

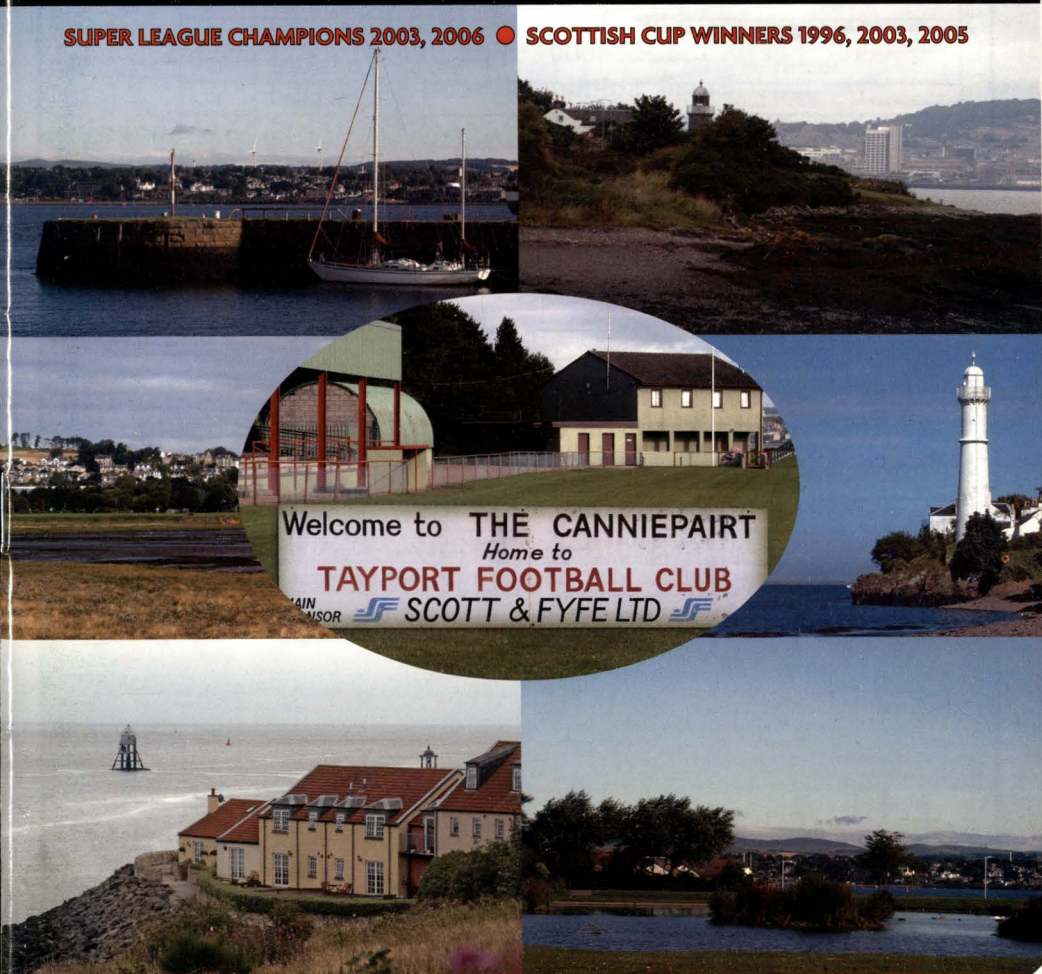

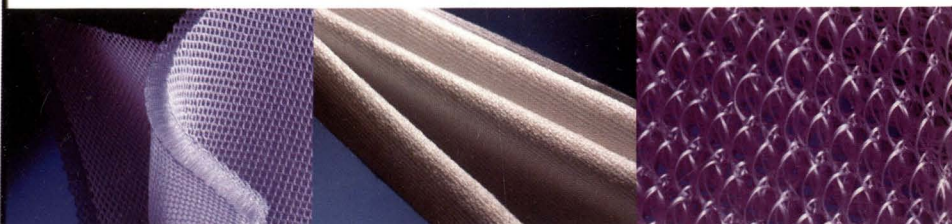

# TODAY'S GAME

**TAYPORT v LOCHEE UNITED**



At the end of September, prior to our last league game on the Canniepairt v Whitburn, an autumn meeting with Lochee United looked likely to have the mouthwatering appeal of a top of the table clash. Although it's still top v third, Tayport's disappointing form since has seen a gap of eight points open up between ourselves and the Dundee club.

After a scintillating start to our league campaign, we seemed to adopt an ultra cautious approach to the Whitburn game, which was lost by the only goal, and the games since have been reminiscent of many of those uninspired affairs which have peppered so much of the last couple of seasons.

As against Whitburn, failure to effectively defend dead ball kicks cost us the goals and points at Bathgate and Kelty. The absence of key players hasn't helped the situation and, although things are improving on the injury front, we'll still be without Rennie and Webster for many weeks yet. Derek Wemyss is not far away from a return and Steve McAllister is back in training.

Lochee, by contrast, have been surging ahead at the top of the table, a home draw with Bathgate the only blip on their screen. Goals in every Super League game to date, shared among six players, our former striker Gary Middleton doing most damage bagging seven of the twenty three scored.

Lochee have been made to work hard in winning their last three away fixtures, each by a 2-1 margin and will be anxious to keep up that run today against their Super League derby opponents.

Tayport may not have been collecting the points but have been creating chances and maybe this afternoon some of those chances won't be missed. We'll see...

Today marks a half century of Tayport v Lochee United

The teams first met in competitive action in 1990 and this afternoon will be the 50th meeting of the two clubs.

Some stats.....

There's only been one season when the sides haven't met - 1993/94 when Lochee were in the Tayside Division Two.

28 of the meetings have been league games, 6 of which have been in the Super League

Tayport have won 20 of the leagues meetings, Lochee have won 5.

The teams have met in 6 Cup Finals, including the Scottish Cup Final. So far it's Tayport 4 Lochee 2.

From 1991 to 1997, Lochee went 14 games between the sides without a win.

Lochee have won four of the last five meetings.

Never, in the 49 games up to this afternoon, has the game finished goalless.

Tayport have scored 123 goals whilst Lochee have found the Tayport net on 52 occasions.

Lochee have failed to score in 18 of the 49 games

In 49 games, Tayport have failed to find the Lochee net on three occasions.

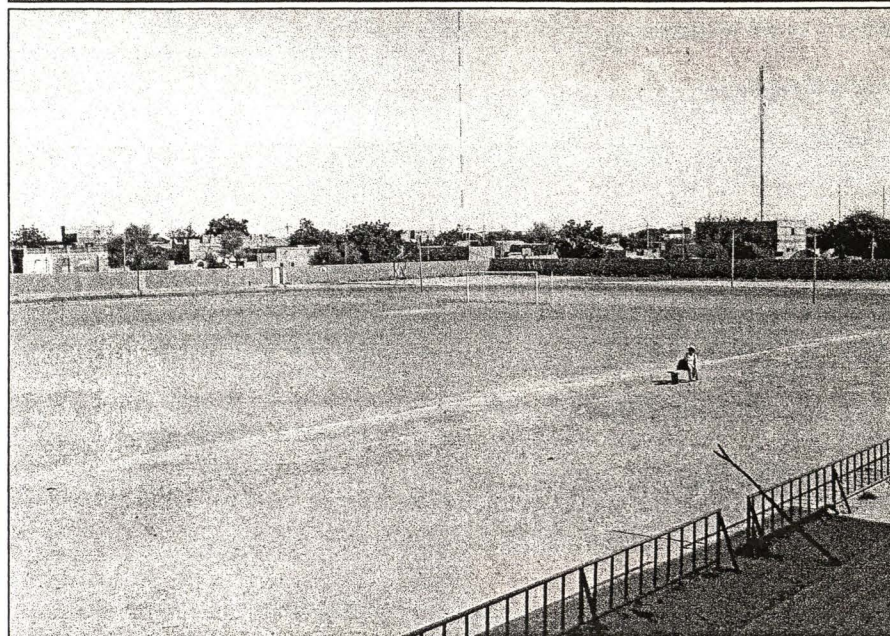
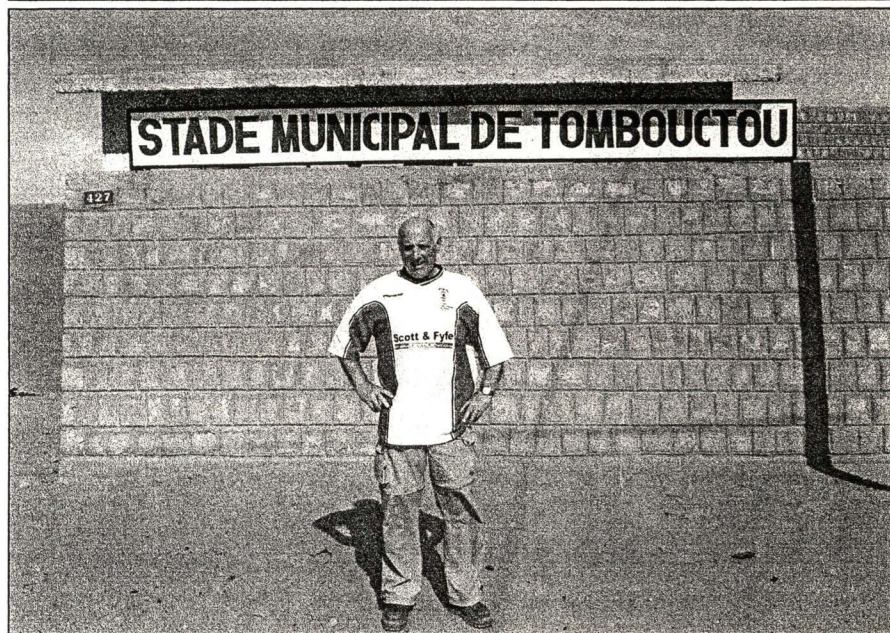
Lochee's biggest winning margin is 3 - 1, a feat the Thomson Park club have achieved on three occasions.

Tayport have beaten their opponents by 8-2, 7-1 and the biggest margin, 9-1, in 2001

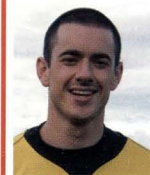

## "EARLY SEASON FORM NEEDS TO BE REPRODUCED TODAY"

says



Welcome back to the Canniepairt. It has been a full six weeks since the last home fixtures, a visit from Whitburn, on Super League duty. Both clubs went into that match with 100% records and it was the visitors who notched what has become their customary win over Tayport, courtesy of Ian Ramage's touch to a low piledriver of a free kick. Remarkably, in six meetings, a goalless draw, a couple of years ago, remains 'Port's best result against the 'Burn.

More of a blow came the following week, when hosts Kelty inflicted another defeat. On the balance of play, Tayport should have recorded at least a share of the points, but an equaliser from Ronnie Kenneth was not built upon and the 'Port support were taken aback to see Murray McDowell net Kelty's winner. We probably shouldn't have been surprised, as a host of former strikers have scored against the club in recent years; Ben Honeyman, Gary Middleton, Ralph Hunter, Davie Evans and even Birdie himself spring to mind.

Anyway, moving on to Creamery Park, where 'Port came ever so close to collecting all three points. Gary Fraser was given the credit for knocking in a breakthrough goal, with around twenty minutes remaining. A late, late leveller from Chris McFadyen, however, thwarted Tayport's hopes.

Surely the Canniepairt outfit were due a win at Oakley. Despite all the pressing, goals were looking unlikely, until Oakley snatched what they must have thought was the winner, two minutes from time, through Lee Cellentano. Overcoming the shock, 'Port went back on the offensive and Ross Gunnion equalised and, in truth, Tayport could have won it at the death. Ronnie Kenneth had a goal disallowed and there were other chances.

Victory was proving elusive. With the Citylink Scottish Junior Cup was on the agenda last weekend, though, a win was duly recorded. The opposition, West Calder United, put an awful lot into the game, yet Tayport's margin of victory should have been more comfortable. It took almost exactly 45 minutes for Brian Craik to open the scoring, but, after an encouraging start to the second half, Cauther were allowed to draw level on 52 minutes. Thankfully, Gary Fraser won a penalty, converted by Brian Craik and 'Port's place in the third round was effectively sealed when West Calder had two men red-carded in a few mad minutes, both for second cautions.

Hopefully, Tayport can now begin reproduce their early season form and, if Lochee United are to be vanquished this afternoon, Frank Conway's troops really must hit top gear.

## media watch



The **Fife Herald** (19 Oct) thought Bathgate stole a point from Tayport with their last minute equaliser when the sides met at Creamery Park in the Super League. The travelling fans, though, were entertained by their side carving out numerous chances.

Tayport's failure to win in four league outings had the headline in the **Herald** (2 Nov) following their 1-1 draw at Oakley and although the reporter thought a victory probably should have been registered, the report acknowledged that Tayport had come perilously close to suffering defeat.

A preview of the West Calder Cup tie in the same edition recognised that injuries would affect the team selection, the loss of Dean Rennie with a broken leg, being a particularly cruel blow, given he had started the Oakley game so brightly operating up front alongside Brian Craik.

The **Evening Telegraph** (5 Nov) had an Allan Kinnersley photo from Tayport's tie at West Calder which showed Birdie getting the all-important opening goal. The **Tele** pointed out there had been a number of outstanding results for local teams in the Scottish Cup. Carnoustie manager Ian Flaherty had to make do without eight regulars, but his patched-up side did him proud, beating West Super League leaders Beith by 2-1 at Laing Park. Best performance of the season, Flaherty reckoned.

Man of many clubs, Paul Ritchie, got the kudos for Lochee's win at Steelend by netting four of his side's seven goals.

The national press plus **Sky** and the **BBC** who normally pay scant attention to Junior football, have been forced to sit up and note the progress of the Junior clubs in the 'big' Scottish Cup. **Sky** even had footage of Pollok v Montrose on their Saturday night football updates.

The **Edinburgh Evening News** had comprehensive coverage of most ties in their area but reserved the main spotlight for Linlithgow v Irvine Meadow. Manager Jim Sinnet, recovering from a hernia operation, took a seat in the stand rather than the dugout, but that vantage point was to last only 27 minutes. According to the **News**, Sinnett stormed down to the pitchside after his team went two goals behind.

The **News** reporter described the action as "as good a game of Junior football you are likely to see all season" and Linlithgow as "the best Junior team in the country at the moment" [Lochee might not quite agree with that assessment, given their win at Prestonfield the other week]

A photo of the high flying Birdie dominated the back page of this week's **Fife Herald** (Nov 9). Another excellent image taken by Allan Kinnersley captured the two goal striker in action at West Calder last week.

# FROM THE ARCHIVES

Not from the Tayport archives this week, but an excerpt from a rare Lochee United programme. The season was 1995/96 and the occasion was a PA Cup tie at Thomson Park in February between Port and a Lochee United side on the back of five successive victories since the turn of the year under the stewardship of new manager Charlie Wilson from Lochgelly Albert.

That run was to come to an abrupt end with Tayport running the home side ragged to record an 8-2 win. A memorable occasion for Grant Paterson. He notched two of the goals!
