

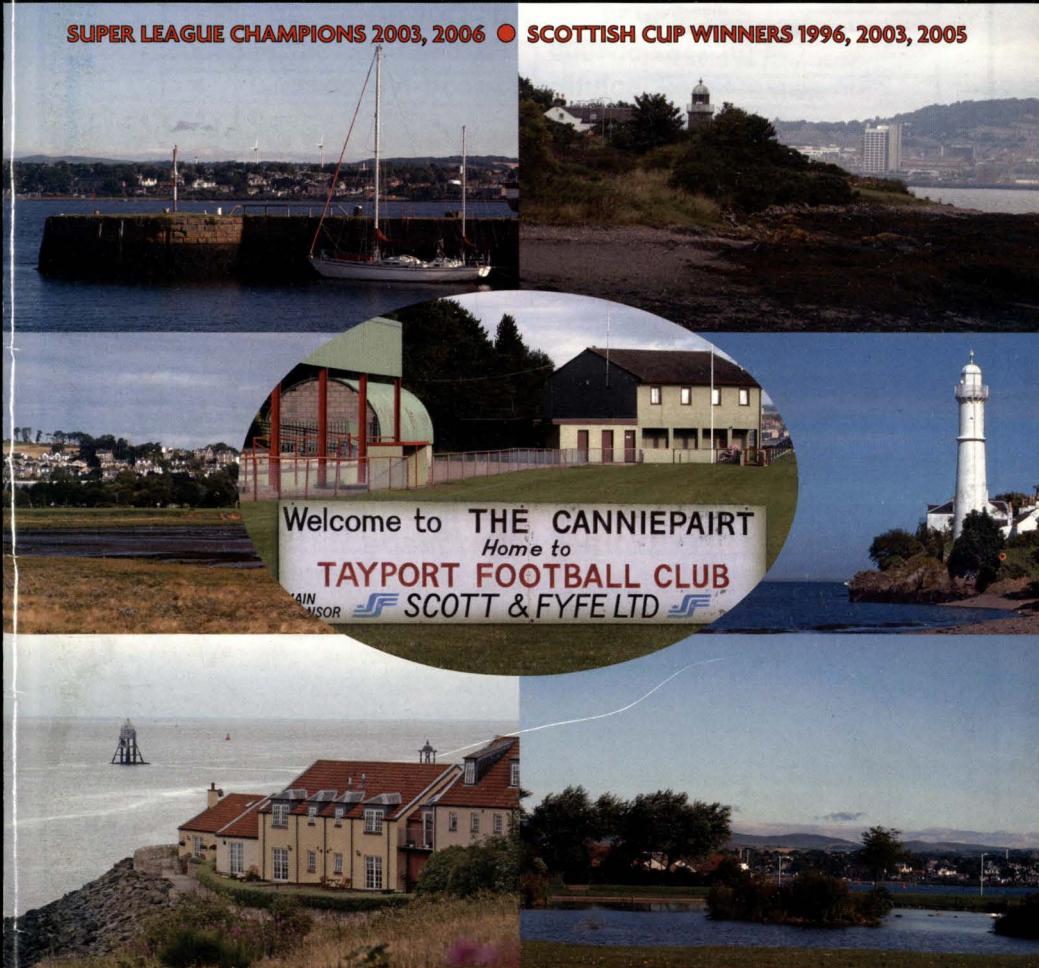

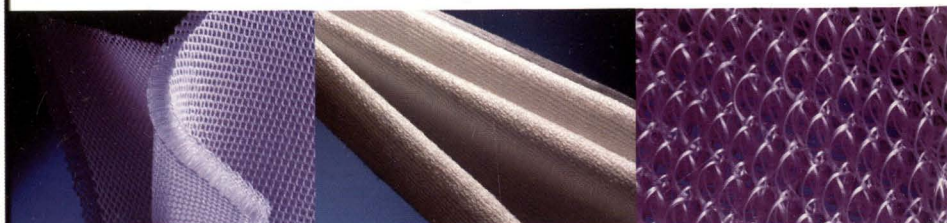

SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP

4th ROUND

TAYPORT v POLLOK

Today will be the seventh Scottish Cup meeting between Tayport and Pollok. The clubs first locked horns in 1990/91, Tayport's first season in the Junior grade. Pollok won that one 4-1, before a crowd of 1,200 on the Canniepairt.

Port had to wait six years for another opportunity to cross swords with the Glasgow club, but there was again disappointment for the Fifers, who went down 1-3 at Fir Park, Motherwell in the 1997 final in front of 3,523.

A year later 1,662 gathered to watch a cracking 6th round tie at Tayport end 3-3. The replay was devoid of goals, even after extra time and will be best remembered for the penalty shoot-out and Grant Miller's penalty kick which flew out of the ground instead of into the net and Tayport were out. 2,104 watched that one.

On to 2002 and a fourth round tie, this time at Newlandsfield where 1,001 again saw the tie end in deadlock, 0-0, but Tayport were fairly comfortable winners in the replay on Canniepairt exactly six years ago to the day, where goals from Barry McNaughton and Ronnie Kenneth put 'Port on the way to the semi-final.

Justifiably, tagged as the game of the day, Tayport await a Pollok team who last conceded a goal away from home way back in October at Links Park, Montrose in the Scottish (Senior) Cup 2-2 draw. The most recent of the cleans sheets was at Kilsyth on 29 December when hapless Kilsyth Rangers were trounced by 9-0 in a league game which keeps Pollok in good position to retain their Super League title and in so doing, get another crack at the other Scottish Cup.

Since then Pollok have had league games v Glenafton and Petershill postponed while Tayport's game at Glenrothes was off last week. Both managements have, nevertheless, had an opportunity to see their opponents in action since the draw was known.

Although Bryan Dingwall and Robert Downs are the recognised Pollok strike force, the super sub Alan Waddell staked his claim for a starting jersey with a hat-trick in half an hour after coming off the bench v Kilsyth.

Tayport will have to tighten up at the back if they are not to be punished in the fashion they have been in recent games. Brian Craik was injured at against Camelon but a bonus was the return to action of Chris Webster and Steve McAllister, both of whom have been out since the start of the season. Martin Maher, who has missed the last two games, and Kevin Kelly, who has missed the last three, will both be pressing for a return.

Referee today is Mr Neil Watters from Montrose

Summer Football's coming....or is it?

Playing summer football is an issue which is trotted out each time we have a spell of sub zero temperatures which cause widespread postponements. This month has been no exception. The lobby for change becomes more vociferous the longer a cold snap lasts. Of course, when the AGM comes round, it's all forgotten. So, the answer, then, for those advocates of summer football, might be to hold the AGM in January!

Seriously, though, whether you are in favour or agin the idea, we have learned that secret discussions have been taking place to produce a consultation paper which would recommend adopting the biggest change the Junior game has known - an eight week winter break and playing through part of June and the entire months of July and August.

It is understood the proposal will allow for two years' notice to get clubs used to the idea of a season starting in July, running to the second week of December and starting up again in the second week of February. Apparently, because of postponements the average numbers of games actually played during that period is fairly insignificant.

The change raises many questions but those drawing up the proposals seem to have looked at everything. Just some of the many radical proposals.....

- The season will continue into June, mainly for successful clubs.
- A two week compulsory break from mid June to start of July
- All regions will start with a short sharp league cup to allow teams to 'warm up'
- Scottish Junior Cup will start in late August and there will be four rounds before the winter break
- No permits will be issued for games during the winter break except for clubs who may still be playing in the Senior Scottish Cup
- No allowances will be made during the season for 'holiday weekend' breaks
- The use of floodlights will be encouraged with the Scottish Government expected to make substantial grants available for this purpose.
- Although Regions will remain, the structure of competitions will be brought into line and consistent across the country.

The consultation document goes on to suggest the clash with traditional summer sports such as bowling, cricket and golf will have little or no impact on the change. The worn condition of pitches etc has also been addressed and it considers that non playing during the winter break period will mean less damage to pitches. The opinion is that the availability of better seeds and fertilisers and the ready availability of 'off the shelf' turf plus the increasing use of artificial pitches will address the worn pitch issue. It recognises also that traditional holiday fortnights are a thing of the past with an increasing number of people now taking holidays throughout the year.

The document goes on to say that it's expected such a major change will have the effect of revitalising the game, with the idea it will encourage new sponsorship and attract more spectators, thus providing revenue to plough back into the Junior game.

We await announcements with interest.....

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS POLLOK F.C.

Pollok, founded in 1908, have been a major force in the game over the years and particularly so since they won their first Scottish Cup in 1981. They have consistently attracted some of the biggest attendances in the Junior game to their tidy Newlandsfield ground.

The social club adjacent to the ground is always a popular attraction to travelling supporters, as Port supporters will testify, especially when we played in the Pollok Sevens Tournament during the 1990s. Pollok have around 30 committee members and an infrastructure which is the envy of some Senior clubs, never mind Junior clubs.

Responsible for maintaining Pollok's success on the park is the experienced Rab Sneddon who had an impressive track record in Junior management with Blantyre Vics, Shotts Bon Accord, Bellshill, Larkhall and Maryhill before replacing Ronnie Lowrie at Newlandsfield. Assisting Rab is Harry Erwin who played around 400 games for Motherwell, Airdrie, Stenhousemuir, Alloa and East Stirlinghire before moving into the Juniors, where among his other appointments was assistant to Jim Sinnet at Linlithgow for a spell.

Apart from Mark McWilliams, now Pollok coach, only defender Stevie Aitchison remains from the team which played at Tayport in the last Scottish Cup meeting of the sides. If he plays today it will be the Pollok skipper's 250th appearance for the club.

Striker Robert Downs, with 45 goals in 123 appearances, is the leading marksman on the club's books. Robert was a Dave Baikie signing for Cowdenbeath from Arthurlie in 2005, scoring three goals in 11 games before being injured and returning to Dunterlie.

The festive period has come and gone and Tayport return to action on the Canniepairt after more than a month of away fixtures and postponements, with what promises to be a high-intensity Scottish Cup tie.

Since their first meeting back in 1991, not only have Tayport and Pollok become regular adversaries, between them, the clubs have gone on to chalk up eight appearances in the final of the "Scottish." That 'Port would account for six of these would have been beyond the expectations of anyone in attendance at the rain-soaked Canniepairt nearly seventeen years ago.

Of course, the highest profile encounter between the two teams was the 1997 final, won by the Newlandsfield outfit, and, before Tayport joined the junior ranks, 'Lok had twice landed the holy grail of junior football, both triumphs coming in the 1980s. So, today sees a clash of two three-time winners of the Scottish Junior Cup, surely a recipe for drama.

There was certainly drama aplenty at Carmuir Park, a fortnight ago, when Camelon kept on taking the lead and 'Port kept on equalising, until six goals were shared. Brian Craik injured himself in cancelling out Graeme McLaren's opener, Ronnie Kenneth provided a swift response to Camelon's next goal, just after the break, then, in the final minute, Jim Lister and super-sub Steven McAllister traded late counters. As a result, it was one Super League point each, probably a fair outcome.

The last match of 2007 had been the Redwood Leisure tie at Lochgelly. Ronnie Kenneth opened the scoring, Chris Webster came off the bench to give 'Port a two-goal cushion, albeit later than expected, and Reon Juskowiak rounded off the scoring. The latter deserved his goal, as his had been the most legitimate-looking of three which had been disallowed. A rare clean-sheet was another plus from a straightforward enough win.

The East of Scotland Cup tie, back in mid-December, should also have been fairly comprehensive, but West Calder were gifted a couple of goals. Thankfully, Juskowiak and Kenneth, with a brace, were on the scoresheet as 'Port won by the odd goal in five.

That means three goals in each of the last three games. It would be nice for that pattern to continue this afternoon, but that does seem unlikely.

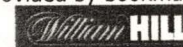

Junior clubs hammered after pitch free-for-all

DALKEITH THISTLE and Harthill Royals were both hammered with huge fines after a free-for-all involving players, supporters and committee members saw their game abandoned before half-time. The fines were handed out by the East Region Scottish Junior FA as a result of the match, played on November 24, being called off by the referee after just 40 minutes.

In a special meeting at Oakley United's ground both clubs were asked to explain their part in the fracas and officials decided Dalkeith assistant manager Paddy Dolan should take the brunt of the criticism. They fined him £150 and banned him from all football this season, effectively a six-month ban, which is huge blow for Dolan and the club. He was seen by the referee as the main culprit in coming on to the pitch and starting the melee. Dolan is no stranger to controversy and to some it was no surprise that he was named and shamed.

Both clubs have been fined £1000 plus a good behaviour bond of another £1000 which are huge sums of money for Junior clubs and a signal of just how seriously the ER-JSFA took the matter.

They felt the clubs had brought the image of Junior football down after some favourable publicity recently. Junior football has been enjoying a period of incredibly good media attention in recent weeks and incidents like this could only damage that image. They felt they had to act and act with authority.

These fines are big for both clubs who do not have the financial clout of others in the region. Dalkeith, who are outraged at this amount, in particular may not survive this. They have a emergency meeting scheduled for Sunday but the signs are not looking good. They have been surviving on a shoestring for years and a fine such as this could finish the club. No-one at the club was available for comment but it seems they are considering an appeal to the Scottish Junior Football Association. If they fail it could be the end of a club struggling to regroup and climb the table.

Harthill, who see themselves as innocent partners in the whole incident, will also find it difficult to pay this money although they have a small social club which could help out. But their main worry comes this weekend. They are involved in a Scottish Cup tie at home to Shotts Bon Accord in what is a derby. Their grounds are only three miles apart and a huge crowd is expected. The Harthill officials fear a younger, more boisterous element of Shotts supporters are heading for the game and, if any trouble arises, then Harthill could see their good behaviour bond disappear overnight.

Again, no-one at the club was available for comment but they too are considering an appeal.

Rosyth's appeal to the SFA following a recent heavy fine by the East Region JFA, has been returned to the Region to be re-opened and the case heard again.

**The last time the
teams met**

Pollok opened their competitive 2005/06 campaign with a penalty shoot-out victory over OVD Scottish Cup holders Tayport at The Canniepairt in the semi-final of the SJFA Super Cup.

With manager Rab Sneddon on holiday it was Harry Erwin who took charge of the team, although he had far from a full squad to select from. Close season signing Bryan Smith made his first competitive appearance in the black and white alongside John McAulay, formerly of Arbroath, and Martin McGinty, previously with Stranraer.

Robbie Henderson found space down the Pollok right, but there was no supporting player to meet his square ball across the face of goal. It took the visitors 10 minutes to produce a save from Frazer Fitzpatrick when a Martin McLauchlan cross was headed tamely at goal by Simon Black. Four minutes later and makeshift centre-half Derek Paterson fouled Henderson 20 yards from goal, with Sean Christie rattling the crossbar with the resultant free kick. Henderson continued to cause problems for the Pollok back line, including one effort where he hit the side netting despite being grounded earlier in the action. At the other end McLauchlan came close to breaking the deadlock in the 31st minute. A Chris Cruickshank cross was headed back across goal by Smith before being cracked against the bar by McLauchlan. McLauchlan then had a penalty appeal turned down before Tayport had their best chance of the match. Pollok had enough numbers back to clear any danger, but failed to do so, leaving Gunnion in a position to curl an effort goalwards, but Wilson turned the ball around the post.

Pollok should have taken the lead seven minutes into the second half when Black found himself six yards from goal with just the 'keeper to beat, but he pulled his shot wide of the target. The game was then stopped for a lengthy period when a collision between Gunnion and Martin Nelson left the Pollok midfielder in need of a stretcher, with Willie Stewart replacing him. Smith had a hooked shot saved as Pollok began to dominate more and more. Black squandered two further chances for the visitors who were clearly missing the cutting edge of last season's top scorer Gavin Friels. Bryan Duell was booked for the home side before 44-year-old Gus Malone replaced Henderson. Burns was called into action ten minutes from time when turning a Gary Middleton effort around the post. Gunnion was then booked before Ross Jamieson replaced McGinty for the 'Lok. Although he came on in the 89th minute he would get eleven minutes of playing time due to the additional time that resulted from the Nelson injury.

The new season was therefore to start for both sides in the same way that the old one had ended v Beith and Carnoustie respectively, with the lottery of a penalty shoot-out. Things didn't look good for 'Lok when Fitzpatrick saved from Smith, but Steven Stewart put his effort wide. Black and Willie Stewart converted for 'Lok, as did Young for the hosts. Middleton then saw his effort saved by Burns, but McClay struck the left hand post with his effort before Duell scored off the inside of the same post to leave the scores at 2-2 after four penalties each. McLauchlan thundered his penalty home, before Morris struck the same post for Tayport that had denied McClay seconds earlier, sending Pollok through to a final clash with Lochee United.

The **Fife Herald's** back page (14/12) concentrated on the Scottish Cup draw against Pollok but also had a colour pic of goalscorer Kevin Kelly in action. Spotted amongst in the crowd in the background of the photo were a trio of Tayport's recent national lottery winners who had been enjoying matchday hospitality at the Can-niepairt.

The (Glasgow) **Evening Times** (12/12) commenting on the Scottish Cup draw said that "Pollok landed the plum tie in the fourth round when they were paired with three times trophy winners Tayport. "Lok boss Rab Sneddon commented " It is yet another away tie and I feel for our fans because of the added expense....but they will head for Tayside in numbers"

Last weekend's press was dominated by the Q O S v Linlithgow Rose Scottish Cup tie. Not only the press but BBC TV too, which showed extended highlights of the game at Palmerston. Much of the hype was as a result of comments attributed to Queens' Steve Tosh which had rubbished Junior participation in the Cup. But Tosh would have none of it. In **The Scotsman** (14/01) the midfielder insisted he welcomed junior clubs in the cup and praised Rose for their performance at Dumfries. Said Tosh " I never said anything derogatory about the juniors or Linlithgow, all I did was ask why the SFA have changed the rules this year. Not a thing was said about the quality of the Junior sides. Some people decided to change what I said. Sometimes as a football player you have to deal with that kind of thing but it's not very nice because it gets personal" So, there we are, the record's set straight. A bit too late, however, for the "1,000 + Lithgae fans who subjected Tosh to a non-stop barrage of abuse"

It's got to be said that the participation of the Juniors has been good for the competition and we could hardly have had better ambassadors representing us for the first time than Pollok and Linlithgow.

The **Evening Telegraph** Junior page (14/01) was headed up by a pic of the Tayport players training at the beach after the game at Glenrothes was frozen off. Unfortunately the Tele blotted its copybook by crediting Pollok's win over St Cuthbert Wanderers to the 1st round of the Junior Cup!

The **Evening Times** (15/01) reported that "Lok boss Rab Sneddon will attempt to conclude the signing of Beith playmaker Martin McGarvey this week, and an approach is also thought to be in the offing for want-away Ayr United ace Davie Hamilton."

FROM THE CLUB'S ARCHIVES NOVEMBER 1973

We look back almost 35 years to November 1973 when Tayport played a Fife Amateur Cup 2nd round tie at home v Eastbank AAC on the East Common. Reason we look back at this game is because the Tayport goalkeeper that day, Alex Houston, has Pollok connections and is expected to be at the game today. It was the only game Alex played for the first team and he kept a clean sheet, an achievement which would never be repeated in any of his games with the Reserve XI!

90 minutes into this New Year's morning the Tayport FC secretary had a text message out of the blue from Alex who was celebrating the New Year in Braemar and had got into company with Mel Irons our former player and assistant manager now at East Fife who was spending the New Year break at the same hotel. They got talking about football, as you do, and discovered they had Tayport FC in common.

Weegie Alex phoned a week or so later for a chat and reminisced over his times and travels with Tayport FC whilst a student in Dundee. Alex was probably best remembered as the 'keeper who held up a match for what seemed like hours as both teams searched for his lost contact lens.

He was asking after former teammates and also recalled the time when he ended up in Dundee Royal Infirmary along with four teammates after Spider McLaren's Moskvich van coming down Albert Street into Tayport en route to Thursday evening training, skidded and rolled over a couple of times, scattering three players, Feechan, Oswald and Ancell out into the street. Alex was left hanging upside down by his seat belt in the front seat.

Alex had initially been recruited to play for the Reserves in the Alliance League, making his debut in a 0-5 defeat at Longforgan earlier that year. Team that day was Alex Houston; John Anderson, Alan Davie; John Porter, Frank Feechan, Brian Dempster; John Gilmour, Eddie Stewart, Cormac Andrews, Brian Burchell and George Caldwell. Ian Morrison was substitute.

The line-up for Alex's only 1st XI game, the 5-0 Fife Cup win the following season was Houston; Ian Mathers, Spider McLaren, Ronnie Fleming, Frank Leslie; Lindsay Ancell, Jim Scott; Abby Oswald, Ian Howe, Raymond White, Doug Henderson. Subs were Eddie Gilmour and Gordon Hughes.

By one of those amazing coincidences, Alex who later moved to Australia, tells us he got chatting to a guy in Singapore Airport, on a stopover en route Down Under, and it turned out this guy had played left back for Eastbank in the aforementioned game.

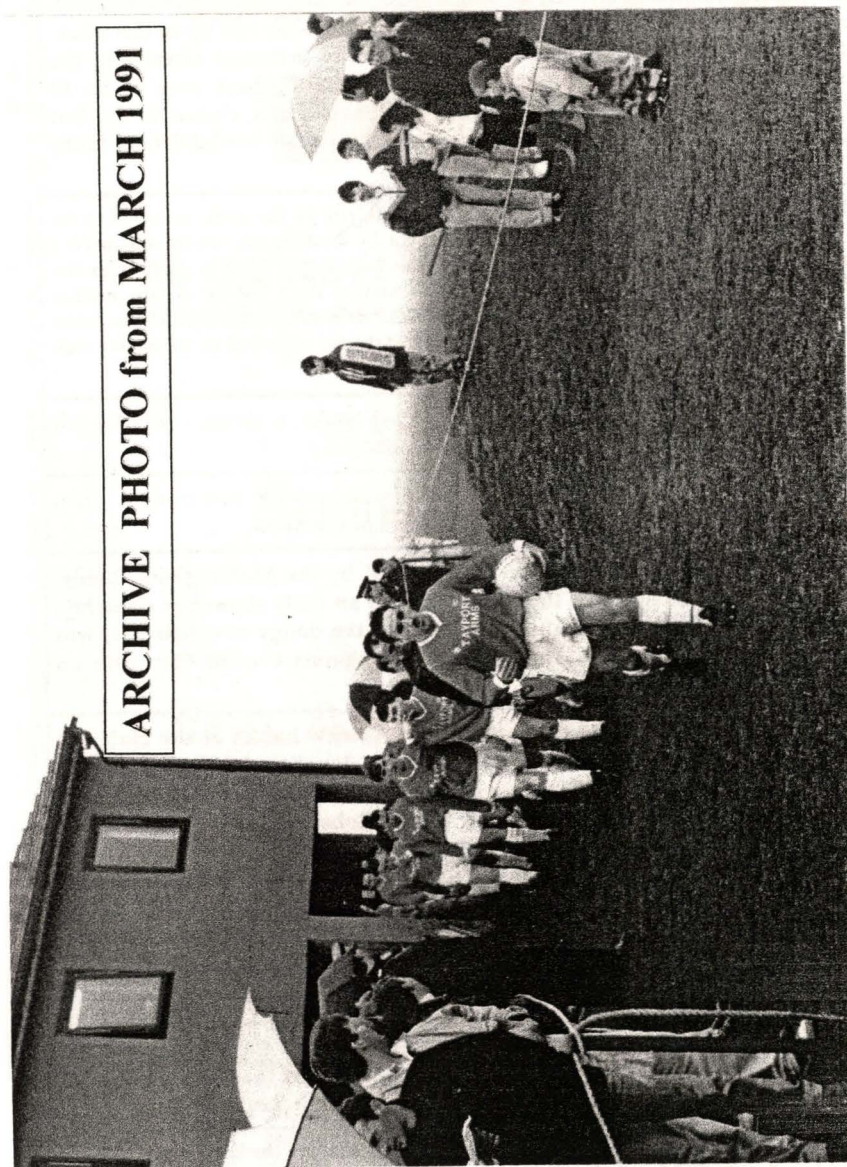

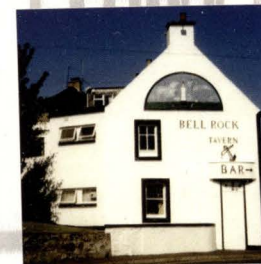
