



TODAY'S VISITORS KIRKINTILLOCH ROB ROY

Kirkintilloch Rob Roy FC has for many years been one of the biggest names in the Junior game with a rich history going back to either 1878 or 1884, depending what reference book one uses. Regardless, it's a long time to have existed in the game, making Rob Roy one of the oldest of Junior clubs.

Rob Roy have appeared in eight Scottish Junior Cup Finals, winning three and have won 30 other cup competitions. It's 106 years since they celebrated their first league championship, the Scottish Junior League in 1900/01, and 44 years since they lifted their most recent, the Central League Championship

Rabs' fans under the age of forty won't know what it's like to celebrate winning silverware, the 1973/74 Central League Cup being the most recent cup win. Cup wins prior to that ranged from their first in 1904/05, the Dunbartonshire Cup, to the Dunbartonshire Junior Cup, Dunbartonshire Junior Charity Cup, Kirkintilloch & District League Cup, Kirkwood Shield, Intermediate League Cup, Central League Cup and Evening Times Cup Winners Cup.

The turn of the present generation has yet to come but, for 70 years, the Scottish Junior Cup was the high spot of every generation of Kirkintilloch fans.

Rob Roy was founded by a group of young men from the Eastside district of Kirkintilloch and was apparently named after a defunct Perthshire Curling Club. Adamslie Park has been Rob Roy's home ground for 80 years.

The list of former players who have gone Senior and made a name for themselves in the game is like a who's who of Scottish football. Among those who served their time at Adamslie were George Young (Rangers), Steve Chalmers (Celtic), Bobby Flavell (Dundee), Tony Green (Blackpool) and Joe Fascione (Chelsea)

TAYPORT v KIRKINTILLOCH ROB ROY

Kirkintilloch Rob Roy seem to have put the turbulence of recent seasons behind them as we welcome them to the Canniepairt for a third time in eleven years. They are going very well in the Central first division, well placed for a tilt at the title, a point behind leaders Cumbernauld with two games in hand. Rob Roy have tasted defeat only once in nine games and are today looking to extend their current unbeaten run which stretches back to 2nd September.

A measure of Rob Roy's improved performances this season has been their cup form. They ran away with their League Cup section at the start of the season and cuffed Carluke by 6-1 before falling, rather unluckily, to Pollok in the semi-final. In the West of Scotland Cup, Lugar Boswell Thistle, our Scottish Cup quarter final opponents in 2005 were put to the sword to the tune of 8-0 only six weeks ago.

After a 2-2 draw at home to Dunipace two weeks ago, the Rabs made five changes to their starting line-up for last week's game v Port Glasgow. Kevin Bell who kept goal for Clydebank here earlier this year took over from Terry McGennis in goal and, given his sound displays against Tayport over two games last season, could retain the No. 1 jersey this afternoon. James Prunty returned from injury last week and there were also starts for Paul Brown, Brian Vaugh and Ryan Deas, as manager John Richardson freshened up his side.

Experienced defender Andy Dearie, one of the two Rabs' survivors from his side's last visit to Tayport, will return as will team captain Paul Campbell. The lively Ryan Deas is likely to retain a starting jersey after showing good form in recent games, as could Paul Brown whose has an impressive
goals per games ratio. Manager Richardson has a strong pool from which to select a side to make
the fourth round for the first time since 2003 when they returned from Carnoustie with a 4-0 win
under their belts.

Tayport's play in recent months has been better than some of their results would suggest but they will require to be focused and cannot afford to gift scoring opportunities to a side which can boast of finding their opponents' net in every game they've played this season.

Derek Wemyss should be back in the No 5 jersey last week, but, following some good displays last Saturday at Forfar, boss Burgess could have had a restless night settling on his starting line-up. Brian Livie had four stitches in a head injury after being taken to hospital after only five minutes last week, but demonstrated his desperation not to lose his place by putting in two spirited training sessions this week. Gus Malone, showing good form when given a rare start and Bryan Duell in a defensive role were others who impressed last week.

Up front there was greater potency at Forfar than in recent weeks with goalscoring performances from Robbie Henderson and Ronnie Kenneth. Murray McDowell, a trialist in recent games, signed earlier this week but is likely to be on the bench.

Let's hope Tayport's formidable cup form continues this afternoon, when Kirkintilloch Rob Roy are in town. 'Port have won ten of their eleven cup matches this season, only losing an academic League Cup sectional tie at Broughty.

Indeed, last Saturday saw Keith Burgess's troops make still further League Cup progress, reaching the semi-finals courtesy of an impressive win at traditionally stubborn Forfar West End. Despite losing Brian Livie to an early head wound, the Tayport defence kept a comfortable clean sheet, while at the other end, Forfar 'keeper Vanderdeyl was beaten on three occasions.

Ronnie Kenneth was first to find the net, at Strathmore Park, in the 39th minute, then he added the game's second goal, shortly after the half-time break, when his glancing header beat the 'keeper at the near post. All this after starting on the bench.

A few more chances were passed up, before Robbie Henderson belted home a cracking volley, after Barry McNaughton had flicked on a Ross Gunnion throwin. Having both Kenneth and Henderson back on the goal trail was just one of several encouraging signs last weekend, the return to action of Steven Stewart being another.

Unfortunately, all has not gone quite so well in the Super League of late, with the home loss to Carnoustie, a fortnight ago, being a substantial blow. Panmure won by the only goal of the game, which came their way, a little too easily, in the eleventh minute of the contest.

Best, however, not to dwell on that particular afternoon, but, instead, to look forward to what should be a closely-fought Scottish Cup tie, with a place in the fourth round the prize for the victors.

Scott Peters - a Tayport legend

Probably helped by his bald head and committed no-nonsense approach to the game, Scott Peters was a stand out wherever he played and was guaranteed to get stick from the opposing fans and be noticed by referees. But Scott had much more

than that, and his football abilities always shone through. Tayport FC reaped the benefit with three Scottish Cup finals and four league championship titles in his five full seasons at the Canniepairt.

Signed by Andy Sommerville from Arbroath FC on a cold and windy February evening at Gayfield, Scott made his debut as a substitute against away to East Craigie. The following week he was on from the start — and Tayport

promptly lost 2-1 at Forfar West End, ending a run of something like 61 games without defeat. What have we got here, the punters must have been muttering! But Andy Sommerville had made no mistake, Scott went on to assume legendary status, playing 202 times and scoring 37 goals including 4 in one match against Lochee United.

By coincidence his final game was against Forfar West End at the end of last season in the final of the Findlay Cup. Only last week Dave Baikie was recalling how Scott had taken the game by the scruff of the neck as Tayport, poised for their first Super League title, seemed to be letting the flag slip away at Bonnyrigg. Scooter rallied the troops and a 2-1 win secured the championship.

Scott decided to retire at the end of last season to concentrate on his business and the novelties of fatherhood, but was eventually persuaded to come out of retirement a couple of weeks ago to help out his local team Kirrie Thistle. We wish him well.

DUNCAN ON THE MOVE

Duncan Bruce, pictured on the front cover of the programme performing his party piece - saving a penalty, asked for a transfer after being unable to dislodge Fitzy from the Tayport goal. Tayport weren't keen to see Duncan move, but he is a player deserving of a regular game and this week accepted an offer from Kinnoull. Duncan was signed from Dundee United in Spring 2002, but was mainly a substitute and was loaned out to Kinnoull before returning and making his debut in a 3-1 win away to Fraserburgh in February 2005.

Last season Duncan shared goalkeeping duties with Fitzy and made a significant contribution to Tayport lifting the league title and reaching the Scottish Cup semifinal. So much so that he won the Supporters' Club Player of the Year award.

Duncan, a student at Edinburgh University, travelled through to Tayport for training every week from the capital, will be back at the Canniepairt soon, as we have to play the Perth side twice in the league this season. We wish Duncan well for the future.

Good afternoon and a very warm welcome to both sets of supporters to today's Scottish Cup tie against Kirkintilloch Rob Roy.

"The Rabs" are no strangers to Tayport as this will be their third visit in 10 years to the Canniepairt on Scottish Cup business. Their season so far has been good, as they sit at the top of their division with a game in hand over rivals Clydebank, who we all will remember gave us two tough games last year at quarter final stage of this cup, so there is no way that we will allow ourselves to get complacent against our west of Scotland opponents.



Over the last couple of weeks we have had contrasting fortunes with a 1-0 league defeat at home to Carnoustie followed by an excellent 3-0 win last Saturday up at Forfar. We started the game really well with a high tempo which never relented over the entire 90 minutes, even though we were dealt an early blow when Brian Livie sustained a bad gash to his head and had to be taken to hospital where they put five stitches in the wound. With Derek Wemyss already missing through work commitments Bryan Duell had to be taken out of the frontline and slotted into defence where he turned in an excellent defensive performance, although he has made it clear he does not want to play there. We also had Morris, Gunnion, Kenneth and McNaughton back to their best on Saturday and with Robbie Henderson looking very sharp, hopefully we can be more consistent and carry some decent form into today's game and the weeks to follow.

We created many chances against Forfar, and netted 3 great goals, but it was our all round performance that gave us the most satisfaction with our defence looking assured, our midfield very competitive and creative in the final third of the park, all of which resulted in our strikers finding the net three times. This, aligned to a clean sheet at the other end, gives us great hope and expectation going into the match today.

On the injury front we still have Lloyd Young and Craig Brown definitely out and we have slight doubts over Ramsay and Livie being available, but with your support and backing, I know that we have a great chance of progressing into the next round, but we also know that we will have to be at our best to beat a very good Kirkmtilloch side this afternoon.

media matters



Today's tie has been getting good press in the **Kirkintilloch Herald**. The Herald reckoned that, although Rabs boss John Richardson was looking forward to a third round glamour tie against Tayport, he wanted to make sure his players kept racking up the points in the Central League first division. Richardson is deliberately playing down his team's chances by talking up Tayport - "best Scottish record of all clubs in the 90s and this century", he says - and telling the readers that his main priority is not the Scottish Cup, it's getting promotion. That was after the draw was made.

In this week's **Kirkie Herald**, John concedes he's been a bit disappointed with his team's form over the last two weeks (draws at home v Dunipace and Port Glasgow). Again Rich is maybe playing mind games, playing down his team's chances. "If there's ever a game coming at the wrong time, it's this one away to Tayport.....there's no doubt this will be a huge task". Bet he's not telling his players that!

The Fife Herald (24/11/06), in reporting the Carnoustie match was bemoaning the fact that "Tayport, for the third successive East Super League match, not only lost three points, but also failed to find the net...again Tayport were the architects of their own downfall, defensive lapses continuing to cost them dear" Even Al Kinnersley's accompanying photograph sensed the mood, with the caption reading "not many smiles coming from the Tayport bench...."

In previewing the Forfar Albion game, the Herald noted that Forfar might be wanting to exorcise some demons [having lost the Findlay Cup Final to Tayport last season and ending with seven men]. The Herald expected to see Robbie Henderson back in the line-up after illness. "Henderson has made two substitute appearances lately and has looked very eager indeed. Hopefully the popular front-man can hit the goal trail tomorrow" The readers wouldn't have been disappointed.

The Evening Telegraph (24/11/06) pointed out that Tayport had lost three league games on the bounce for the first time ever. Despite introducing the topic, the Tele pointed out that "any talk of a crisis or panic in the Fifers' camp was quickly dismissed!" The Tele Junior page headline was "Kirrie Sign Peters", rightly describing Kirrie's signing of the Tayport legend as a major acquisition.

The Edinburgh Evening News (27/11/06) majored on the Armadale v Whitburn League Cup semi-final tie which Armadale won on penalties after a 1-1 draw. Reporter John Gilmour singled out referee Chambers (the referee at our last Scottish tie v Thorniewood) for stick after awarding Armadale a controversial last minute penalty "....the furore started again as the teams prepared for the penalty shoot-out and Whitburn manager Derek Strickland had to be restrained from confronting the referee", read the report.

The **Fife Herald** (1/12/06) reporting the Forfar WE game, thought that the Loons had been enveloped by a sense of frustration as they had been comprehensively defeated by a determined Tayport outfit. Like the **Evening Telegraph** (1/12/06), the Herald noted Rob Roy's pedigree and illustrious cup history, the Tele describing today's game as an eye-catching tie.

It's been a turbulent few seasons at Kirkintilloch

The Kirkintilloch faithful will be hoping the management roller coaster is now firmly behind them after a couple of seasons of management upheaval at Adamslie Park.

With Rabs struggling in the Super League First Division in early 2005, manager Mick Oliver handed in his notice, citing pressures of business. After assistant John McLelland had briefly looked after matters, the Rob Roy committee sprang a surprise by appointing Bobby Pullen, manager of ultra successful amateur club Harestanes to the Adamslie hot seat. Pullen got off to a great start with an unbeaten run of 7 games and finished the season 10 points clear of a relegation spot.

Pullen's reign last a mere ten months and in January this year he handed in his notice, saying simply that results had not been good enough and, with four months of the season remaining he reckoned there was still the opportunity for someone to turn the fortunes around.

Again the Rabs committee turned to Pullen's assistant, 28 years old John McLelland who'd been forced to quit Senior football with Airdrie through injury.

McLelland got off to a great start with four wins on the spin. The competition of the Super League first division was tough however, and a draw was followed by four defeats, saw the team plunge into the relegation mire.

After defeat by Largs in early April, McLelland was asked to resign, with club officials claiming he had lost the dressing room. McLelland refused to resign so was sacked - after only nine games in charge.

The players denied the gaffer had lost the dressing room and a trio of Senior players refused to takeover on a caretaker basis, so the committee went back to the sacked McLelland and asked him to come back. He refused. The drastic action to try and avoid relegation didn't pay off and Rabs tumbled into the Central First Division.

All change again at the middle of May when present incumbents John Richardson and his assistant John Mitchell teamed up to take control of the famous old club.

Richardson had an impressive pedigree, steering Kilsyth Rangers to the Central League title in 2003 before taking over as youth coach at Dumbarton. The chance to take over at Adamslie was too good to pass up and Rich and Mitch, along with coach Charlie Spiers, have brought some much needed stability to the club along with a number of talented new signings and will be looking forward to this afternoon's tie.

TAYPORT and ROB ROY THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Tayport and Rob Roy first met on 16 March 1996 in the quarter final of the Scottish Cup when 910 saw Port reach the last four thanks to a 2-1 win on the Canniepairt with goals from Steven Stewart and Dave Reilly. Still in the Tayport camp and in line for a game today, are Grant Paterson, Steven Stewart and Allan Ramsay. Present goalie coach Fraser Mann was between the sticks that day. Gary Thompson was the manager of Rob Roy that season, but there are no survivors from their squad that day in today's Kirkintilloch pool.

It was to be another seven years before the sides would next cross swords and again the venue was the Canniepairt. The tie on 6th December 2003, attracted a crowd of 411, was goalless. But Tayport came good in the replay, winning 5-1 at Adamslie with Roberto Morris scoring what would be the club's Goal of the Season on a dreadful afternoon of rain and wind in front of an estimated 493 sodden souls.

Rob Roy's Andy Dearie and Stephen McPeake survive from that tie while Tayport can still call on the services of Fitzpatrick, Gunnion, Paterson, Morris, Ramsay, Stewart, Wemyss and McNaughton. 
