

# TODAY'S GAME

## WHYTE & MACKAY SUPER LEAGUE TAYPORT v WHITBURN

Whitburn manager Derek Strickland was an interested spectator at Bonnyrigg last week and no doubt his game plan for the Super League's match of the day this afternoon will reflect his observations.

It's Whitburn's third season in the Super League and in their previous campaigns, they have lacked consistency after starting both campaigns well. With a 100pc record to date, the Central Park boss will be hoping it's third time lucky.

An opening day defeat, by the odd goal to Fauldhouse, effectively cost Whitburn League Cup qualification and, although they won the remainder of their section matches, so too did Fauldhouse to qualify for the last four. Today Whitburn look to maintain their record of scoring in every match played to date this season, rattling in an average of over three goals per game and chalking up an eighth successive victory.

No shortage of quality and experience in the visitors' likely line-up with the likes of Iain Ramage, John Murphy and Kenny Hannah as well as the internationalist Joe Mbu in central defence. Last season's top marksman Andy Roberts and top scorer for the previous two seasons, Colin Strickland, along with new signing and current top scorer Alex Lurinsky provide a potent goal threat.

Lurinsky and another new signing midfielder Scott Murphy were in the Fauldhouse United side which exited the East of Scotland Cup here earlier this year, so it's a quick return to Canniepairt for them.

Tayport were without four key players at Bonnyrigg last week, Roberto, Brian Livie and the injured duo of Chris Webster and Steve McAllister but, although the first three named will return to the squad, McAllister will sit out again through injury. Ronnie Kenneth was an unused substitute last week but his fitness has improved and he is set for a return as it's expected Gary Fraser will be recalled by Forfar Athletic. Missing will be Dean Rennie and probably Peter Flick.

There were a number of sound performances last week, so it will be interesting to see who make the management's starting XI.

The following article is taken from the Whitburn Juniors' Website and gives an interesting insight to life in the Juniors during the middle of the last century

## Memories of an ex Whitburn Juniors Committee Man

I received the following text in an email from Alexander Sibbald who was a Burnies' committee man in the early six-

I joined the Whitburn Committee in April 1959, the same day as Jimmy Ferguson. I was just short of 20 years of age. I left in October 1964. It was a wonderful experience. Three of us were elected, that day, Morris Everitt being the third. This brought the committee up to the full complement at the time of 21 members, which was a first.

Ronnie McGlinchey, Bobby Welsh, Jimmy Kerr, Wullie Johnstone and Tam Baillie of the 1966 committee, were also members during my tenure. I became Minute Secretary for a year or so. In those days the minutes were written by hand in a Minute Book, and were read out at the next weekly committee for adoption. The meetings were held on Sundays in the old tea rooms just at the main gate. These old minute books will contain a mine of information.

We spent ages at the weekly committee meeting debating the merits of the team and players for the previous game. Then believe it or not the whole committee of 21 picked the team for the next game. (The Trainer only trained the players in those days). It was quite farcical and was more so, because often we would have a meeting just before a game, whether home or away, to reselect the team due to last minute injuries of players etc. So there we were in public arguing the merits of last minute selections.

Some of us tried to get the system changed to selection by the trainer, but it never happened in my time, because Jimmy Brown the ex player, who was appointed in 1959 as trainer didn't want to take on the responsibility of team selection. I would imagine the system didn't change until Wullie Johnstone gave up the Secretary's job.

We used to run monthly late night dances in the Welfare Hall on the first Friday evening of the month until 3.00 am on the Saturday morning to raise funds. Calling into Wood's bakery on the way home to buy freshly baked stuff was marvellous. The bakery and shop was diagonally opposite Morrisons pub. One of the two brothers who owned the bakery, Jim, was Treasurer of the Burnie for many years until about 1957 when he moved down to Blackpool to run a guest house. In those days many people went on their annual two week holidays to Blackpool, either for the Edinburgh fortnight, or the Glasgow Fair fortnight, or the Bathgate Trades fortnight. There were many factories and pits in those days in the Whitburn\Armadale\ Bathgate triangle taking their holidays on one of these fortnights, dependent upon tradition and location.

Weekly bingo sessions were also run by committee members for fund raising in the Baillie Hall (now the District Council Offices.) Bobby Welsh, Jimmy Ferguson, Tam Baillie and Johnny Sneddon, another committee member at the time, ran these sessions for years. Johnny was quite a character. He worked in the grocery department of the old West Benhar Co-op just along from Woods bakery on the same side, and next door to the second pub in Whitburn, called the Old Market Inn. A Mr Roberts was the pub owner. Johnny was a mild man until match day when he stood at the pavilion and hurled abuse at the referee when he thought Whitburn were being hard done by.

We also got income from selling match raffle tickets, and of course transferring players to the seniors. A white form signing paid 200 pounds and a green form paid eighty pounds.

And occasionally Morrison's pub would buy a match ball for the club for the Scottish cup ties, without any public fanfare. The start of sponsorship.

We got 200 pounds in 1959 when the Rangers signed John Greig, one of their great players, in spite of the fact, he never kicked a ball for us, or entered Central Park . He had played for the juvenile team Edinburgh Athletic. Sid Bryson who ran this team had Whitburn connections and asked us if we would sign John on a white form, even although he was going straight to Ibrox, from Edinburgh Athletic, Signing this form made John Greig a registered junior player and ensured he could play junior football if he hadn't made it at Ibrox. At this time players couldn't be reinstated from seniors to juniors if they hadn't previously played, or signed white or green forms at junior level.

Rangers played fair by us by getting John to sign a white form rather than a green one, as they could have done. Of course John Greig went on to play very successfully at senior level for Rangers and Scotland. But he's in the record book as a

We played our players ten shillings (50 pence) for a win, and nothing for a draw or loss. Big matches like the Scottish Cup was big money. A pound was the fee for winning and ten shillings for a draw - nothing for losing. Players also got an annual signing on fee. From memory it was about twenty pounds.

I also remember that it was in the early 1960s when the club first discussed the possibility of setting up a social club. Committee member Gilbert French agreed to gather information on how to get it off the ground. Successful social clubs at the time were the Miners Welfare, the Bowling Club, and the Labour Club. There were two very large pits at either end of the town. Polkemmet Colliery at the west end, and the Lady at Redmill. And of course Whitburn was very much a Labour Party town then.

#### Other memories I have of the club are

The erection of the enclosure in 1946. It came from the old Polish army camp at Polkemmet Estate. One of the best things

The levelling of part of Central Park about 1957. At that time there was quite a hill running up to the enclosure at the Longridge Road end of the ground. It extended down the park to about the eighteen yards line at the same end.

In 1948 20 people or so flew to Aberdeen to a replayed Scottish cup tie against Aberdeen Balgownie. One of the organisers was Geordie Franchitti, who was an Italian immigrant to the town in the 1920s. He owned the West End Cafe next to the Miners Welfare Hall. Geordie is related to Dario Franchitti the current very successful Indy 300 car driver in the USA. Geordie used to walk down every morning to Bert Topping the barber for a shave. The barber's shop was next to Woods

## TAYPORT v WHITBURN The previous meetings

Prior to the introduction of the Super League, Tayport and Whitburn had met each other only once, a Scottish Cup quarter final tie on the Canniepairt in 1995.

892 spectators saw goals from Keith Jardine and Paul Taylor give the visitors their victory and a place in the semi final v Glanafton which they duly won before losing to Camelon in the final.

It was only one of two blemishes on Tayport's 53 game campaign record that season and ended a 36 game unbeaten run.

It was ten years before the sides would meet again, in August 2005, their first meeting in the Super League and, although it was only 3-2 for the Burnies, they played Tayport off the park that afternoon.



Alan Flanagan, Iain Ramage and Colin Strickland had the home side 3-0 ahead and cruising before Bryan Duell and Sean Christie grabbed late goals for Port before 278 at Central Park.


The return at Canniepairt was a goalless affair in April 06. To the 265 fans, Tayport looked to have blown their title chances by failing to secure vic-

tory, but as we all warmly recall, Whitburn beat Bathgate 2-0 in the last game of the season to leave Tayport as unlikely champions. Still a great feeling, though!

Last season it was 2-1 for Whithurn in both league encounters Strickland and Kenny Hannah/ Ronnie Kenneth at Whitburn (353)and Strickland and Andy Roberts/ Kenneth at Canniepairt (158).



The article below appears in the current edition of the Arngrove Northern League's quarterly publication *Northern Ventures Northern Gains* and we reproduce it here because the subject matter, the Reverend Frank Campbell, was assistant referee for our match at Bonnyrigg last Saturday. He certainly gets around, apparently he's on the line at a match in Middlesborough this afternoon.

The Council have just sold it for £7million to a Supermarket chain and penniless Ashington will later this year play their last ever game at what has been their home for 100yrs +.

## media watch

In the Fife Herald (21 Sept), Kevin Kelly got the headlines and a photo recognition of his two goals v Glenrothes, a feat that was to be repeated against Bonnyrigg seven days later. Manager Frank Conway thought his team had played well but was disappointed to concede two goals. The scribe reported that Reon Juskowiak 'demonstrated fabulous technique to unleash a screaming volley which thundered off the bar—so near a wonder goal—which would have been Tayport's fifth'.

Whilst the **Evening Telegraph** on Monday (24 Sept) didn't have too much to say on Tayport's win at Bonnyrigg, the **Edinburgh Evening News** had a couple of pages and three pics of the New Dundas Park clash. The newspaper understandably concentrated on Bonnyrigg's fourth successive defeat, noting that it was officially the club's worst start to a season since 1890 - 117 years ago!

Reporter Mark Bonthrone described Tayport as a 'physical, uncompromising side' but noted Linlithgow manager Jim Sinnet's astonishing declaration that it was the 'worst Tayport team he had seen in more than six years'. Said the reporter, however, the proof of the pudding is in the results and ......at the weekend they blew Bonnyrigg away in the opening 45 minutes and, but for some poor finishing, the tie could have been over as a contest by half-time'.

The **Midlothian Advertiser** (27 Sep) carried a lengthy report on last week's game. Describing Bonnyrigg, double cup holders and Super League runners-up last season, as an ailing side, 'Striker' reported that Rose eventually crumbled to a better team on the day. The report agreed that 'Referee Hogg had denied Tayport a penalty when Craig Meikle crashed Brian Craik in the box' and observed by the end that 'down 3-0 with 13 minutes to go it was damage limitation for Bonnyrigg who were well beaten over the 90 minutes'.

It was red faces on **The Courier** sports desk and quizzical expressions in the hoosies of Arbroath on Tuesday morning when a headline announced 'Arbroath Vics part company with Low' It was, of course, Arbroath SC, who had parted company with their manager but SC never got a mention. Jim Low had been at the helm at Seaton Park for ten years and, as secretary John Barron said, 'he had been more than just a manager over the past decade and everybody is truly grateful for the effort he has put in...'

Ahead of today's first round of the re-vamped Scottish Cup, the Sunday Herald (23 Sept) had an all too rare article featuring Junior football. Pointing out it was eleven years since the Juniors had first approached the SFA requesting that the Juniors get a few places at the top table, the article made reference to the fact that 'former Tayport boss Dave Baikie had made a successful re-emergence from the junior game at East Fife'.

Linlithgow boss Jim Sinnet was interviewed as was Rose striker Brian Carrigan. 18 trophies in six years at Linlithgow were attributed to Sinnet, so arithmetic is clearly not Jim's or the reporter's strong point. 'Come Saturday, said the article, the junior clubs will be out to teach the rest of Scottish football a lesson'. Let's hope so.


