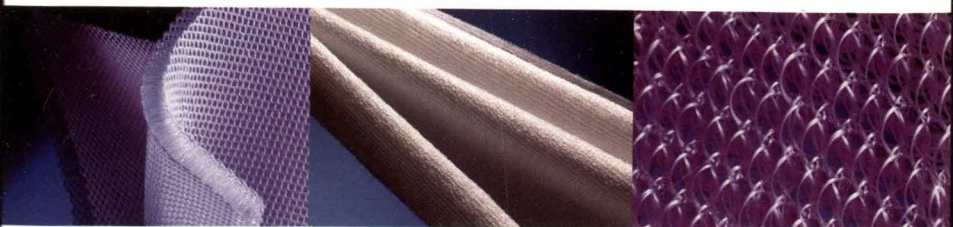

TAYPORT v HILL OF BEATH

Today is the meeting of two teams who have, by their own expectations and aspirations, underperformed so far this season. Both teams invested heavily in playing resources during the close season yet both teams have yet to find the consistency to mount a serious title challenge.

Haws' squad includes close season signings Roger Duffin (Oakley), Fraser Arnot (Rosyth) Steven Bathgate (Kelty), Chris Burt (Lochore) and Craig Noble (Glenrothes). Haws also acquired John Knox from St Andrews but the fiery ex-Tayport midfielder is on the transfer list.

The loss of the ever present Tom Courts to Kelty last week, was a blow to boss Jock Finlayson's plans and he will be looking to fill the gap, probably by bringing in one or two loan signings from the Seniors. Jock has already secured the signing of youngster Scott Bisset from East Fife but he is unlikely to be available this afternoon.

Like their opponents today, Haws have found goals hard to come by in recent games and top scorer to date is midfielder Fraser Beveridge, one of whose tally of nine was against us in Haws' 2-1 defeat earlier in the season.

With the league programme now approaching the halfway stage, the result of today's game will either be the springboard for a top three finish for the winners or will plunge the losers into a winter of discontent which will have the spectre of relegation hovering.

Tayport will count themselves unfortunate to lose last week, given the fact that both goals were cheaply conceded, but this has been the case so often in recent months and has put too great a pressure on an ineffectual attack to claw back the goals. Maybe last week's disappointing result will act as a wake up call. Time will tell.

Steven McAllister could be back today and there could be a starting place for Barry McNaughton who still tops the list of Tayport's all-time Super League scorers, a tally which includes a hat trick against this afternoon's visitors. Derek Wemyss, although he has managed some training, is likely to be missing again.

Last Saturday's *Courier* (10 Nov) in its preview of the Tayport v Lochee game indicated a 'cracker' was on the cards. Frank Conway "believes his side would have to be at their best" while an identical quote was attributed to his opposite number - boss Ray McKinnon who "believes they will need to be at their best" McKinnon added "This is the big game on Tayside these days, and whoever wants it most will win"

Monday's feedback in *The Courier* quoted the Lochee boss as saying "It was a very professional performance in which the concentration levels of the players and the work ethos was very high and I simply couldn't fault them" The Tayport manager "was happy enough with our performance because we matched them, but they were more streetwise than us"

The *Fife Herald* (16 Nov) report on Tayport v Lochee reflected the disappointment felt by most 'Port fans. The paper noted that United bossed the game and Tayport were punished for mistakes whilst on the one occasion visiting keeper Ross was troubled, he was equal to Brian Craik's volley and was never again troubled during the match. Frank Conway in his post match interview was "understandably a little deflated by the outcome", pointing out that "their [Lochee] defenders don't try to play football, they defend while we made too many individual errors and on top of that we didn't get enough from our midfield players"

The back page of the *Fife Herald* (Nov 16) was lit up with a colourful action shot from the Lochee game, courtesy of Alan Kinnersley. The headline pointed out this afternoon Tayport would be bidding for their first win in six league encounters. The match preview thought there was a "danger of the side slipping back into the type of mundane form which marred last season"

With the Keir's Parkers having won three and lost five of their Super League games to date, the reporter thought "it would be no great surprise if Saturday's match gives them their first draw of the current campaign"

Not surprisingly The *Edinburgh Evening News* (16 Nov) provided a six hundred word preview on this afternoon's top of the table clash between Lochee and Whitburn at Thomson Park. Eight league games played and only one goal conceded - a penalty kick but keeper Stuart Walker modestly put that down to the quality of the players in front of him. The keeper also acknowledged that a new goalie coach at Central Park had helped his concentration. Manager Derek Strickland wasn't getting carried away with his team's form. "It's how you play in the second half of the season that counts", said the former Rangers and Hearts forward.

Unfortunately for those who might be travelling up from the capital for the game, the reporter listed the kick off as 2pm

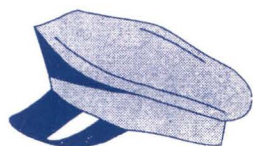

FROM THE CLUB'S ARCHIVES NOVEMBER 16 1968

Thirty nine years ago, on Saturday 16th November 1968, **Tayport's 1st XI** was playing a Fife Cup tie at Beveridge Park, Kirkcaldy against **ARGOS UNITED**. It was a first post war Fife Cup tie for Tayport and they returned north in happy mood following a 3-0 win. Doug Henderson and George Ritchie, Tayport's scorers that day, incidentally, were both spectators at The Canniepairt last Saturday v Lochee United. The score was an own goal.

'Port's line-up was Derek White, Walter Kemp, Jim Mathers, Ron Laing, Jim Scott, Richard Redpath, Abby Oswald, George Ritchie, Ian White, Andy Johnstone, Doug Henderson. Stan Cowe was substitute (only one sub allowed in those days). Four of the team are still Tayport residents.

The **Reserves** were also away from home, playing an Alliance League match against **DUNDEE YMCA** at Clive Road, Dundee, one of the football grounds in the city now given over to housing.

It was also a good day for the stiffys who recorded a 3-2 win. The line-up was Dick Pearce in goal, Ian Mathers, Jim Foulis, Ronnie Redpath, Andy Horan, Derek McRobbie, Dennis Auld, Raymond White, Ian Mackie, George Bryson and Alan Brown. Sub was Jimmy Wighton. Goalscorers were Auld, Bryson and Mackie. Almost 40 years on, six of that team still reside in Tayport.

In the Juniors it was to be **Cambuslang Rangers'** year for the Scottish Junior Cup, the now defunct **Frances Colliery** were to lift the Fife Cup, the only silverware the Colliery would ever win, while **Thornton Hibs** were on their way to the Fife League Championship.

It was to be the last season before Dundee, Angus and Perthshire amalgamated to become Tayside. **Lochee Utd** won the last Dundee Juniors' title, their first in the 73 year history of the competition. **Osborne** won the Courier Cup, **Harp**, the Telegraph Cup, **Downfield** the Currie Cup and **North End** lifted the Kiddie Cup.

In the Senior game in 1968 **Raith Rovers** and **Arbroath** were in the top division. **St Johnstone** attracted a crowd of 16,000 to Muirton Park to see **Rangers** lose 2-0 to two goals from Kenny Aird and 35,000 squeezed into Tynecastle to see **Hearts** play **Celtic**. A young Archie Knox was in the **Forfar Athletic** team which defeated **Stenhousemuir** by 9-1 before an attendance of 986. Lucky to get 9 goals in a season now!

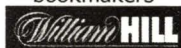

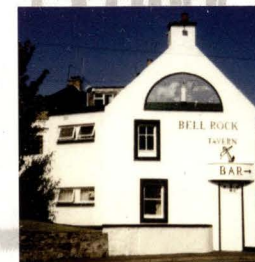
