

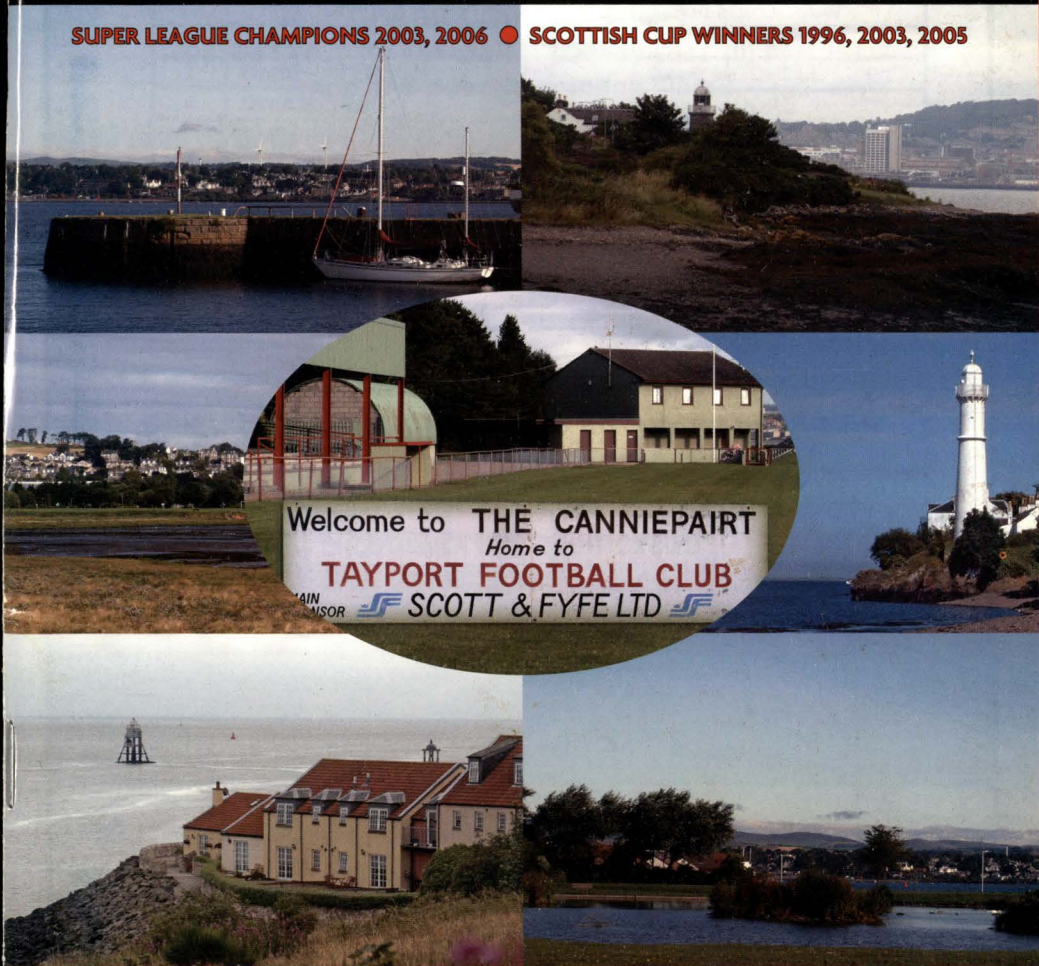

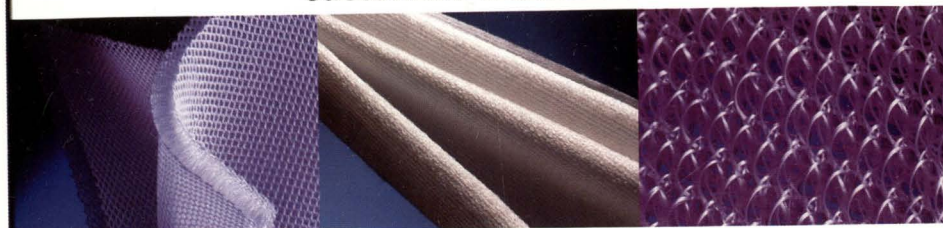

TODAY'S GAME

EAST of SCOTLAND CUP TAYPORT v WEST CALDER UNITED

Having gone seventeen years without crossing swords with West Calder, we now find ourselves playing each other twice in the space of six weeks in the Junior game's two most prestigious cup competitions.

Tayport edged the Scottish Cup meeting earlier this season, winning 2-1 at Burngrange Park thanks to two goals from top scorer Brian Craik. Tayport had the upper hand during the first half but once Dave Reid had levelled for West Calder against the run of play in the second half, it became anybody's game until Birdie's second, from the penalty spot, killed off the locals' resistance.

Despite playing at the East Region's third level, West Calder's mix of talented and enthusiastic young blood and experienced juniors showed enough in the Scottish tie to indicate that they cannot be taken lightly. Already this season West Calder upset the form book by going to Perth and holding Kinnoull to a 2-2 draw in the Scottish. To demonstrate this was no fluke, United finished off their opponents in the replay, albeit on penalty kicks.

Tayport showed some good form last week against Carnoustie, treating the fans to more goals in 45 minutes than they had seen from their favourites in their three previous games on the Canniepairt. Consistency, however, is what the supporters will be looking for today—and an end to the loss of cheaply conceded goals which littered the three games v Carnoustie.

Derek Wemyss made a surprise, yet welcome, return last week but there seems to be little prospect of Webster, McAllister and Rennie returning in the near future. Kevin Kelly, taken off last Saturday, looks unlikely to be fit for today. Brian Livie and Reon Juskowiak, neither of whom have started the past two games, could be on from the start and Peter Flick could get an opportunity between the sticks.

This afternoon's game will be decided over 90 minutes with penalty kicks used to settle matters if the game ends all square. We welcome Ms Lorraine Clark as the lady in the middle, taking charge of a game on the Canniepairt for the first time.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS WEST CALDER UNITED

We welcome West Calder to the Canniepairt for the first time, for this East of Scotland Cup first round tie.

The West Lothian village of West Calder, which is situated on the Edinburgh to Glasgow railway 4 miles west of Livingston, has, in common with many of the communities in the Lothians, a mining history. In the 19th century and early part of the 20th century West Calder was the main centre in Scotland for the oil shale economy. Indeed, at one time, Young's Addiewell Oil Plant was the principal plant in Scotland for the manufacture of paraffin.

The club's ground, Burngrange Park, shares the name with the Colliery which was the scene of a mine disaster in 1947 when 15 miners lost their lives.

It was three years later that West Calder United was formed and it's fair to say that a West Calder fan of less than pension age will be hard pushed to recall the West Lothian club's last silverware success. Records suggest that 1957-1959 was the most productive period in the club's history with a Brown Cup success and two successes each in the now forgotten Murray Cup and Thornton Shield. Since then, however, very little to write home about.

Things could be changing, however, as the club has just received the go ahead for the relocation of their ground from Burngrange Park a short distance to the east end of the village where a new facility will be constructed. It should be the start of an exciting new era for the club.

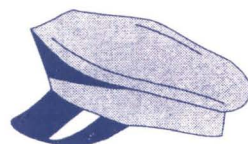

THE EAST OF SCOTLAND CUP

The East of Scotland Cup, currently sponsored by John Walker, is one of the country's oldest football competitions, first contested in the 19th century. Winners in the inaugural year of 1896/97 were Broxburn Athletic, a club still on the go today. Many of the former winners of the competition, which carried on and was played for, regardless of two World Wars, are now defunct.

Some of those with their name on the trophy but long since gone are the likes of Leith Ivanhoe, Niddrie Bluebell, Loanhead Mayflower, Denbeath Star and Portobello Thistle.

In terms of winning the competition, Linlithgow Rose are out in front with thirteen wins, closely followed by Newtongrange Star with 12 successes.

It's a competition in which neither of this afternoon's Canniepairt combatants have done well. Since entering the competition when it first embraced the former Tayside and Fife Region clubs in 2005, Tayport's progress has been limited to the last sixteen stage, when they went down to eventual finalists Rosyth in last season's competition. Prior to then it had been an ignominious 1-0 home defeat by the now defunct Elmwood at the first hurdle, and the loss of two goals in the dying minutes to draw 3-3 with Hill of Beath before losing a penalty shoot out in 2006, again at the first hurdle. West Calder will take heart from the fact that the three exits to date have all been at home.

If West Calder's record is anything to go by they will need to take heart from somewhere. The past nine seasons has seen them record a solitary win, 2-1 at home to Dalkeith in the 2002/2003 competition.

Holders Bathgate Thistle are unlikely to see their progress halted at home to Crossgates Primrose. Indeed, it's almost as if the competition has been seeded with all the Super League teams facing sides from lower divisions.

If there is to be a shock, then it could be at Strathmore Park, Forfar where West End await a visit from Camelon. West End have been going like a bomb this season and are currently in pole position for a step up to the Super League. Camelon, however, are the form team in the Super League with five wins on the bounce.

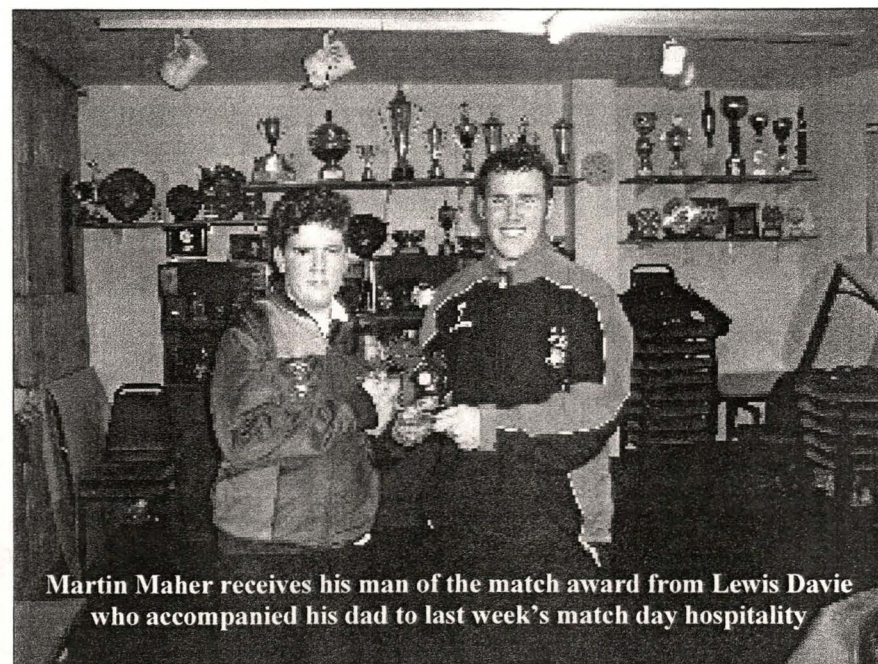

One of the Tayport landmarks of the second half of the 20th Century has disappeared. Just like Lucky Scaup and the church spire before it, the 'windbreak', which dominated the East Common for over 50 years, is no more. Constructed of the demolition material from the great Scott & Fyfe fire of c.1956, the man-made mound was grassed over and provided a barrier between the Common and first the camping site and then the caravan site. The thousands of tons of material has been spirited away to allow more accommodation for residential caravans.

Former Tayport striker and 2005 Scottish Cup final hero Robbie Henderson hit his first hat-trick for Cove Rangers last week in the Aberdeen club's Highland League 4-1 win at Brora Rangers. Another Perth based ex-Tayport Robbie, Robbie Holden, whose last game was the dramatic winner v Violet in the 2003 Challenge Cup final, is also amongst the goals these days, scoring with great regularity for Kinnoull.

Rosyth, who were unable to field a team v Newtongrange in a Premier League game last month, have been hit by the East Region FA beaks to the tune of a £500 fine and the loss of the points.

It is understood Camelon agreed a five figure sum as an out of court settlement with their former team manager, who had claimed unfair dismissal last season.

Seems like the Hamishmackay Tayport supporters' club is alive and well and living in Glasgow. A Tayport exile with nom de plume of 'Port's legendary striker was very quickly on the club's website forum after the draw, confessing he was in a quandary, having become something of a Pollok fan since a move to Glasgow some years ago. A wee hint as to who he will be favouring on the 19th comes in his confession that he wears his Tayport shirt under his coat when at Newlandsfield.

The draw for the 4th round of the Scottish Cup had the **internet** buzzing on Wednesday morning (not Tuesday as originally intimated). A film of the actual draw being made was on the internet on the **Evening Times** website.

The **Times** reported that 'Pollok had landed the plum draw being paired with three times trophy winners Tayport.' The Pollok manager Rab Sneddon said 'Tayport have a long standing cup tradition like ourselves and will be very difficult opponents' He added 'It is yet another away tie and I feel for our fans because of the added expense they have to incur. But they will head for Tayside in numbers'.

'Fitba fa' on the **Juniors Yahoo** site reckoned 'the tie of the round is obviously Tayport v Pollok and is a mouthwatering prospect...' **The Evening Telegraph's** red & white headline was 'Tayport handed plum Scottish tie'. **The Courier** described it as 'Tayport's plum tie' and said 'the visit of the reigning West Super Champions is undoubtedly the tie of the round and one that should attract a bumper gate'. Tayport's Frank Conway stated ' The main thing is we are at home. It will be a great occasion and a real test for all the new boys in the team....'

The Sunday Mail had a photographer and reporter at the Canniepairt on Saturday for the Carnoustie replay but nothing appeared in the next day's edition following a mix up at the Press Association offices in Leeds, would you believe. There was pretty extensive coverage in the **Daily Record** on Monday, however, illustrated by a photo of Martin Maher celebrating his first goal for the club.

The Evening Telegraph on Monday had very good coverage of the replay with a tremendous colour pic stretched across the width of the page. The pic showed Brian Craik's majestic header on the stroke of half time which brought Tayport level for a second time. Another action shot caught Kevin Kelly firing in a cross with an attentive crowd in the enclosure as a backdrop.

The **Edinburgh Evening News'** main report on Monday was of Whitburn's home league defeat by Kelty Hearts.. The **News** pointed out it was an afternoon of firsts for the home club, their first defeat and their first goals lost in open play, their only previous goal against being a penalty.. A disappointing crowd of 150 caused the reporter to question why more fans don't come out to back a club which is 'putting in a serious and credible title challenge'. It was 'Port player of last season Murray McDowell who was instrumental in Whitburn's downfall, his play setting up both Kelty goals in a 2-1 win. Burnies' manager Derek Strickland said he'd try to bring in players after Christmas but 'the problem is that the players that are available are at over inflated prices and we are just not willing to pay that.'

Another ex-Tayport player was in the **News** report on the Linlithgow 3-1 defeat at Glenrothes, Graham Nicoll firing the final nail in the Rose coffin at the Warout.

Two second half goals in Bathgate's 2-0 Super League win over Bonnyrigg, Manager Willie Hill reckoned, was down to a change of tactics at half-time after his side had lost the middle of the park during the first period.

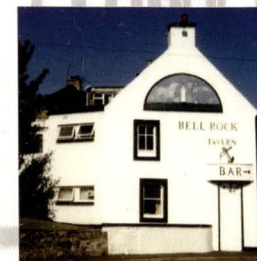
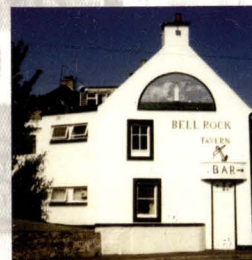
