games a number of injuries have cleared up, so the squad should be in better health today, which of course, gives the manager selection problems of the more pleasant sort.

Carnoustie, though still retaining the experienced backbone which has stood the team in good stead over recent seasons, have introduced some new faces. Midfielder Stuart Abbot from Dundee United who grabbed the equaliser at Bathgate, Aaron Conway from Sauchie, Kevin Cumming and Robert Hendry from Forfar and Henry Hall's young lad, Ewan from Montrose. Most recent recruit is the seasoned campaigner Gary Bollan. The former Dundee United star who also saw service with Rangers was most recently with Brechin City. On the bench for the last couple of weeks, he could be on from the start here today.

Several Tayport players have carried a number of niggling injuries over the last few weeks, but indications are that only Lloyd Young (broken foot) and Craig Brown (cartilage) are out through injury. Barry McNaughton, back from holiday, and Robbie Henderson are back and, with the latter having four training sessions and 45 minutes last week under his belt, could be on from the start.

Former Carnoustie player Murray McDowell was Tayport's trialist at Violet last week and another former Gowfer, Chris Webster, plays his first game in Tayport colours against his former teammates.

LEAGUE CAMPAIGN FRAGMENTED

EAST REGION DIVISIONS REVIEW

The fact that an East South and an East North Division causes confusion to the uninitiated before a ball is kicked is perhaps symptomatic of the current untidy state of play within the East Region's five divisions.

Little can be gleaned from a **Super League** which shows that one club, Linlithgow, has played three times as many games as another club, Lochee United, only three months into the season. What little there is, however, suggests that Bonnyrigg Rose are shaping up as prime title challengers with Whitburn also showing they could be putting together a more sustained bid than last season. Bo'ness, with one wins and seven defeats from eight, have a lot to do as have Kinnoull with only four goals and one point from their opening five matches. It is early days, however, and in a hugely competitive league it will likely be six months before the die is cast.

In the **Premier Division**, it's the same situation with Kelty, for example, having played only 2 games compared with Penicuik's 9 and North End 3 compared with Arniston's 8. It's going to be one helluva scrap before promotion and relegation is settled next May or more likely, June.

A bit more shape about the **North Division** with Forfar West End, Downfield and East Craigie as yet unbeaten. Even at this early stage, Coupar Angus and Brechin Vics look as if they have their work cut out to avoid being the clubs battling it out for the bottom slot. For the championship, it's difficult to look further than Forfar West End, Broughty Athletic or Blairgowrie.

In the Central Division, Luncarty, Bankfoot and Jeanfield will be enjoying visiting the fields of Fife but it's difficult to see the Big County clubs getting the better of say, Dundonald, Kirkcaldy or Ballingry Rovers for a promotion spot.

The **East South Division** will be a marathon with 28 games to be played by each club, so it's going to be a long haul for the Lothians clubs and it will be a few months yet before the challengers move away from the pack.

The new league structure laid the foundations for a strong and competitive league which could have provided a real springboard for the Junior game in the east of Scotland. However the marketing potential has been stifled by the misguided decision to clutter things up the League Cup - certainly in its current format.

Friday's Edinburgh Evening News' preview of last Saturday's card had a full page feature and photograph on former Tayport star John 'Chalkie' Elliott, whose impressive form is a significant factor in Bonnyrigg Rose's unbeaten start to the season. Chalkie commented that the unbeaten run which has continued from last season and stretches to 20 odd games has given the team great confidence, Said John "We really believe we are capable of going anywhere and winning". He did concede, however, that the famous Bonnyrigg slope has helped them.

The **Evening Telegraph** preview concentrated on the Scottish Cup replays and credited Gowfers gaffer Ian Flaherty's half-time pep talk as working wonders in securing a second bite at the cherry. Carnoustie's Dougie Mitchell called it right when he was quoted as saying that everyone was optimistic about going through to the third round.

Downfield manager John Clenaghan, justifiably as it turned out, warned against complacency after returning from Musselburgh with a draw, reckoning that the Spiders would have to "perform to our maximum, as they have players who can punish us". This they duly did, winning 2-1.

The Fife Herald's headline gave Bryan Duell the credit for spearheading Tayport to victory in their Scottish tie at home to Thorniewood. The report acknowledged that the Uddingston team had given Tayport an 'almighty scare'. The reporter considered that the sending off of 'wood's McGraw at 1-2, turned the game in Tayport's favour. "Too many players were off colour" commented manager Burgess in his summing up. The Herald scribe also spotted that Thorniewood actually had three players red-carded, noting that sub Murphy had been carded after the final whistle.

The Herald also covered Newburgh's surprise Scottish Cup win at Coupar Angus. Great determination, strength and character had been displayed and there was a special mention for young Rikki Wells, who was with Tayport pre-season, and had caused Coupar's defence all sorts of problems.

In the Herald's preview of the Violet League cup-tie, Keith Burgess insisted that he wanted to see his experienced defenders cut out the defensive lapses that had occurred in recent outings. The article pointed out that the least experienced defender is Brian Livie and he has played in two Scottish Cup semi finals and one final.

Monday's Evening Telegraph provided comprehensive coverage of the weekend's card with its Sixth edition concentrating mainly on the Fife based clubs with a big report on the seven goal Super League thriller between Oakley and Hill of Beath and two colourful action photos from Newburgh where Kirkcaldy were the visitors. As well as reports, all the tables, local results, fixtures and Scottish Cup draw made the Tele's Junior page good reading at the Monday tea table (or is that still considered bad manners?).

The Late Extra edition had coverage of all the matches from north of the Tay, concentrating on what was a good day for the locals in the Scottish Cup. Only a small para, but East Craigie received deserved credit for a 2-1 smash and grab in their replay at Buchanhaven.



It's clearly a measure to try and claw back some of the anticipated backlog. Of course, at that time of the year, weather conditions will have a big say.

Isn't it a trifle strange that neighbouring clubs should be matched against each other at this time of the season - Tayport v Lochee and Tayport v Carnoustie in successive home games, and Harp at St Andrews last week for example, when these games could be played during the early weeks of midweek fixtures in April instead of potential trips to the Lothians.




