SCOTTISH CUP SEMI FINAL ATTENDANCES REACH AN ALL TIME LOW

Scottish Junior FA officials will surely have to re-think their Scottish Cup semi final marketing strategy after this season's competition featured the lowest ever last-four attendances. Cumnock v Thornton and Pollok v Bathgate, both at Broadwood Stadium (Clyde FC) struggled to attract an aggregate attendance of 3,385 on the last two Saturdays. Compare that with the 10,855 who rolled up to watch the semi finals as recently as six years ago.

We are told that Friday semi finals have been ruled out by the Police which is, of course, a nonsense and it's no surprise that the SJFA are understood to be raising the issue with the Scottish Government. They might ask at the same time how the Police justified prohibiting East Fife from cracking open a bottle of champagne on the pitch after their game at East Stirling to celebrate their championship success the other week. We're sure that was never the intention of those who drafted the legislation.

So, day of the week apart, why are the attendances dropping so sharply? Is it because they are being played before a ghostly atmosphere in a soulless Broadwood Stadium? Is it because it's invariably on a "fiery pitch in a blustery wind"? Or is it because the ground selected is miles away from either club's home ground?

They are all probably contributory factors, but the main reason has got to be the lamentable marketing of the occasion. A powerful marketing strategy is bound to pay dividends at the gate and the powers that be must get together with the sponsors to market the competition, to select the best date, the most appropriate venue and get ALL the press on board.

Something is surely wrong when there were no reports of last Saturday's semi final in the Sunday papers, nothing in the Sunday Mail, Sunday Post, Mail on Sunday, Sunday Herald and, never mind trying to find a report in the Scotland on Sunday, you couldn't even find the result!

WHITE and MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v OAKLEY UNITED

Anything other than a victory for Oakley United here this afternoon will sound the death knell for the Blairwood Park club's Super League survival hopes. Relegation has been looming for sometime and even a win today, would merely be a stay of execution.

One thing in Oakley's favour, however, is their recent league record on the Canniepairt - two wins from their past four visits including, of course, that embarrassing 5-1 humiliation exactly a year ago.

Player/ manager Willie Newbigging lost several key players during the close season and has struggled to adequately plug the gaps. League form has hit rock bottom with nary a point and only one goal scored in their last six Super League outings over the last eight weeks. Most recent defeat was on Wednesday past when Scottish Cup finalists Bathgate Thistle won 2-0 at Blairwood.

Despite their poor form of late, Oakley have their pride and in the likes of John Rushford, Scott Lammie and Lee Celentano, who scored in the 1-1 draw earlier this season at Blairwood, have players capable of causing an upset.

There should be no pressure on Tayport this afternoon and there is no reason why we can't see an exciting attacking display, the type of performance which has been missing on many occasions this season. The confidence that comes with a seven game unbeaten run will be exuded and that should auger well for the fans. The Canniepairt recorded its lowest ever Super League attendance at home on Wednesday past and it's only by providing some exciting, quality football that we can expect better crowds.

Chris Webster missed out on Wednesday through holidays but Ross Gunnion had recovered sufficiently from ill-health, which caused him to miss the League Cup final, to get a substitute jersey. Changes are likely with several players who have played bit parts over the past few games, Darren Scott and Birdie Craik, for example, set to get a starting jersey. The injured Roberto Morris plus any players who took knocks v Carnoustie are likely to be rested.

There have been some excellent individual performances over the past couple of games, eg Derek Wemyss and Brian Livie and the warm applause for Murray Urquhart when he was substituted on Wednesday, was testimony to his wholehearted contribution to recent games.

"RENNIE STRIKES PAY HANDSOME DIVIDEND"

Port have enjoyed a positive spell since the last edition of the 'Port Prog. It seems an age since Dean Rennie's goal brought three points from the Super League fixture against Kelty, in mid-March. The local hero won the game with his first touch, after coming on as a substitute, following several months on the sidelines.

Rennie was at it again this midweek, scoring the only goal of the game when old Tayside rivals Carnoustie Panmure visited the Canniepairt on league duty. A cracking right-foot finish, with 25 minutes on the clock was enough to send the Gowfers into deep relegation trouble.

In Tayport's other recent Super League fixture, on 22nd March, a late, late equaliser from Barry McNaughton, a header from a few inches out, rescued a point from the trip to the Warout, after Ryan Ewing had drawn first blood for Glenrothes.

Following that match, Frank Conway's troops had a couple of away cup ties to negotiate. Kinnoull were defeated at Tulloch Park, with McNaughton again on the scoresheet, netting a brace in a 3-1 win, with Ross Gunnion the other scorer, before 'Noull netted a consolation, in the East of Scotland Cup.

Coupar Angus were fortunate to keep Tayport at bay during the opening ten minutes of a Challenge Cup tie and, thereafter, actually held out until the hour, when Brian Craik finally made the breakthrough. Birdie soon added a second goal and Steven McAllister completed an ultimately comfortable win.

At Seaton Park, 'Port were twice behind to Arbroath SC, before running out 4-2 winners, in the Currie Cup. This time, it was Ronnie Kenneth who notched two goals, with the on-form duo of Rennie and McNaughton also on target. Rennie's goal was a sublime left-foot curler, which atoned for a miss from the penalty spot, moments earlier.

Ironically, Tayport probably produced their best recent performance last Friday evening, only to suffer the heartache of a penalty shoot-out defeat. Lochee United went into the DJ Laing League Cup final as hot favourites, but it was Tayport who made a blistering start. Kevin Kelly netted after only 32 seconds, at Laing Park, and Ronnie Kenneth later doubled the lead.

Unfortunately, decisions seemed to go against the Canniepairt men throughout the match and two, in particular, would cost Tayport dear. Lochee were awarded a debatable free kick, well into stoppage time at the end of the half, and Craig Robertson, netted his second attempt. (The first, apparently, struck a hand in the Tayport wall, on the edge of the box).

Then, midway through the second half, the Bluebells were awarded a penalty, converted by Paul Blackwood, and yet more spot kick drama lay ahead. Agonisingly, Brian Craik, so often a hero for 'Port, was the fall-guy, his miss the only one of nine spot kicks taken, giving Lochee a 5-3 victory.


